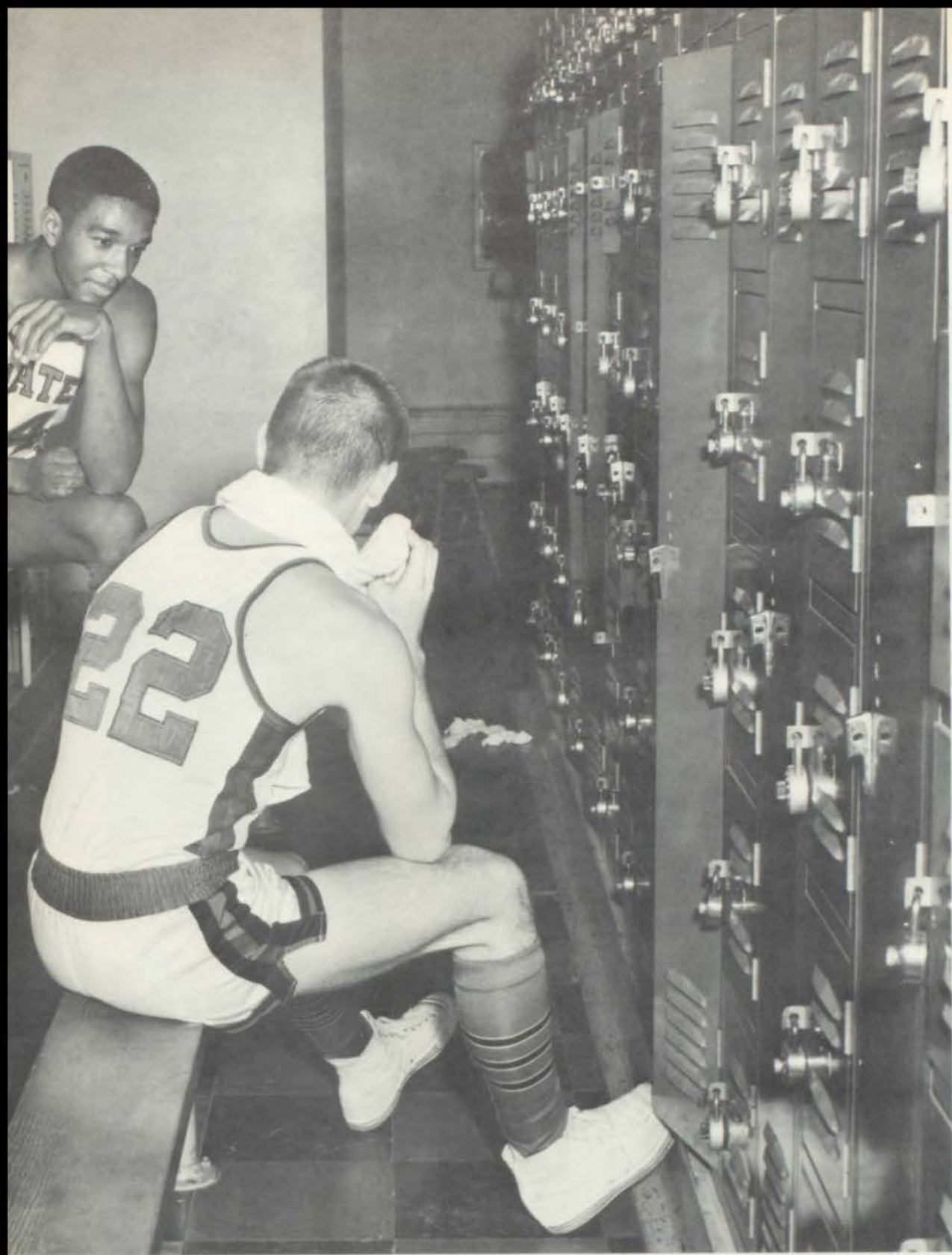
With a starting blast of the referee's whistle, the game rolls into action and Paseo's athletic year begins again.

The season can be described as thrilling but unsuccessful.

