Southeast, our last game, enabled the Pirates to tie for second place in the league. 32-14 was the score. Fessler completed ten passes which boosted our score considerably.

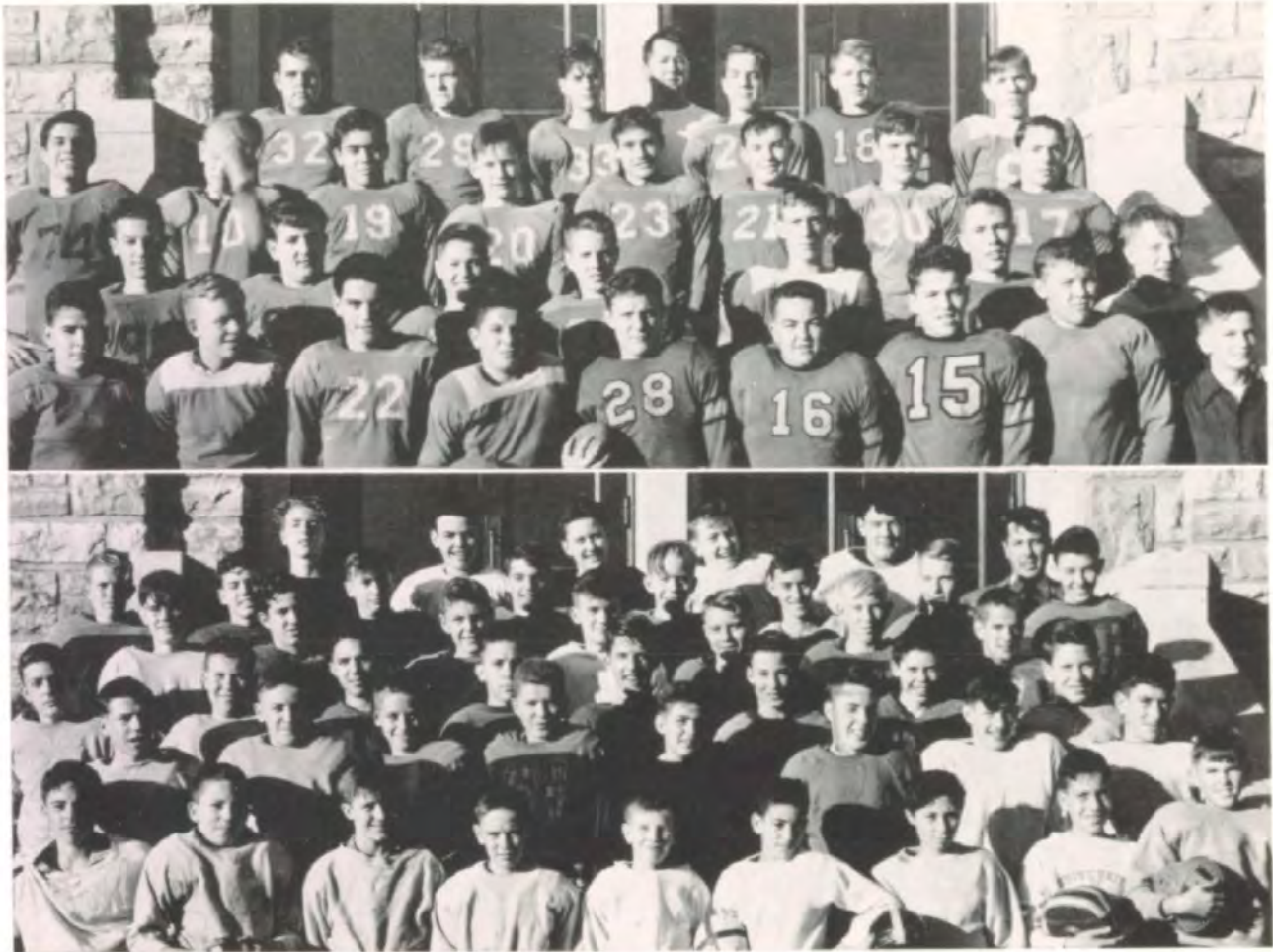

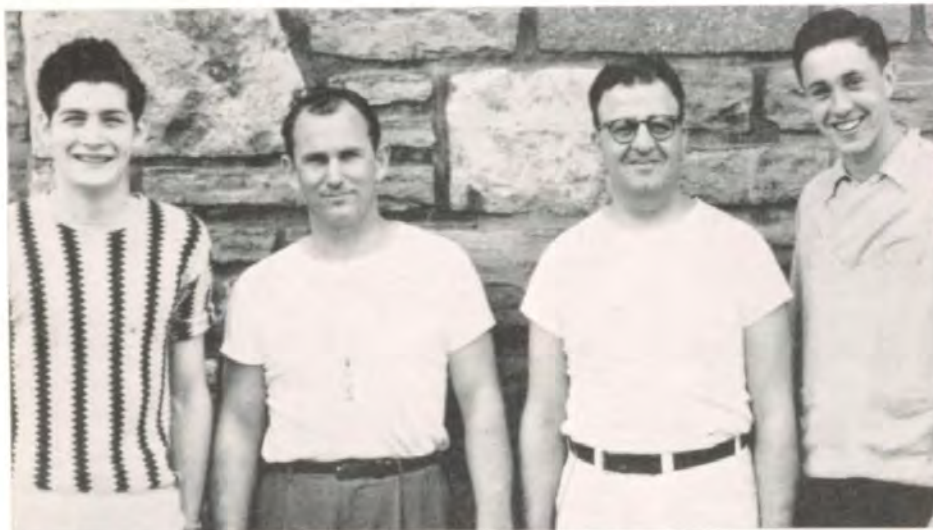
In the last league game with Northeast Paseo was victorious, 38-27. In this game Fessler made