At the end of the season Paseo's fight and determination were rewarded. Pat O'Connor, who time after time came up with blocked kicks and key tackles to keep the Pirates in the game, received this same honor. Center Gene Fabes, halfback Ralph Kincaid, and quarterback Bob Coulter were likewise awarded for their efforts, being named in the league's honorable mention.

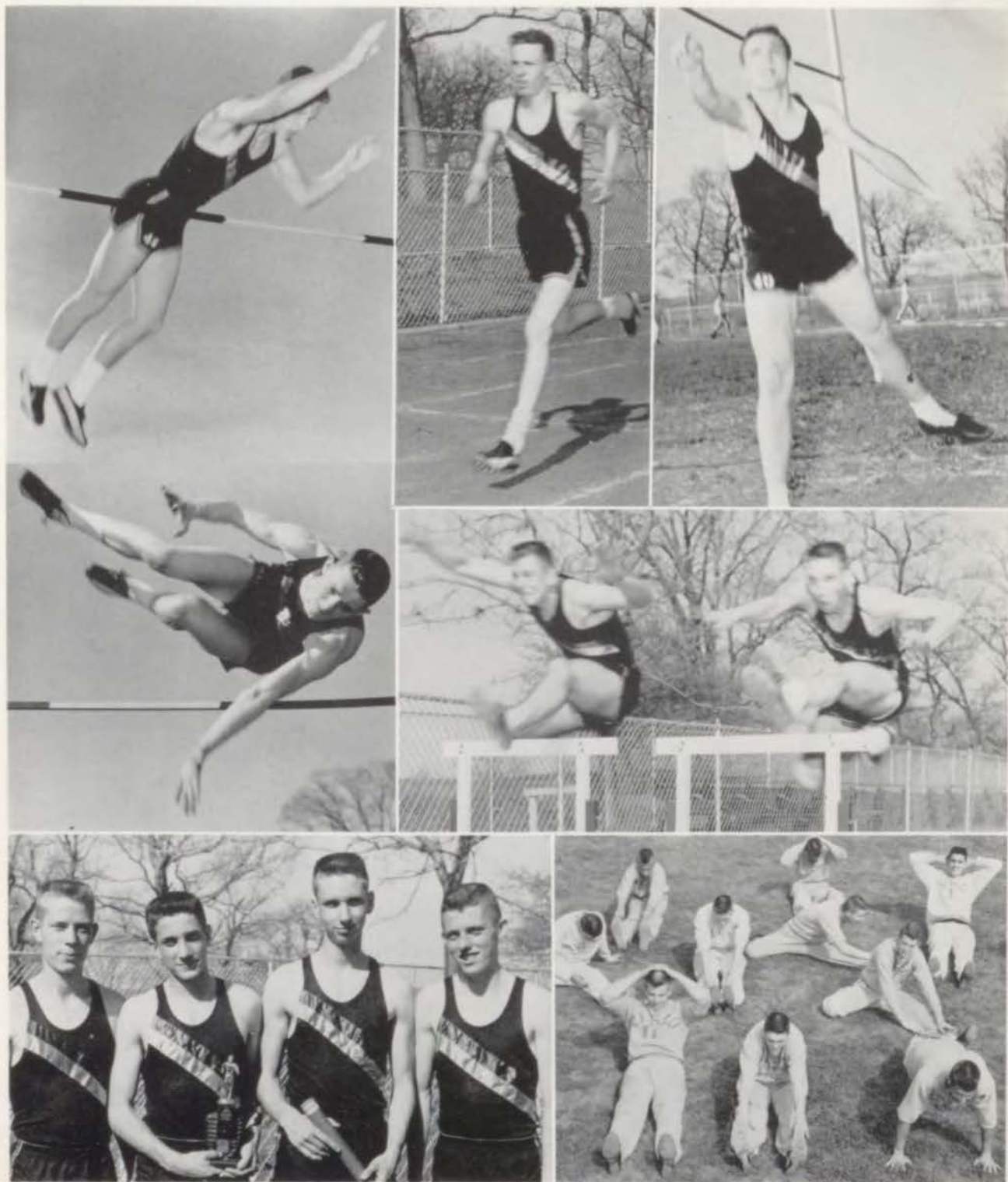

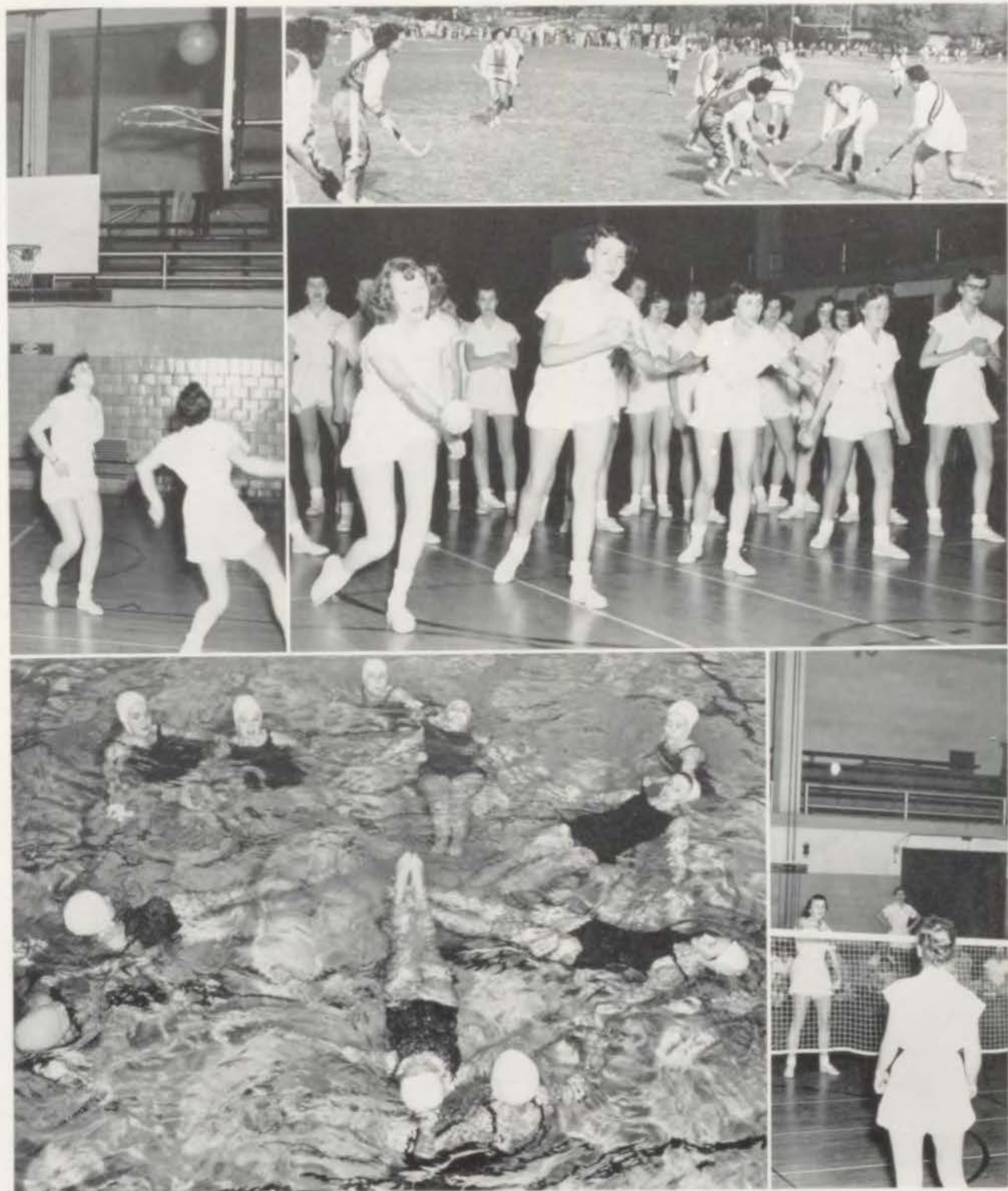
