

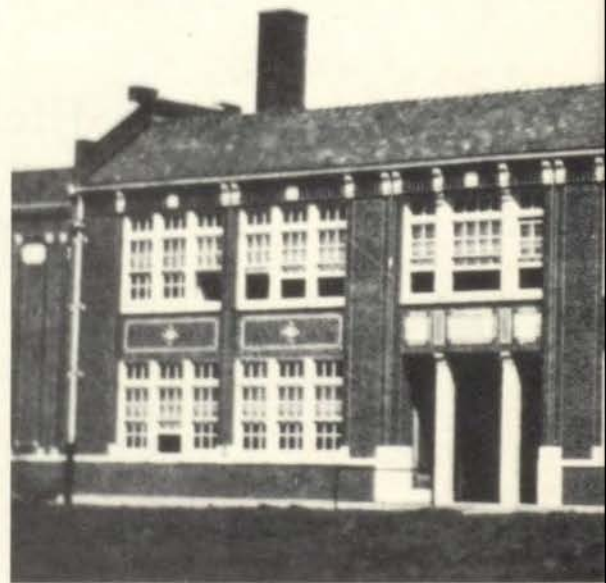


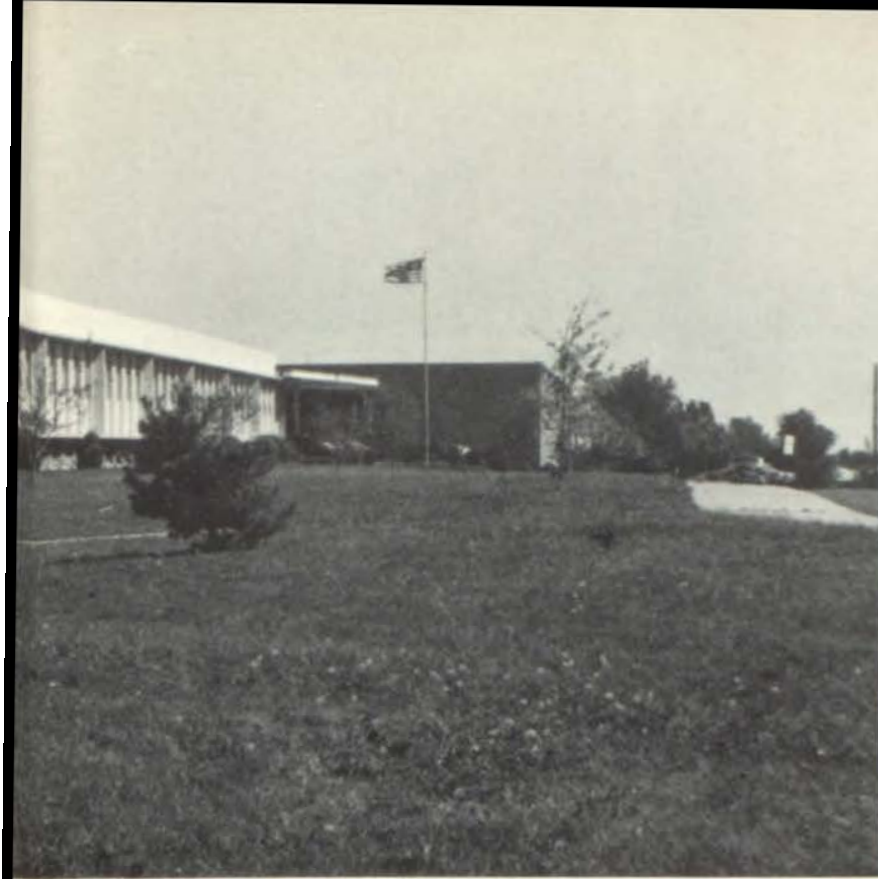

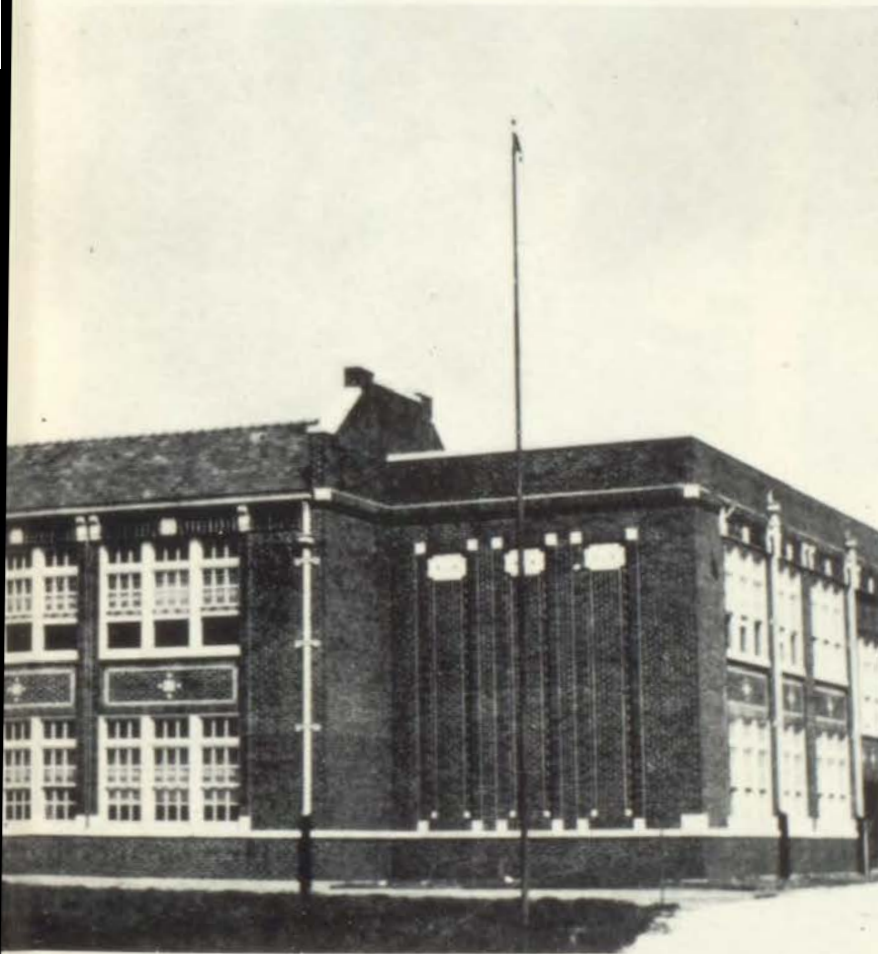

1930-55. The ROTC performs at an assembly.

