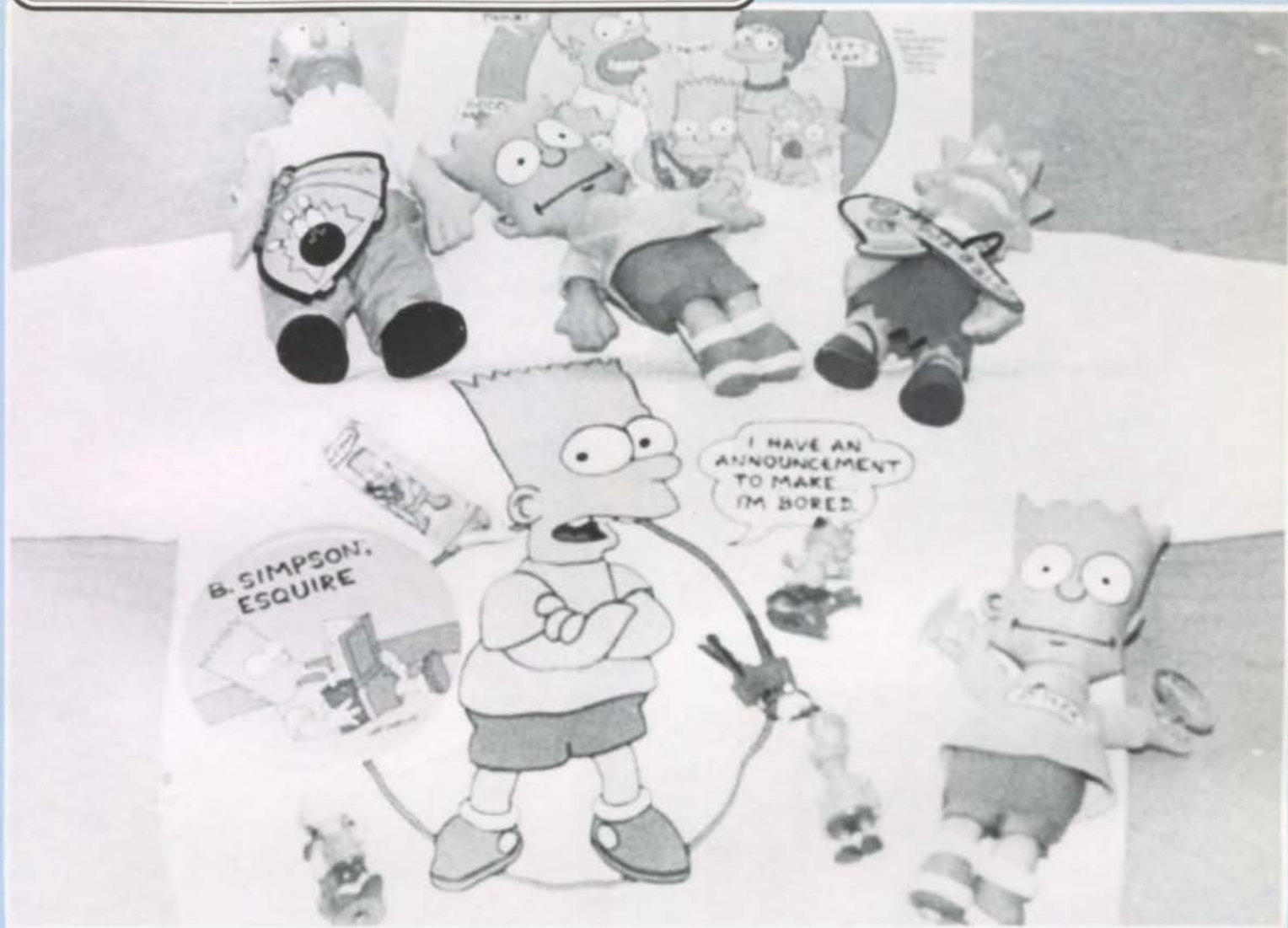

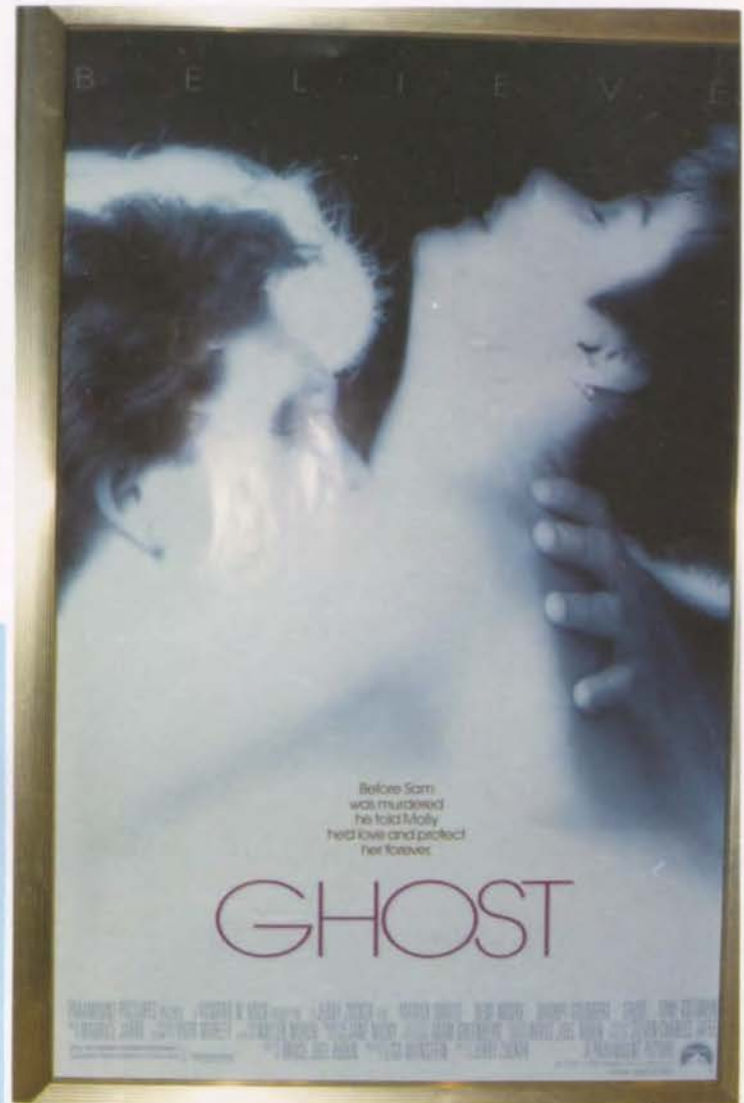

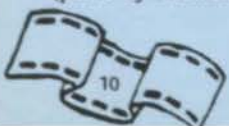

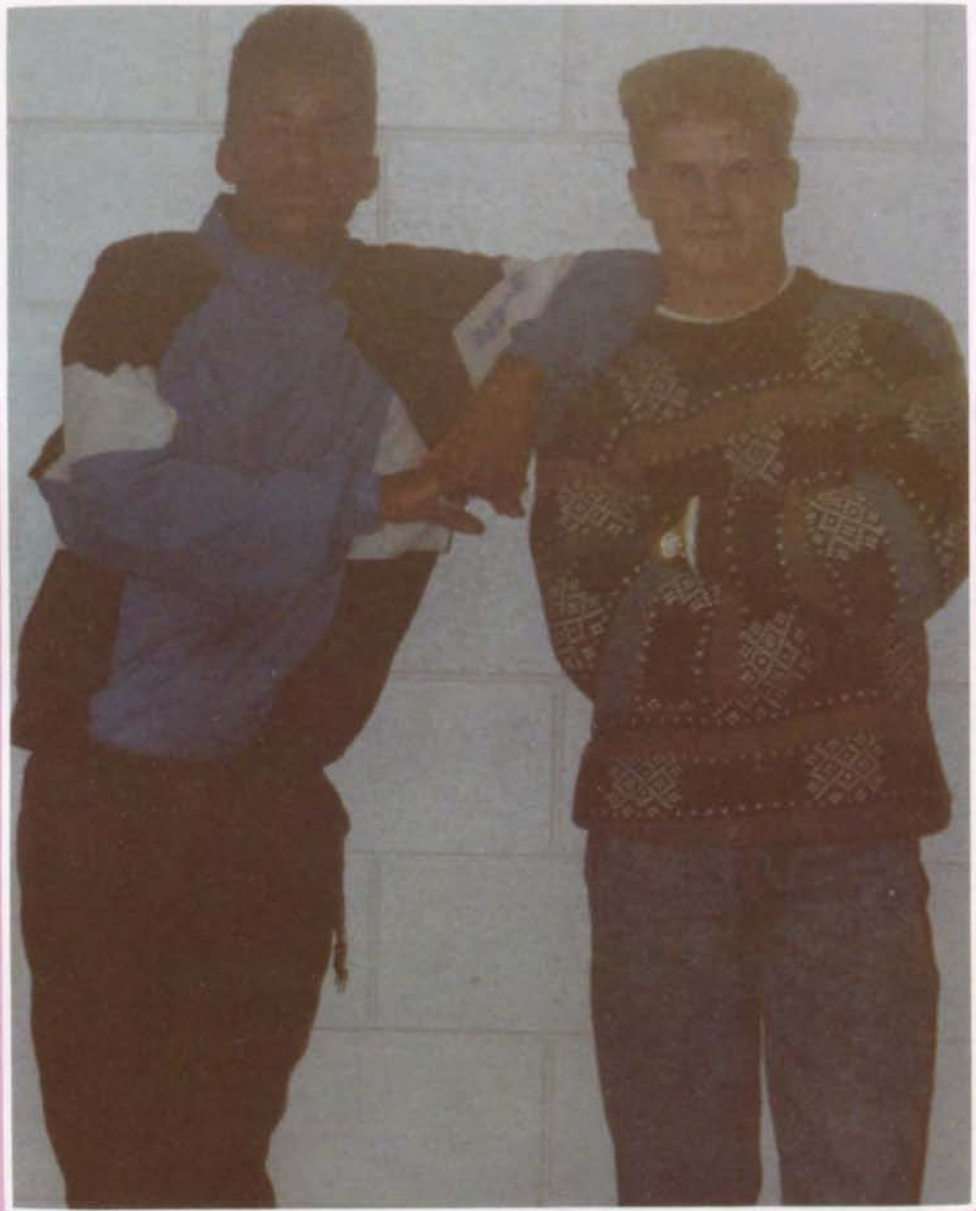

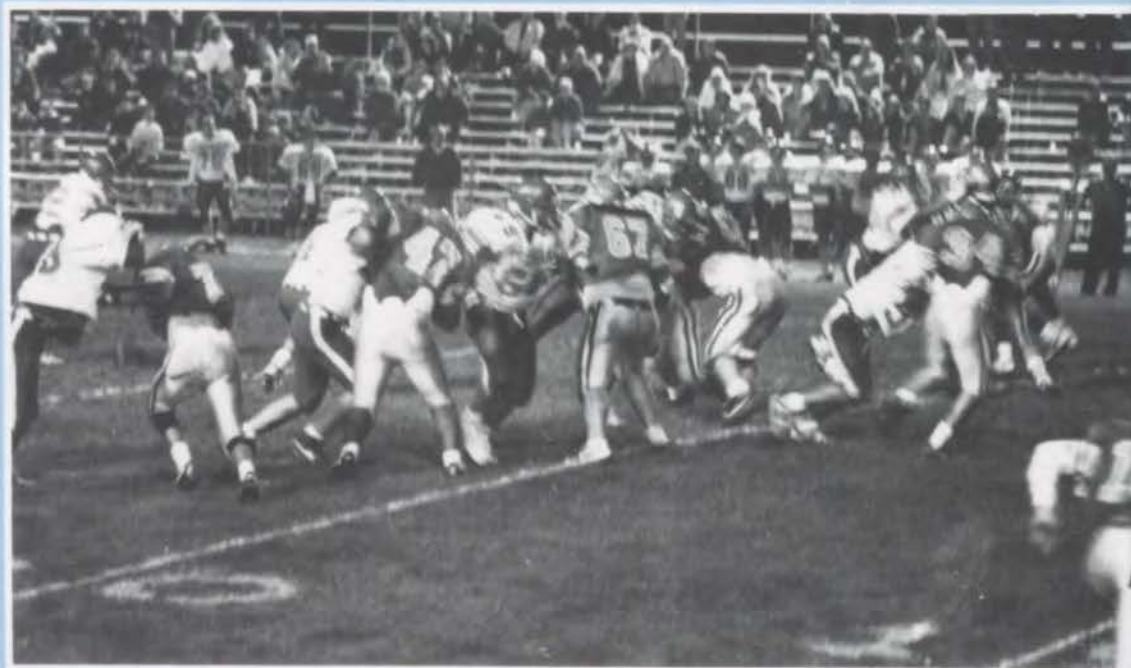

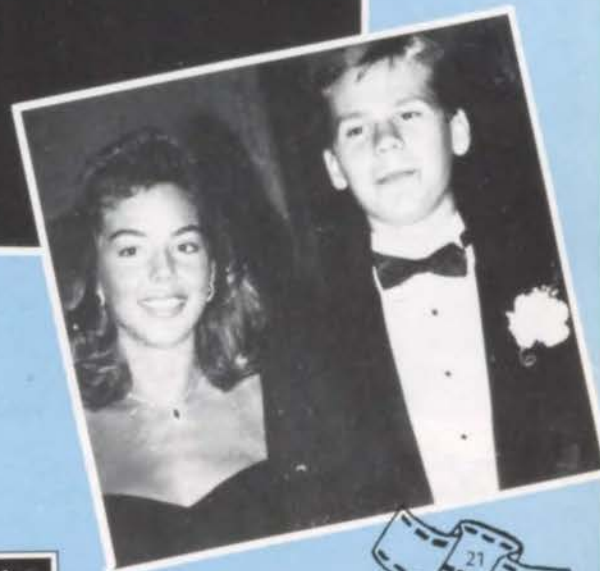

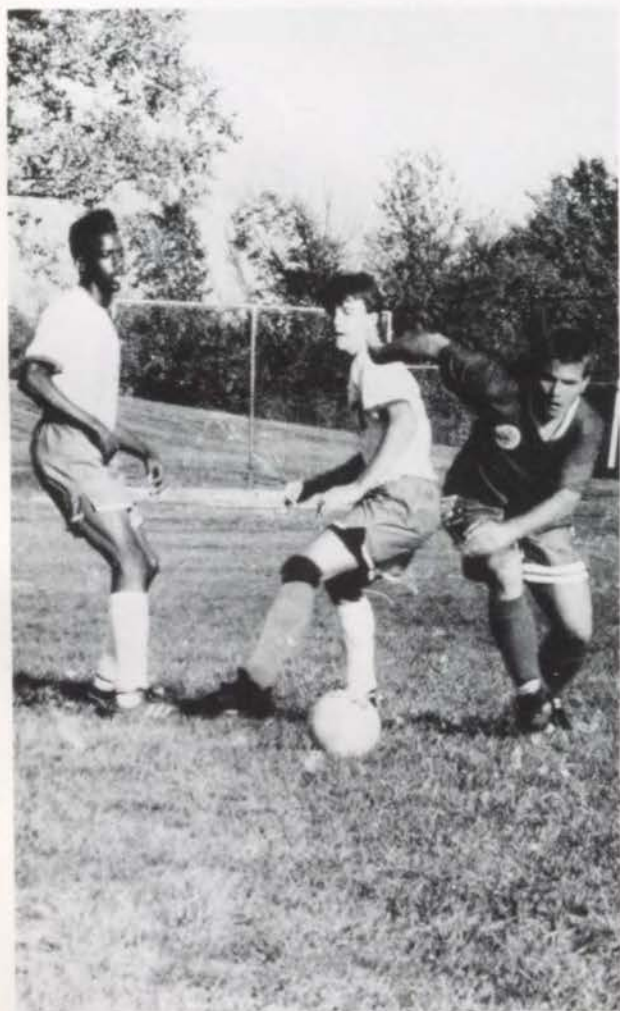