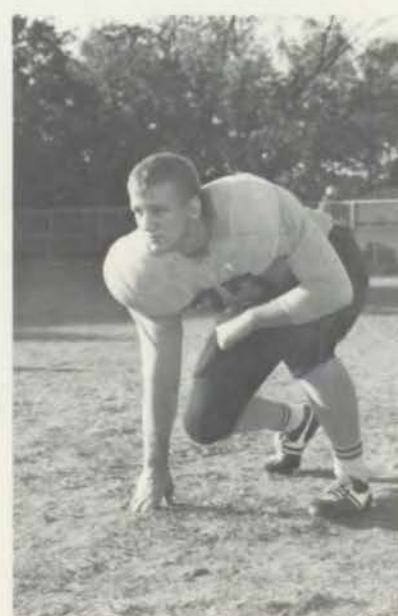

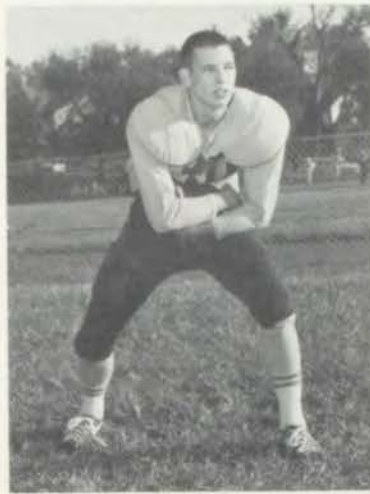

Outperforming eight of the ten teams in the Interscholastic League, Paseo's varsity Pirates zoomed to a towering second place position in the 1963-64 basketball standings.

At the beginning of the season, the Pirates were predicted to end up no higher than fourth place. But as the weeks passed, speed, teamwork and an overwhelming desire to win boosted the team closer and closer to championship hopes. The boys brushed aside the idea that Paseo couldn't make it into the upper brackets, and carried the ball through victory after victory.

The Bucs were unable to penetrate the armor of Southeast's Knights who handed them their first defeat. But six consecutive teams fell before the mighty Pirate sword, including second place-rated Manual. Anxiously the Pirate bucketmen looked forward to their game with Central, and even though Central was favored to win, team hopes for an upset victory were high. However, the Eagles proved too strong for Paseo, and with this second defeat the Pirates' chances for the championship were crushed.

The team bounced back to win their final league game against Van Horn, thus bringing their final record to 7-2, and securing them solidly in second place.

Bringing equal honors to Paseo's roster of basketball achievement was her Junior Varsity team, which finished high in the league, and the Sophomore team which chalked up a winning 6-4 record. Warmer Weather Welcomes Track As Third Major Interscholastic League Sport

With the coming of warmer weather to Kansas City, the Interscholastic League schools begin preparing for the third major sport of the year, track. Football and basketball now give way to high hurdles and distance runs.

Track season is a welcome change for both the boys who participate in the meets and the supporters who attend them. Track meets are quite different from other major sport games, because several individual events are held simultaneously. For example, shot put, broad jump and pole vault events are usually carried out at the same time, thus providing the spectators with more than one center of attention. This three-ring-circus effect makes track fun to watch and to take part in.

At Paseo, track is a sport which commands a great deal of interest. Since the individual events allow for a wide range of specialization, boys may choose to take part in one area or several. Track

events include high jump, running broad jump, shot put, pole vaulting, high and low hurdle races, relay races, dashes, and distance runs.

The winning team in a meet is determined by a point system. A specific number of points is awarded for placement in each event. A first place receives the highest number of points and the lowest place receives the smallest number of points. The team earning the highest point total is considered the winner. This means that individual efforts determine the effort of the entire team.

Unlike so-called "team" sports, track and its individual nature allows several teams to participate in one meet. Track events need not be limited to only two teams.

The diversified centers of interest provided by track makes it one of the most enjoyable sports in the interscholastic league program.

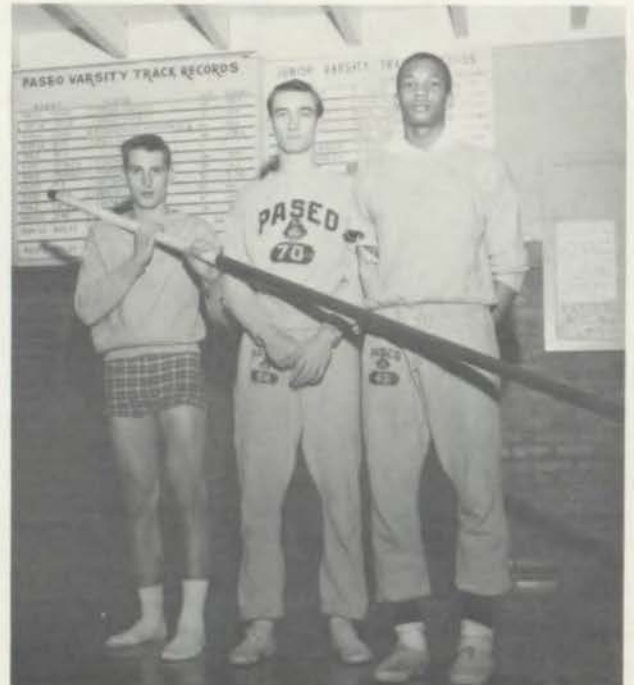

These water lovers displayed their skills for the public at the annual swim club show. For them, the water was always fine.