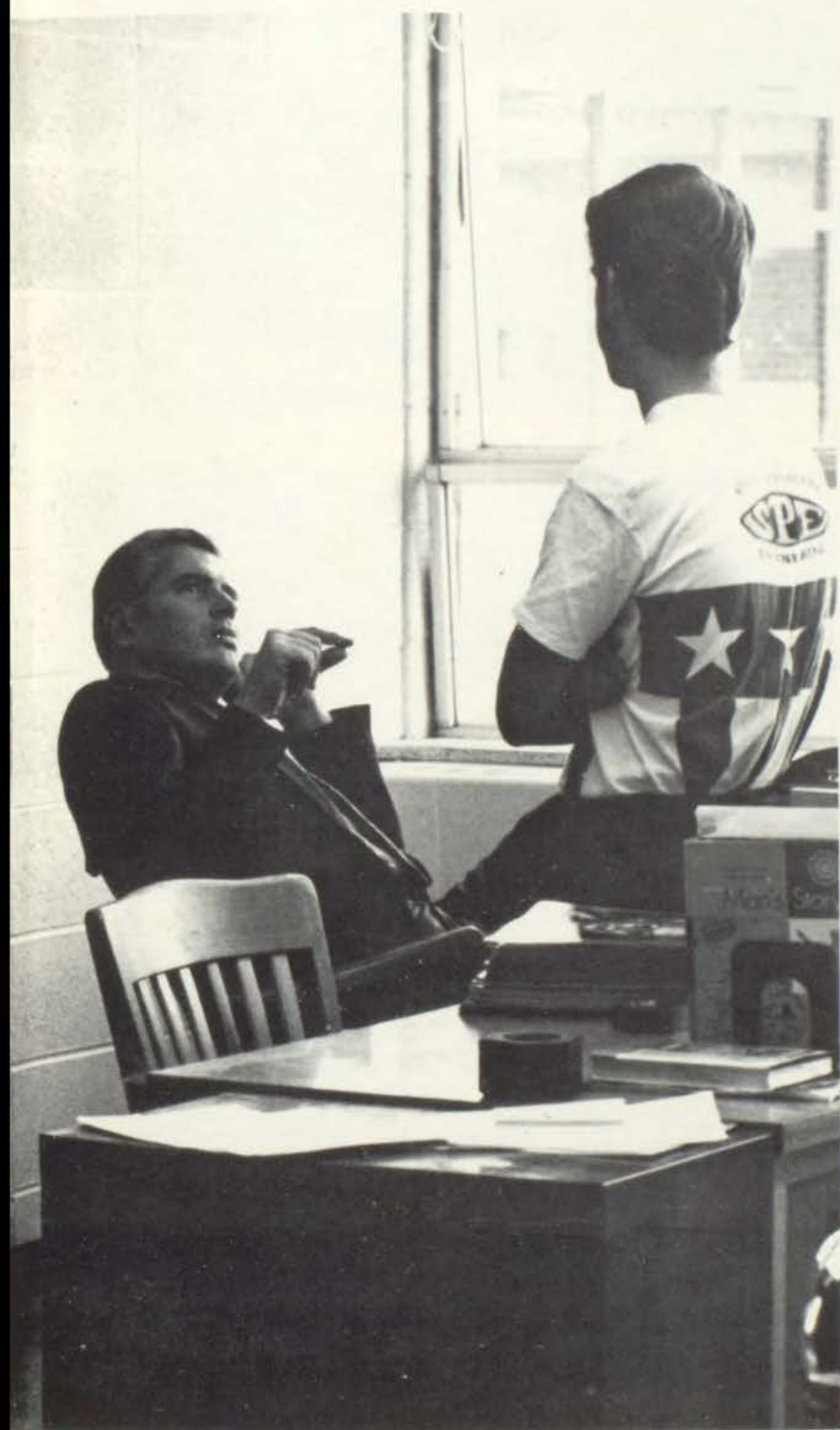

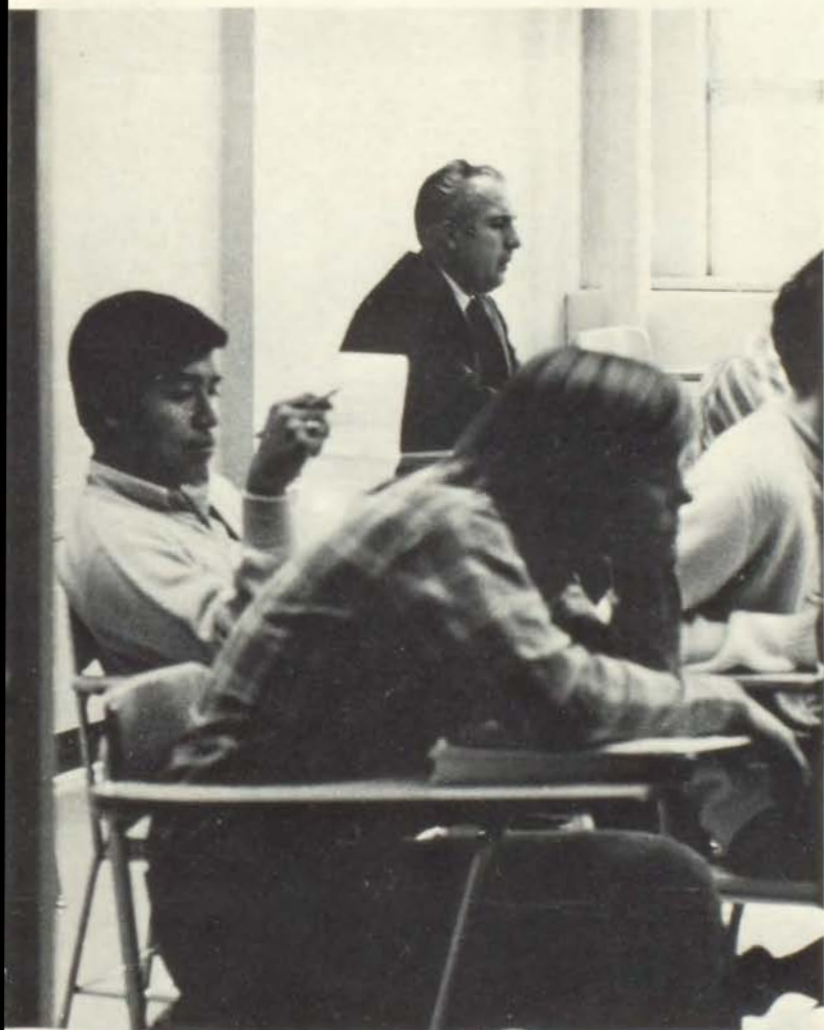

Mr. Wrisinger said that the "overall purpose of the vocational business program is to prepare the students to find useful employment in business and clerical fields upon graduation from high school. However, many secretarial and clerical skills are useful for the college-bound student who needs part-time work during summers and vacations. Bookkeeping, law, and general business knowledge are useful to all students, whether work-bound or college-bound, for understanding of the American business economy."

