National Honor Society Raises Standards

The greatest scholastic honor which can be bestowed upon a student at Northeast is to be elected to the National Honor Society. To become a member of the society, a student must have at least a strong "S" grade average, good citizenship marks, and must meet with the approval of the faculty.

The faculty council carefully evaluated the merit of each student and then submitted the

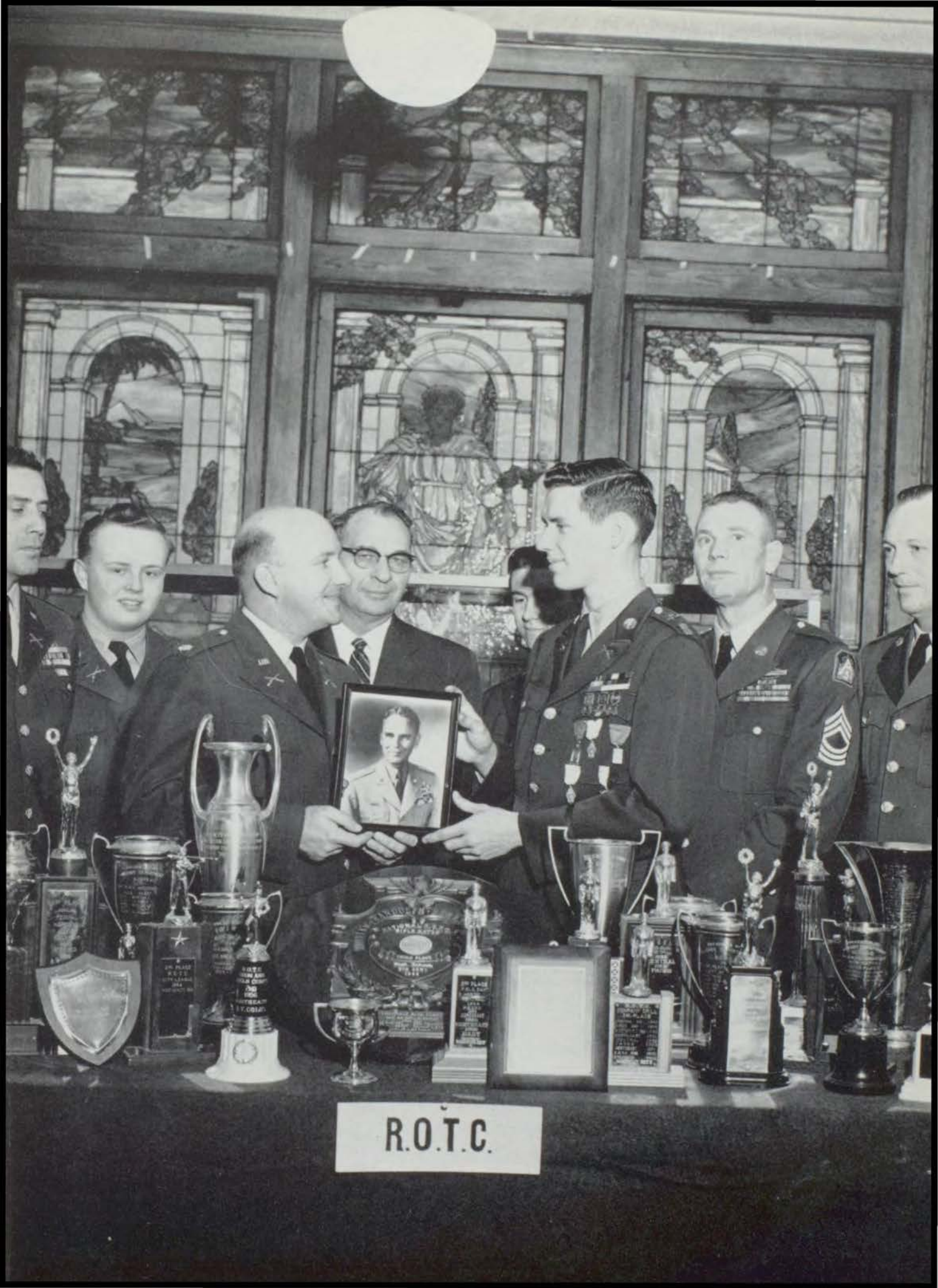

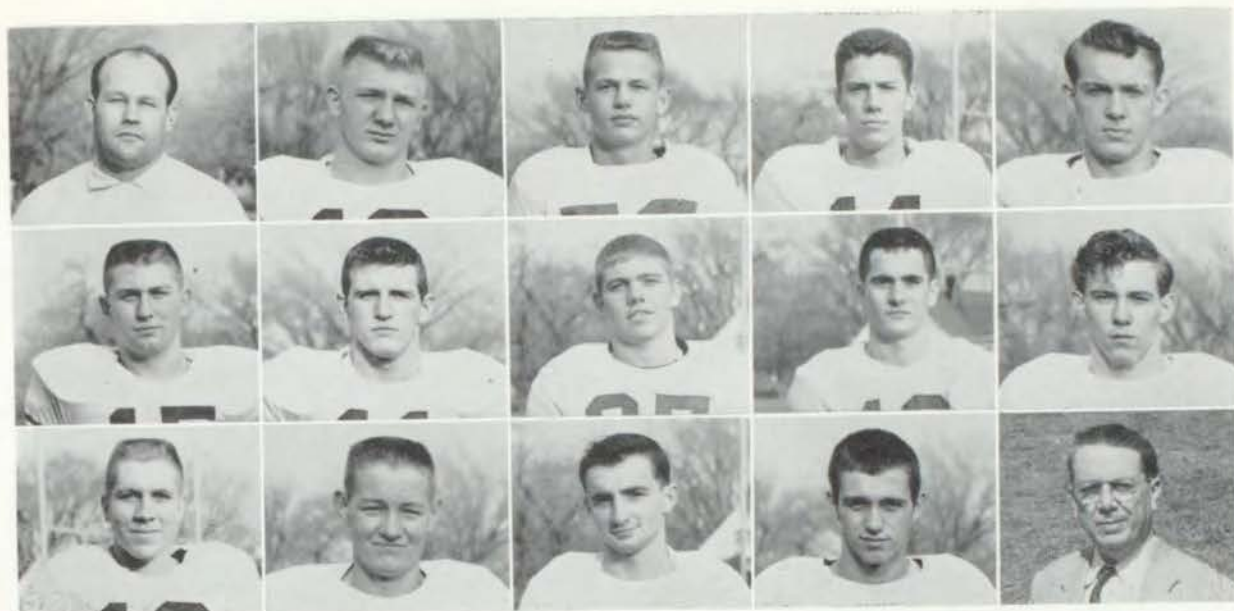

Northeast finished the season with a 12-6 victory over Westport.

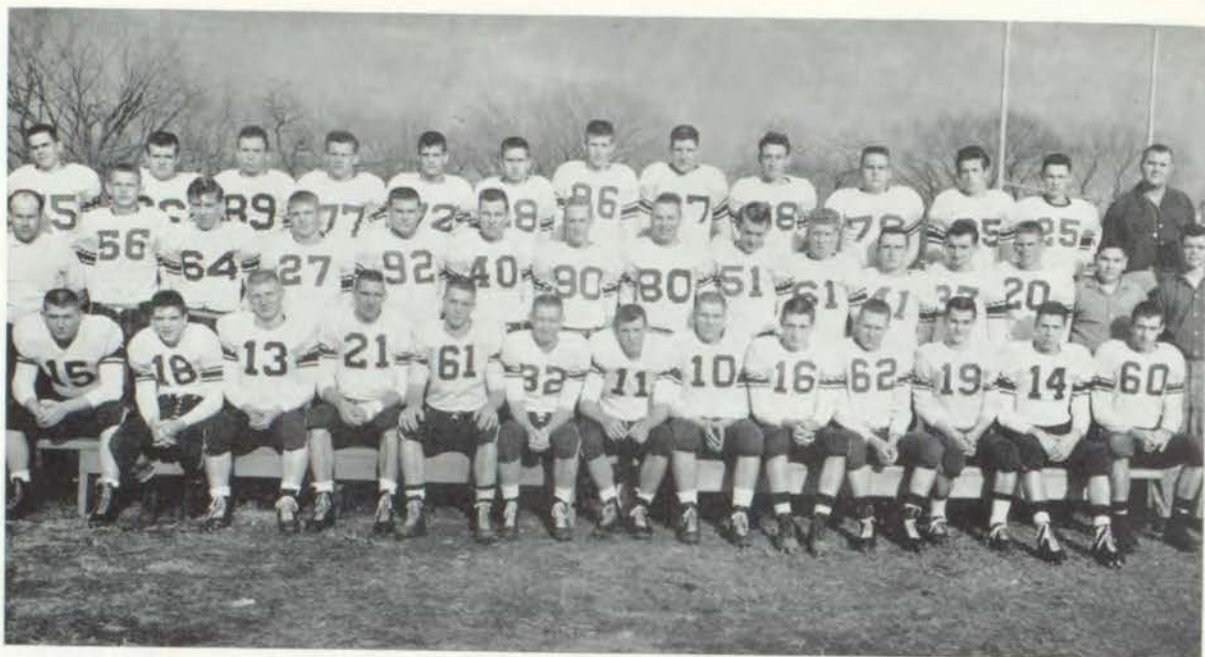
Even though the record for the season was somewhat disappointing, Northeast players won several places on the All-Star Teams.

