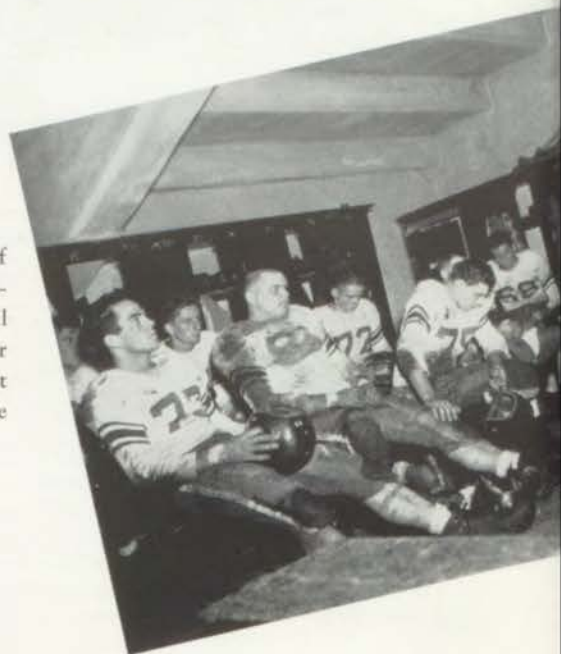

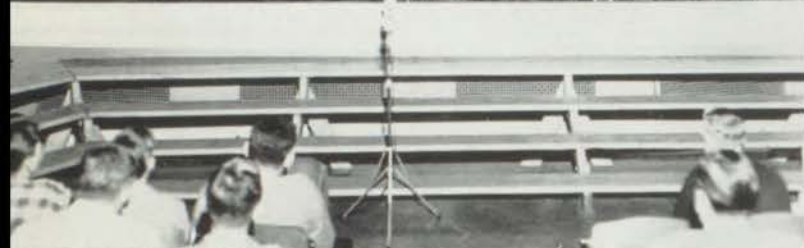


Badminton is one of the most popular games with Northeast girls. It requires good co-ordination and considerable skill.