his seasonal total 100 points, which was the highest for the season in the league.

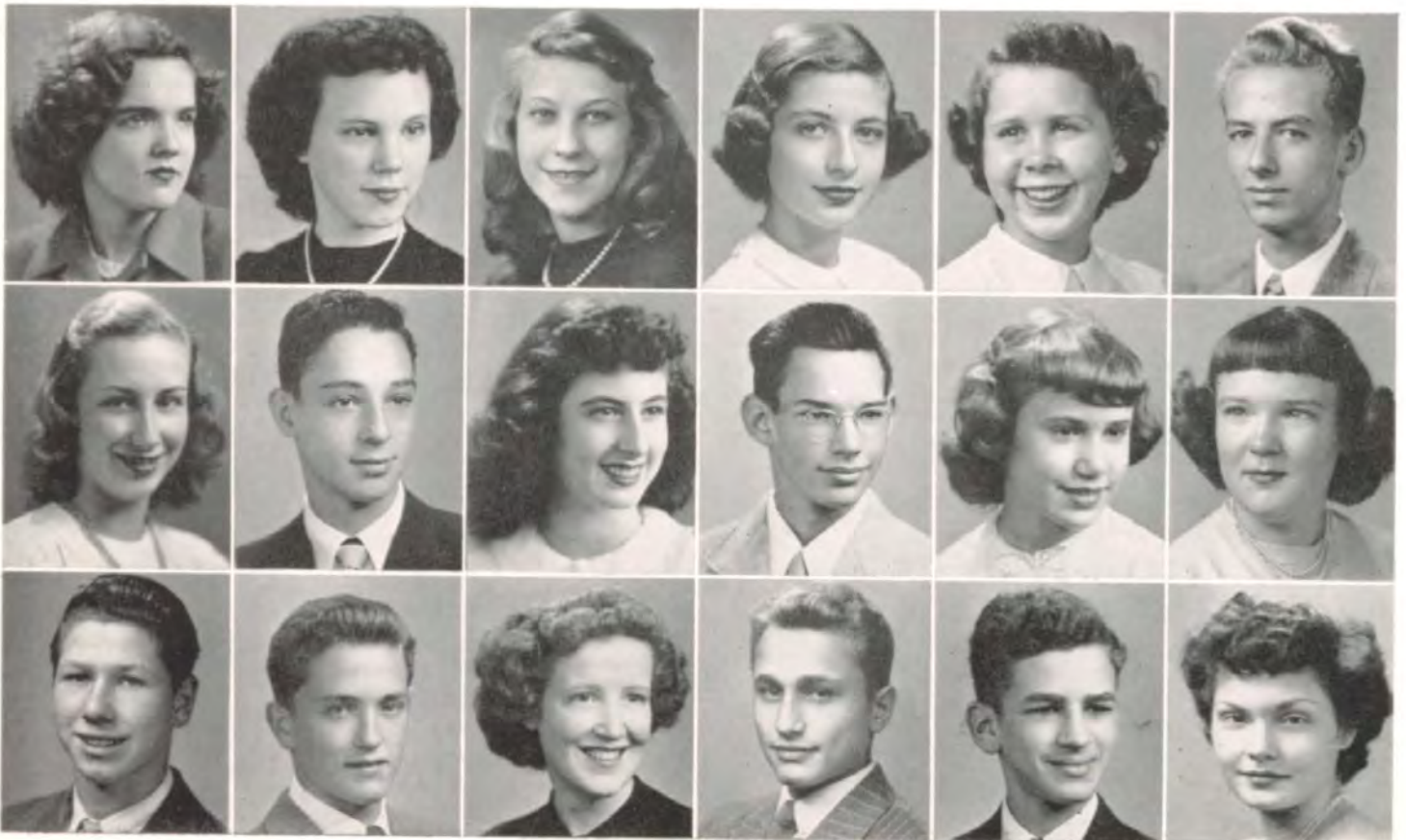

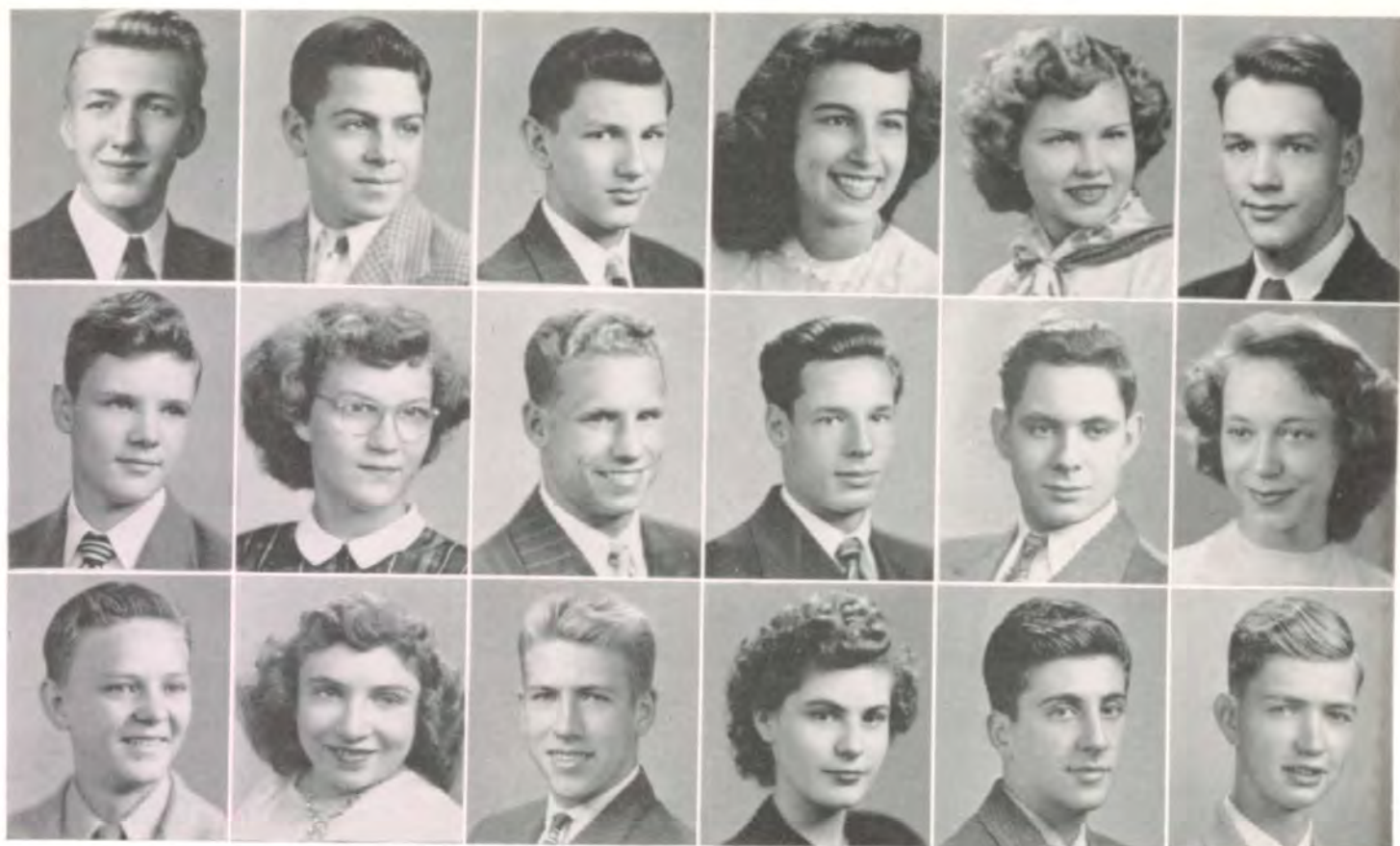

