ESL = English as a Second Lanaguage is for international students who need to develop and improve their English language ability.



Mr. Tebe is from Cameroon, Africa. He was inspired to become an ESL teacher because of his own immigration experience. Mr. Tebe teaches the ESL class in which the newly arrived foreign students attend. After these students improve, they move up to a higher level ESL class. Mr. Tebe has many goals for his students. "I would like my students to be able to communicate with others and understand the requirements of their teachers." The lesson plans are similar to those of the other ESL classes except there is an emphasis on basic reading and writing in Mr. Tebe's class.

Ms. Stika has taught ESL for fifteen years. She enjoys seeing her students make progress. "I can see them learning when they improve their pronunciation." Another sign of progress in Ms. Stika's class is the ability of her students to tell jokes. "For my students to be able to tell jokes in English is a true sign that they are learning." Each student starts at a different level of understanding. Some students are unable to read or write in their own native language and tend to pick up bad speaking habits from their American classmates. An average day in Ms. Stika's class consists of the students practicing the communication skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

FYI : This year approximately one-fourth (1/4) of our student body are ESL (300/1200).

Mr. Yao has taught ESL for two years. He is from Chang Chun, China which was occupied by Japan during World War II. "I wanted to become an ESL teacher because I appreciate the diversity in a student body." Adapting to a different country is very difficult. Foreigners must not only deal with cultural shock but the language barrier. The ethnic communities help new residents adjust as does ESL. " I enjoy seeing my students change over time. Some students come into my class not knowing how to speak English. Over time they leave speaking it fluently."



Staff Sergeant Monegro is a native of the Dominican Republic. He has lived in the United States for 32 years. His family moved here in order to seek a better life. When Staff Sergeant Monegro first became an American student in New York, he was in an ESL program. At that time ESL was a little different. "Years ago my ESL teacher also taught many general subjects. If I ever had a problem understanding something the teacher could always translate." Being a student who was in ESL, Staff Sergeant Monegro has an understanding about the significance of this program. "I believe that if there was not an ESL program a portion of the students would be left out."

Peshraw Barzinji

Peshraw Barzinji is a native from Iraq. He has lived in the United States for two years. Peshraw immigrated in order to receive a better education and avoid the war in Iraq. The other reason he came to the United States is because his father works for the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Office. Peshraw developed a better sense of English through ESL. The United States gave him many opportunities including a different lifestyle. Peshraw is a senior this year and he plans to use the skills ESL taught him.

HongPhuc Do

There are many different reasons why people move to the United States. Most are based on educational and employment needs. Three years ago Hong moved here for a different reason. She moved to avoid the lack of opportunities in Vietnam. While living in the United States she is more independent. She can go to school instead of having to work. In Vietnam children work to help provide for their families. Hong believes that ESL helped her to adapt to an American school. " Before I was in ESL I had trouble with English but now I'm doing much better."



Idil Ali



In Somalia there is no government control over the country. As a result, the people living in Somalia do not have much of anything. To improve their lifestyle and educational needs, Idil and her family moved to the United States. Learning English isn't hard for Idil because she was taught by her father in Somalia. Sometimes she needs help and when she does ESL is there for her. Idil wears a scarf because it is a part of her religious and cultural tradition.

Berta Damian

After living in the United States for four years Berta has not forgotten her home country of Mexico. Berta left Mexico in order to rejoin her family who were already living in Kansas City. Living in the United States has changed Berta for the better. She is now involved in many different activities. "I like living in the U.S. because I can make friends, go to school and have a nice home." ESL helps students in so many ways. In her case, it was her reading that was greatly improved.



Sofija Bencun

Sofija Bencun and her family immigrated to the United States only one year ago. They moved to escape the unfair government in Bosnia and the sound of continuous bombing. They also moved here to seek better employment. "In Bosnia it is very hard to find a job in which you could support your family." Sofija is still finding it a little hard to adapt to the U.S. Aside from a few problems that will be solved in time, Sofija is happy to be here. She plans to be a photographer in the future.

Sergey Akopov

Sergey Akopov was afraid of being sent to the army in Russia. He moved to the United States where he would not have to fight. In the five months that Sergey has been a citizen, he has improved his English. In ESL, Sergey feels that he is respected and understood by his peers. Although he is very new to the United States, Sergey is ready to live in freedom, the same freedom which Americans take for granted everyday.

Kevin Kimbrough always wanted to become a chef. When he was a junior, he started to go to Manual Vocation School for the Culinary Arts Program. During the summer of 1999, Kevin attended a national convention for culinary arts. At the contest there was a cook-off contest between forty-five participants, Kevin took fifth place. Then he went to state and placed first. Kevin's family has a long history of cooks and chefs. After high school, Kevin plans to go to Johnson County Community Colleges because it is one of the best culinary arts schools in the nation. After college, he plans to continue working at his present job where he is a cook. During his free time he cooks and reads many different cook books. He also likes to develop different recipes. His family always tries his new recipes.





The culinary arts program teaches the handling and preparation of food. Students learn both basic and advanced steps of cooking. All the dishes in the culinary arts program are started from scratch. Students are taught by a certified chef. Students will learn the state and federal laws of food sanitation. After completing this program, you will be eligible to participate in an internship at a local restaurant.



Culinary Arts/Business

This program teaches accounting, banking, credit and computer applications. The academy gives you the experience to run a small or large business, or if you are more interested in learning different aspects of a business the academy of finance will tailor your program to your interest.



