


We came to realize that we didn't want to be numbers or slots punched in an IBM card with the warning to avoid bending, spindling, or mutilating.








Science Classes Attract The Students of Ability




Woodworking classes experimented with different kinds of saws with a special emphasis on the use and care of the table saw.











On February 28, 1970, the Ruskin AFROTC participated in the dedication of the new Ruskin Post Office.



Selling Homecoming mums was a big money-making project.









National Honor Society Makes Leaders of Future





Hi-Light Rated All-Missouri in MIPA Contests



Ruskin's Thespians Are Highspirited and Active








As a money-making project Rhetoricians sold chocolate candy bars. During the spring a bake sale was also held by debaters.



Burns-McDowell Send Speaker to Math Club






Members learned the basic procedures in operating ham radios. Using a five-band radio in room 101, they held contests to contact other ham operators with the contact code.

Four Main Subjects Make Up Curriculum of ROTC

Academically oriented, the Air Force Junior Reserve Officer's Training Courses consisted of four broad subject areas: (1) fundamentals of aerospace, (2) principles of aerospace, (3) people in aerospace, and (4) the military in American life.

Basic study in Aerospace Education I included the early beginnings of aviation, space exploration, modern aircraft, and weather. Cadets became acquainted with Air Force traditions, customs, and courtesies, flag etiquette, proper uniform dress, and basic military drill, movements and commands.


Pep Club Gives Foster Child a Helping Hand





Janna Bridges was head of the first five member squad. They taught members of the Pep Club new songs and cheers and led spectators at all football and basketball games.
























Ruskin Grapplers of 69-70 Have Improved Season

Ruskin's Baseball Team Cruises to an 8-5 Record



Yet, four hours before opening night, Madeline had to decline her position to Denise Kemple, junior, due to a throat ailment. The supporting characters were Karen Holloway, Mary Lee Wynn, and Stan Harmon. Student Council held its annual Snowball dance where Mary Lee Wynn was crowned queen. Nanci Moll and Alicia Chavez were her senior attendants. The senior student council officers were Lloyd Anderson, president; Mary Lee Wynn, secretary; and Gary Watkins, treasurer. After semester break, Ruskin held its first informal Basketball Homecoming. Lisa Riggs was crowned queen with Annette Price and Kerry Willoughby as senior attendants. The yearbook staff was headed by four returning seniors, Linda Ricketts, senior advisor; Karen Holloway, senior editor; Cherie Nugen, underclass editor; and Bill Yeager, business manager. Bob Palmer, editor, led the award-winning Hi-Light staff. Mike Floyd and Bob Palmer represented Ruskin as National Merit Finalists. Jack Ricketts and Mike Floyd were recognized as the top ranked students of the class. Their class averages were based on the scholastic rating since their freshman year. The Prom was held this year at the Hotel Muehlebach. The following week graduation ceremonies were performed at the RLDS auditorium on May 22. The final gathering for all the seniors. Yes, the final. We will never again be all the same or be all together again as we were when we turned our tassels from the left to the right.

The colorful history of Hickman Mills dates back to 1795 when Daniel Morgan came to Missouri. In 1885, Union Point School was established as the first public school. In 1901, the Missouri General Assembly enacted a law which permitted two or more districts to consolidate into one and by vote of the people, vote bonds for the construction of a high school. This, in the spring of 1902, Consolidated District No. 1 became the first district in the state to take advantage of this law. The high school was built during the summer and 25 students enrolled in September. The school was named for John Ruskin, the English art critic, writer, and social reformer. The cost of the original school was \$3,250.

In 1939, the original Ruskin High School, located at approximately 107th and Blue Ridge, became outgrown. Housing development was booming in the early 1950's and toddlers and tricycles began to replace grazing cattle in the meadows. The need to provide schools was acute, and patrons of the district again rose to the occasion, and since 1954 have voted bonds and levies to construct 12 ultra modern schools and make additions to others. A second high school is presently under construction.

The third Ruskin High School was opened in 1955; but on May 20, 1957, a devastating tornado struck and destroyed most of the building. The present building was completed in 1958 and has had some additions since that time.

Just before the Thanksgiving holiday in 1956, the student

body was presented a school flag made by Mrs. Helen Emery. At the dedication ceremony, Mr. Blaine E. Steck, principal, introduced Mrs. Emery, a Ruskin graduate. She told about the student body fifty years ago to the day they met and selected the golden eagle as the emblem and blue and gold as school colors.

Not enough can be said about this emblem. It is revered by students, former students, and members of the community. A certain spirit centers around this colorful emblem as it enjoys a prime resting place in the floor near the main entrance at the school. It must never be stepped upon. If by accident this should occur, the offender is required to shine the eagle. This has become a favorite means of initiating lower classmen entering Ruskin.

Ruskin High School is widely known and well respected throughout the state. The school enjoys a AAA rating from the State Department of Education, is accredited by North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges, is a member of the Suburban Eight Conference, and ranks high in competition in both academic and athletic events.

Yes, Ruskin is a proud school! Its enthusiasm and spirit overflows into the community and tends to unite the community on issues so important to the future. It has had a long historical past but many pages of progressive history are still to unfold. True to its emblem, the Golden Eagle, the school tries to "flap its wings less and soar higher and more graceful than all others."














Juniors
