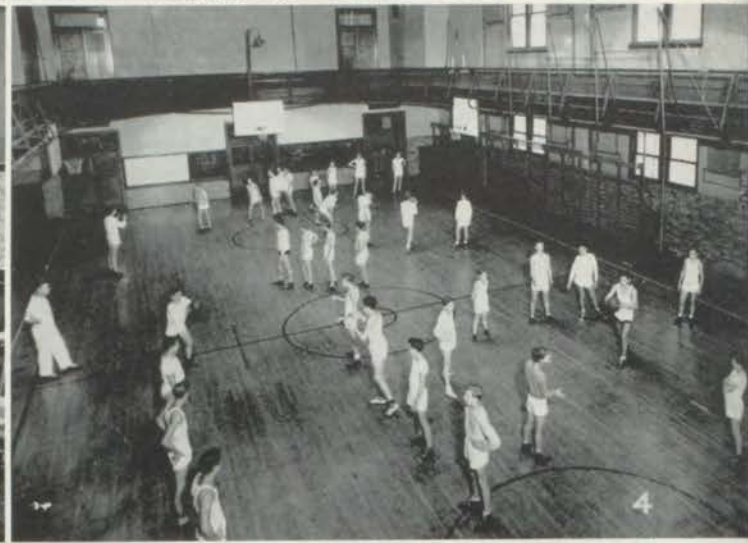

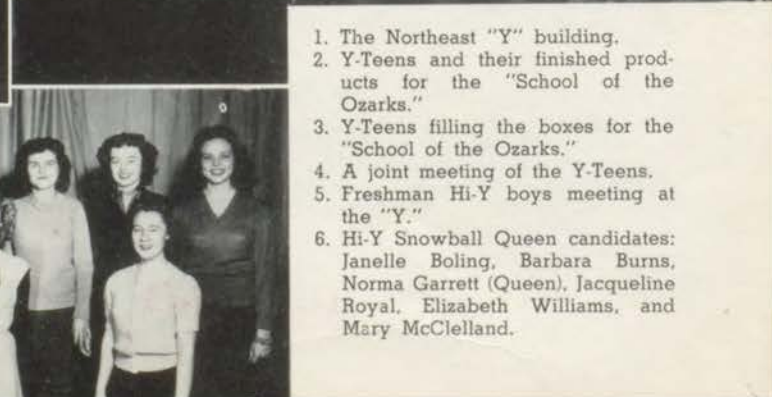
This organization undertakes various activities. Among these are a yearly conference and certain social functions such as the annual Snowball Dance.

The Northeast Courier was first published in 1913. At that time it was printed with the school annual as a quarterly magazine called the Nor'easter. As time passed, it was evident that two publications were needed; and so, in 1923, the two were separated. Both continued to be called the Nor'easter until 1926, when the name of the paper was changed to the Northeast Courier.

The Courier is published exclusively by Northeasters. A newswriting class, under the guidance of Mr. Ditmars, gathers, writes, and

edits the news. Printing classes, working under Mr. Kunz, set most of the type and print the paper.

Newswriting gives "budding journalists" their first taste of newspaper work.

During the first semester of newswriting, students are taught to write news stories, feature stories, and editorials. They also learn to read copy and proof, to write headlines, and to do the many other tasks required in publishing a school paper.

to all out-of-town subscribers, to the advertisers, and to about one hundred and fifty high schools throughout the United States. The circulation manager is in charge of the delivery of papers to subscribers in the school. Approximately fifteen hundred papers of each issue were sold this year.

The function of a school paper is to promote good sportsmanship, co-operate with the faculty and students, support school activities, and present news accurately.