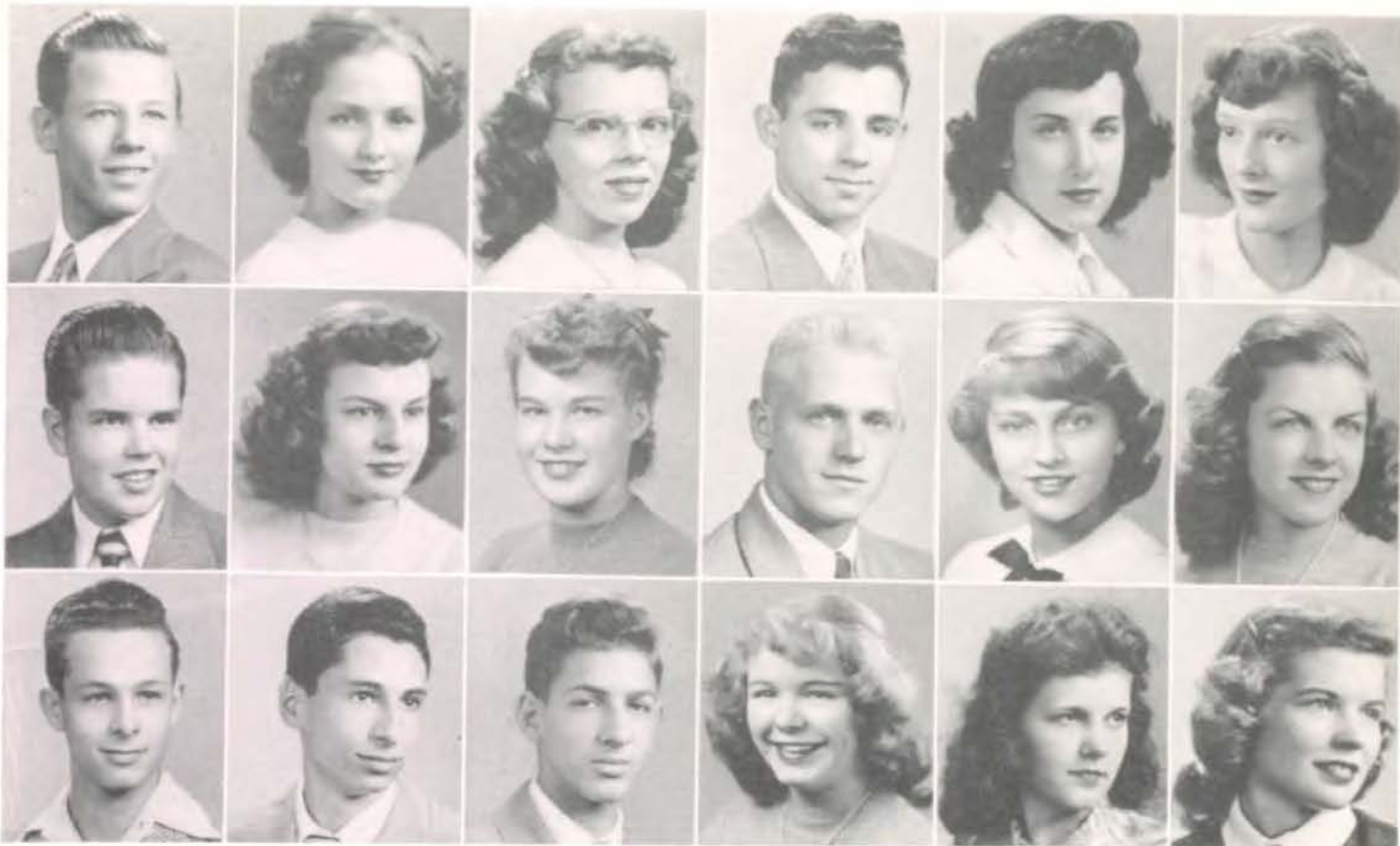
TED MATHEWS—To become an engineer or study medicine is this proud senior's ambition. Ted was a member of Engineers. He hopes to attend K.U.

