built on the dead-eye passing of Bob Haubein, the Pirates fell to defeat. The blow came with two minutes left in the closing period, when Dick Kenworthy went back to kick from his 25. The snap sailed over his head, and Kenny Ross nailed him in the end zone for a safety.

Paseo snapped back with a 39-7 victory over Van Horn. It was evident from the opening kick-off, that the Pirates had on their scoring clothes. The Falcons led as long as it took Bob Haubein to escort a kick-off back 86 yards, which was nineteen seconds by the scoreboard clock.

To lead the Pirates to a 13-7 triumph over Northeast, Bob Haubein, in a whirlwind opening, decided that it was the night for running — and as soon as he got the ball, he did just that. The Vikings' straight, single-winged offense seemed to give the Pirates some trouble, but when the pressure was on, Paseo showed that it had all the stuff it needed.

In the most one-sided game in Interscholastic League history, Paseo routed Manual, 78-0, breaking two scoring records on the way. Dick Kenworthy scored seven touchdowns to set new loop Individual mark.

The Pirates and the Knights virtually cancelled each other out of the Interscholastic League championship picture with a 0-0 deadlock. Outside of the 10-yard lines, the Southeast squad was able to maneuver its offensive in somewhat victorious form, but beyond the 10 the Pirates' defense took over. Lloyd Williams, a rugged tackle, and Dick Hensley, linebacker, were top defenders.

Paseo dampened Easts' Homecoming with a victory of 21-7. The Pirates rode the single wing 63 yards on nine plays to score in the first four minutes of play. Marvin Lambert's defensive work was outstanding. In one stretch, he recorded four unassisted tackles in five plays. Bill Koste, Tom Lappin, and John Robertson also sparked.

Shaking off the crisp night air, Paseo pushed forward in an all-around team effort to triumph over Lincoln, and wind up the season with a 25-7 victory over the Tigers. Bob Haubein filled the air with passes as he connected on eight of 22, including 2 second-half scoring heaves to Dick Kenworthy.

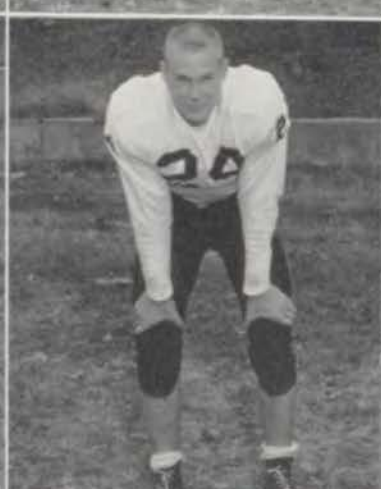
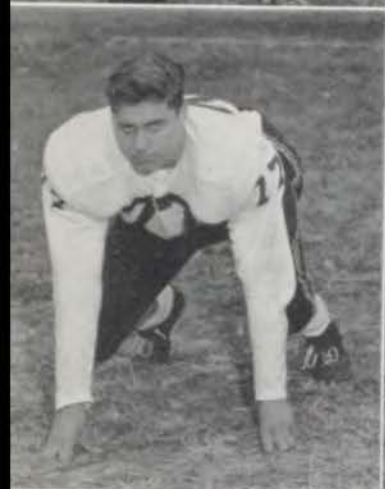
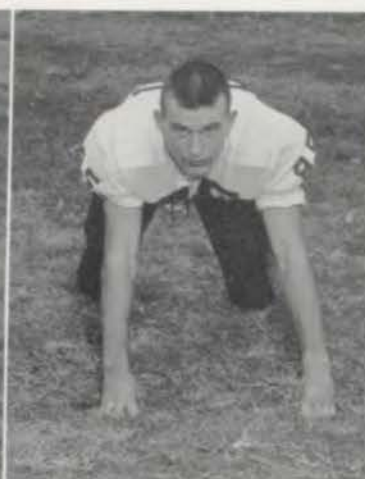