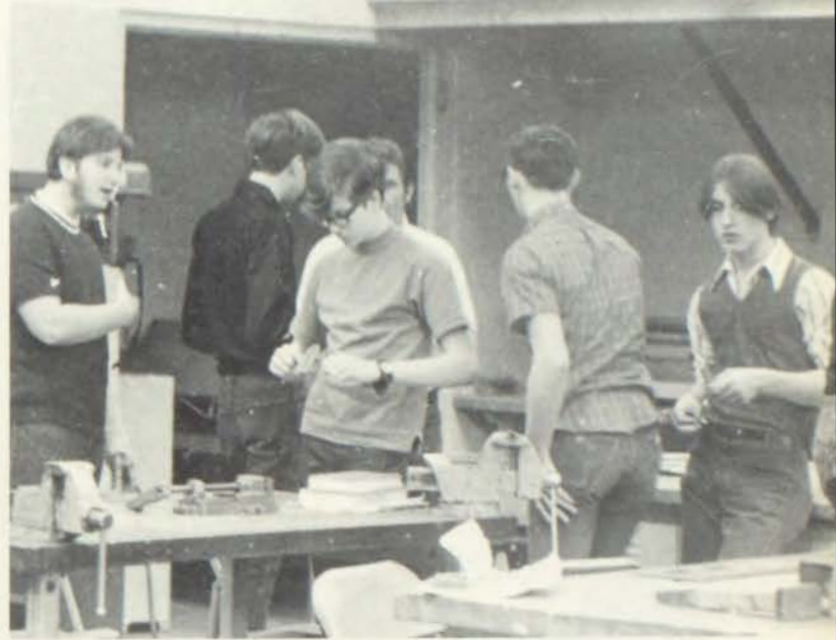

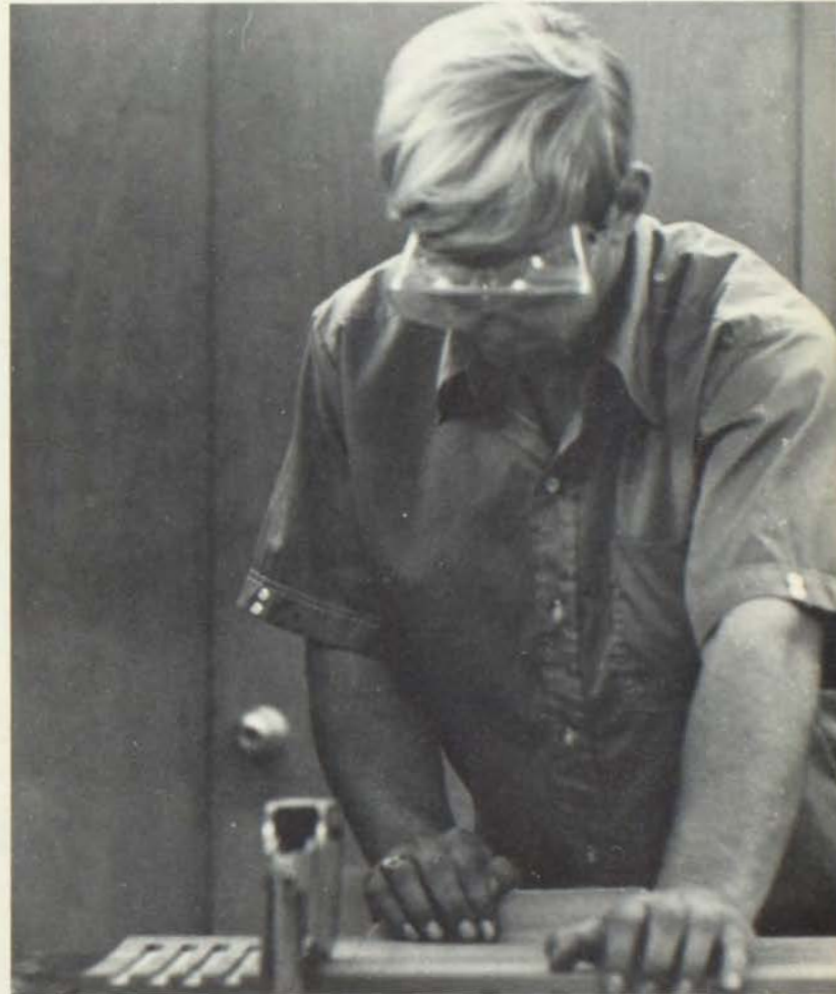

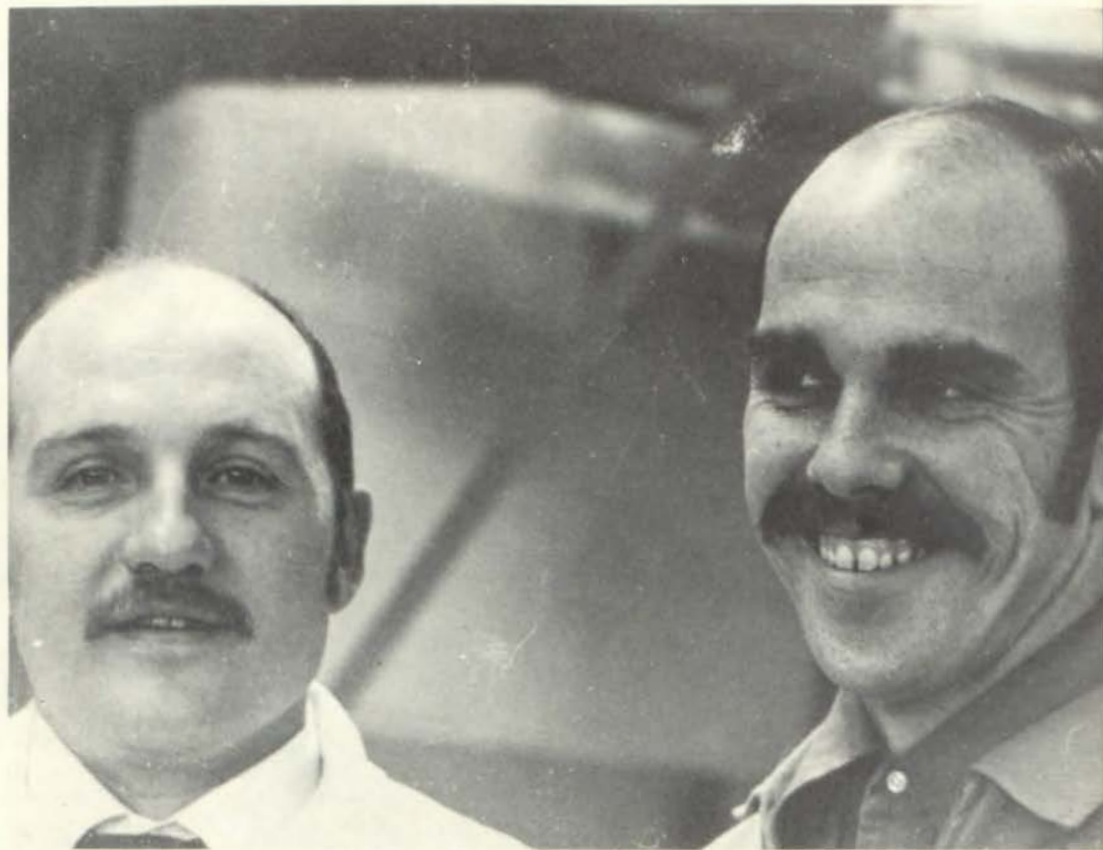

History Courses Varied to Meet Student Needs

Ruskin's history courses this year consisted of world history II, American history, Missouri history, contemporary issues, and American and comparative government.

The chief aim of the Missouri history course was to give pupils a greater appreciation of our state and to make them conscious of the resources and the varied opportunities which Missouri affords its citizens. It also brought out the part played by Missouri in the western development of the United States.

American government and comparative government were sequential courses. The aim of American government was to impress upon the student the responsibility of citizenship for the development of better government. The students learned how the state has grown from a simple organization to the complex society of today. The structure and operation of the national, state, and local governments was studied along with social and political problems. In comparative government, the student was given a comparative understanding of the relationships which exist between the American democratic system and various systems of government present in other parts of the world. The relationships and differences between the three "isms" were studied, that is, capitalism, socialism, and communism.

Geography included a study of the economic, social, and physical science of the world with emphasis on the United States. The course was designed to help the student achieve a better understanding of the influence of geography on the culture and economic progress of the world.

Psychology, the scientific study of human behavior, dealt with the reasons for people's actions. The purpose of the course was to aid the student in understanding himself and others.

Family relations prepared the students to meet the premarital and post-marital demands they will face in the future. Open class and group discussion covered every subject from dating behavior to the needs of senior citizens in a rapidly changing society.