## *Juniors break tradition*

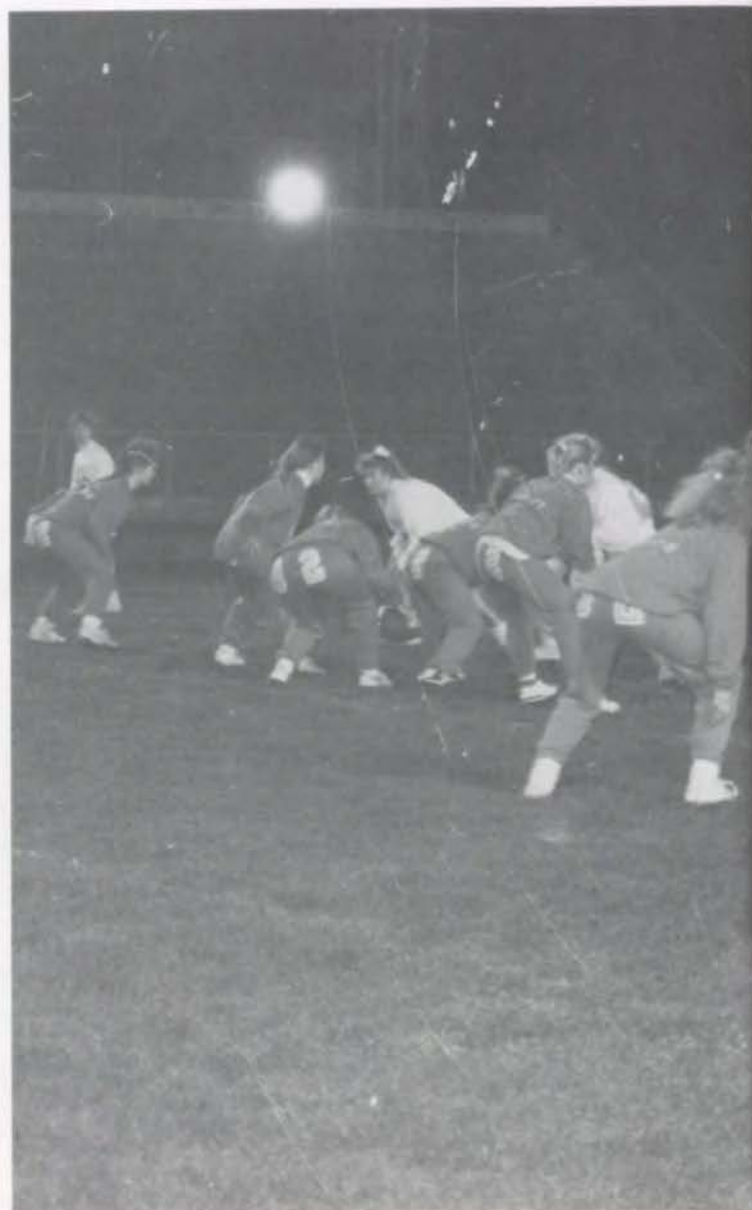

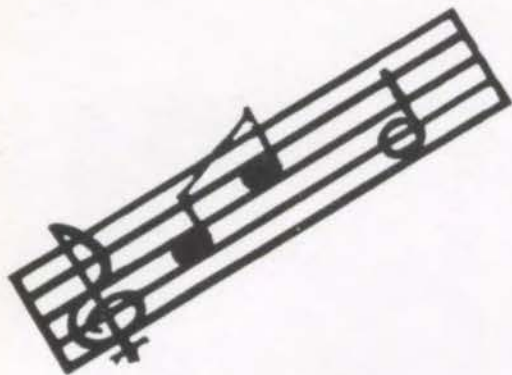

## *Students Hammer Their Way to the REC*

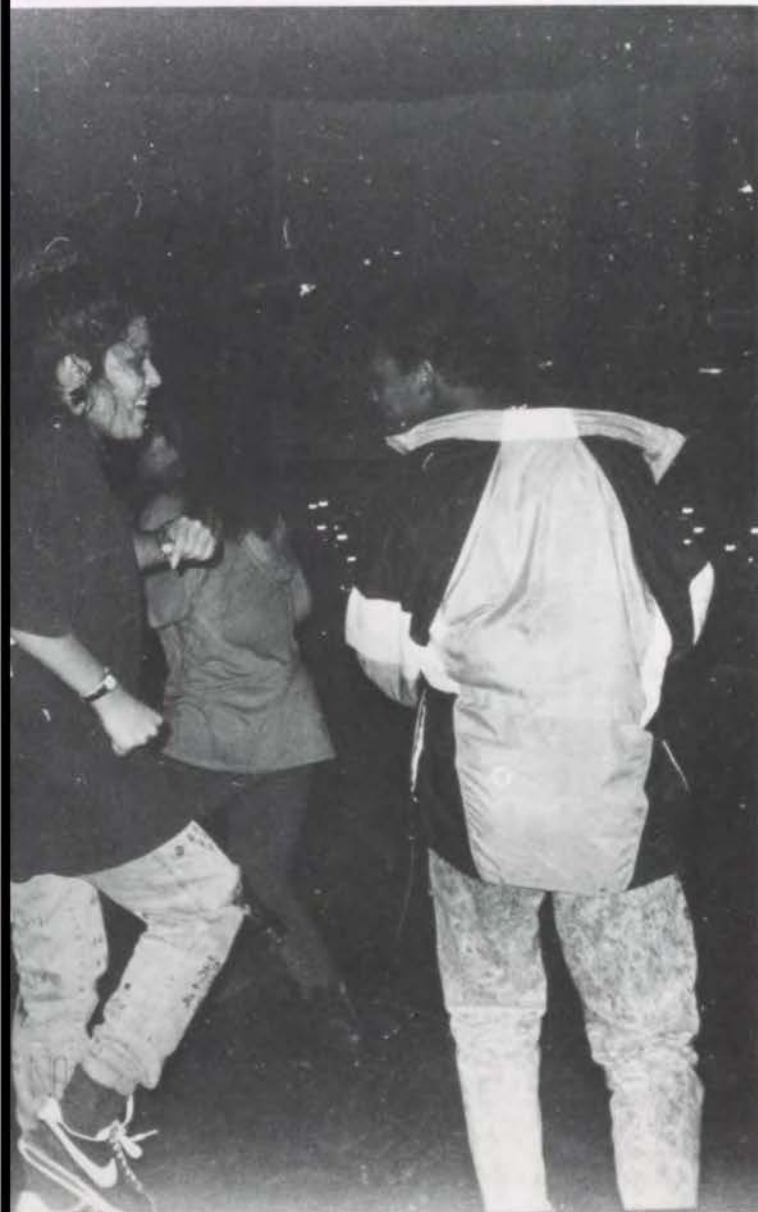
From the casual dressed Raytown-Raytown South Back To School Dance and the semi-formal WPA, to Prom, dances offered