# Hot free-throw shooting lifts Paseo into championship

**COLUMBIA** — Paseo Coach Willie Bowie said he knew when Troy Buchanan defeated Paseo in the Missouri 2A third-place game back in 1986, his team would be back in the not-too-distant future.

The Pirates did return, and this time they defeated Buchanan 72-65 in a 3A semifinal game Friday at the Hearnes Center.

"This team is more patient than the Paseo team that came here two years ago," Bowie said.

Paseo, 28-2, meets New Madrid County, 24-7, at 6:25 in tonight's championship game. Buchanan and Willard meet at noon in the third-place game.

## Missouri 3A boys

New Madrid County Central defeated Willard 66-61 in the other semifinal game.

Paseo had trouble shaking the smaller Trojans, 24-6, holding on to a 30-24 halftime lead and 49-42 advantage at the end of three quarters.

"They're a pesky team," Bowie said. "Just when it seems like you have a good lead they're right back in the game."

The Trojans used their outside shooting attack, led by senior forward Bryan Silver's 27 points and guard Roy Phillips' 19 points, and cut the Paseo led to 69-65 on a Silver jump shot.

But the Pirates, who made 22 of 29 free throws, got two free throws from junior Larry Lewis with 30 seconds left, making it 71-65.

Lewis scored eight of his 20 points in the fourth quarter.

Paseo's Anthony Peeler led the Pirates with 25 points while junior Fred May added 12. Peeler also had 10 rebounds, dished out 10 assists and had five steals, but it was his 11-for-13 shooting at the free-throw line that Troy Coach Mitch Wilkins said hurt the most.

"We tried hard to stop him from scoring as evident by the three guys that fouled out trying to guard him (Phillips, Jeff Wilke, and Shane Cappell)," Wilkins said. "The kid's a great talent, that's all."

Peeler, who brought the Hearnes

Center crowd to its feet with a baseline-to-baseline dribble and dunk late in the first quarter, said when the Pirates play their running game everything clicks into place.

"We're not as good in a slowdown offense like some teams," Peeler said. "We create offense with our defensive play."

Troy had last lead of the game at 15-14 after Silver, who made 12 of 20 shots, hit a 20-footer.

Bowie said he told the Pirates to adjust the defense to key on Silver, but it didn't work.

"He's one of the best players I've seen," Bowie said. "We tried to keep him under control since we couldn't stop him."

Silver, who scored 17 of his 27

points in the first half, said his team lost some intensity in the fourth quarter.

"They (Paseo) were blocking shots all over the place, and our players got intimidated," Silver said.

# Peeler dazzles with dunks in Dapper Dan Classic

Pittsburgh—The fans came to see the nation's two most talked-about high school players, Alonzo Mourning and Billy Owens, but they left the Dapper Dan Roundball Classic talking about the not-so-nationally-known Anthony Peeler and Orlando Vega.

The East routed the West team 121-100, despite the performance of Paseo's Peeler.

Peeler, a 6-foot-4 wing who will attend Missouri in the fall, was the crowd-pleaser. He spiced the game with six slam dunks, including two spectacular breakaways from midcourt. He scored 19 points and was awarded the West team's most valuable player award.

Vega, a 6-foot-4 native of Washington, D.C., who was the last player picked for the game, scored 24 points and Kentucky recruit Shawn Ellis of Elkhart, Ind., had 21 as the East routed the West 121-100 Friday night in the nation's oldest prep all-star

game.

Vega was chosen the East MVP and was the high scorer.

Vega, from Oak Hill Academy in Mouth of Wilson, Va., was added to the East's roster last week when Todd Day of Memphis, Tenn., was unable to attend. He made eight of 12 shots and seven of nine free throws.

"I didn't really come here to score a lot of points or to prove anything, I just came here to play the game and have fun," Vega said. "We blended well together and I'm happy about the MVP award, because I wasn't expecting it."

A fourth-team Parade All-America who will attend Arizona, Vega scored 12 points in each half as the favored East took first-half leads of as many as 13 points and then cruised to the victory as five players scored in double figures.

The 6-10 Mourning had several jams, but the king of the dunks was Peeler. At one point he scored seven straight West points on three breakaway slams and a

free throw.

"(Missouri) Coach (Norm) Stewart told me to work on my defense, that if I played good defense the points would come," Peeler said. "I had six dunks in a game before, but this was different. I mean this is the Dapper Dan and everybody wants to come here and play in this game."

The quicker East team opened up a 104-79 lead with about 5 minutes left and substitutes for both teams wound up logging more playing time than the regulars.

The attendance was 14,042 in the 16,033-seat Civic Arena.

Landover, Md.—Malik Sealy scored 23 points and Litterial Green added 19 as the U.S. All-Stars posted a 112-83 victory over the Capital All-Stars in the 15th annual Capital Classic High School All-Star Game at the Capital Centre.

