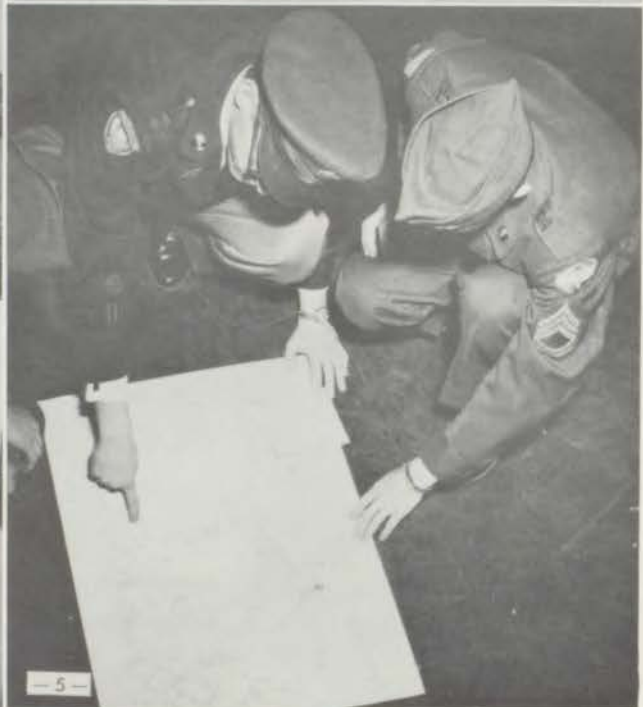


### ROTC BALL, HIGHLIGHT OF CADET YEAR

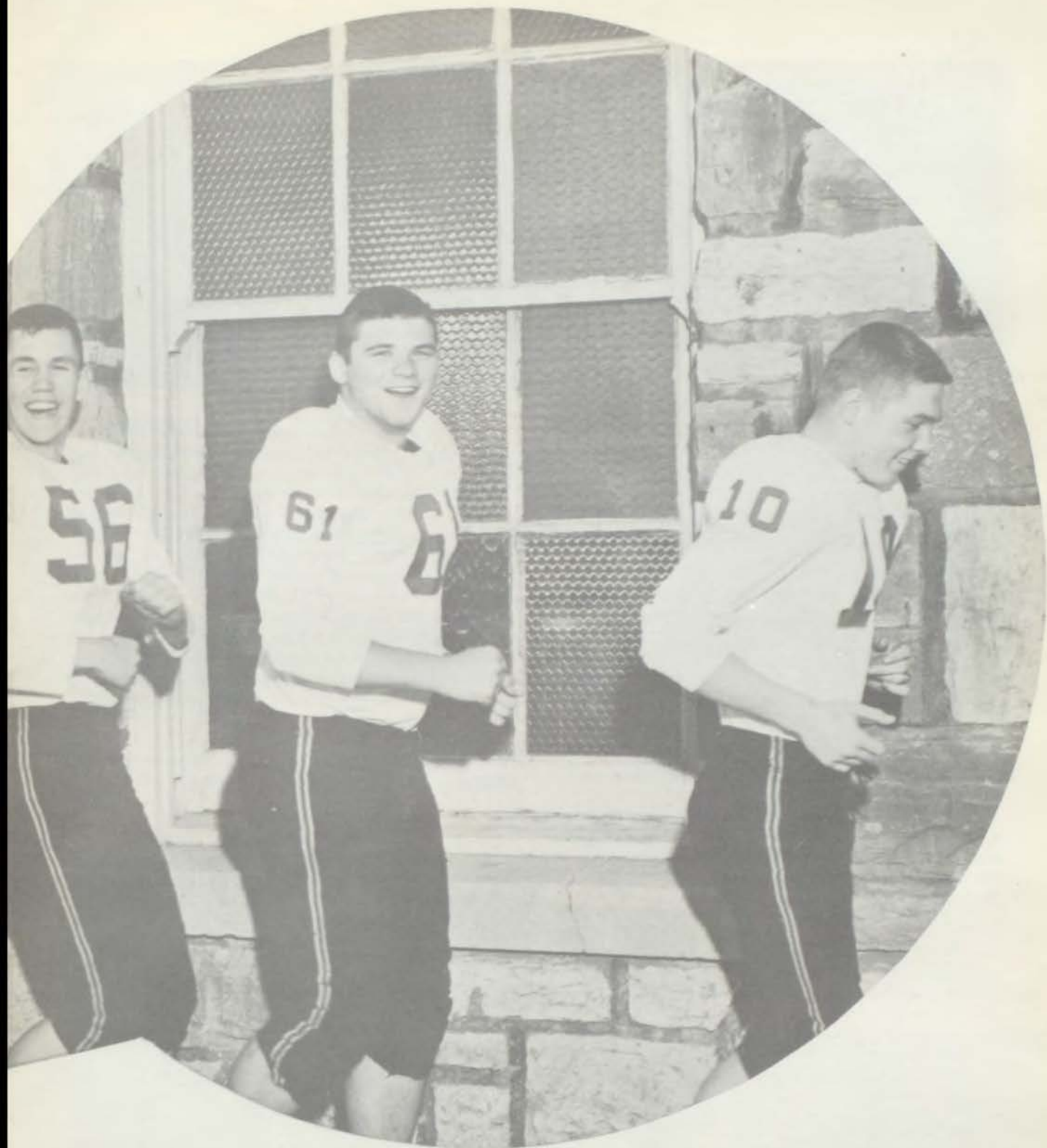

The following week, the Pirates lost a thrilling rock 'em, sock 'em contest to the tough Rockhurst Hawks.

Westport, our first league foe, fielded a tough defense one week later and contained the Buc's single-wing ground attack. Paseo's only touchdown came when the Buc's intercepted a Tiger pass and ran it to the Westport 33, where after a 23-yard pass, Bob Allison bulled his way to paydirt.

Air-borne tactics proved fatal in the East game as the Bears intercepted three Buc passes and cashed them into seven points apiece. The Bears earned 37 more points, bringing the final score to 58-21.





Fortunes of football turn quickly, and in the next game, the Pirates staged a 40-0 rout over the Manual Redbirds. Kenworthy sparked the Pirate crew, personally making four of the six Paseo touchdowns.

Lapsing into a losing streak, the Pirate crew lost to Central 47-7, Northeast 34-7, and to loop title-holder Southeast 45-0.

The final game of the season was against Southwest. In the first half the Indians' offense registered a 6-0 advantage. Paseo countered with a tally, as Kenworthy scored from the Indians' 11. The Pirates thus tied the score at 6-6. Both teams gained another 7 points, making the final score a 13-13 dead-lock.

