P.T.A. Shows Great Interest in Northeast

The National Parent-Teacher Association has done much to secure better educational opportunities for the youth of America and to create a closer relationship between the home and the school. It works also to raise the standards of home life and to secure adequate laws for the care and protection of youth. To accomplish these aims, it brings together the parent and teacher, giving each an opportunity to express his ideas and to listen to those of others.

For the students at Northeast, the PTA sponsors the always popular Junior-Senior Prom and

an annual picnic at Fairyland Park. For the parents, it secures prominent speakers for the meetings, offers forum discussions, sponsors parent-education classes, and holds many interesting meetings in which Northeast students give the program. Each year through their sewing bees, the members make many garments for the Mutual Help Organizations.

Varied Activities

Occupy Homeroom Period

A twenty-minute period is set aside each school day known as homeroom. At this time a bulletin is brought to each room. The bulletin outlines the activities of the day and informs the student body and faculty of coming school and social events.

The elections of homeroom officers, student council representatives, junior and senior class officers, City Hall Day officials, and senior ballot take place during this period.

Filling Christmas stockings for veterans and donating to the Red Cross and United Funds are some of the charitable activities carried on during the year.

Each room is visited periodically by students selling the school publications and tickets for various sports and social events.

Homeroom helps to bring the administration and student body closer together, and gives the students a feeling of responsibility.

Journalism Students Gain Newspaper

In the first semester, the Newswriting Class, under the direction of Mr. Thomas Ditmars, studies the correct way to write headlines, editorials, news stories, and such important details as how to organize the material that is to go on each page. 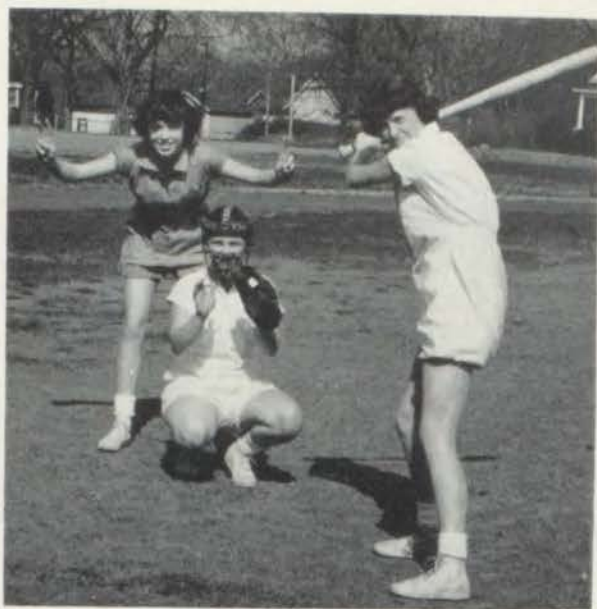