Sealy, a 6-7 forward from the Bronx who will attend St. John's next fall, also led the U.S. team

with nine rebounds. He had only five points and two rebounds in the first half, but added six points in the first 3:24 of the second half, as the U.S. Stars stretched their 49-38 halftime lead into a 63-42 advantage.

Matt Steigenga, another 6-7 forward who is headed to Michigan State next season, contributed 13 points and six rebounds in 19 minutes for the U.S. team. A three-time all-state selection in Michigan, Steigenga scored eight in the first half and three more in the opening minute of the second half.

Washington-area player of the year, Jerrod Mustaf of DeMatha High in Hyattsville, Md., lived up to his advance billing. The 6-10 Mustaf, who is headed to Maryland, led the Capital All-Stars with 13 points and 11 rebounds.

Milton Bell, of Richmond, who will play at Georgetown next year, was the only other double-figure scorer for the Capital squad. He had 11 points, all in the second half.

## Peeler picked to play in All-American game

Paseo's Anthony Peeler won another award Monday. This one, however, even faked out Peeler.

"I didn't know anything about it," Peeler said after it was announced at a school assembly that he was one of 25 high school basketball players chosen to the McDonald's All-American team (complete team, Page C-4).

"This is something I've thought about since I was a freshman, to make the team and play on TV. This is the best award ever."

It was the second award in the last week for Peeler, who will attend Missouri Saturday he was selected Gatorade Circle of Champions Central region player of the year. He is one of eight players selected to the team and is a finalist for national player of the year.

At the assembly Tom Krewson, administrative assistant to

Missouri Gov. John Ashcroft, presented Peeler a proclamation from the governor. Councilman Frank Palermo represented Kansas City Mayor Richard Berkley and proclaimed Monday Anthony Peeler Day.

Larry Peeler, Anthony's father, said his son was caught off balance. Larry Peeler said what surprised Anthony most was what he wore to school, including a Chicago White Sox warm-up jacket and sweat pants.

"He was surprised and kind of angry," Larry Peeler said. "He said, 'Why didn't you tell me?' I knew since last Wednesday."

"Years ago we knew Anthony had the ability athletically, yet as a teen we tell him to strive for what he wants. He always worked hard at what he did."

A 6-4 senior, Peeler is a do-it-all player for the Pirates. He has helped lead Paseo to a 27-2 record going into the Missouri 3A state tournament, which starts Friday in Columbia. He averages 26.6 points, 11.5 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 2.5 steals. Really, there's no set position for Peeler, who plays inside and outside.

The 11th annual McDonald's All-American game is scheduled for April 17 at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque.

this victory was a lot sweeter than the earlier victory over the Owls because the Pirates executed better.