students a place to meet with friends for good times.

The War Ends! Seven months after Iraq invaded Kuwait, six weeks after Operation Desert Storm began, and one hundred hours after the ground war started, Kuwait was liberated, a cease fire was called, and peace and freedom were restored.

During the war in the gulf, Americans pulled the flags out of the attic and bought fabric stores out of yellow ribbon. Patriotism that had been lacking in the past few years resurged in full force. 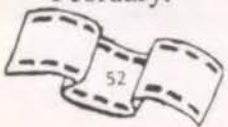

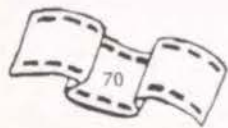

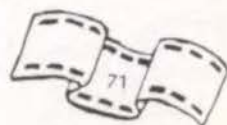


What is special services and why is it important to Raytown High School?

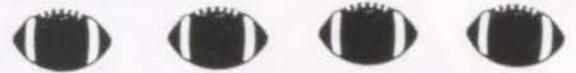

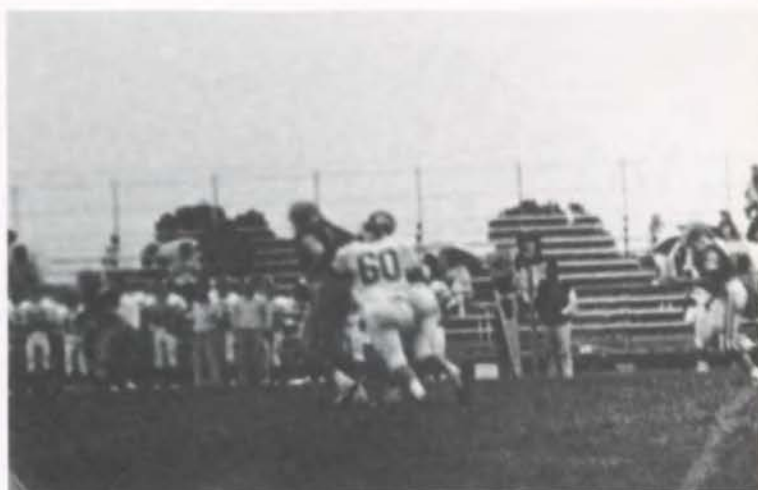

the South and Grandview games. The team acted like they had won a World Cup."

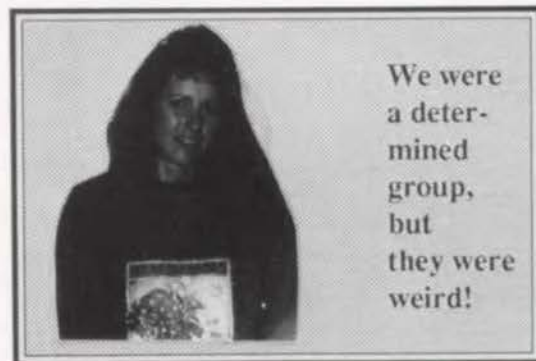

Coach Bailey.

