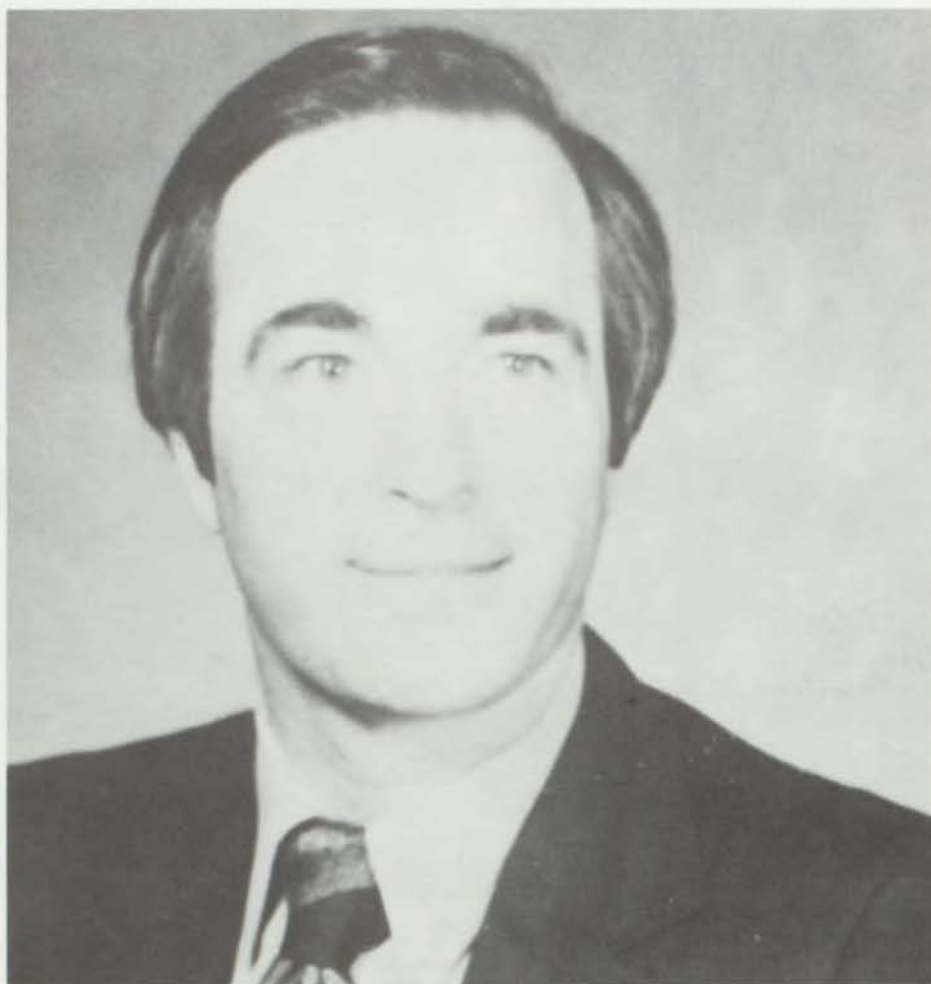
# ADMINISTRATION
