FIRST TEAM FOOTBALL

With eighteen returning lettermen, Coach Dwight had the nucleus of a fine team. The Pirates finished the season by winning five games and losing four to take fourth place in league standings. Joe Crouthers and Arthur Meltzer were selected as first team All-Stars, while Charles Gentry, Bud McLeroy, and Fred Merrell rated Honorable Mention.

Although outrun and outpassed by an elusive band of Rockhurst Hawlets in the opening non-league encounter, Paseo played heads-up ball to emerge victorious, 22-6. The Pirates forged into the lead, which they never relinquished, on the opening kick off, when Joe Crouthers, taking a handoff from Punkie Hoglund, whirled 70 yards to score. Fred Merrell introduced an almost forgotten feature when he drop-kicked two conversions.

The William Chrisman Bears reared on hind legs and cuffed the Bucs with an aerial paw into a 20-12 defeat in the last pre-league game. League play was the workhorse this time, plunging one touchdown and setting up the other. The Pirates seemed dazed by the lights of Ott Field, and Chrisman pushed them up and down the field. A fumble on the Buccaneer 30-yard line set up the clinching Bear touchdown.

Paseo capitalized on Red Bird fumbles to win their first league victory, 44-8. Manual's only touchdown came when Schooley took Gentry's kick-off and raced 96 yards to score. This was one of the longest touchdown runs of the season. The Bucs' passing attack counted for 13 points and gained valuable yardage in mid-field. Doug Allen, Merrell, and Crouthers were outstanding for Paseo.

In their third league battle, Paseo was defeated by the Southeast Knights, 27-20. The Knights were favored by two touchdowns but had to come from behind to win. Cecile "Lightning Legs" Taylor scored all of Southeast's points, one of his touchdown jaunts being a 90-yard return of a kickoff. Merrell and Crouthers again played bang-up ball for Paseo.

Failing to take advantage of numerous breaks, Paseo lost its next game to Westport, 19-2. Doyce Gentry scored the only points for Paseo when he broke through the line and caught the Westport ball carrier behind his goal line. Three times the Pirates were within 10 yards of a touchdown and once down to the 4-yard line. But the Bucs just couldn't push the ball over the double stripe.

An inspired Paseo squad defeated Northeast for the first time in twelve years, 12-7. This was truly the upset of the year as the Vikings were favored to win by fourteen points. Crouthers was the whole show for the Bucs, scoring both touchdowns, one on a twisting 80-yard run. In the second half, due to the Pirates' superb line play, Northeast was unable to get the ball over the mid-field stripe.

In the next to last game of the season, assisted by a strong wind, Paseo defeated Central, 33-0. Poor punting by Central gave the Bucs the ball on the 28-yard line. Five plays later, Crouthers plunged for the tally. Later, Stan Shane pursued an Eagle fumble 25 yards into the end zone where he fell on it for the score.

In the final game of the season, Paseo downed East, 14-7. It was more one sided than the score shows, but five Buc fumbles, all recovered by the Bears, helped to keep Paseo's score down. Hoglund and Cohen scored the Pirates' counters on runs of 2 and 10 yards, respectively. East scored on a pass play from Pryor to Cross that netted 62 yards.

Coach Dwight and the team deserve a vote of thanks from the student body for a fine season.