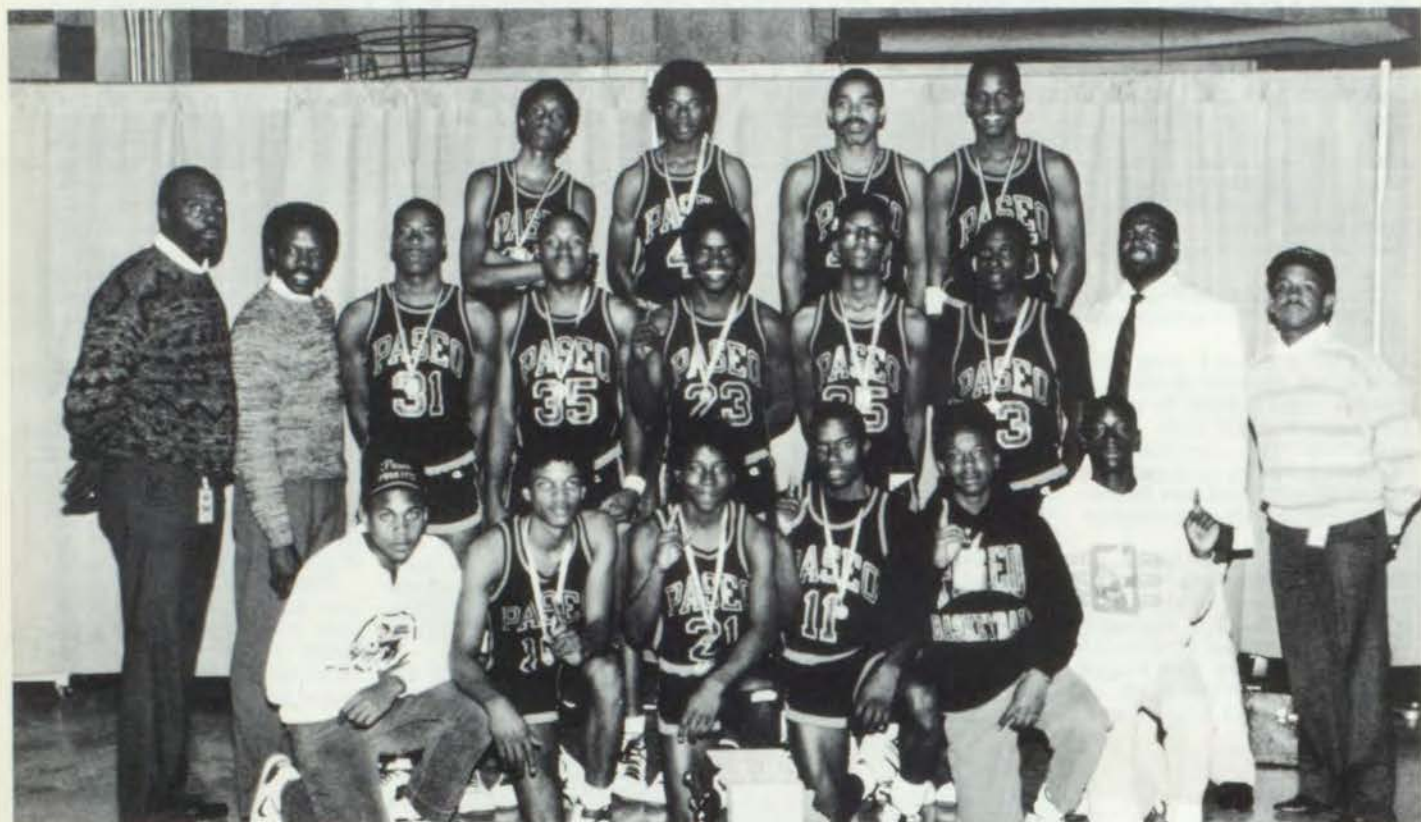

Paseo led 36-41 after three quarters but a dunk and a three-point conversion by Peeler with 8:17 left in the fourth period gave the Pirates their biggest lead of the game at 61-43.

"Our game plan was to run the whole game," Peeler said, "but we didn't want to take too many shots so we slowed it up at times." Peeler led 36-27 at halftime. Chris Wittler led Marshall with 19 points and Tommy Penzinger and Donald Blasier added 14 each for the Owls.

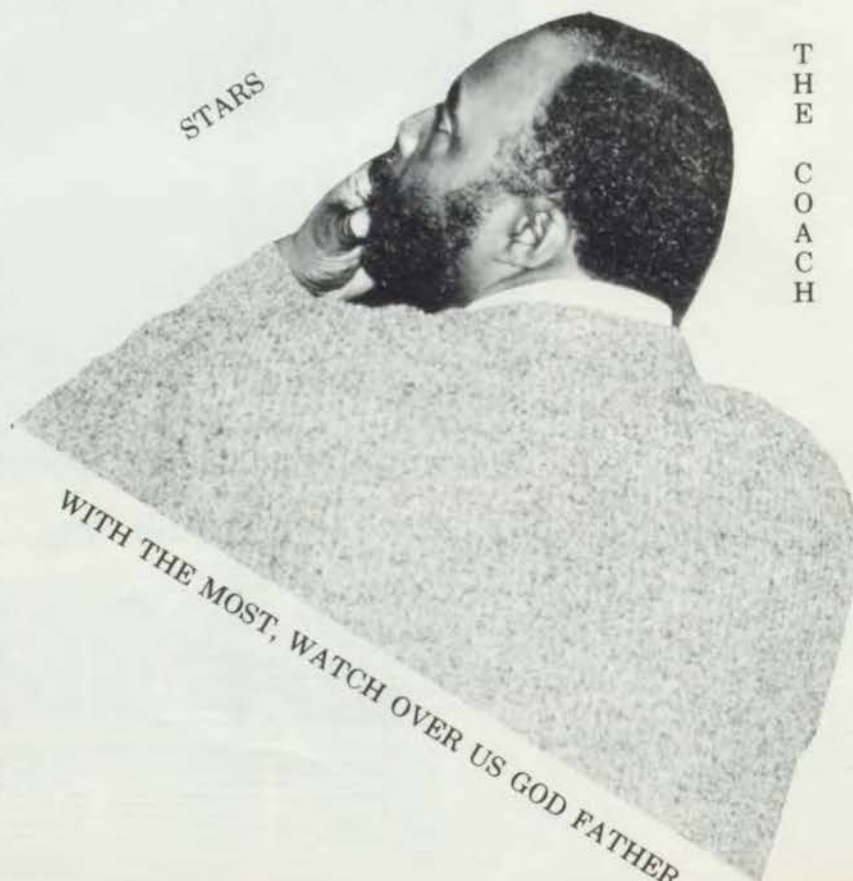
