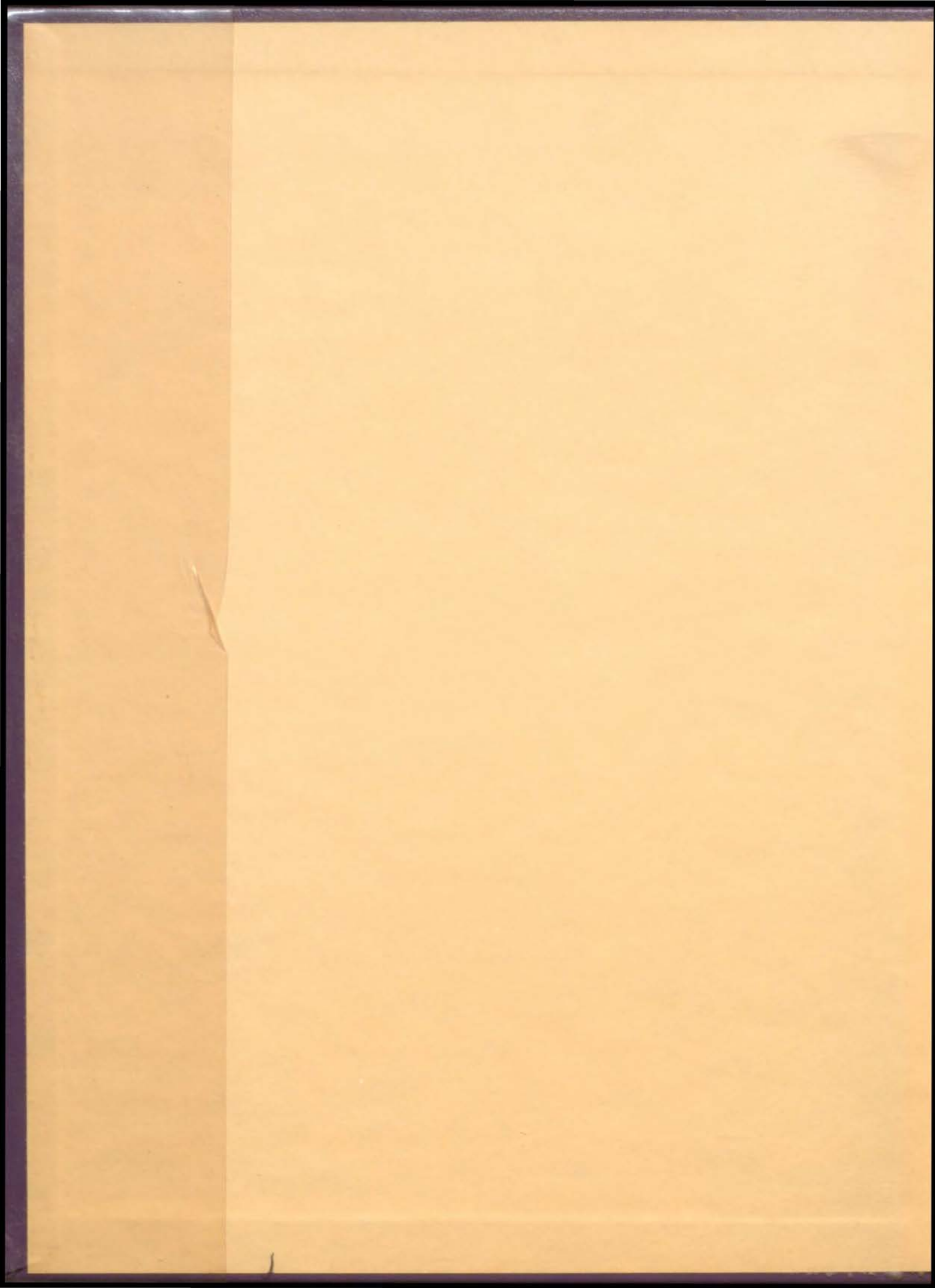