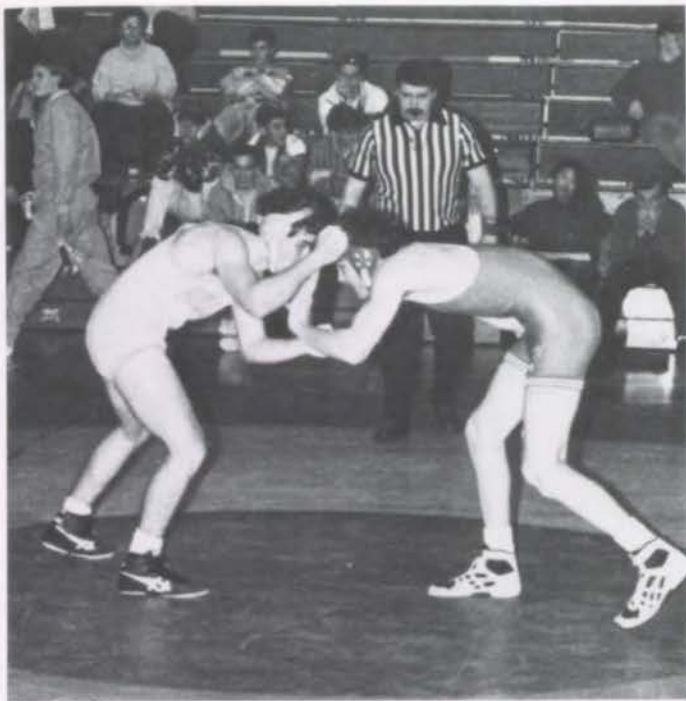

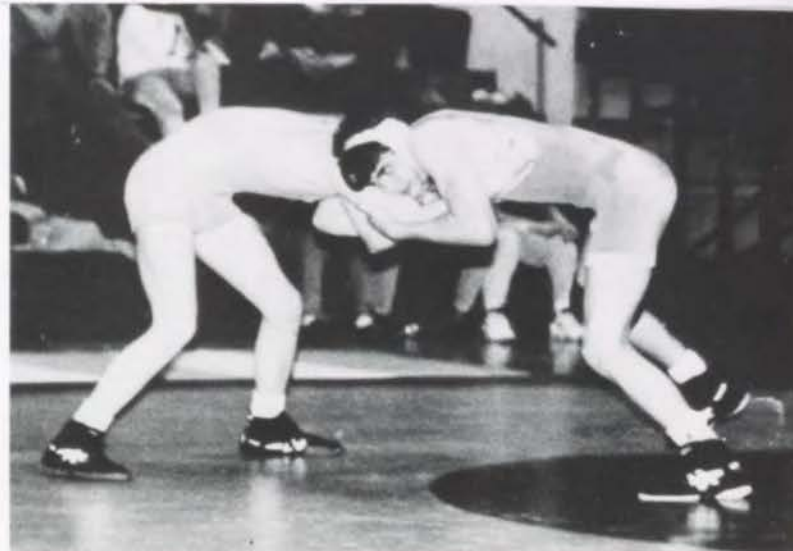

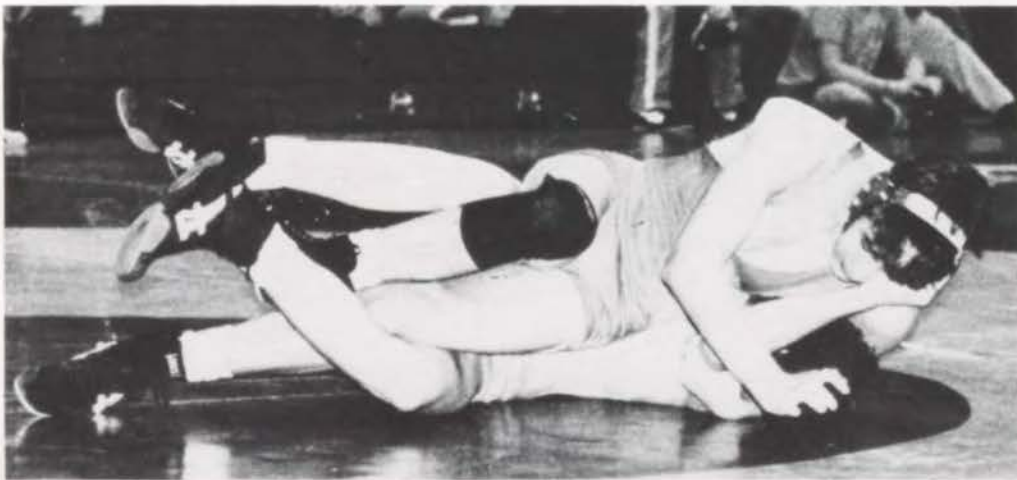
and are adjusted well to the new coaching methods he taught."

