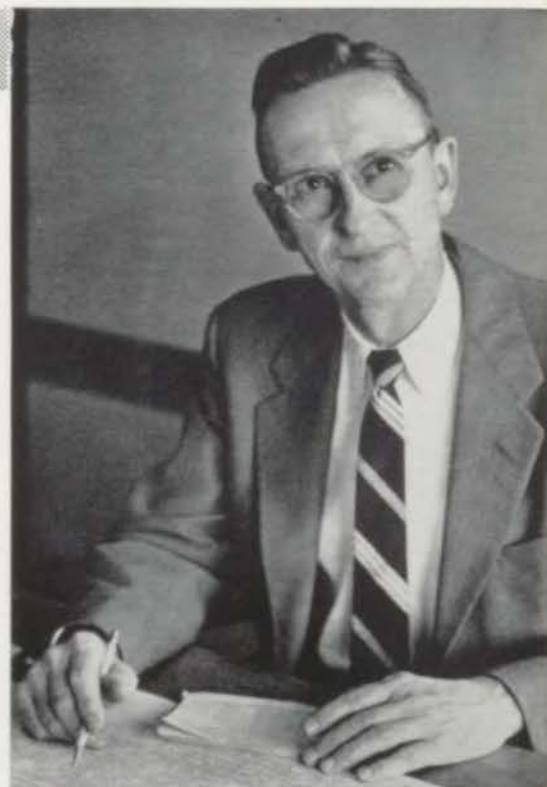
According to Mr. Bond, "The opportunity of working with youth has been a great comfort, for I enjoy seeing the development of young people I've worked with."

