
JOYCE WHITSITT — A popular Junior Joyce was elected secretary of her class. She was also a member of Zetas, Mask and Wig, Girl's



Scholarship, Character, Leadership, and Service are the determining qualities for the selection of members of the National Honor Society. Ten per cent of the Senior class is elected to membership each year.

### Rifle Team