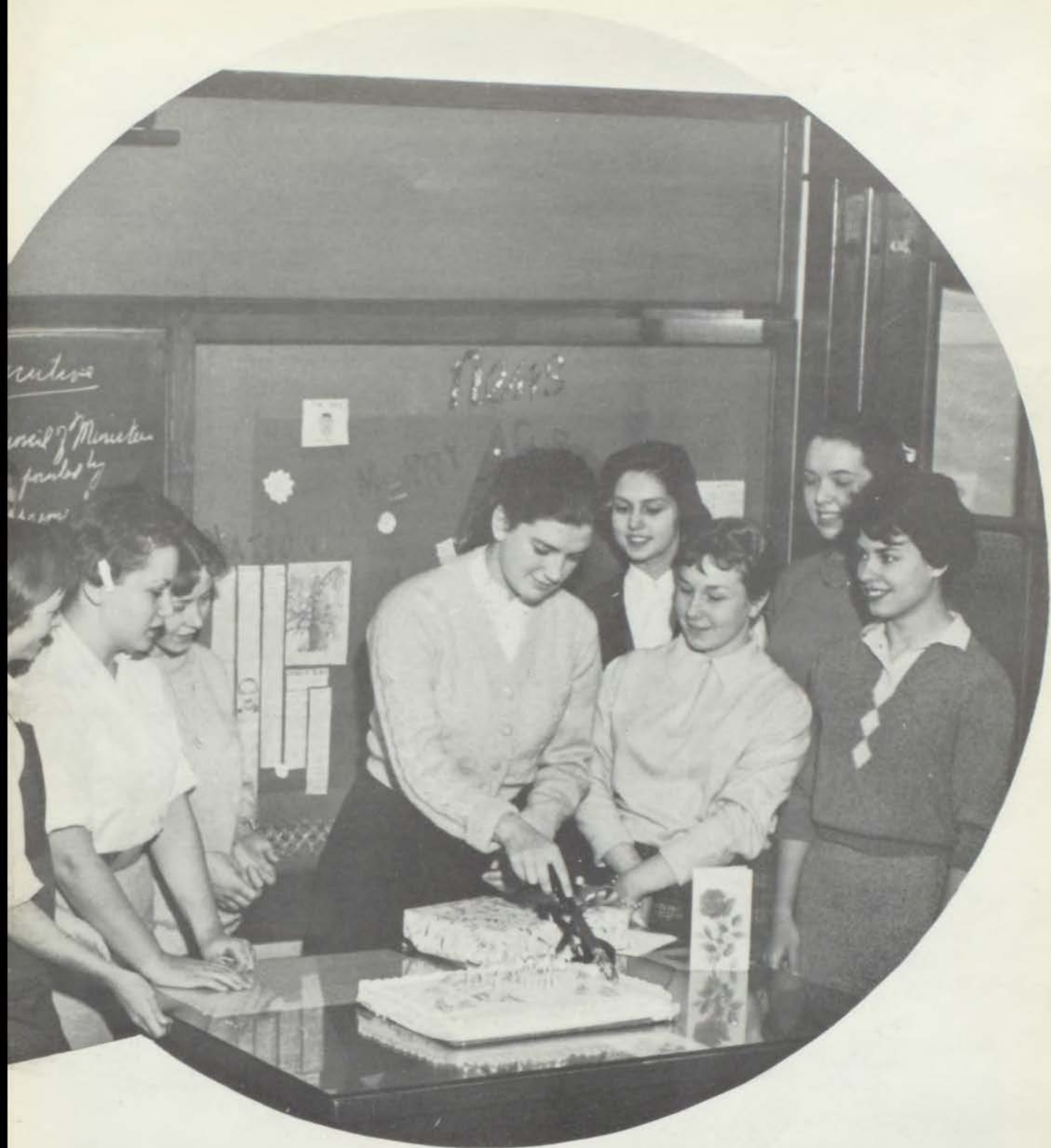