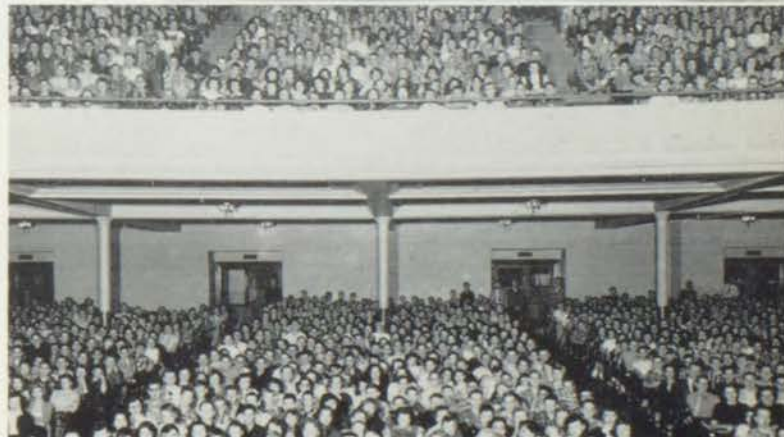

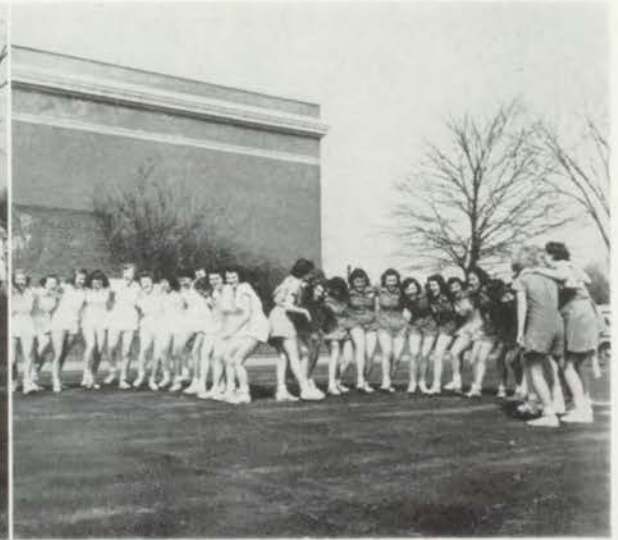
Olympic Club

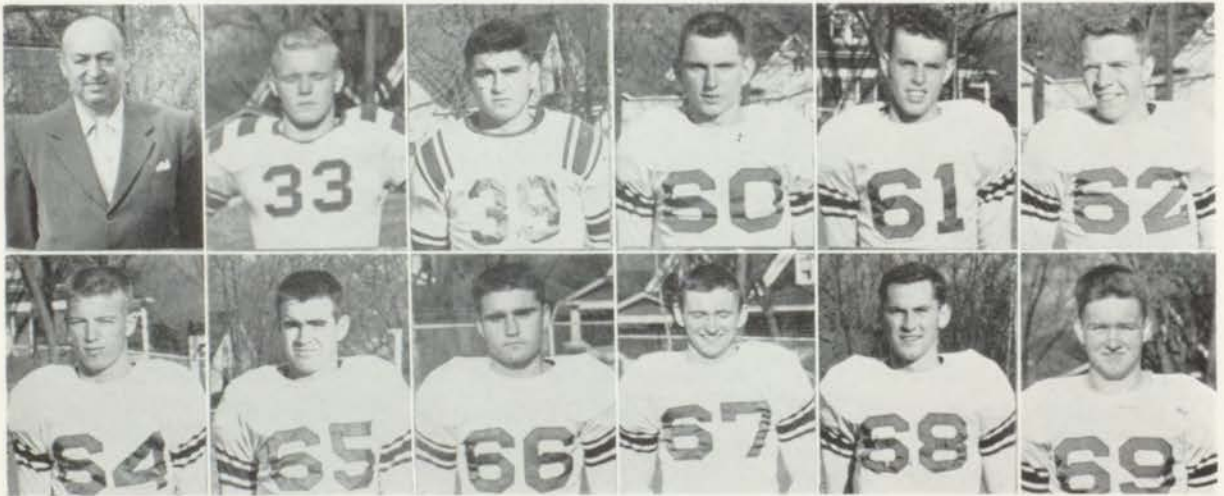

The boys on this year's B squad will be valuable players on next year's first team.

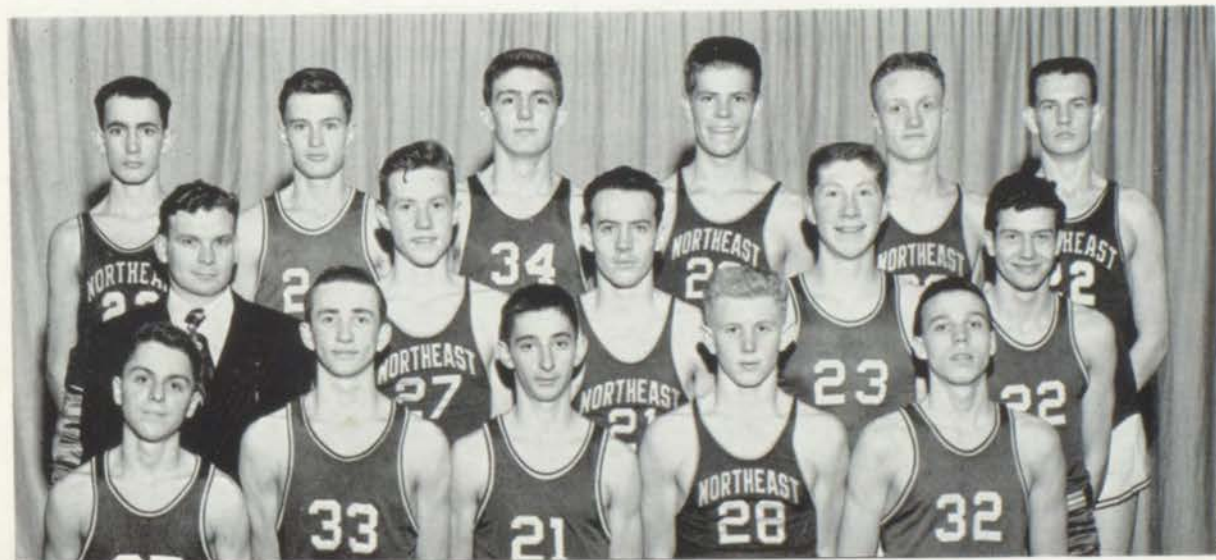