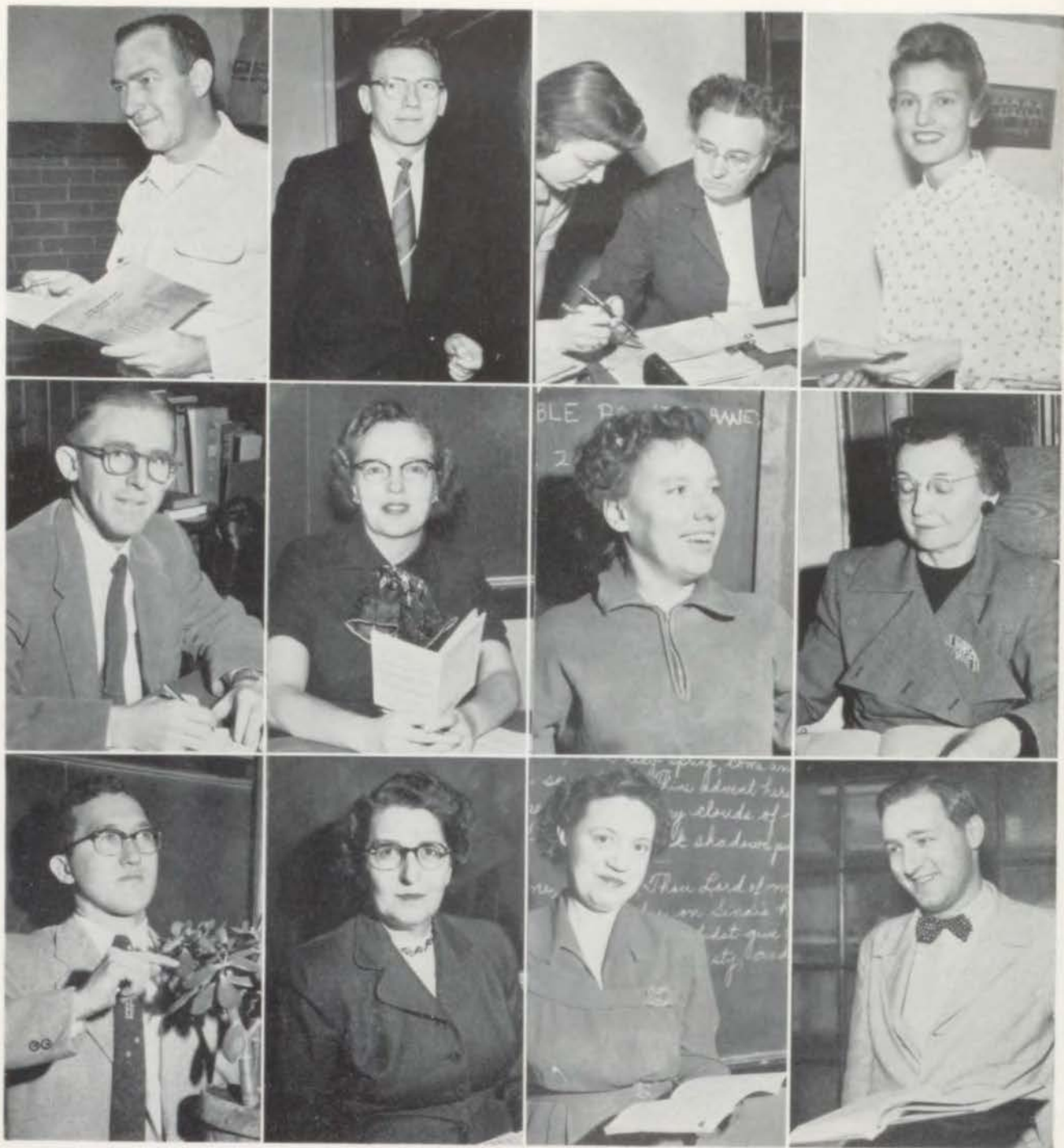

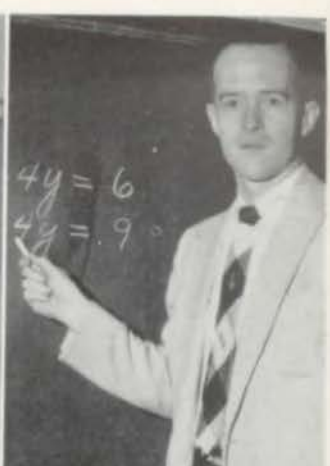

Staff Serves Students, Library Serves Community

Trying to satisfy the wants of 1800 students, the twenty-three women who make up the cafeteria staff are confronted with a difficult job.

During a typical day about three hundred plate lunches are sold, more than two hundred salads, and six hundred pies and cakes are bought, along with some eight hundred purchases of potato chips and candy. Between sixty and a hundred quarts of ice cream a day round out the enormous consumption of students.


The staff uses equipment valued at \$50,000 in preparing fresh food daily.

Handling the second largest circulation in Kansas City, the ten women who staff the library find it a very busy place. In addition to the regular staff, the library has to employ five high school students to help handle all the work.

In the year ending July, 1956, the library had a circulation of 218,000.

With 32,316 books, eighty-five different magazine subscriptions, files of pictures, and pamphlets, the library suits the needs of all levels of learning be it elementary or college.

