FOREWORD

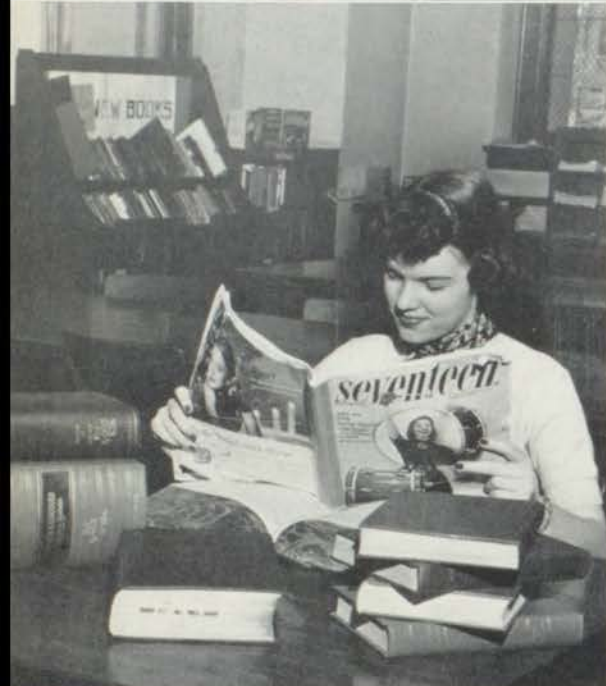
Dear Miss Cain,

could be found splashing and diving in the swimming pool.