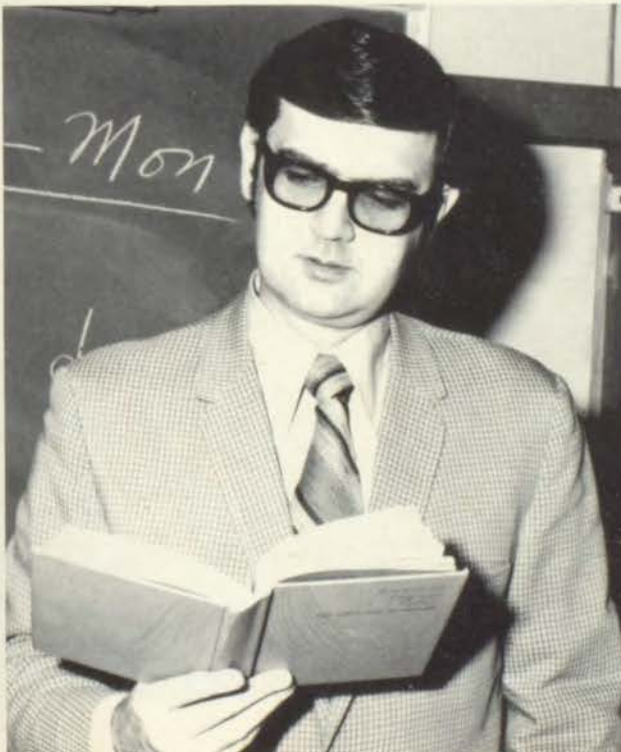
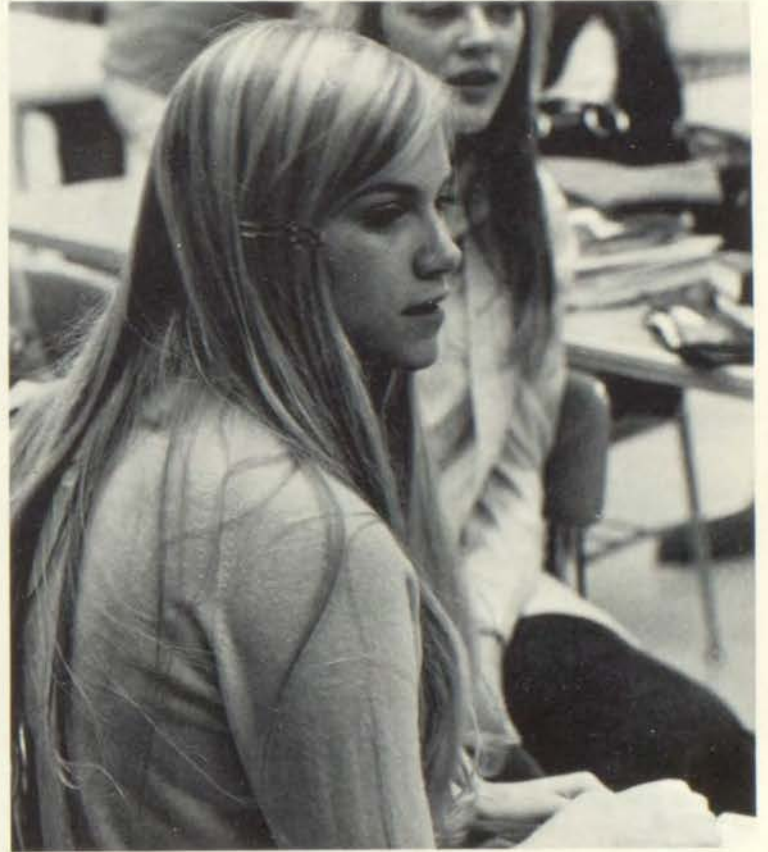