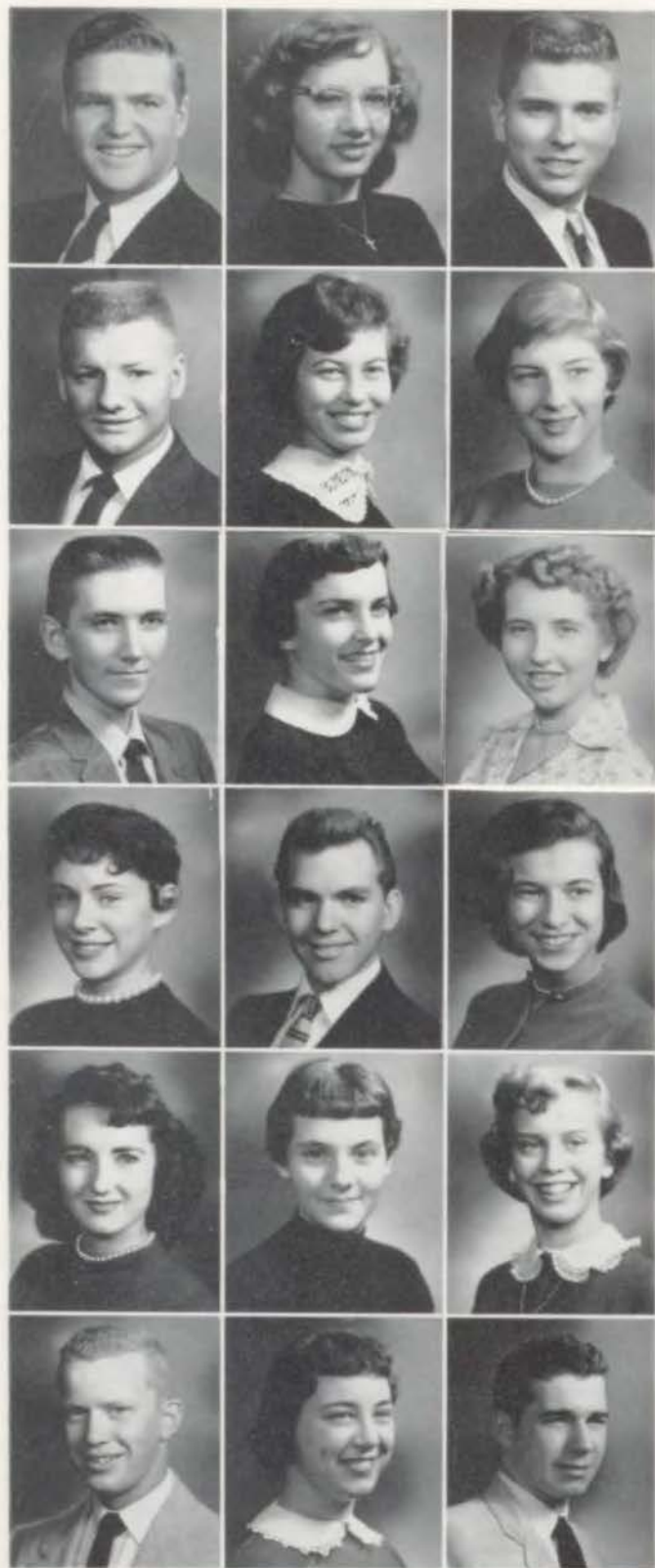

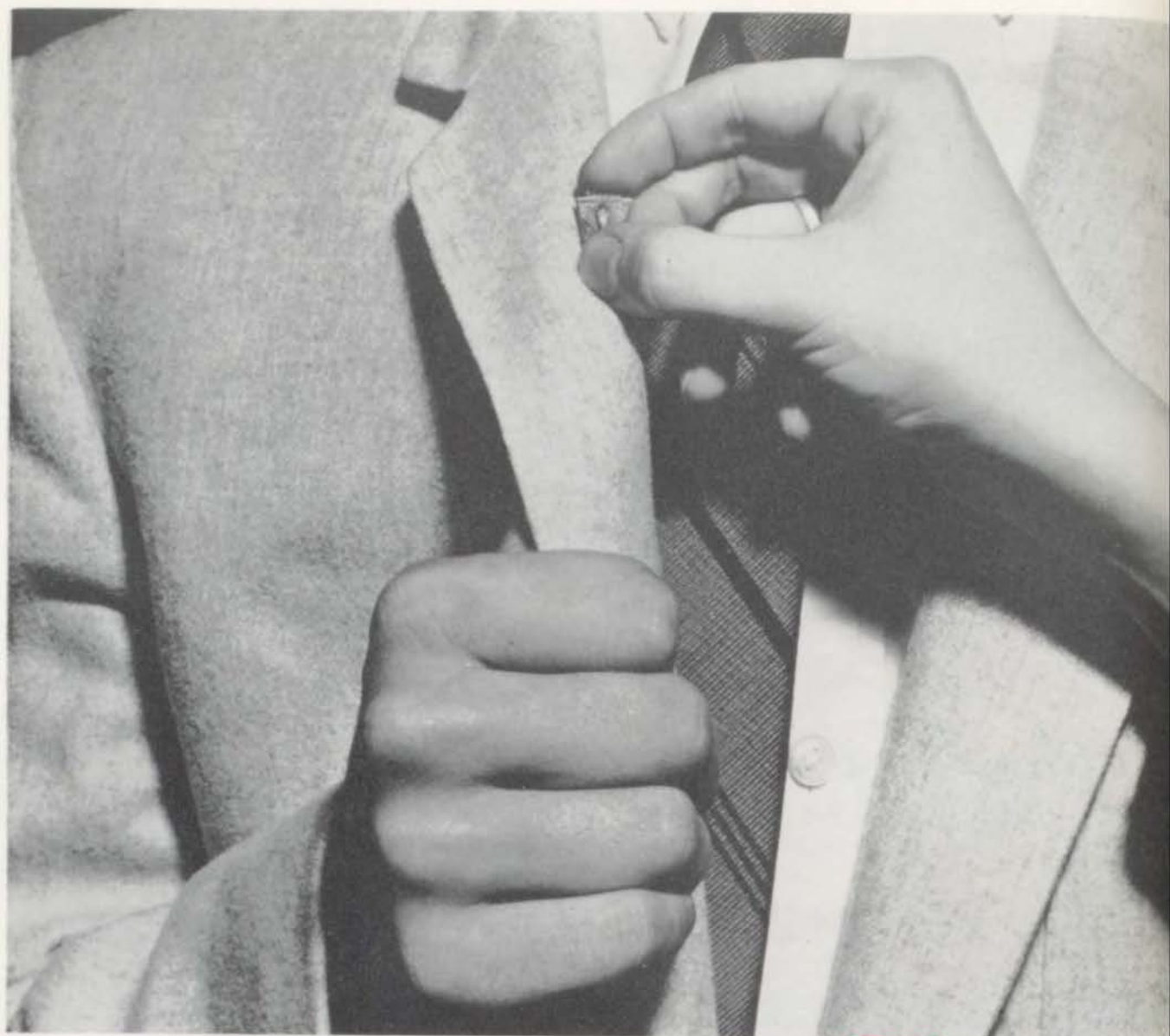

NHS, Quill and Scroll Elect New Members

Paseo's largest and best known honorary organizations are the National Honor Society and the Quill and Scroll. Membership in both groups is based on high standards and is limited to a relatively small number of persons.

Anyone on the Press or PASEON staff is eligible to be selected for Quill and Scroll on the basis of their journalistic achievement. New members received their pins at a banquet on April 30, from Dennis Cowan, the only second-year member in 1957.