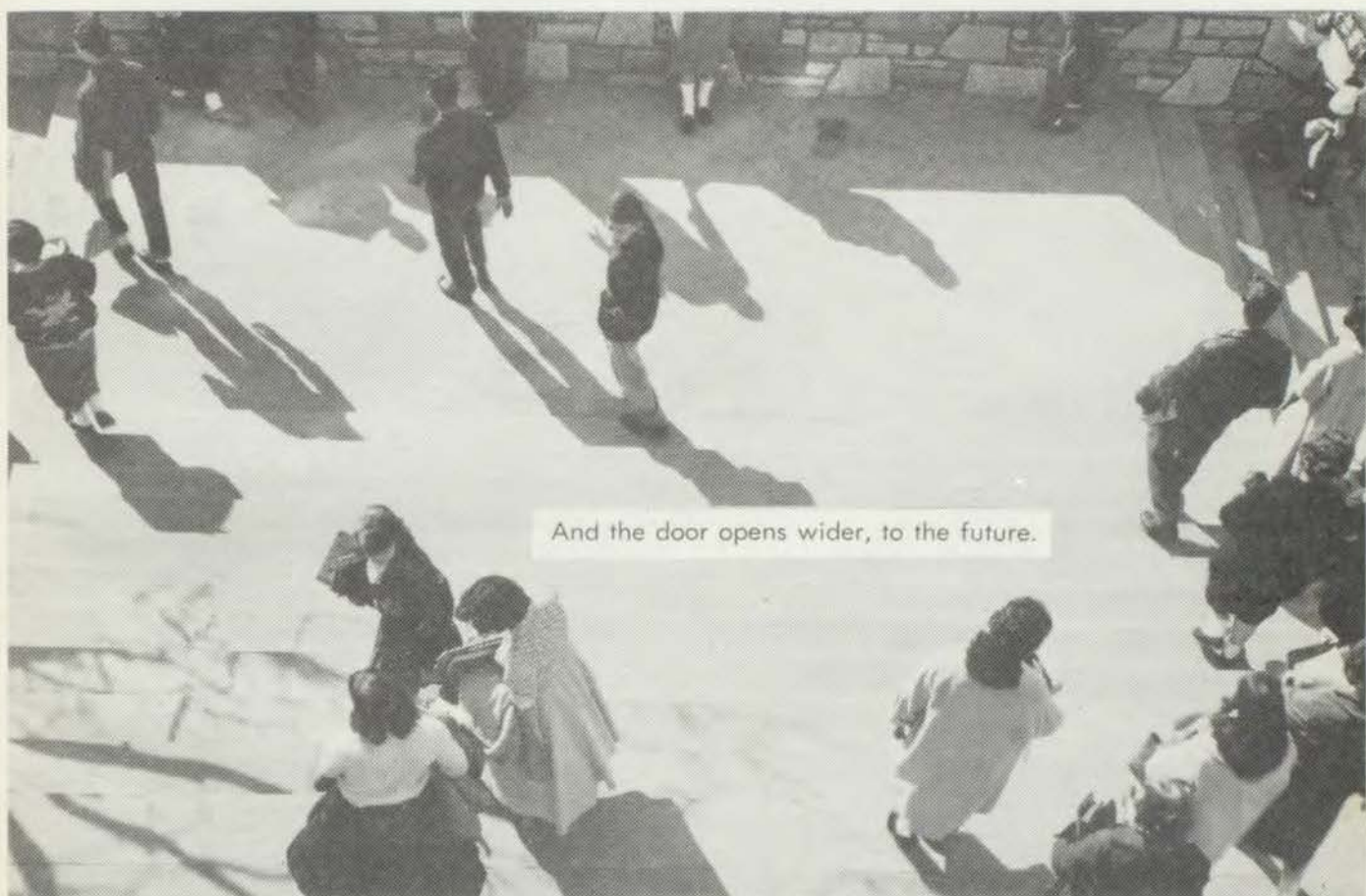