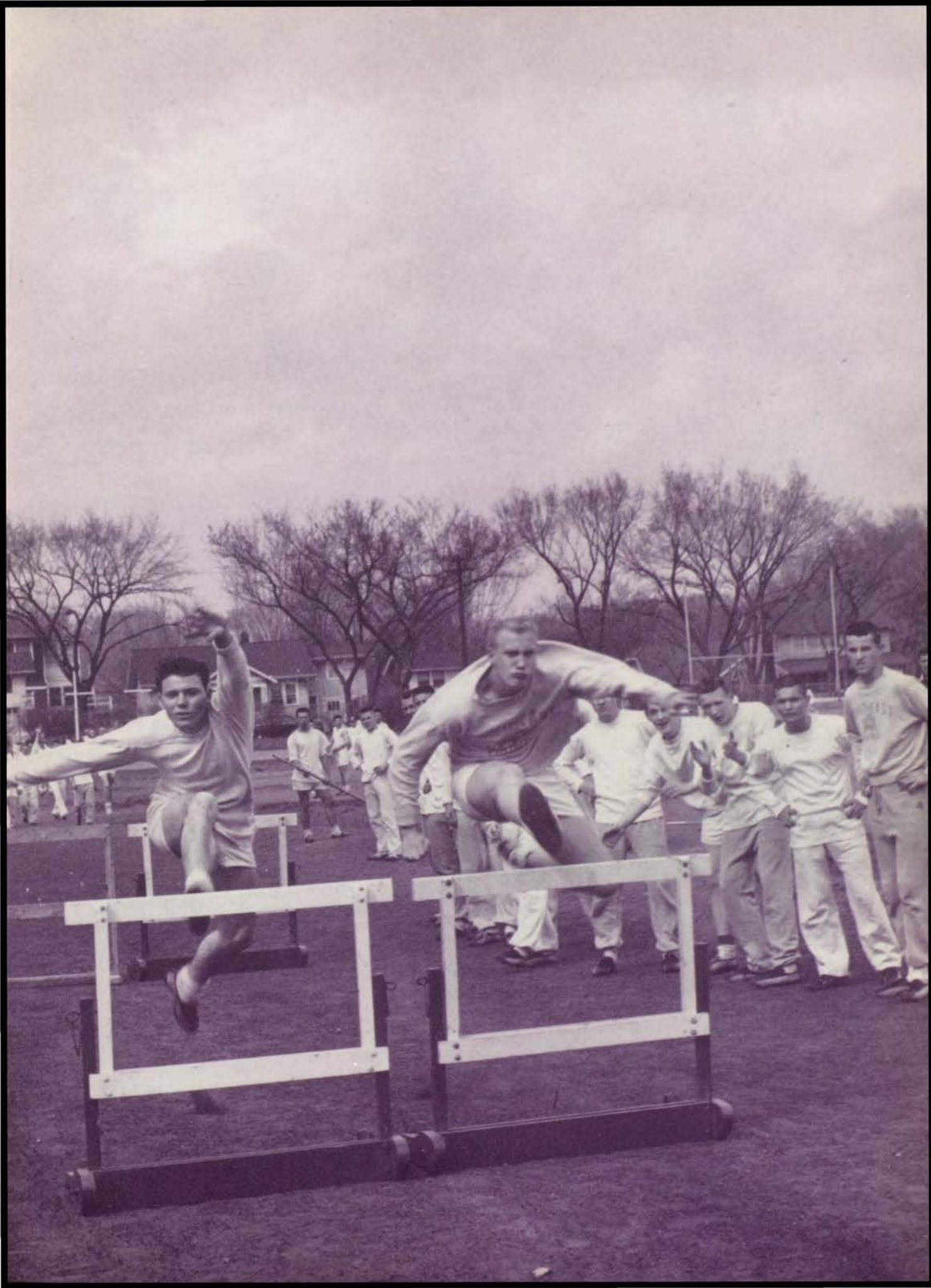


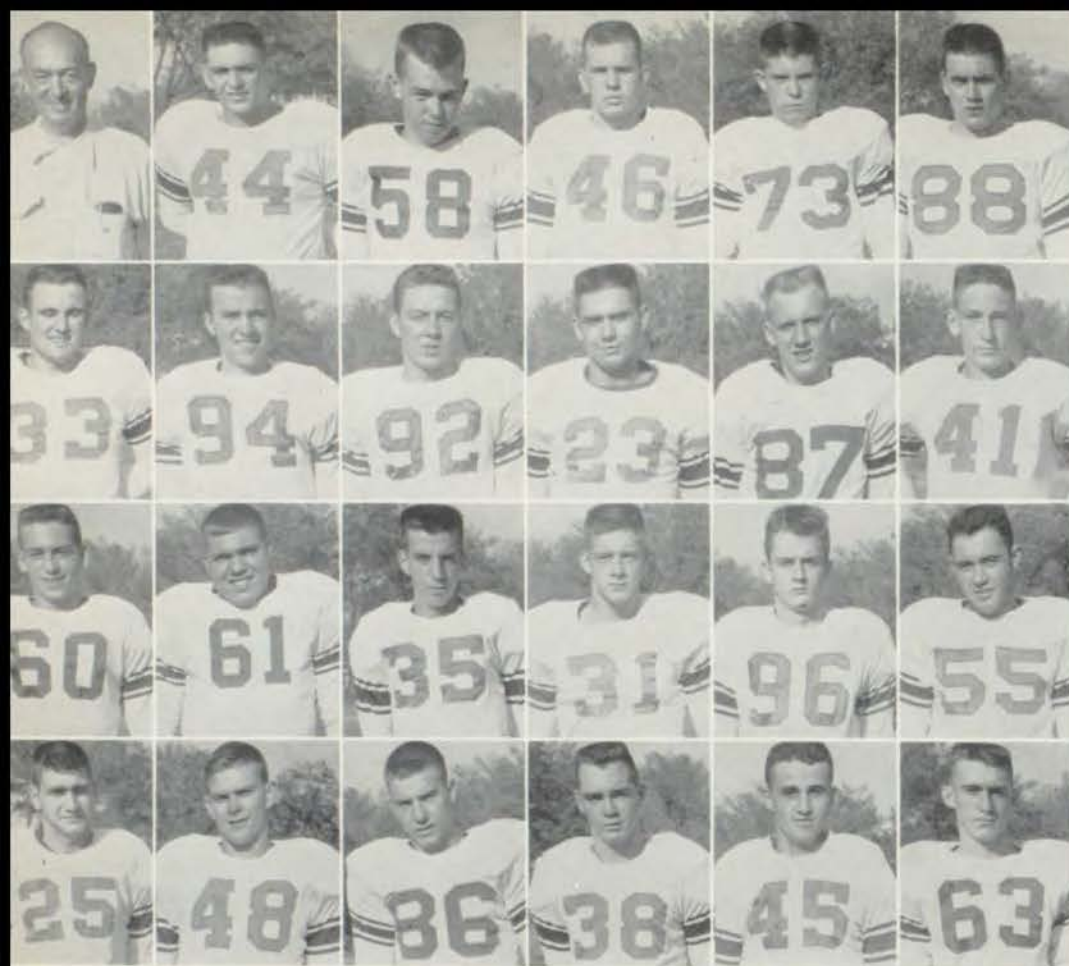

The game, picked by sportswriters to be the game of the season, fulfilled all expectations. The rushing and passing attack of the Vikings reached the peak of effectiveness, but they were edged out in the final stanza of the game by a long East touchdown drive.

In two other nonleague games, Northeast rolled over their traditional rival, William Chrisman, but were defeated by a powerful Wyandotte in the last game of the season.

The final statistics of the Vikings showed four games won, three games lost, and three games tied. This overall record finds the football tradition here at Northeast still strong, as the team continues to surpass the .500 mark.

Vikes Capture First in League Play

The 1955-56 basketball season brought to the Interscholastic League a much needed change in the playing facilities, and established a schedule that was reasonable and satisfactory to all the schools involved. The Vikings, with five returning players from last year's state basketball team, were picked by most sportswriters and coaches to win the championship. But, with an evenly matched league, it was also realized that virtually anything could happen.

Under the expert coaching of Coach Charles Huhn, things did happen. The Vikes placed first in the Interscholastic League, with eight straight victories and only one setback, which was at the hands of Central.

The next game, which was against the hard-fighting Lincoln Tigers, saw the Vikes playing their best. The Vikes won by a decisive margin, and then went on to the finals.

Before a crowd of 2,300 wildly rooting fans, the Vikings, after suffering two cold quarters, lost to North Kansas City, bringing to a close a successful season of sixteen wins and five losses.