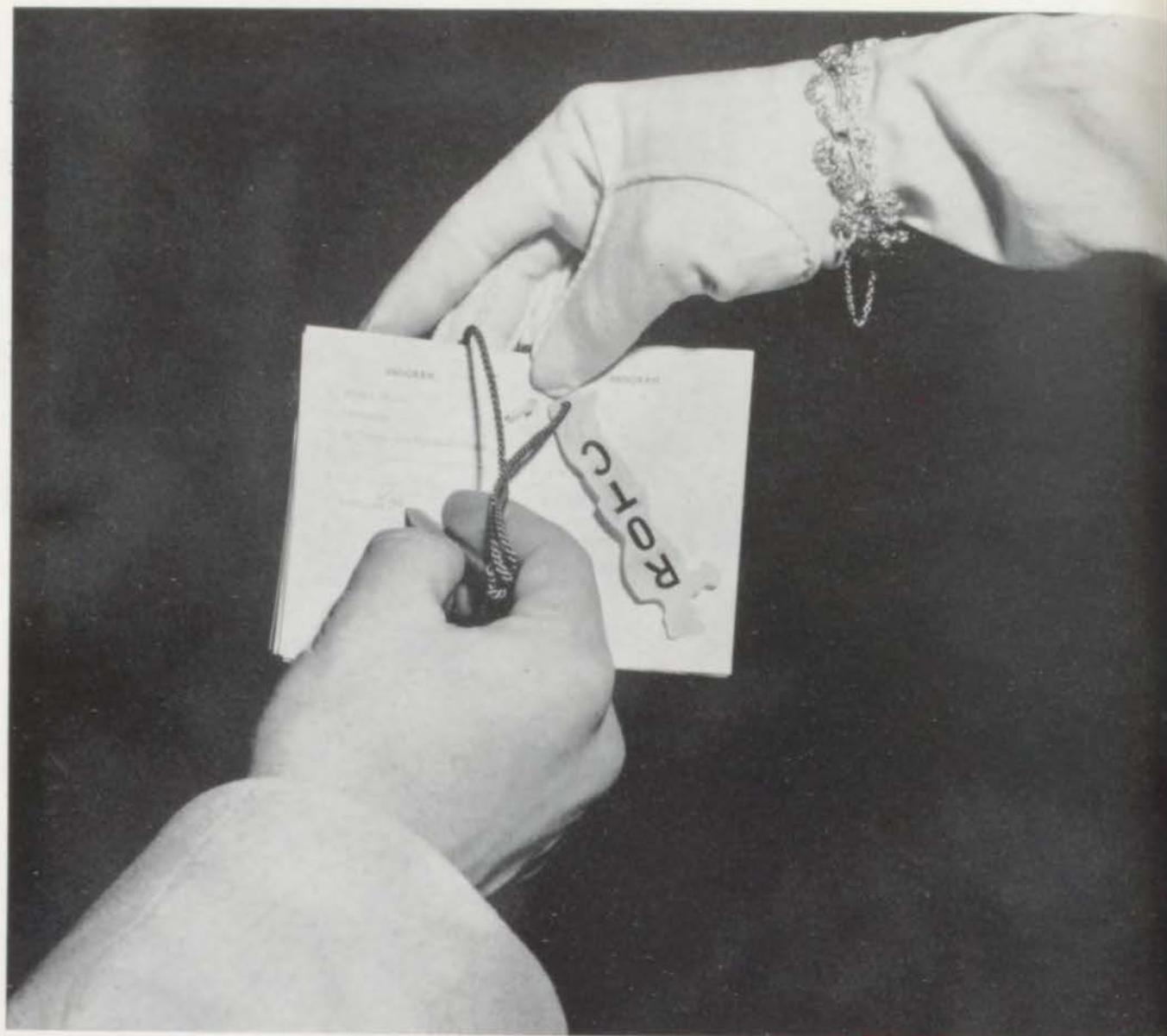

