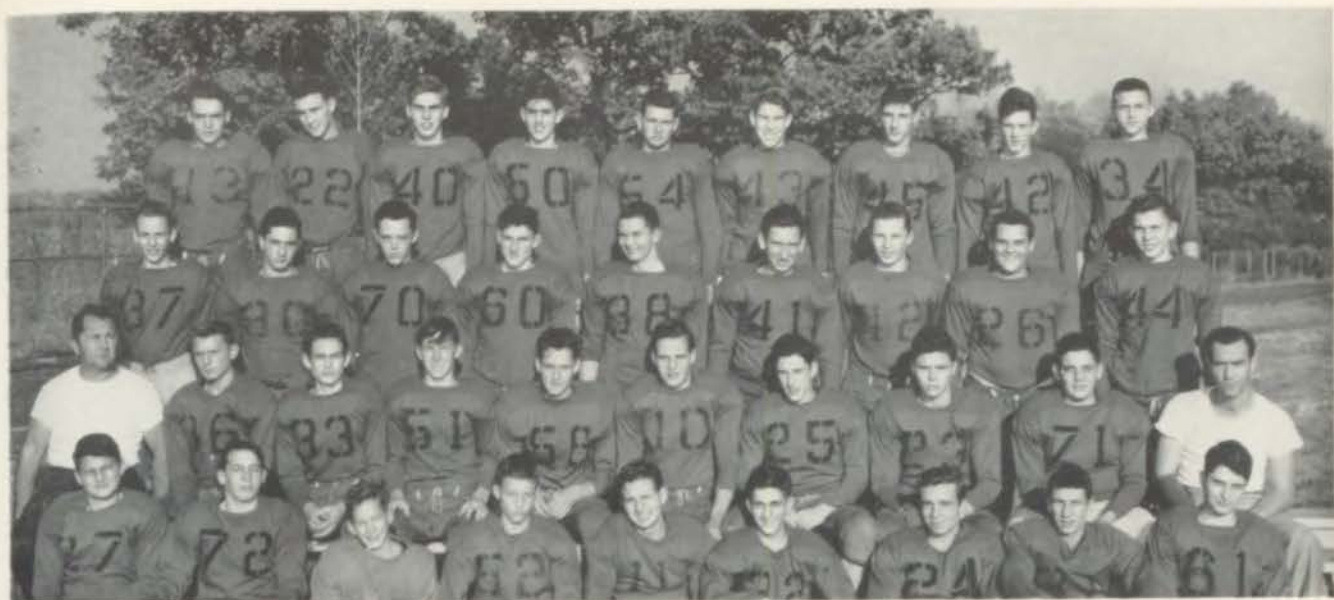
Stinging from last year's trouncing by Paseo, the Westport Tigers dished out a 33-0 verdict over the Pirates