Auto Tech/Cosmetology

The automotive program teaches students both basic and more advanced steps of keeping a car running. Most of the experiences come not from a text book, but from actual hands-on experiences. Most of the cars the kids work on have been in an accident. They do all of the repairs and repaint the cars before returning them to the owners.



The cosmetology program is for students who are interested in going into the field of hair design. Cosmetology is one of the fastest growing fields. After two successful years in the cosmetology classes, you will be a licensed cosmetologist, you will be able to run your own beauty shop and you will be able to cut different styles of hair. You will learn basic manicure and facial techniques.



The building trades program covers the four separate areas of construction operations: carpentry, bricklaying, cement finishing, and residential electricity. Upon completion of the program, you can pursue such jobs as an electrician, brick layer or general laborer with potential to make \$30 an hour. You will be prepared to work as an apprentice or to continue your studies in a 2 or 4 year college program.

Fabric Care/ Fashion Design



The fabric care program at Manual includes dry cleaning, pressing, marking, spotting, inspecting and assembling, fabric recognition, alterations and garment storing. You will be able to obtain a job as a customer service representative, spotter, presser, inspector, assembler or bagger immediately after graduation.



The fashion design program covers topics such as clothing design, textiles; history of fashion, new technological innovations for the future, and careers in fashion. You will learn basic principles of design, line, color and patternmaking and advanced clothing construction techniques.



AgriScience

You will learn the basics of processing, preparing, storing, and distributing quality food and food by-products. You'll learn how to sow and germinate seeds, take and root cuttings, pot seedlings, water and fertilize plants properly, and apply pesticides to control insects and disease damage.



Livestock caretakers have daily responsibilities of nutrition and care of sheep. Some sheep are owned individually and some are owned by the school corporation.

MPI (Math-Physics Institute) is an opportunity for Northeast students to attend college at the Independence Campus of UMKC and study Calculus and Physics. The students take a math readiness test in April of their junior year and those who pass with a score of 12 or more are eligible to attend the University in the fall of their senior year. Students receive both college and high school credit for the courses they take and experience a taste of what college is like. The students do not have to pay for the courses or their textbooks and all classes are taught by UMKC professors; high school teachers act as laboratory assistants to help the students. For most of the area students who take part in MPI, the experience is a challenging one, but the rewards are great. Students have the opportunity to listen to guest lectures widely renowned in the fields of mathematics and science and to ask questions of these experts. Students also are connected to working scientists and mathematicians through the Internet. They experience a team learning environment in the laboratories and can do research using the Internet. The students do a lot of hands-on experiments and even attend a day at Worlds of Fun to explore the physics involved in amusement parks. They retrieve data relevant to the physics used in the construction of the various rides. This type of college experience can and does spark a real interest in the sciences and the application of mathematics. Each year MPI publishes a newsletter where current students, as well as graduates of the program can share their feelings about the program with others. Most students say the work is as hard as anything they have ever experienced, but prepares them for future studies.

Colonel James Berry will be missed by his students who comprise the highly ranked Northeast Jr ROTC unit and his colleagues and friends. CELEBRATE

Reynold Middleton, a 1981 graduate, ranks as one of Northeast's most distinguished alumni. As both scholar and athlete, Middleton was always at the top of his class. He was honored with the M. Wayne McKanna award, presented by long tradition to the most outstanding student athlete of the graduating class.

Middleton set records throughout his career in cross-country and track. He won numerous district and sectional titles. He represented the school in a total of 10 state champion meets—more than any other Northeast graduate. He competed in the state cross-country meets during his sophomore, junior, and senior years. Middleton's cross-country career peaked as a junior in 1979, when he brought home a first-place medal from the Missouri state cross-country meet. His time of 12:51 still stands as a record on the 2.5-mile course, shattering the old state record by eighteen seconds. His career was marred by injury and sickness; still able to place 8th in the state meet that year, leading the first team to compete at the state meet.

A distance specialist, Middleton shined with his performance as a member of the track team. At the 1978 state meet, he ran a 9:52 two-mile, setting a school record for freshmen in the state. At one point more year, Middleton had posted the fastest miles in the nation. He still holds records in the 800-m and 1600-m runs. He was also a member of the record-setting 2-mile relay team in 1981.

Middleton was successful in indoor track as well. As a sophomore he took first place in the indoor two-mile at the state meet. As a junior, his time of 9:28 in the mile run, which broke the existing record, was good enough for another second-place finish at the state meet.

In 1980, Middleton added international titles to his list of achievements. He represented the United States in several European meets, running races in Germany, France, Norway, Sweden, and Switzerland. At the Helsingborg International Junior Championships in Sweden, Middleton won the 1500 meters with a record time of 3:57.4, besting eighty other athletes from eighteen countries.

Heavily recruited by universities across the country, Middleton began his college career at the University of Nebraska and graduated as a standout member of the cross-country and track teams at Northwest Missouri State University. For six years, Middleton was a teacher and a coach at Northeast. In that time he worked with two state champions, Tim Harden and Antwoine Steele. Harden went on to win a silver medal in the 1996 Olympic games.

Currently Middleton teaches and coaches at Notre Dame de Sion, a private girls' school in south Kansas City. Although the small facility has no track on campus, the enthusiasm and dedication of the athletes has boosted the young program to success at the district and state level. The cross-country team in particular has attended the last five Missouri state competitions. Appropriately enough, the school colors of Sion are purple and white.