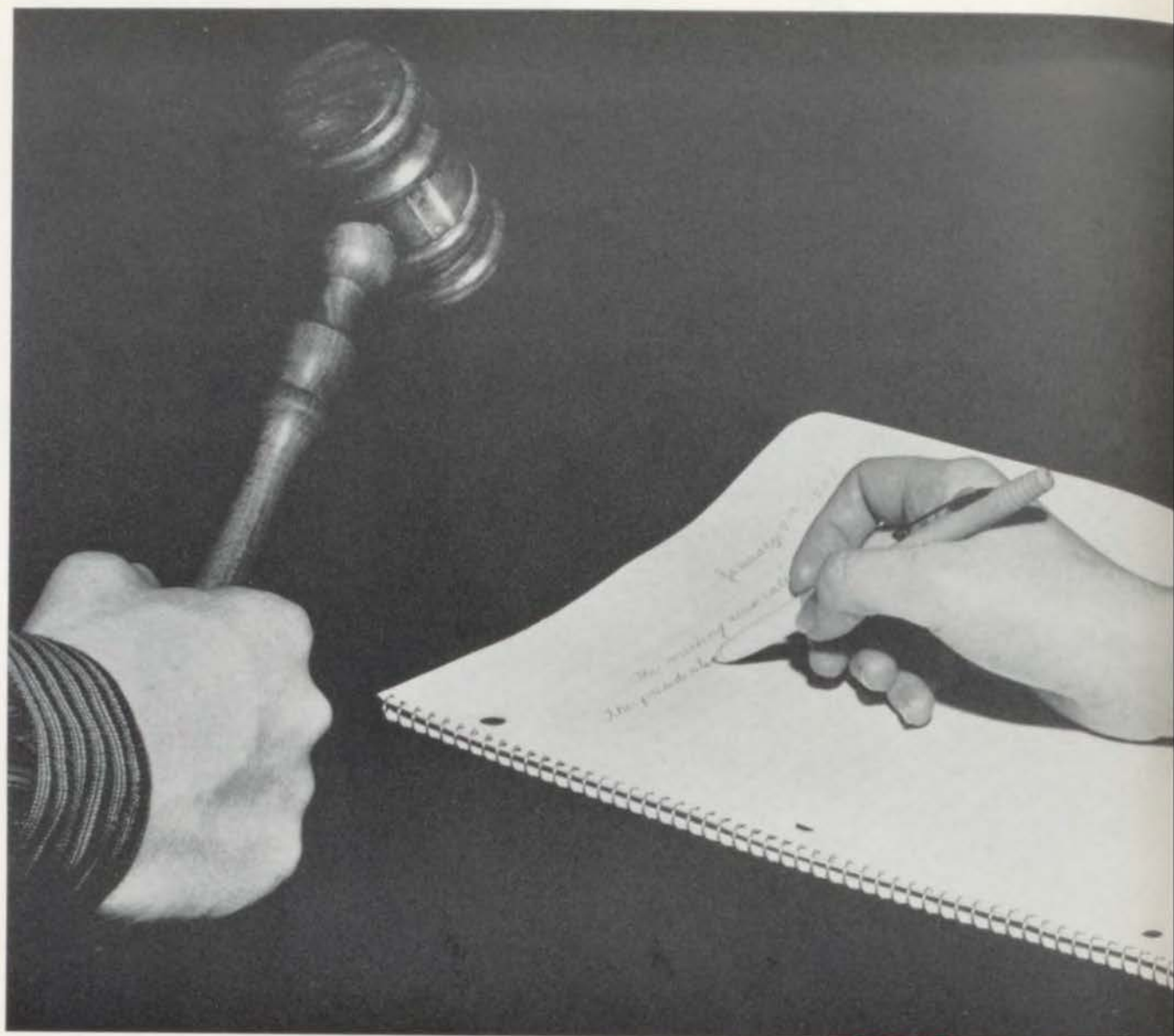

Paseo Sets Records at East, S-M Meets