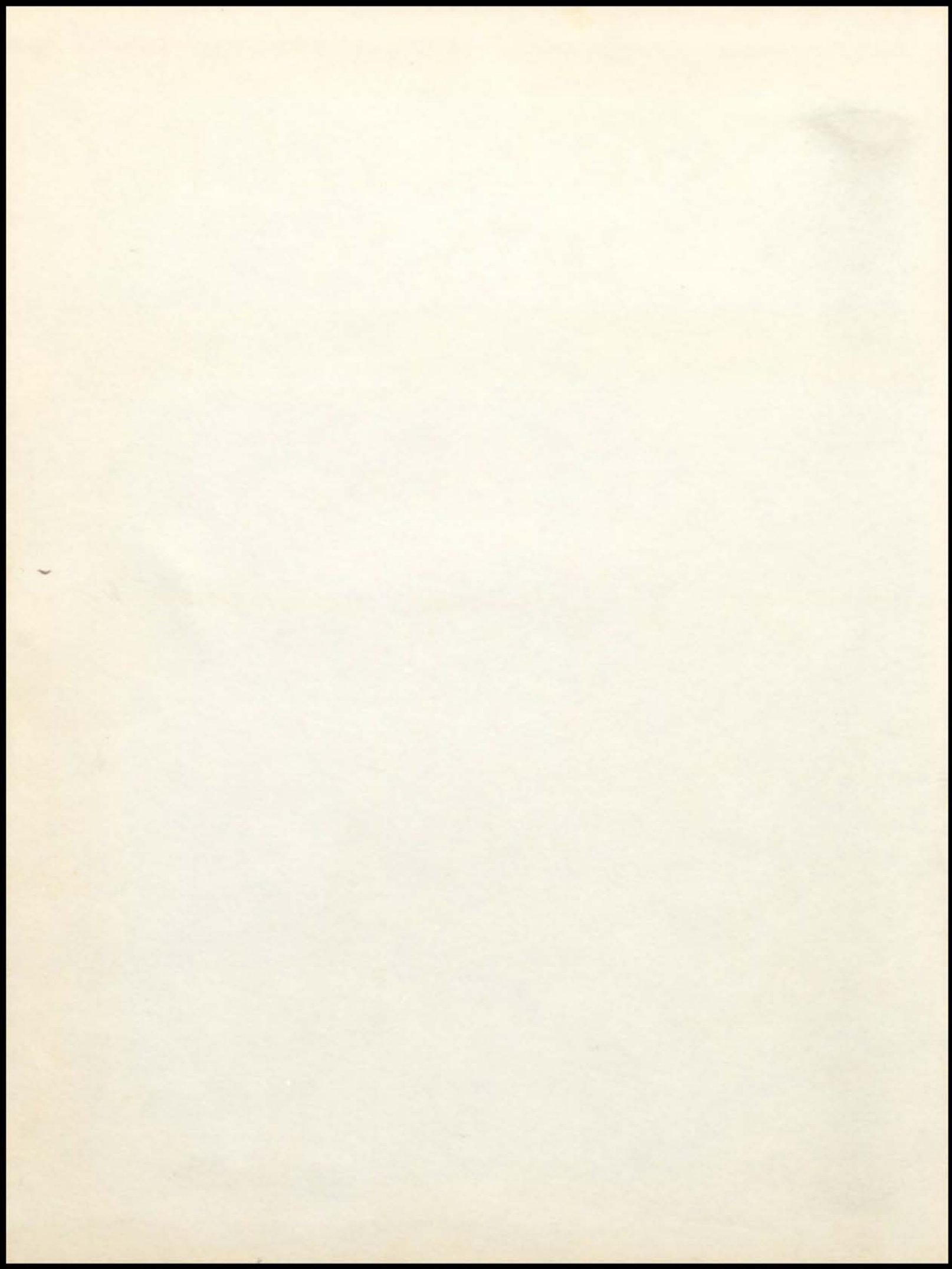