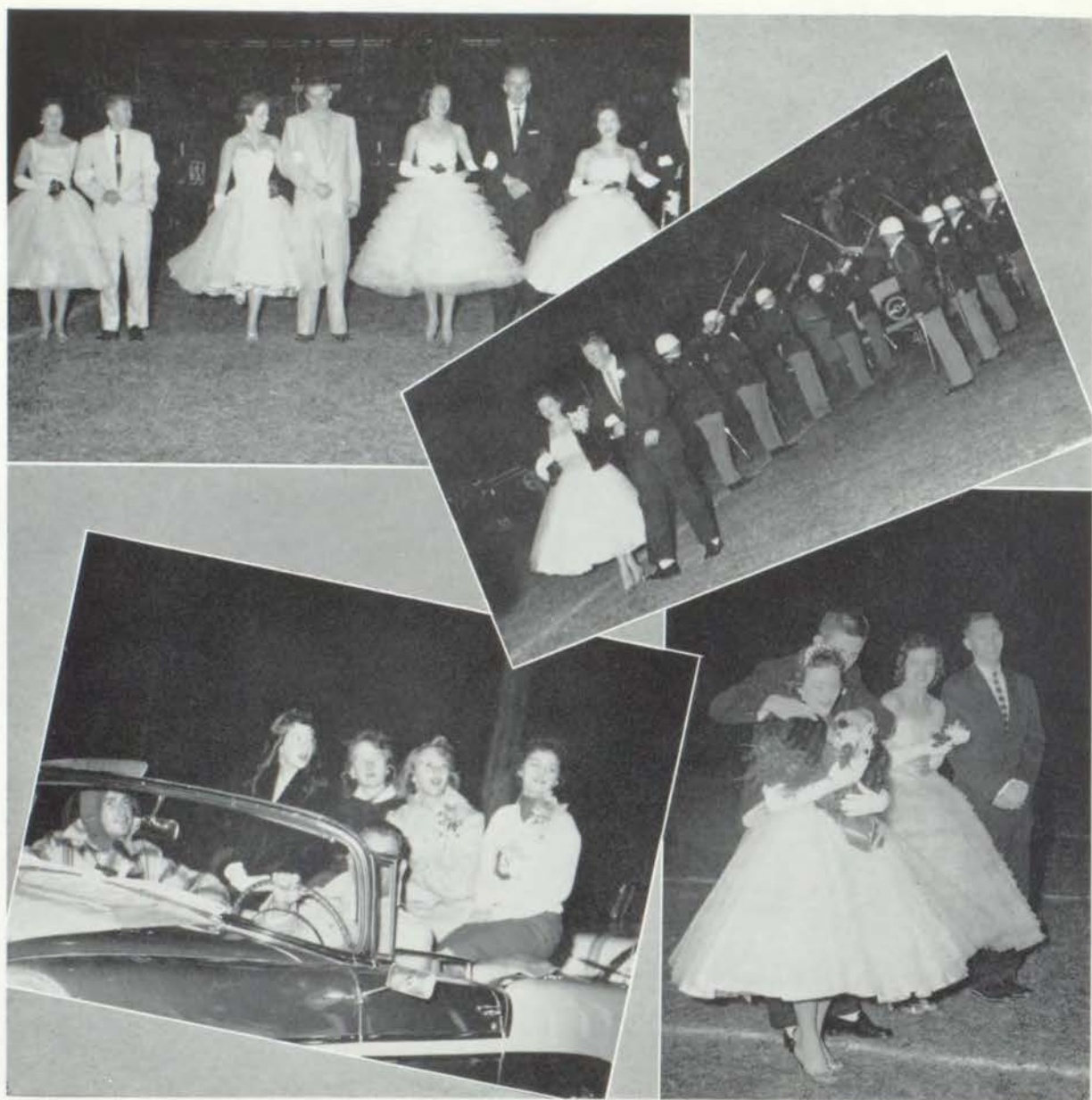
