Forty-two Seniors Elected to

National Honor Society

- Not long after the end of the first semester, the seniors began to wonder who would be elected to the National Honor Society. They eagerly awaited the posting of grade indexes, and finally, on April 9, the new members of the Northeast High School Chapter of the National Honor Society were announced. Forty-two students were elected by the principal and a faculty committee on the basis of scholarship, leadership, character, and service to the school.
- To be eligible for membership, a student must have spent at least one year in Northeast, and must have maintained a 3.25 scholarship index, which is an average of a strong "S." The faculty committee, Mrs. Bell, Mr. Ditmars, Miss Gaylord, Mr. Wasson, Miss Gherring, Miss Gregory, and Mr. Calvert, chairman, consulted the other faculty mem-
- bers as to the traits of leadership, character, service of each candidate, and then checked the citizenship records in the office. This method of selection was based on the idea that a line, such as the 3.25 index, should be drawn, and all those students above it, with the faculty's approval, would become Society members. The committee believed that this method was fair and objective, since the standards were fixed before the selection of members took place.
- The idea of honor societies is not new, for ancient and medieval universities established them to honor outstanding students. Today the National Honor Society is as important to the high school as Phi Beta Kappa is to the university, and probably no honor conferred by the school is more desired than the privilege of wearing the N.H.S. pin.











• In the Co-operative Occupational Education program, the students enrolled attend classes for a half day and work the remainder of the day in offices, stores, and factories. They have the opportunity to secure employment in a field which is interesting to them, and receive credit for this work toward a high-school diploma. A student usually takes three classes in the morn-

ing. One hour is C. O. E. and the other two are either subjects required for graduation, or subjects pertaining to the individual's outside work. The C. O. E. grades are based on an Employers' Rating Sheet, which is sent by the employers to the school. On this sheet each student is rated on quality and quantity of work, personal char-



Miss Marie Wasson was a teacher of social science at Northeast for more than twenty years.