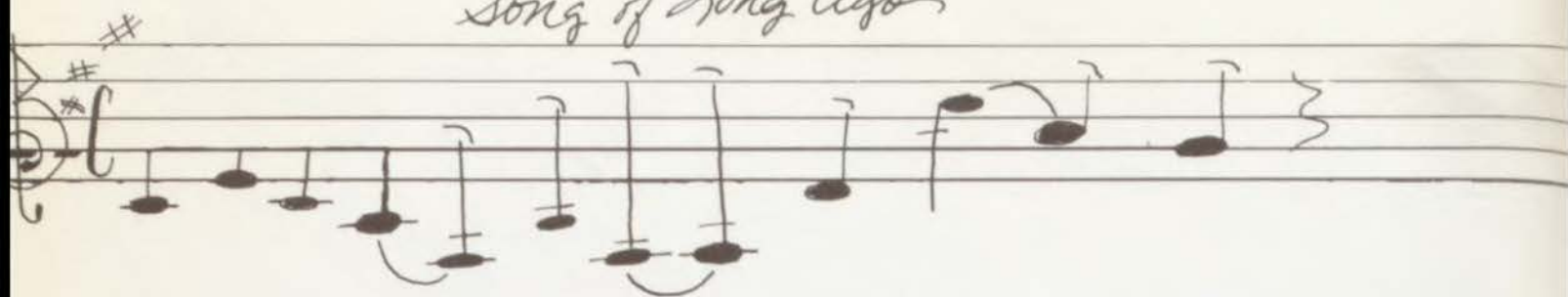

My first thought was that it couldn't be true. Then I realized that retirement parties, bald heads, grandmother bracelets and moves to Sun City and Leisure World are facts of life for me and my contemporaries.

On October 28, 1913, purple and white were chosen as Northeast's colors and the first yell was composed. One week later The Nor'easter was chosen as the name for the school publication. At first it was in the form of a magazine. This year the name of the paper was changed to "The Northeast Courier" in order to distinguish it from the annual.

Thoughts of the past will never grow dim, like that first high school graduation and the realization that...

This newest high school of Kansas City is a busy place. One hundred and fifty men, carpenters, bricklayers, plumbers, steam fitters, tanners, hod carriers, concrete setters and mixers, are working every day on the construction. The two huge boilers now are being placed and the ventilating flues are being set. Much of the electric wiring has been installed. Four derricks placed around the building haul brick and concrete to the workers on the fourth floor. "We are up to the contract time, so far," Mr. Lovitt explained yesterday. "And if rains or bad weather do not prevent, the building will be completed and turned over to the school board September 30. This is contract time." The building will cost \$372,000.

Ours was the era of the flapper, gin flasks and wild parties, but I didn't know anything about it until I read articles and books a generation later. I never heard of Scott Fitzgerald in high school. While he and Zelda were cavorting on the Riviera and in Paris, we were studying "Ivanhoe" and Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar," and going to silent movies at the Gladstone, the St. John and the Benton.

The only movie I remember is "The Shiek of Araby" with Rudolph Valentino, and the reason I remember it is because my father forbade me to see it. But I went to a Saturday matinee at the Benton with my friend, Virginia Belle.

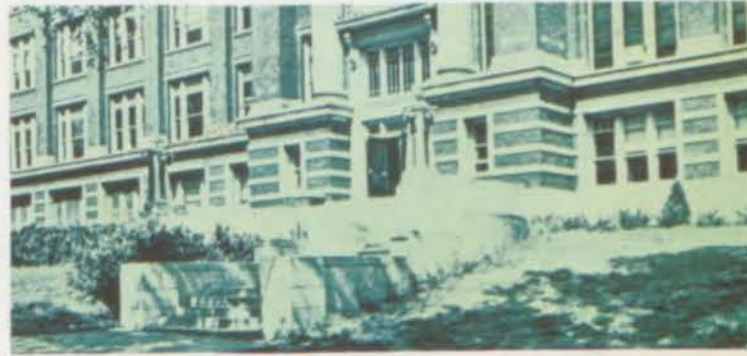
AWARD TO NORTHEAST BOOK.

The 1954 Annual Is One of Three Winning All-American Rating.

The 1954 Noreaster, student annual publication of Northeast high school, has been awarded an All-American rating by the National Scholastic Press association.

The All-American rating was won this year by only three schools in the country in the same size bracket, 1,500 to 2,000 pupils. This is the first time the award has been presented to a Kansas City high school. Northeast has slightly more than 1,800 pupils.