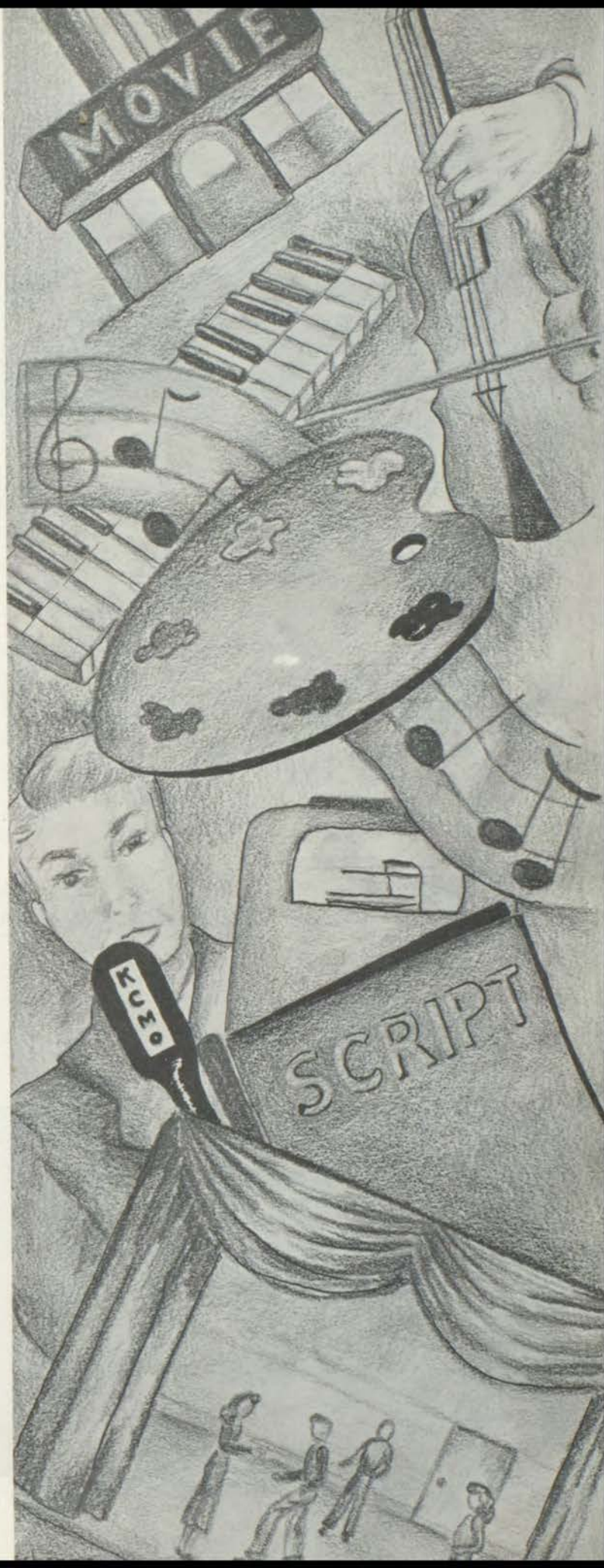

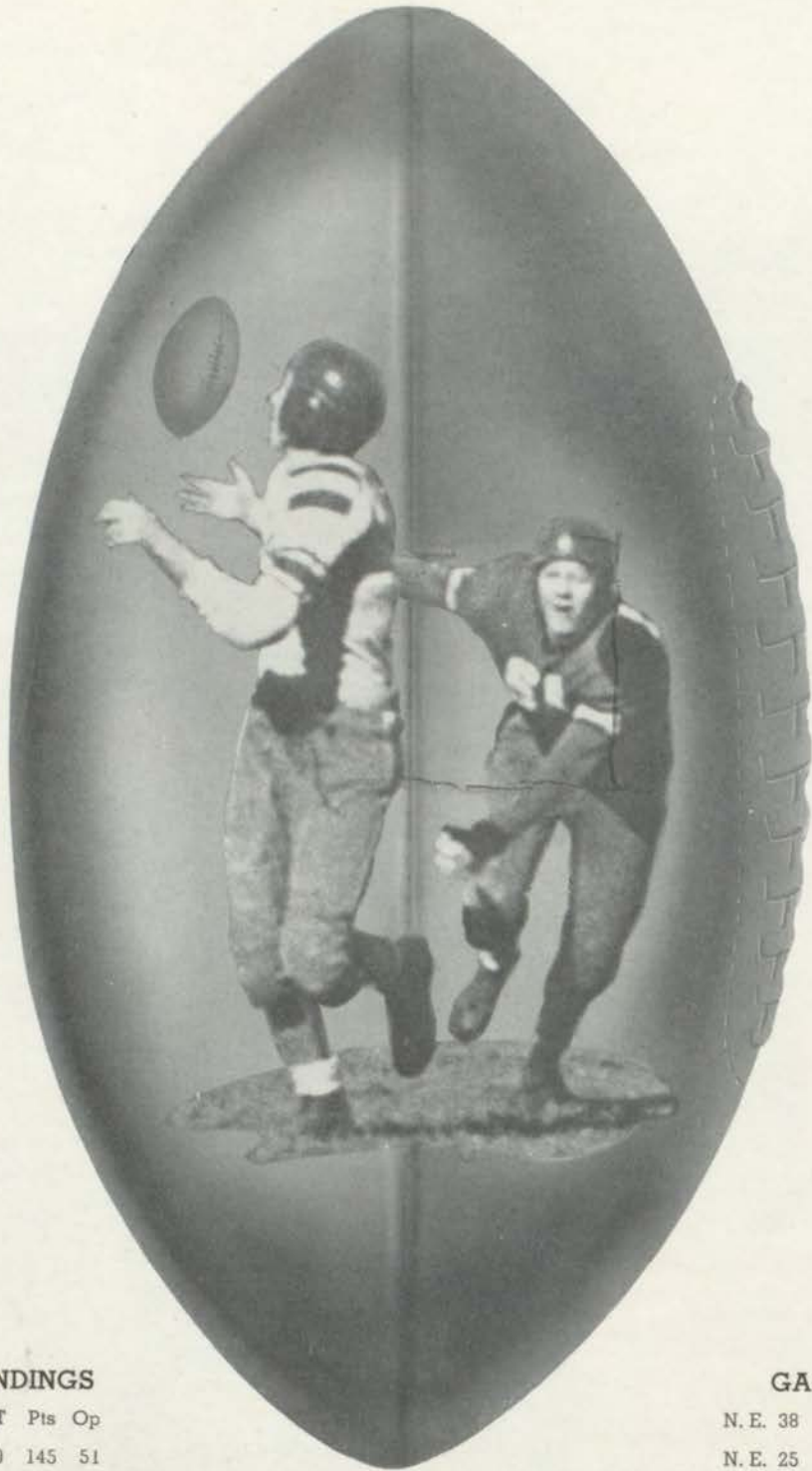

The last game of the season was with the Manual Redbirds. The