Suzanne Jones qualified and place 32nd in the State Meet out of 180 runners. This was the 2nd highest finish in State Competition for a N.E. girl.







The junior varsity volleyball team had a rather good season this past year. They finished with a record of 4 wins and 4 losses. They played in the Junior Varsity Interscholastic


The Junior Varsity basketball team had an outstanding season, Coach Russ and his team held practices at 6:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.







Ecology Club.


