





















#### SENIOR OFFICERS







Hurrying back to our seats for the next act, we nearly knocked down John Herbst, who invited us to come to his freshman history class the next day and hear him lecture to his students.



# THE JUNIOR CLASS SPEAKS


We are not Bernhardts or Barrymores, but the Junior Class of 1945 knows its lines well and is ready to take the lead for '46.

# FOOTBALL

With five lettermen returning, Coach E. A. Markey had little difficulty in building a squad of Vikings into a triumphant football team. The Vikings lost only three games during the season, two of which were by one point.

In the first game the Northeast boys showed their ability by defeating, for the third successive year, the William Chrisman Bears, 13 to 12.

The Vikings suffered their first defeat in twelve starts against the Westport Tigers 6 to 0. The lone score came after Westport had recovered a Northeast fumble on the Vikings' one-yard line.

The second defeat in as many weeks was administered to the Vikings by the Ward Cyclones, 14 to 13. The Vikings showed much power against a heavier team, piling up 57 more yards than the Cyclones.

After two straight defeats the Vikings suddenly exploded, plowing over the Southwest Indians 18 to 0. Northeast unleashed a powerful offensive, showing much ability in both passing and running attacks.

Northeast's second defeat in the league, the third of the season, came from the Southeast Knights, 14 to 13. In subduing the Vikings, the Knights played superior football.

In winning their second league contest over a strong Central Eagle team, the Vikings demonstrated a strong line and a fine running attack. There were many fumbles, the game ending 6 to 0 in favor of Northeast.

By defeating the East Bears 6 to 0, the Viking forward wall proved to be the best in the league. During the first three quarters, both teams demonstrated fine defensive play, with Northeast unleashing a powerful drive late in the third quarter and scoring on the first play of the fourth quarter. Both teams illustrated fine passing attacks.

In the final game of the season, the Vikings smothered the Paseo Pirates 20 to 0. The Vikings dominated the play most of the time, capitalizing on accurate passing and fine runs to score their three touchdowns.

Capable and efficient was the line of Northeast Vikings, and against strong opposition it proved to be the best in the league. At the center position was Charles Buschhorn. The two guards were Albert De Weerdt and Dick McNamera. Paul Parker and Jack Phillips were the Viking tackles. The ends were Darell Norris and John Hix.

The backfield positions were filled with such backs as John Glorioso, left half; Ed Lee, fullback; Donn Martin, quarterback; Pat Murphy and Don Evinger, alternating at the right-half position.

Coach E. A. Markey has done a magnificent job in helping to build the high school youth of today into the men of tomorrow. He is indeed an inspiration to those who work under his direction. By building a powerful offense around the "T" and single-wing formations, Coach Markey was able to guide the Vikings into third place this year.

Because of the strong Viking line, Northeast had the best defensive record this season, having only 20 points scored against it. In the last four seasons, Northeast's opponents have crossed the Viking goal line only 12 times, making a total of 77 points. This is an average of 3.2 points a game for the opposition. This is the best defensive record in the league. Northeast and Coach Markey can be proud of this record.

Four Northeast Vikings were honored by winning berths on the All-Star Teams. Two of the boys won positions on the first team. At left half was John Glorioso, the most versatile player and the hardest runner in the league, which is proved by the fact that he gained more yardage than any other player in the Interscholastic League. At the center position is Charles Buschhorn, the most aggressive linebacker in the league. Charles saved many a game through his brilliant defensive play. On the second team were two boys who should easily win their positions on the first team next fall. Very few gains were made through right tackle this year, as this position was very capably filled by Paul Parker. End runs seldom were successful around left end, as Darell Norris was a fine defensive player and a good pass snatcher.

The prospects for next year's team are exceptionally good. Six of this season's starting line-up and two additional lettermen are returning, making a total of eight lettermen for next fall.



We of the battalion wish to express our sincere appreciation for the way he has instructed us, led us, and helped us to attain honors.


The Northeast Battalion was the largest in the city this year. It made a good record in drill, theory, and inspection, but doing this has become standard in our school.