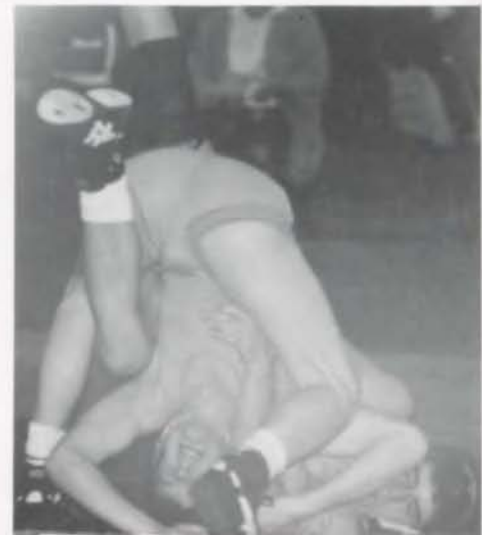

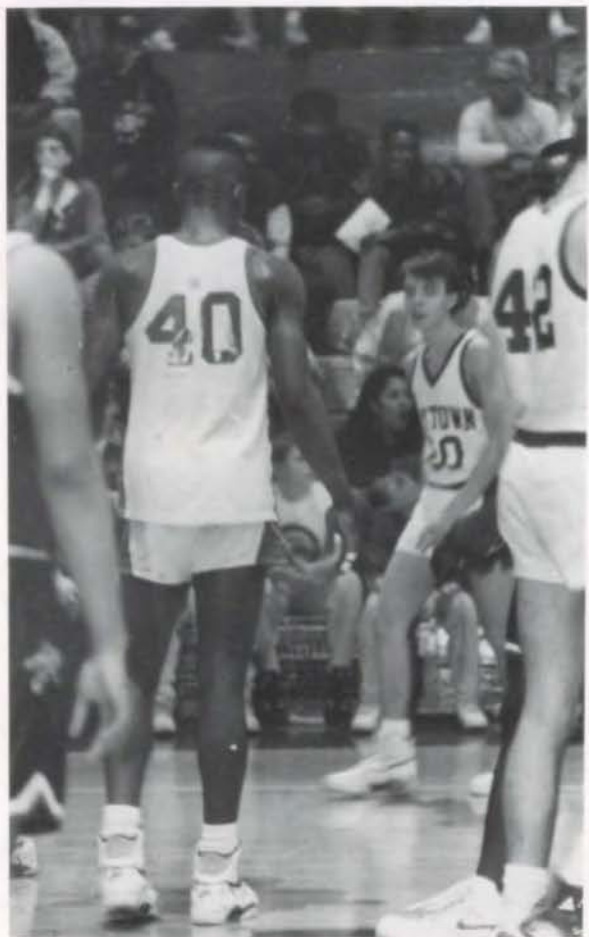

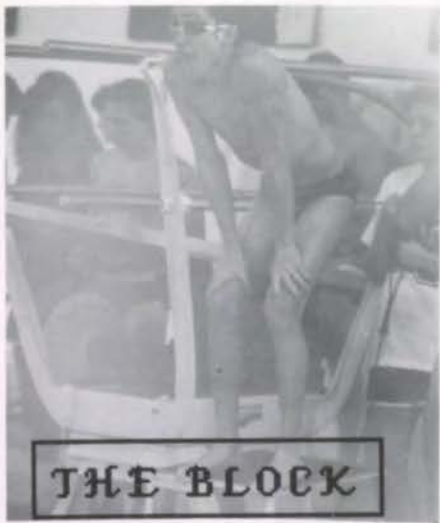

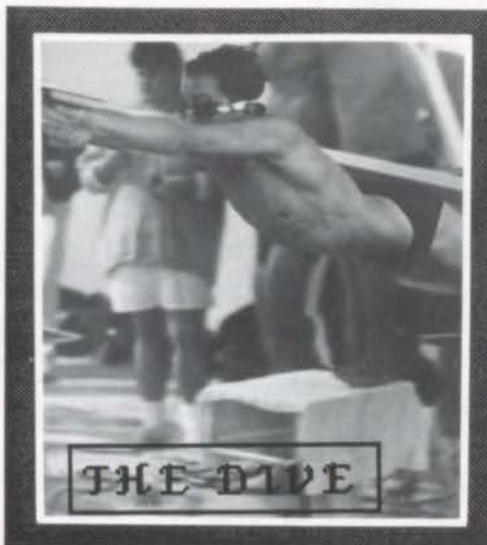

