Coach Dwight started out the season with a green crew. There were three returning lettermen from last year, Bill Reeder, Charles Gentry, and Larry Ricks. The rest of the team was composed mostly of inexperienced players, and Coach Dwight spent the early parts of the season whipping them into shape. Hampered greatly by injuries, Paseo won only two games this season, but this did not dampen the spirit of the loyal Paseo rooters.

Paseo was overcome in their first game of the season with Rockhurst 26 to 0. The teams were fairly even on the ground, but the Hawks displayed a terrific passing attack which baffled the Buc crew. In this game our center John Metheny was sent from the game with an injured foot and was out most of the season. Crouthers played a good game for the Pirates.

In their first league game, Paseo was defeated 26 to 6 by Southwest. The Paseo backfield was rushed throughout the game by the big Southwest line. This greatly hampered the Pirates passing attack. Fumbles proved costly to the Bucs throughout the game. The Paseo touchdown was scored by Reeder after a 52 yd. drive. Merrell and Reeder were the spearheads of the scoring drive.

Paseo upset favored Southeast in their next encounter, 15 to 13. Southeast's touchdowns were both scored by Corky Taylor on long runs early in the game. Paseo's first touchdown was the result of a blocked punt. Reeder blocked the punt and Blowers fell on the ball. Two points were added when Bloch, punting for the Knights, stepped out of the end zone giving Paseo a safety. Paseo's other touchdown was the result of a 68 yd. drive in 8 plays. Crouthers carried the brunt of the attack for the Bucs and Reeder played a fine game.

Paseo defeated Manual in their third league game 20 to 0. Crouthers led the Pirates, doing most of the carrying with assistance from Reeder. The first two touchdowns were both scored by Crouthers. The third score was put over by Bill Hopkins. In this game Paseo suffered the loss of its captain, Bill Reeder, who was injured in the early part of the game, and was out for the rest of the season.

In the next game East was victorious for the first time as they defeated the Pirates by the narrow margin of 14 to 13. Both of the Bears' touchdowns were made by Jimmy Jacks and Russ Barnes scored both extra points. Calkins Van Deursen scored the first touchdown on a pass from Don Henzlik, and Max Gordon scored the other on an 85 yd. run after recovering a fumble in mid air. This was a tough one for the Bucs to lose.

In the Westport game, the Pirates received their worst defeat of the season. They were downed 42 to 0. The first half it was all Westport, but in the third quarter Hogleund, second team quarterback, came into the game and put some life into the Buc crew, sparking a drive that almost resulted in a touchdown. The game ended with Paseo unable to push across a score.

In the next to last game of the season, Paseo faced the Central Eagles. The speedy Eagle backfield ran circles around the Pirates as they won 21 to 0. Through the early part of the game, Paseo was kept out of trouble by the fine punting of Fred Merrell. Paseo scored once on a long pass from Chuck Gentry to Calkins Van Deursen but the play was nullified because the ball was ruled dead before the pass was thrown.

In the last game of the season, Paseo was downed 28 to 0. The Vikes satisfied any doubts as to the outcome by marching 72 yds. to score in the first 7 minutes of the game. Paseo only threatened once. A pass from Hogleund to Van Deursen put the ball on the Northeast 4 yd. line, 1st and ten, but they netted —5 yds. in four tries and Northeast took over. The only consolation was that The Star said Paseo would be handed the season's worst defeat, which would have had to be more than 60 to 6; the score by which Westport defeated Manual.

