




Football Zueen Pep Club

Bob was plagued with a broken wrist during most of the season. Outside of this, he was noted for his accurate set shot.



A Letter from the Coaches

Dear Student Body,

Every year the Athletic Department consisting of the coaching staff makes four trophy awards to four members of the athletic teams that more nearly represent the qualifications and standards designated by the awards given. The oldest trophy is the Shivers cup given by Mrs. C. E. Shivers in memory of her son, Bernard, who participated in basketball and later died as a junior on May 14, 1929. This trophy is awarded to the basketball player who stands for the highest in scholarship, citizenship, and sportsmanship.

The Mount Davis trophy is given in memory of Coach Davis, who was a member of the Kansas City school system for 22 years, and who served as varsity football and track coach at Paseo from 1943 until 1948 at the time of his death.

In memory of Jack Davenport, a member of Paseo's football team and the class of 1949, a trophy is given to an outstanding football player each year. Jack, a member of the Marine Corps, died in 1952 in combat during the Korean conflict and was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Mr. Thomas Jay, a sports-minded patron of the Paseo district, presented the school with the Jay Trophy in 1953 to be presented each year to the outstanding athlete.

It is indeed a pleasure for the coaching staff to make their presentations in 1956 to the following four athletes who so well deserve the honor that these names represent.

Pasco's 1956 track team, defending city champions, with eleven returning lettermen; Vernon Jones, Herb Kohn, Ralph Kincaid, Hugh Baysinger, Ronnie Bilyeu, Ken Lambert, Dick Webster, Eddie Miner, Shelton Gallas, and Howard Shoup all worked hard to make this one of the biggest and best years in Pasco's track history.

With the season only about half over this ambitious team had already broken school, city, and state records. The mile relay team of Jones, Baysinger, Kohn, and Gallas winning the State-Indoor Track meet two years in succession this year, set a new state record of 3:38.6. In both the State Indoor and Shawnee Mission Relays, Vernon Jones has tied the school record of 15.0 in the high hurdles. As the season progresses Paseo will undoubtedly see many more records set and bettered as a result of this hard-working team.