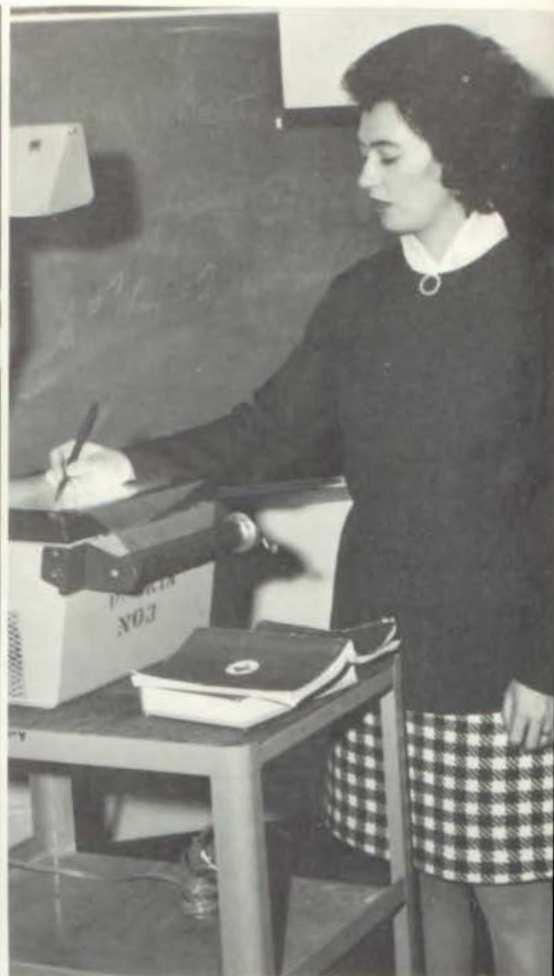

Ruskin's Mathematics Department Again Headed By Mrs. Ellen Skaggs

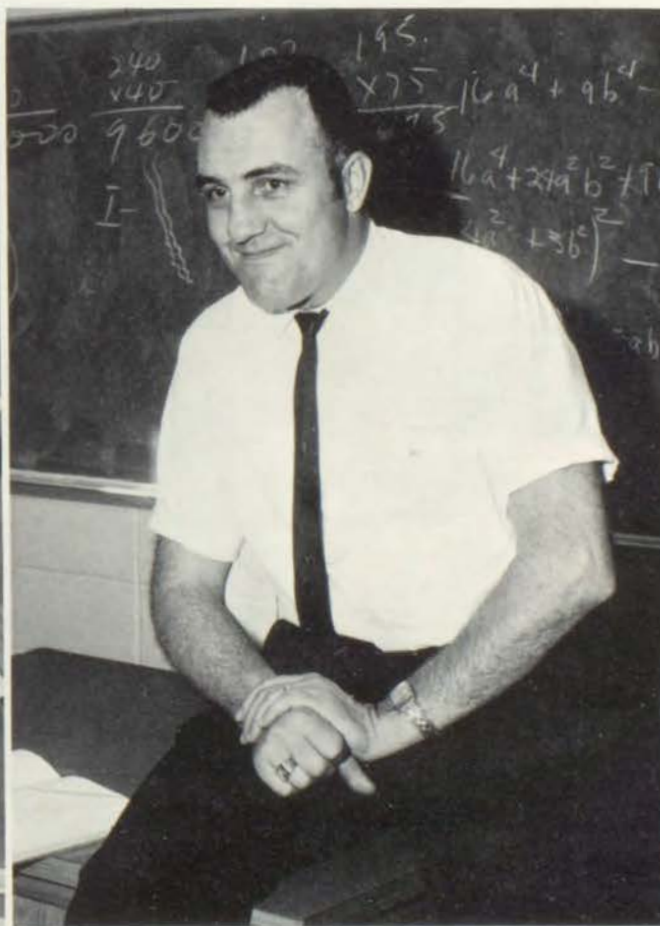
The basic purpose of the Ruskin mathematics department on the senior high level was to prepare students to do related work in college and in industry. Mrs. Ellen Skaggs was the department head this year. She felt that the courses offered gave review in basic arithmetic and algebra and introduced the student to more advanced mathematical concepts.

The five major divisions in the department were algebra I, algebra II, geometry, mathematical analysis and trigonometry, and senior math. 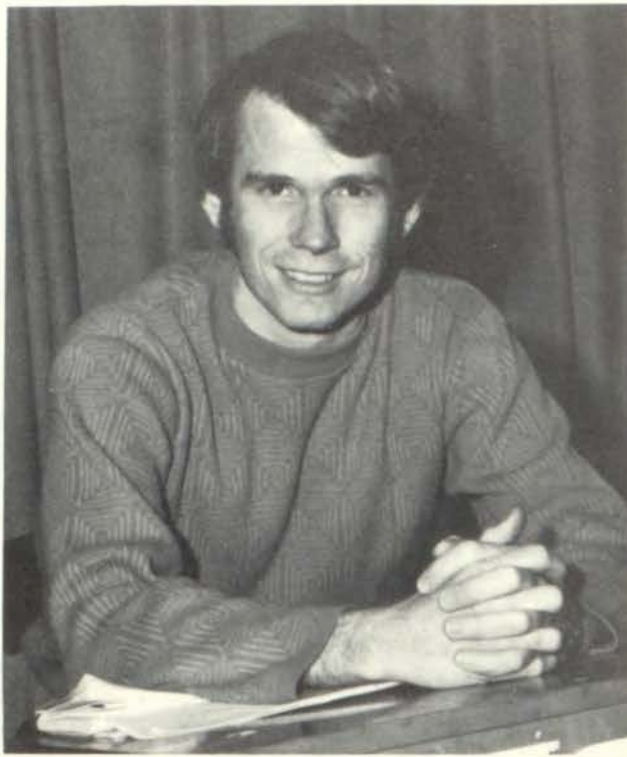

