We Raiders have been united by a century of tradition.






In 1913, Mrs. Hill started the Sunset Hill School for girls in her own home. The school then moved into a home on 57th Street which quickly became too small. In 1919, Sunset Hill School moved from their second location on 57th Street to 400 W. 51st Street, the present location of the Wornall Campus. The two locations were so close that the faculty decided that they, with the help of the students, could move most of the contents of the school themselves. Everyone carried something: wagons were loaded with books and supplies, and the entire school paraded down the street to their new home. The idea of the Centennial walk was to re-create the original walk, but use the first location of the Country Day School (the Wornall House) as the starting location to incorporate both of the predecessor schools. 100 students, chosen by a lottery, Mrs. Wornall and Mrs. Hill impersonators, Steve Bellis, Jon Styslinger, and the Pep Band, walked from the Wornall House to the lower campus. The upper and middle school walked from the Ward Parkway campus to the Wornall Campus where the students and faculty met up with the rest of the school. They carried signs symbolizing one hundred years, and Dr. Bellis and Mr. Styslinger carried a Pembroke Hill banner (shown above). The entire school gathered in front of Founders Hall for a group picture. To end the ceremony, each division donated a momento to be saved in a time capsule for the next Centennial.

















Wednesday's activity consisted of contestants attempting to throw a ping-pong ball into various cups for points and the junior class dominated!














Youth in Government














Did you know that the Pembroke Hill Robotics Team was the 2353rd team to join the robotics league? Hey, that is where the name Legion 2353 came from! That is one of many things people don't know about Legion 2353. The Pembroke Hill Robotics Team is one of sixty in Kansas City that are working on a robot to compete in the spring. Each team starts with a basic kit of robotic materials and then have a budget to buy extras. On January 8th, each team is given the assignment for the robotics season. This year's assignment was for each team to build a robot that can pick up an inner-tube and set it on a peg ten feet in the air. The Pembroke Hill Legion 2353 breaks the assignment into three different sections. A few team members work on the building and design, a few work on the programming and others work on the objectives, such as size and weight. The Legion 2353 is a hard-working team who hopes for success in their spring competitions.



Science



Science Olympiad. If you're looking for genius scientific skills, look no further. The Upper School Science Olympiad team has ranked first, second, or third in the state of Missouri every year beginning in 1990. They have placed first or second at state, qualifying for nationals, 19 times. Nationals moves to a different college every year, in the past, the team has traveled to Georgia, Colorado, Washington, Alabama, Arizona, and Chicago. The National Competition of 2010 was in Urbana-Champaign, Illinois. At the national level, the Science Olympiad team has placed sixth in 1991, tenth in 1992, 11th in 1995, and third in 1996. Science Olympiad events vary from Sumo Bots, Ecology, Wind Power, to Protein Modeling. Those are of course are just a few of the many events that run every competition. 


Boys Occer
























Our own photographers used Cannon cameras and equipment generously provided by Bill Wolf-Tinsman and his fellows editors of the 1982 Pinnacle Staff in