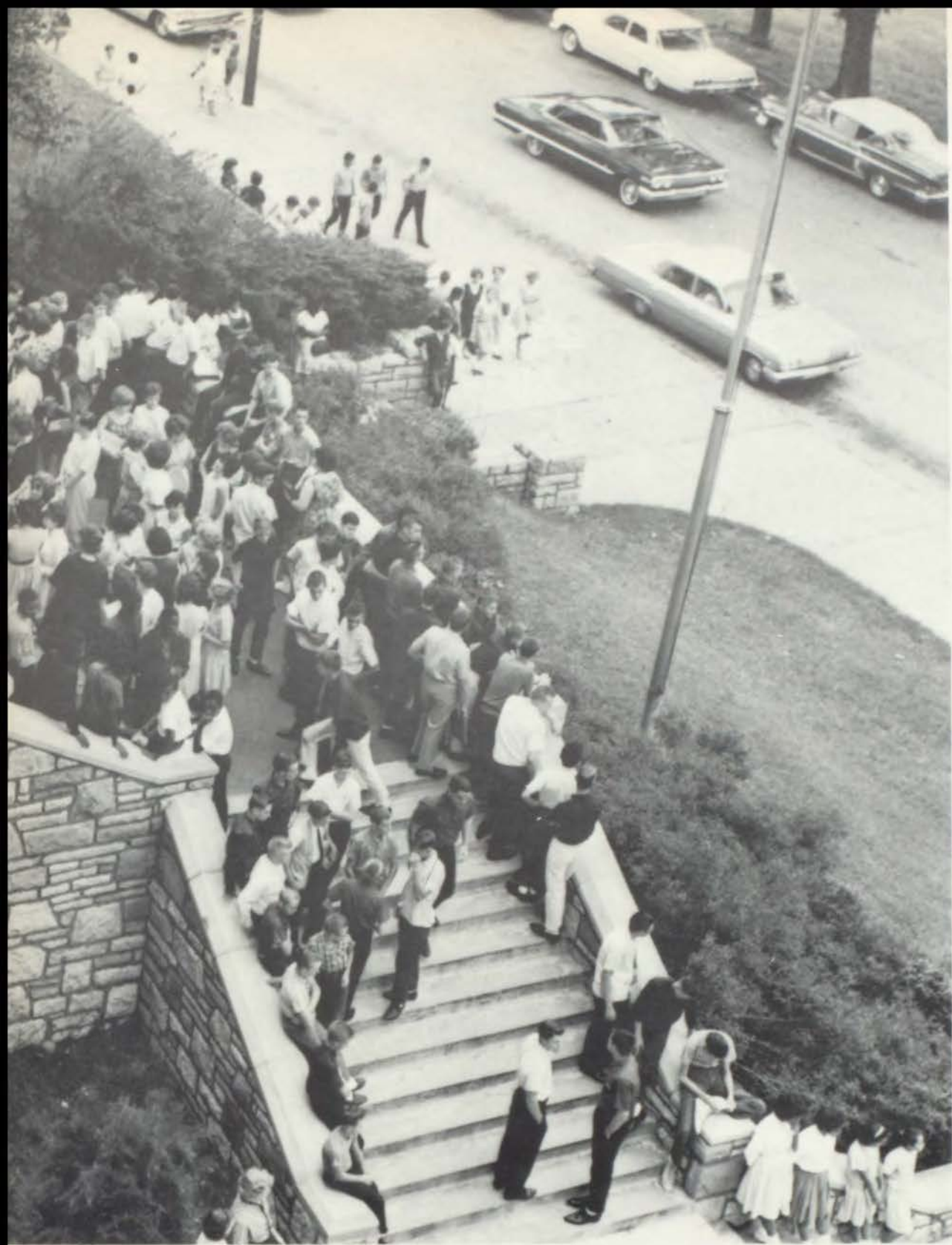