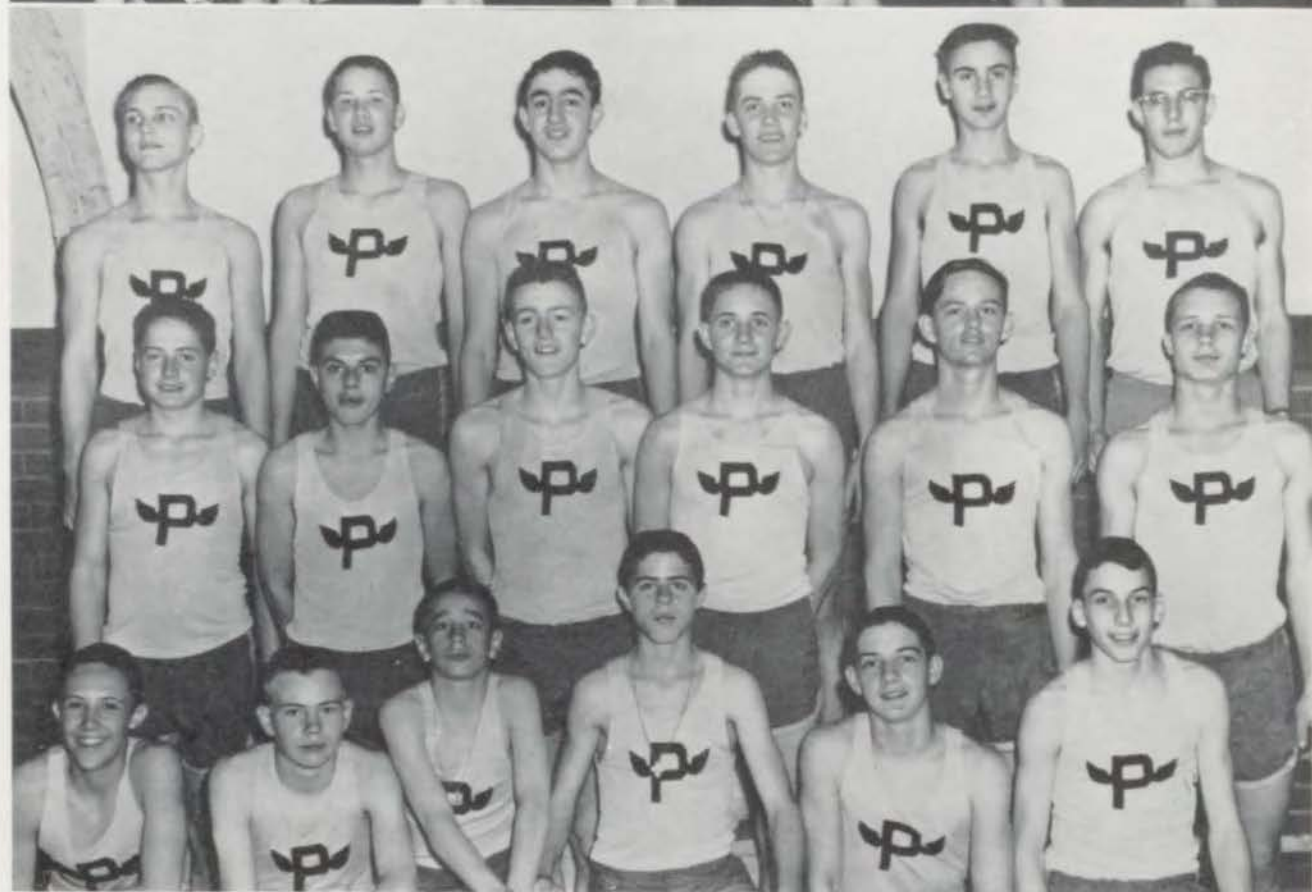

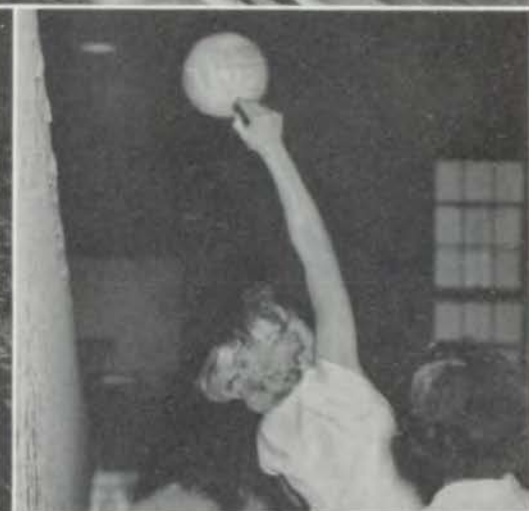