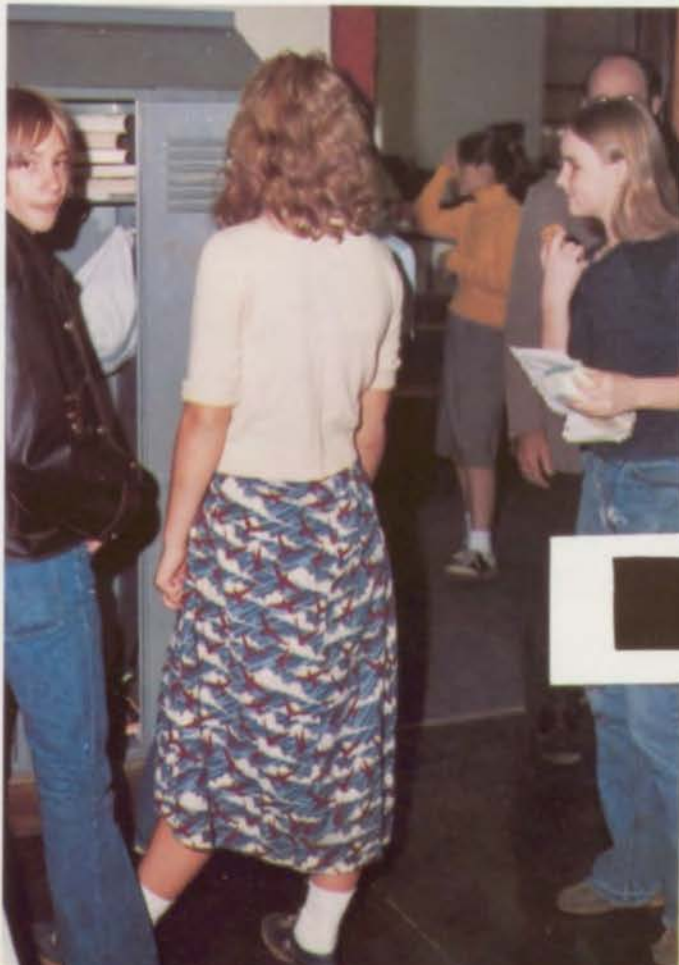
This is the fifth annual Spirit Week. Spirit Week is usually held the week of Homecoming.

Each day of Spirit week is something different. The students may dress in the clothes of that day. This year there was Sports day, Over-all day, 50's day, and Purple and White day.

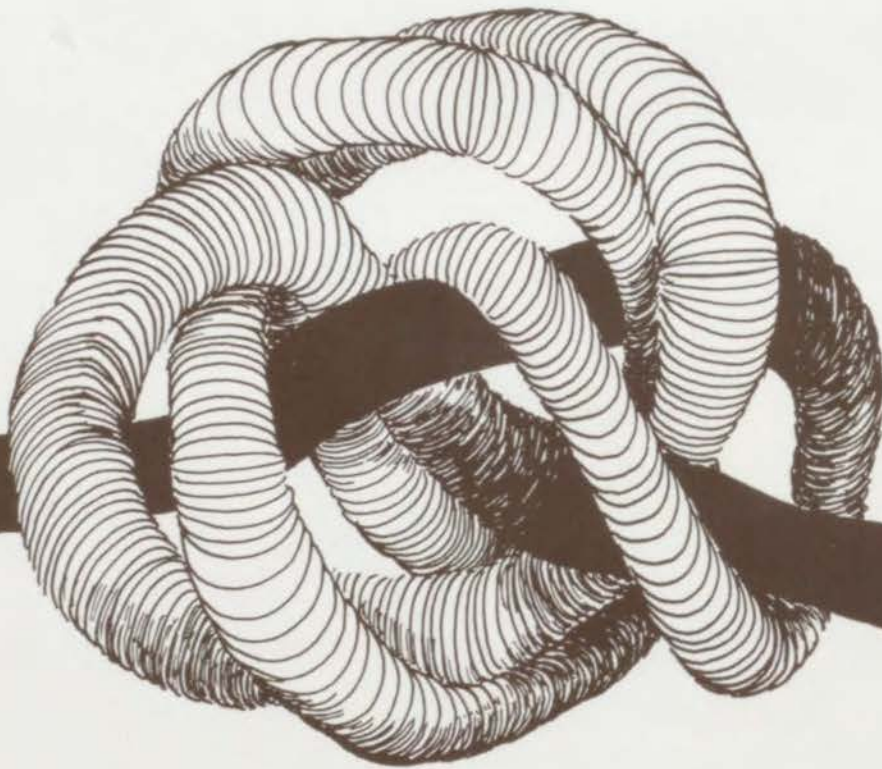
Spirit week was started to build up enthusiasm in both the students and members of the football team.
