Co-captains elected for the season were Dick McNamara, guard, and Albert DeWeerd, guard.

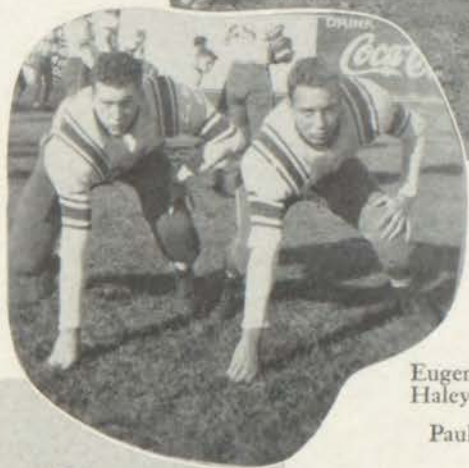

GIRLS' SPORTS

In the fall of the year the first cry in girls' sports is "sticks." This familiar term means HOCKEY. After dribbling, bully off, and driving have been practiced sufficiently, the classes form teams for intramural competition.

SPEEDBALL truly lives up to its name, being a combination of hockey, football, soccer, and basketball. This odd mixture is one of the most exciting and strenuous team sports for girls.

GOLF is new this year in the girls' physical education program at Northeast. Skills are developed in class, but the play takes place after school, once a week for a month. Although the girls didn't become professional golfers, they did enjoy learning a new game.

HORSEBACK RIDING, recently added to the field of individual sports, has become very popular.

BASKETBALL and VOLLEYBALL take the spotlight in the winter months, when the weather is too cold for outdoor sports. During this time the girls practice the skills required for playing these games. For basketball they practice free shots, screen plays, jumps, passes, and shooting goals; for volleyball they work on set-ups, smashes, assisted serves, and recovering low balls. Teams are then chosen to play in a round-robin tournament.

The girls' gym classes also enjoy sessions of ICE SKATING and BOWLING at the Pla-Mor.

SWIMMING is one of our most popular sports. The girls enjoy the use of the pool twice each week. One-fifth of the student's physical education grade is based on participation in this activity, much time being spent in learning the different swimming methods and strokes. Lifesaving and water safety are also taught.

MODERN DANCING is studied for two weeks each semester. In preparation for dancing the girls learn arm and leg swings, push-ups, and the art of falling gracefully—if there is such an art!

SOFTBALL heads the list of spring sports, with tennis, badminton, hand tennis, aerial darts, and Ping-pong following.

The physical education course is designed to promote good sportsmanship, a spirit of cooperation, the co-ordination of mind and body, and the development of poise, and physical and mental health.

The girls are receiving special recognition for the work they are doing. City-wide standards have been set up for awarding small and large shields and the large chenille letter, similar to the one received by the boys. Any girl may receive one of these awards, depending on the amount of work done and the ability of the girl.

The department is under the very capable instruction of the Misses Ruth Buchanan, Jean Boardman, and Ruth Biggerstaff. The student sports' managers also deserve credit for doing their share to keep things running smoothly.

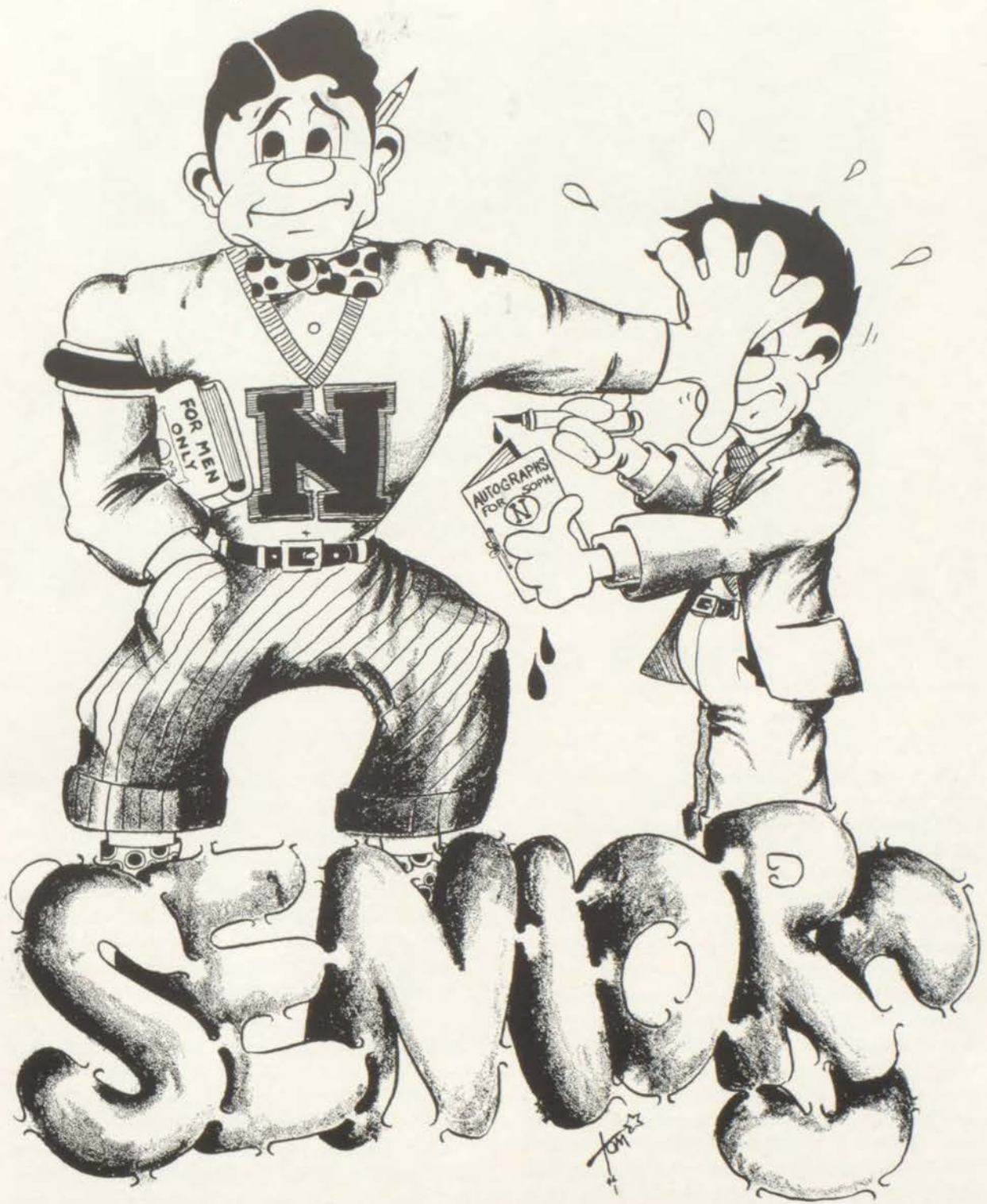
MRS. BELL, affectionately known as Senora Bell to her students, is the adviser.

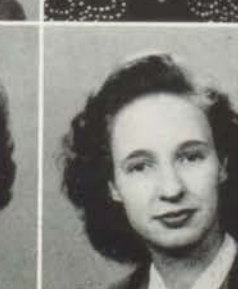