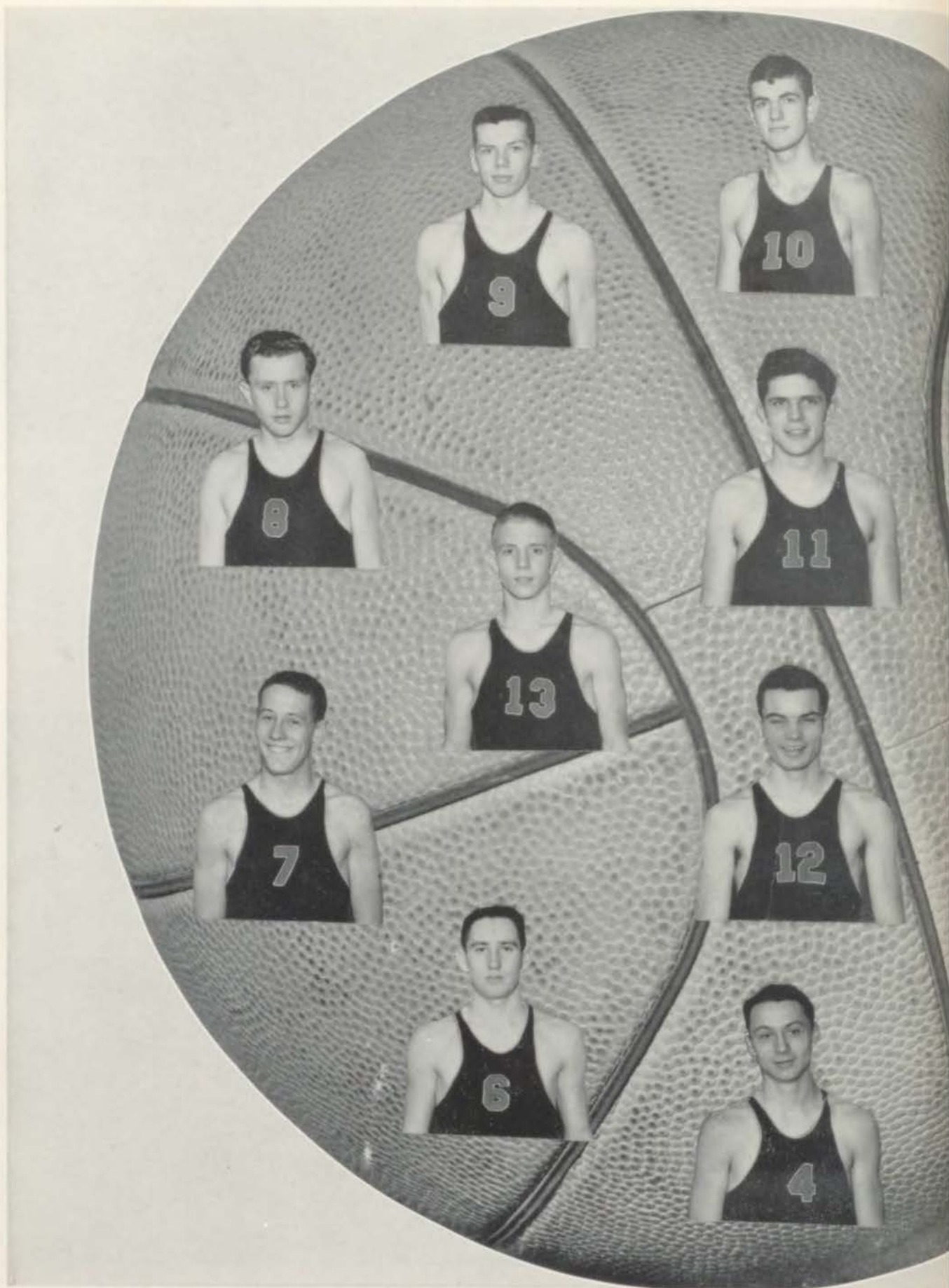

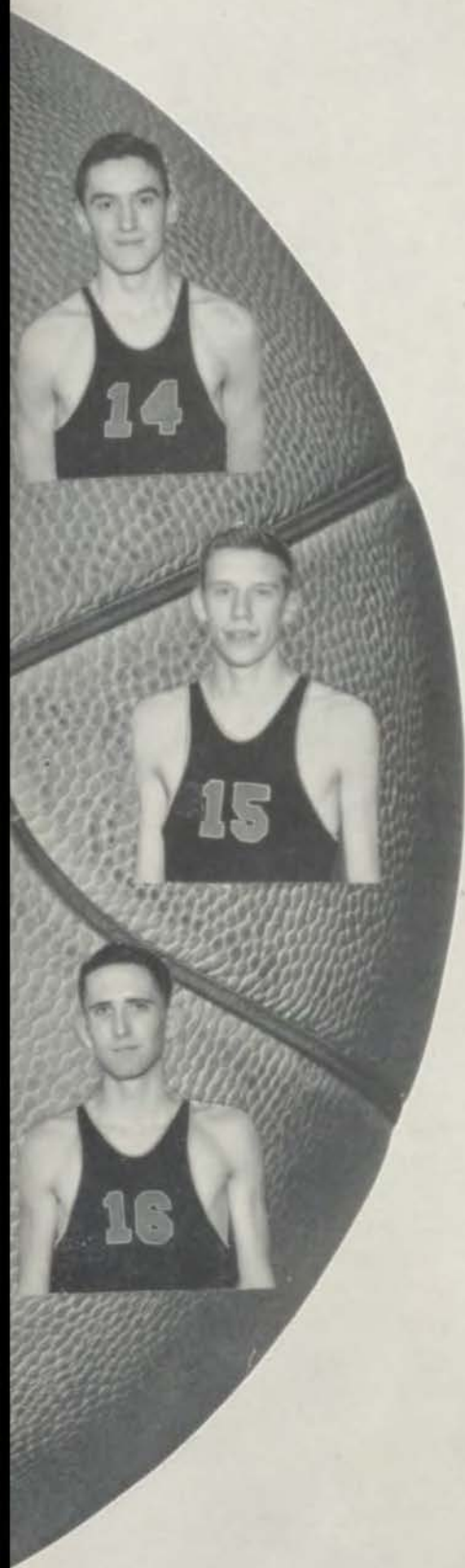

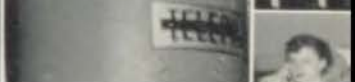