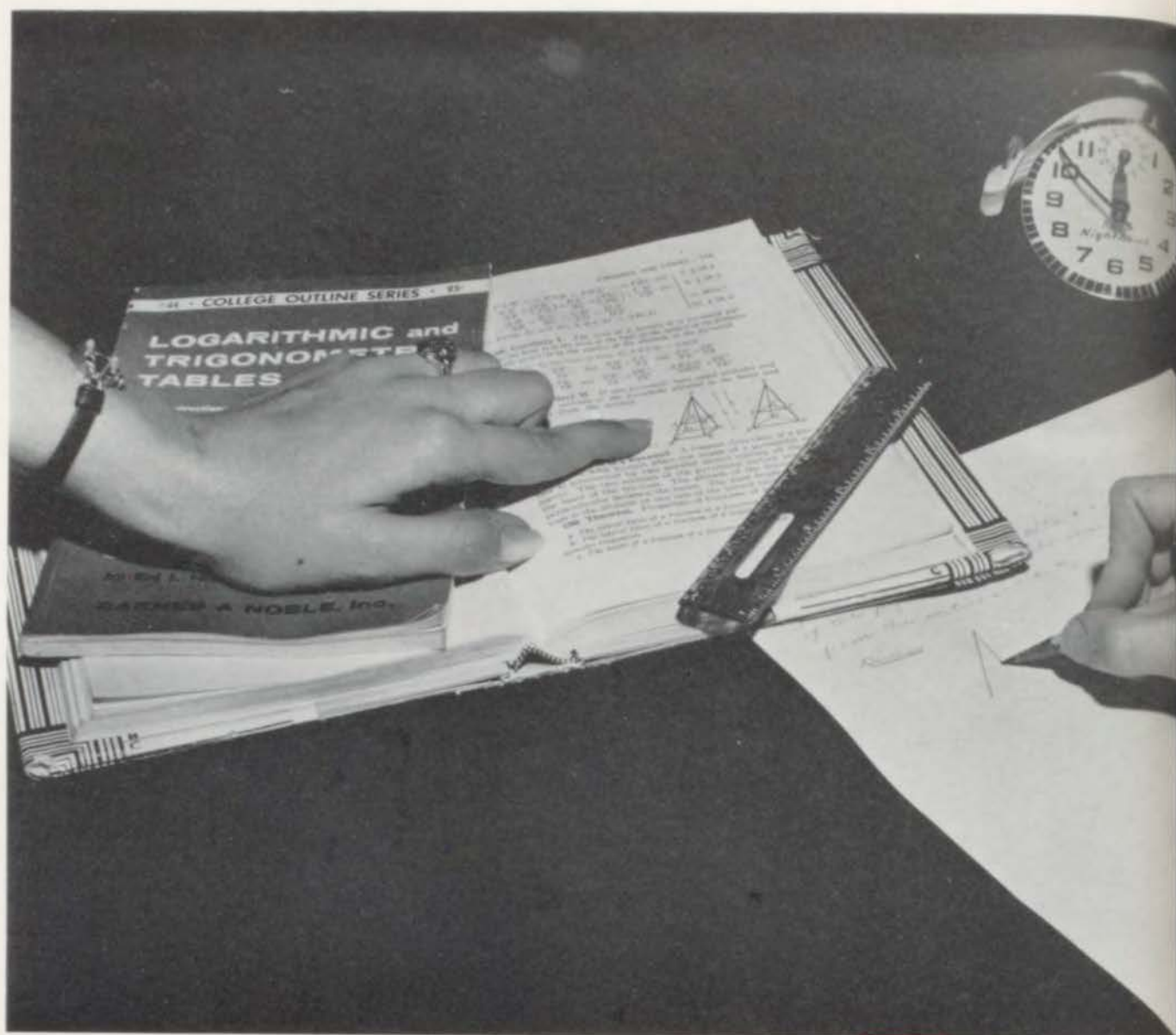