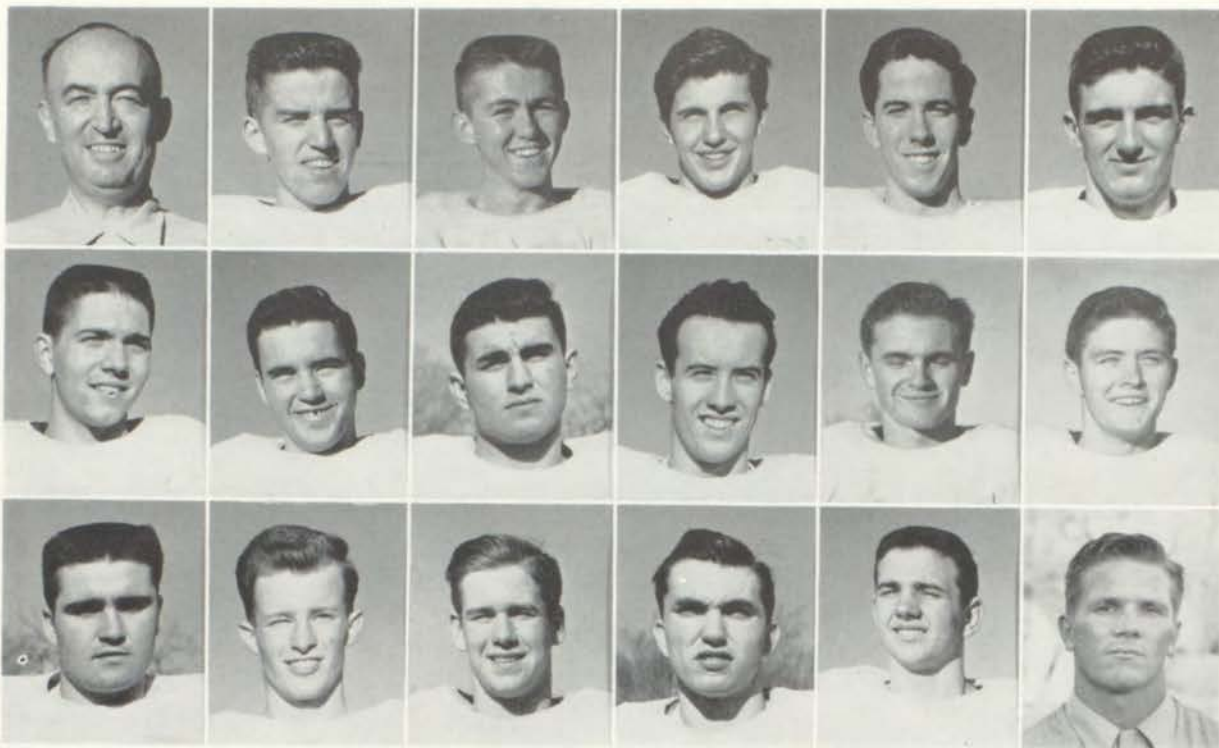

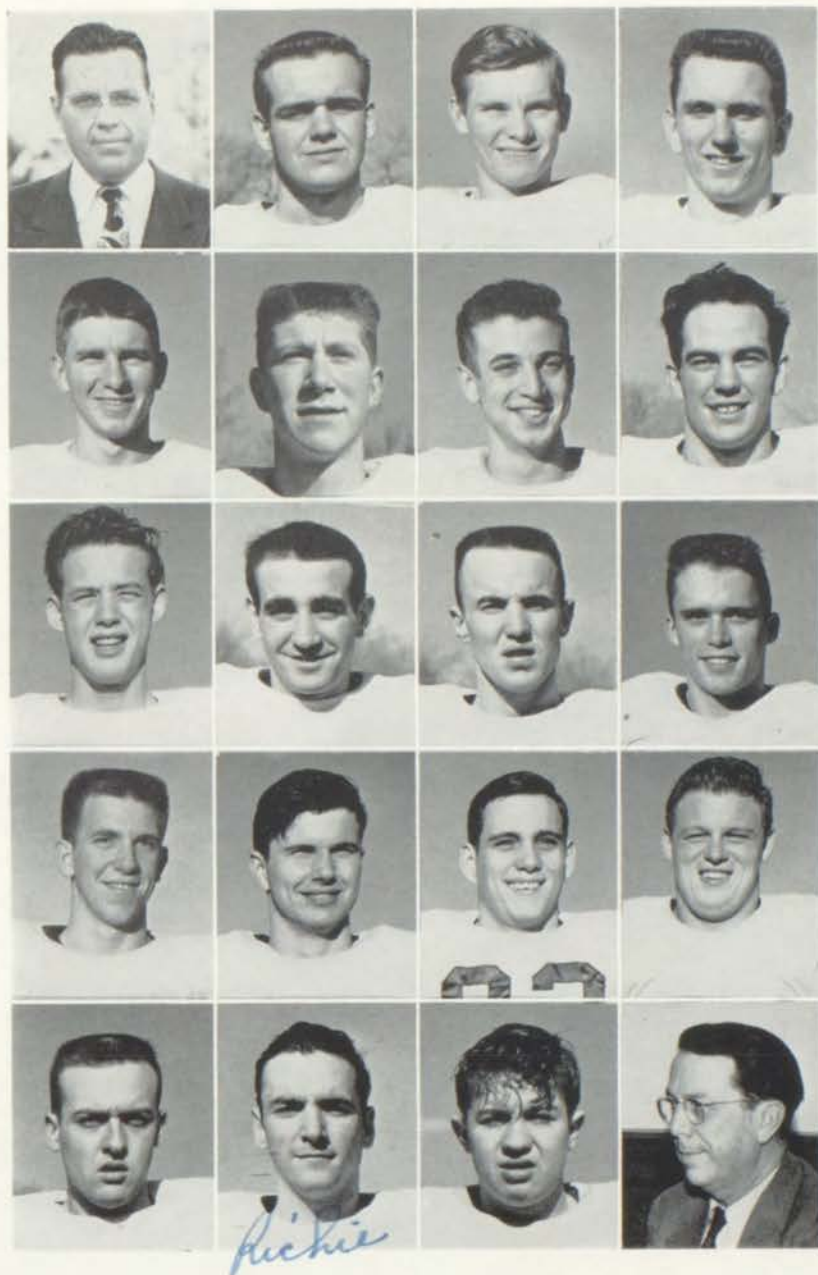