JACK MINDELL—Eating and loafing are Jack's ideas of a good time. His ambition is to become a business executive. We will be seeing him at J.C.

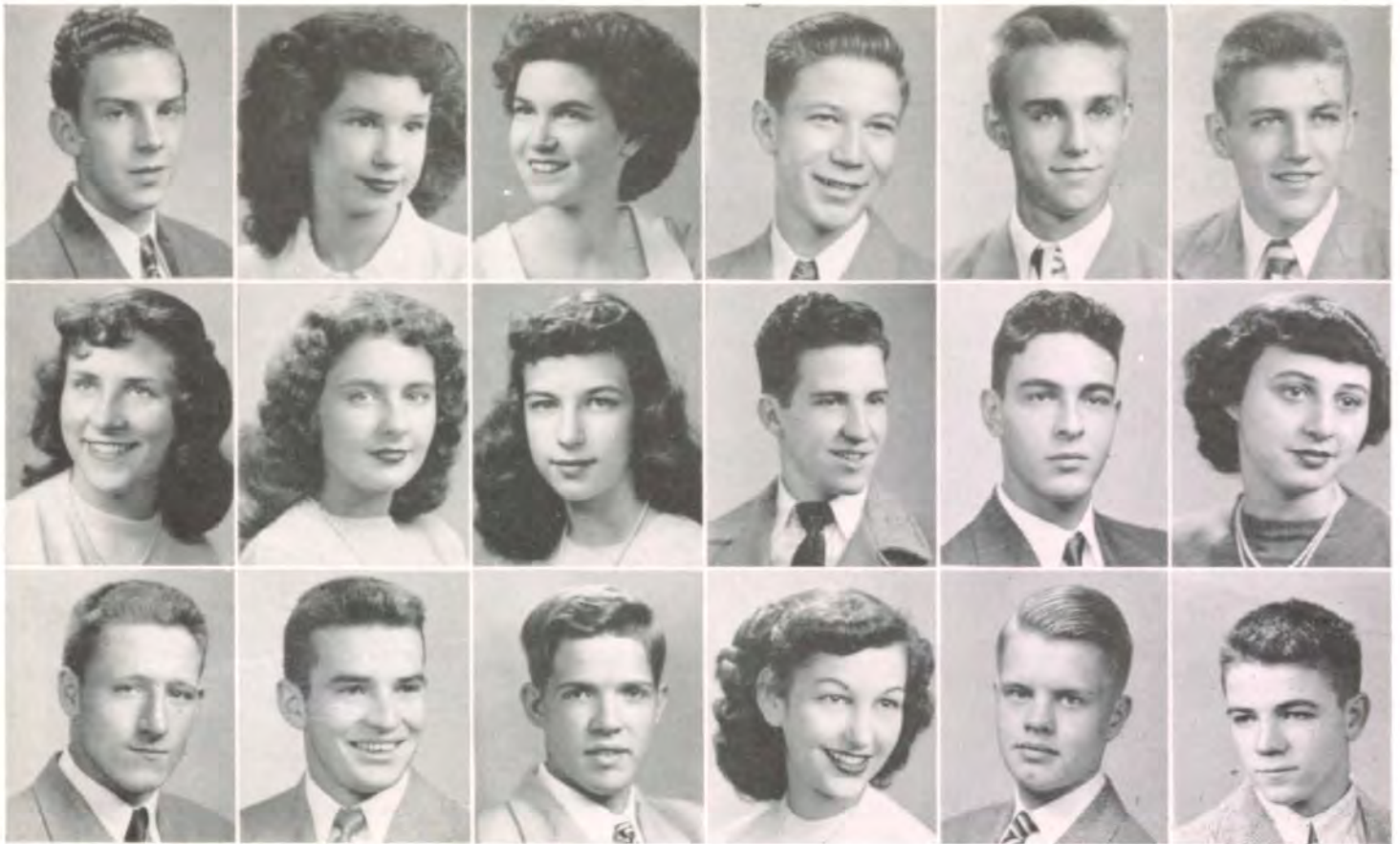
JERRY MOKOFSKY—Toting scenery was the job of this senior, for he was a noble member of the Stage Crew. J.C. will be his next stop.
