




Communities

For the year 2003-2004, Northeast High School is entering into a new educational reform initiative. In conjunction with the institute for Research and Reform in Education (I.R.R.E.), four small learning communities (SLC) have been formed from student interest-surveys. The SLC's are Business & Finance, Engineering & Technology, Health & Wellness, and Life & Language. Within the community, students receive instruction in core courses as well as theme electives.

Each of the four SLC's has a coordinator, vice-principal, counselor, core teachers, and elective teachers. This division promises to create a better student/teacher relationship. Research from I.R.R.E. indicates an improvement in academic performance results. Therefore, students will be better prepared for the future.








The Health and Wellness Small Learning Community

Graduation May 29, 2003



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
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


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Our Four Years Here Were...

In cosidering the 4x4 scheduling, one distinct advantage appears: Students are able to focus on four classes/areas of study instead of eight. Therefore studnets should be better able to master content and apply skills learned in their four courses. 4x4 scheduling is also easier for counselors because we have four classes to balance, not eight. However, since only four classes are offered at any one time, there is one clear disadvantage for students- fewer opportunities to earn "make-up" credit for failed courses.

4x4

For the year 2003-2004, the seniors as well as the juniors, sophmores, and freshman are embracing a new program to improve academic progress. We have a new partner IRRE (Institute for Research and Reform in Education) and IRRE plan's to team with the schools and district to improve teaching and learning. IRRE has standards for students, which they are expected to achieve and to be involved in high stakes testing tied to those standards. This program has focused on the needs of students struggling with literacy and math. IRRE works with each school and the district to learn more on where they are before joining with them to expand instructional improvement. IRRE works with schools on three complementary approaches to improving instruction:

1. 4x4 scheduling is used to give students more time in language arts and math with lower student/adult ratios for as much of that time as possible. 4x4 scheduling is discussed in each class section by the counselors.

2. Working with all staff to increase the difficulty of what they teach and to engage all students to learn.

3. Identify and supporting visible instructional leaders to sustain and focus on teaching and learning.




The Rifle Team