Viking backfield engaged in wild scoring and won 34 to 0, giving us an undisputed claim to the championship.

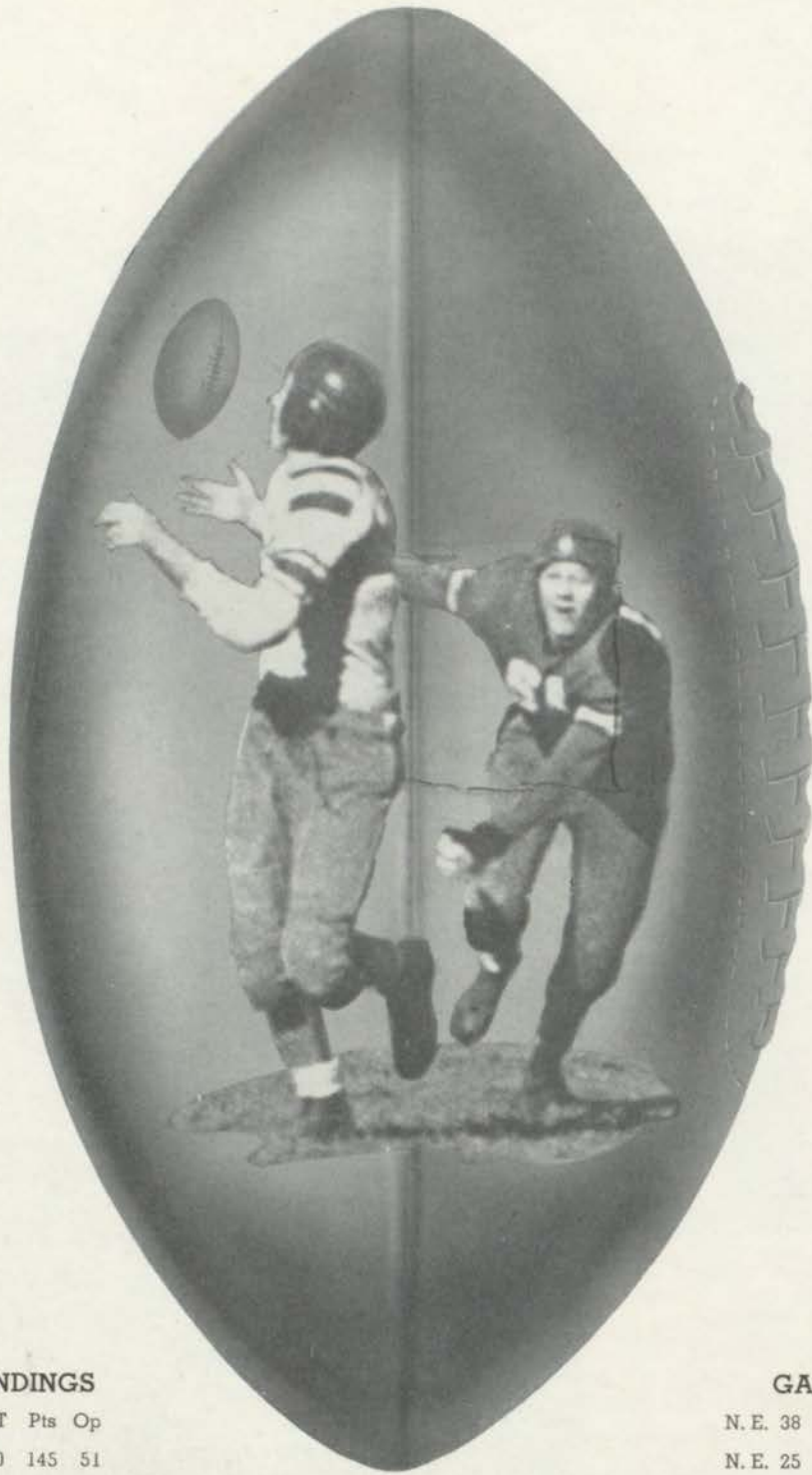