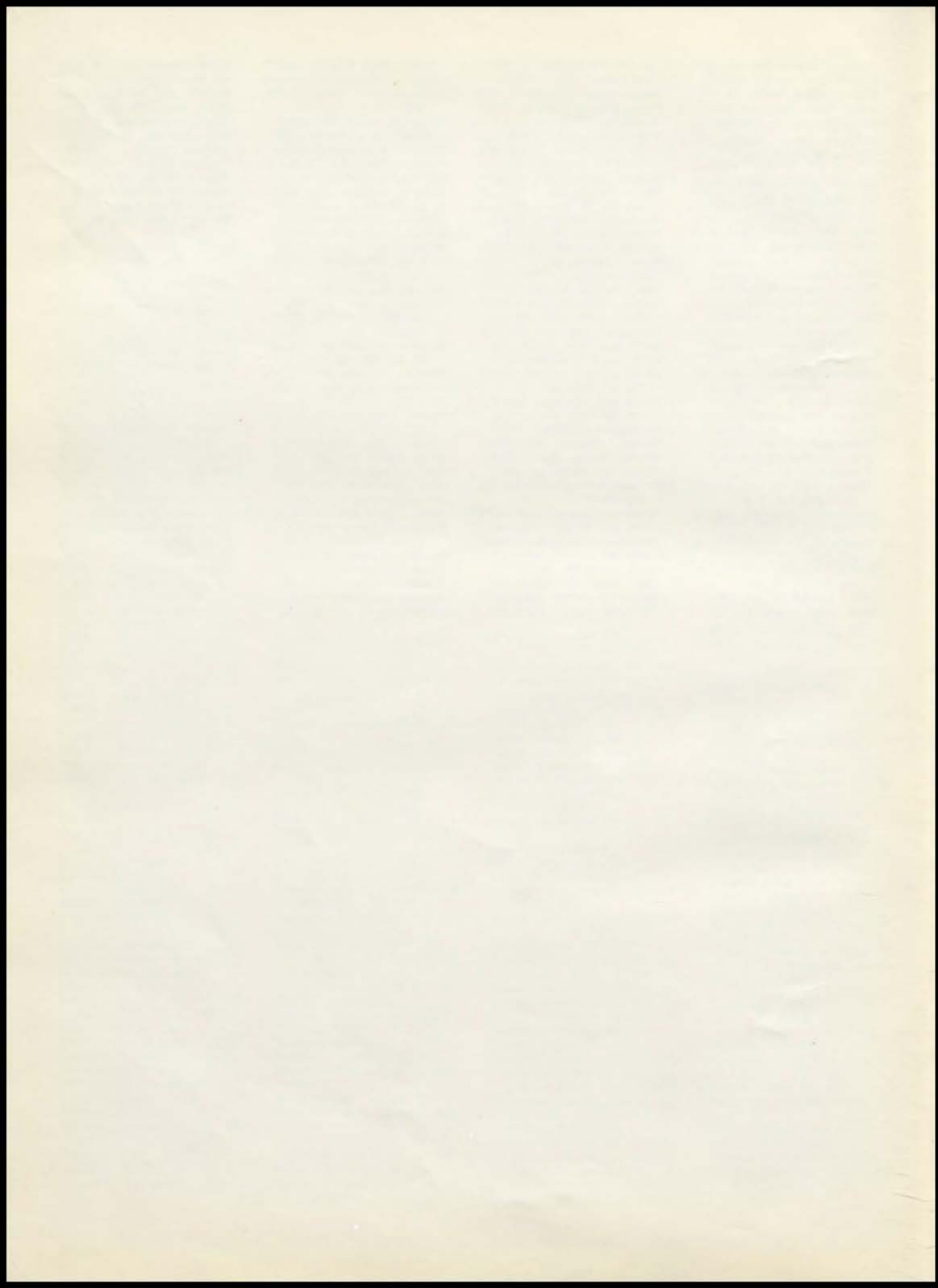