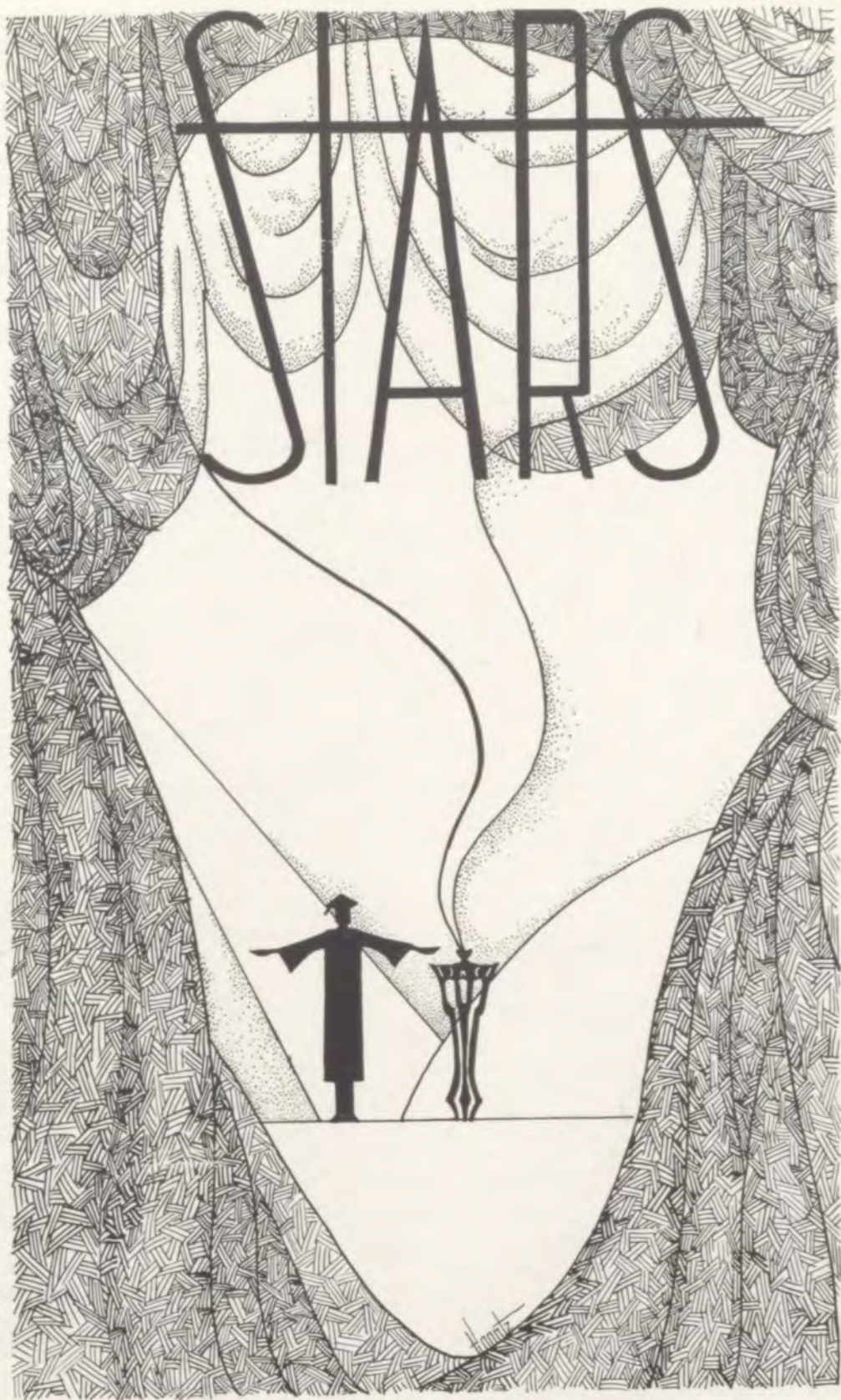

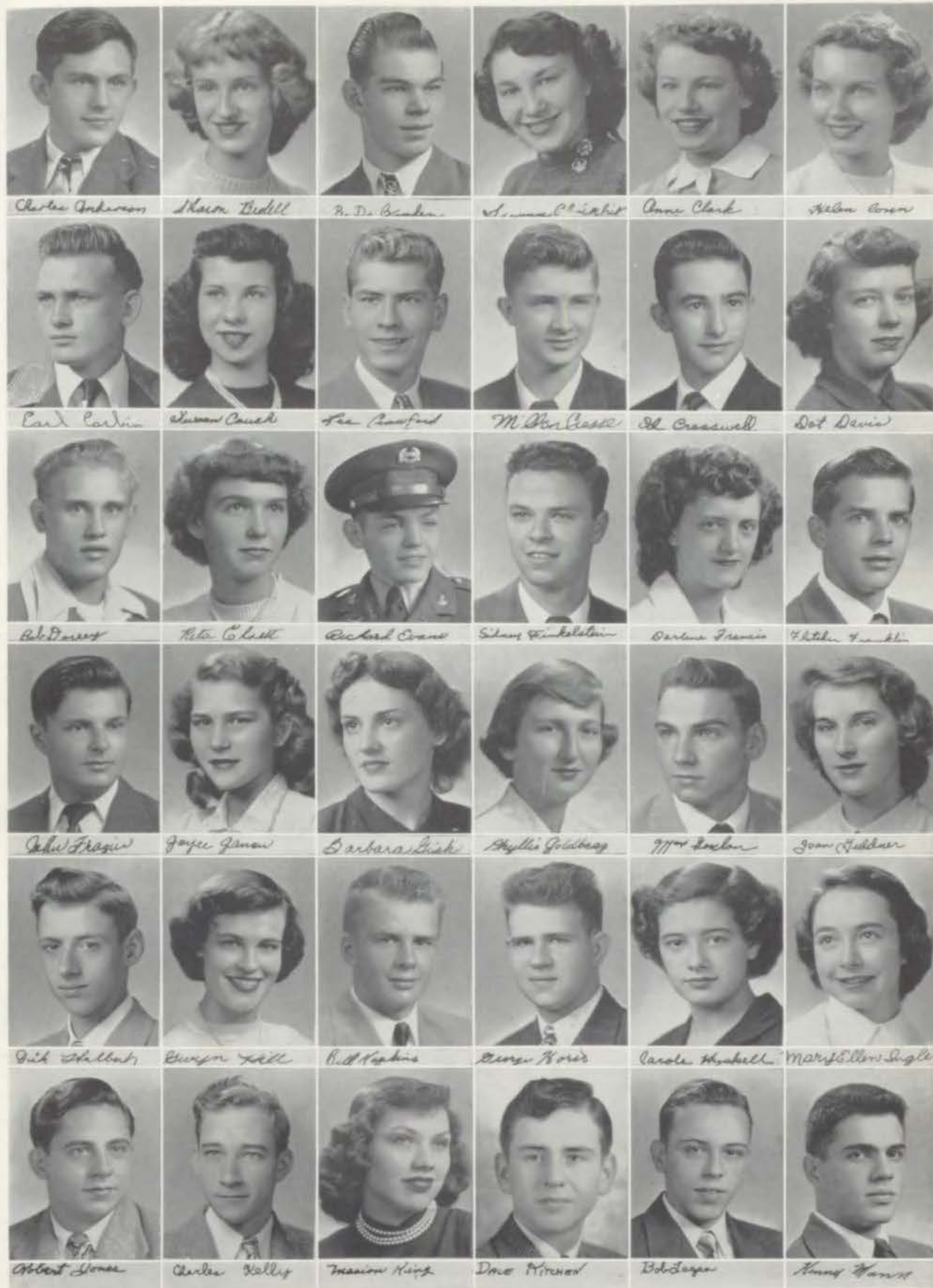

Through the years, several of the original members of the class have left Paseo's halls, but still others have come to take their place. Now, only 21 of the original eighth grade class of 56 members are still attending Paseo.

Small but mighty, the entire senior class has only 75 members. These seniors will go their ways after graduation with an extra year of schooling behind them. A year older and a year wiser, they will be better prepared to assume the responsibilities of later life.

Upholding the honorable tradition of Paseo, the 1950 seniors now step into the background. Countless classes yet to come will follow this class of classes which made history as the "pioneer of the eighth grade."