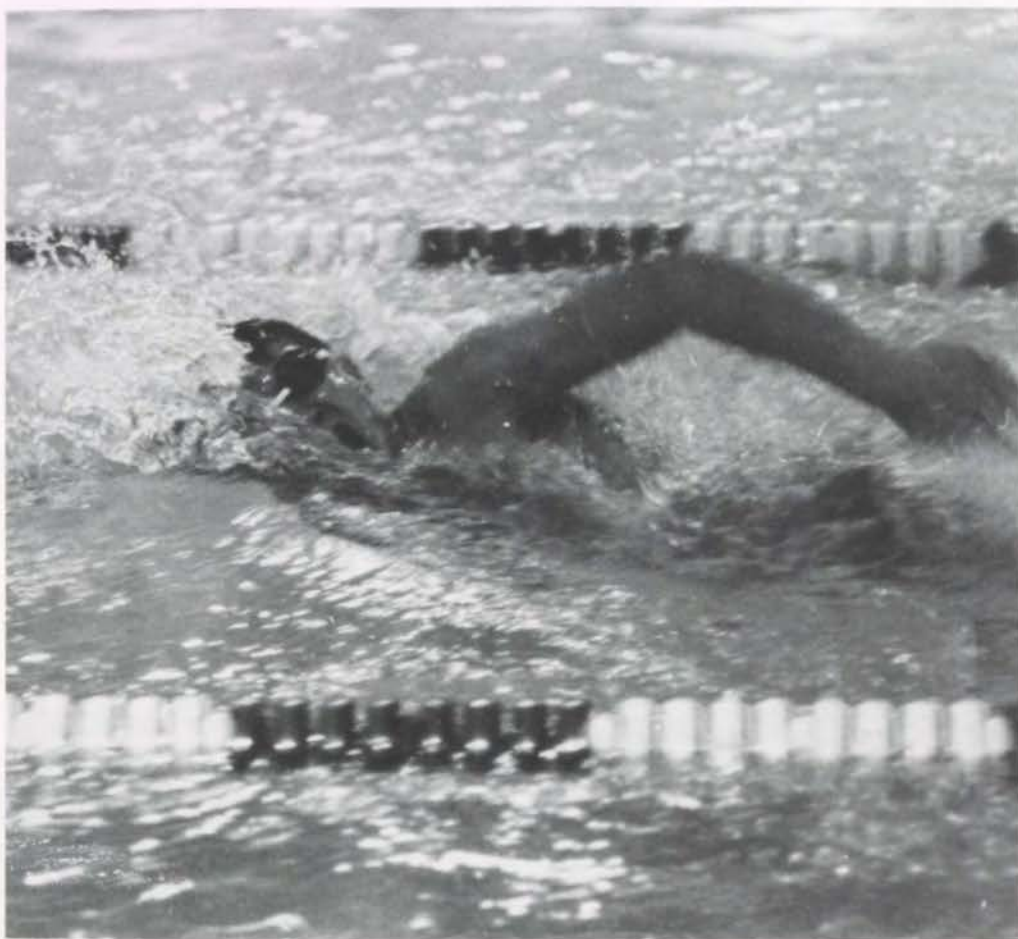

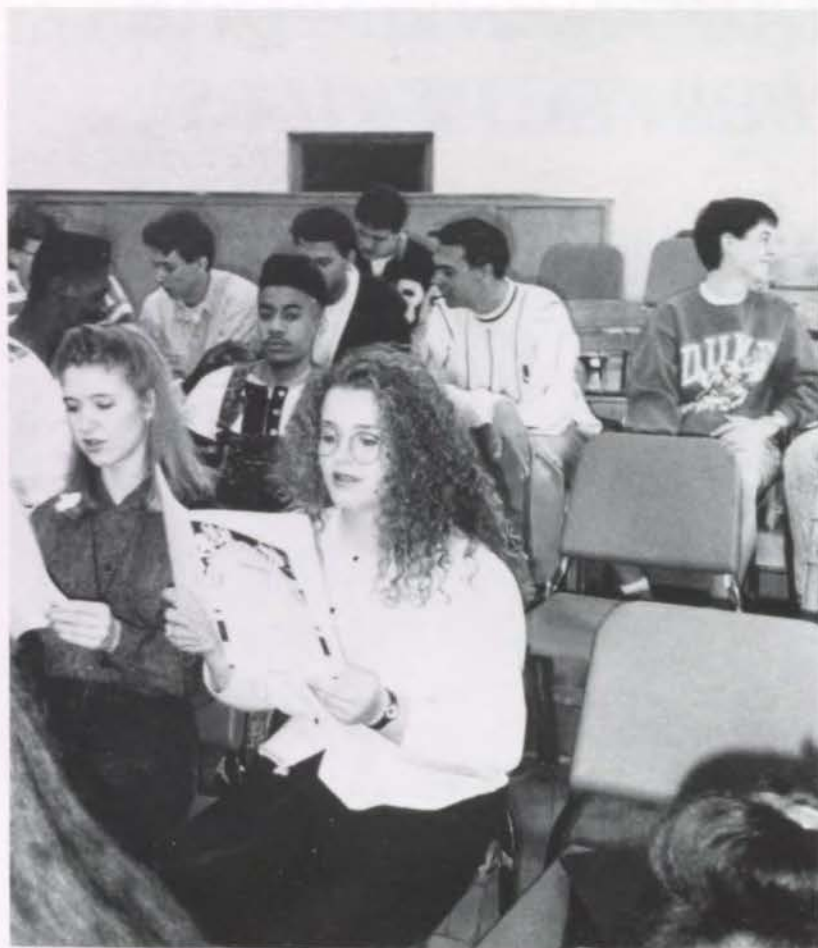

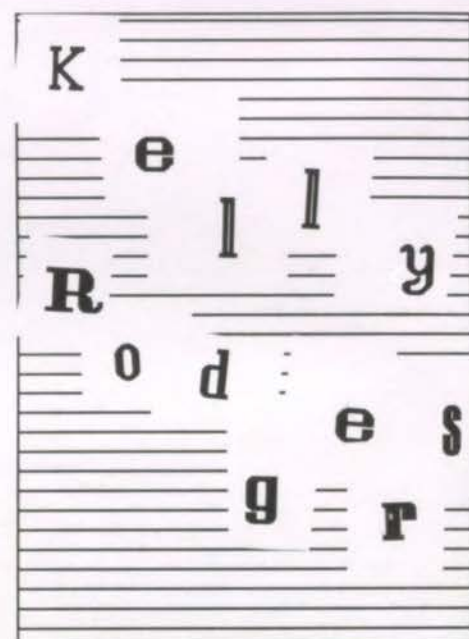




# EDITORS' PAGE