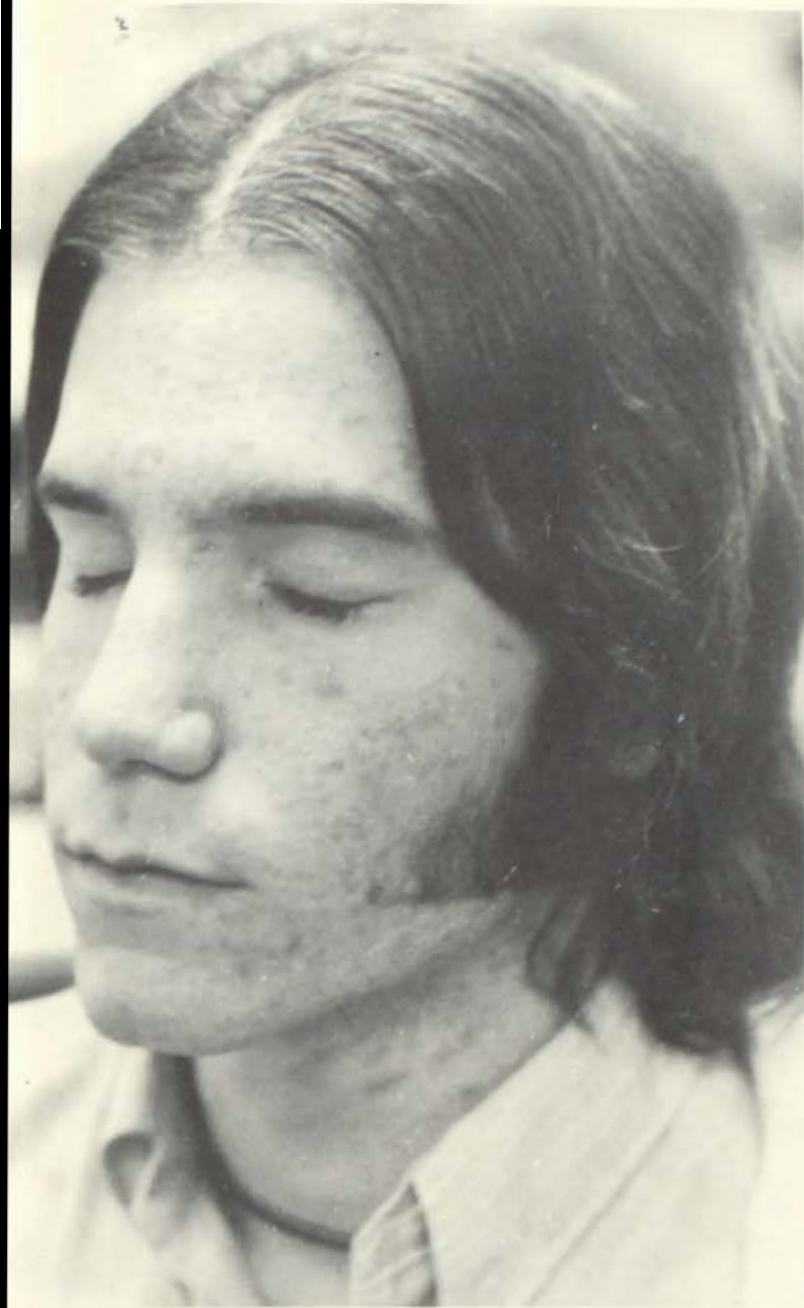

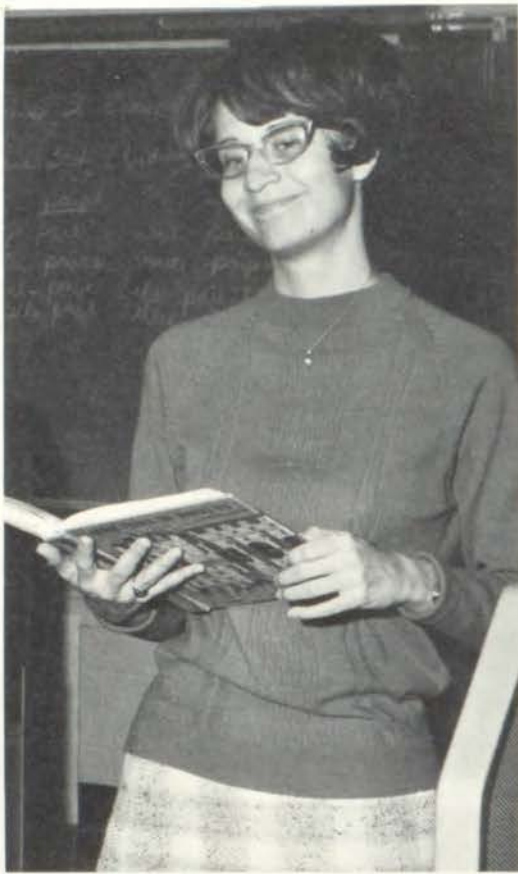
The Debate Team attended several tournaments this year in competition with area schools. Included were the Mexico, Conference, and District tournaments, and the State tournament which was held this Spring.

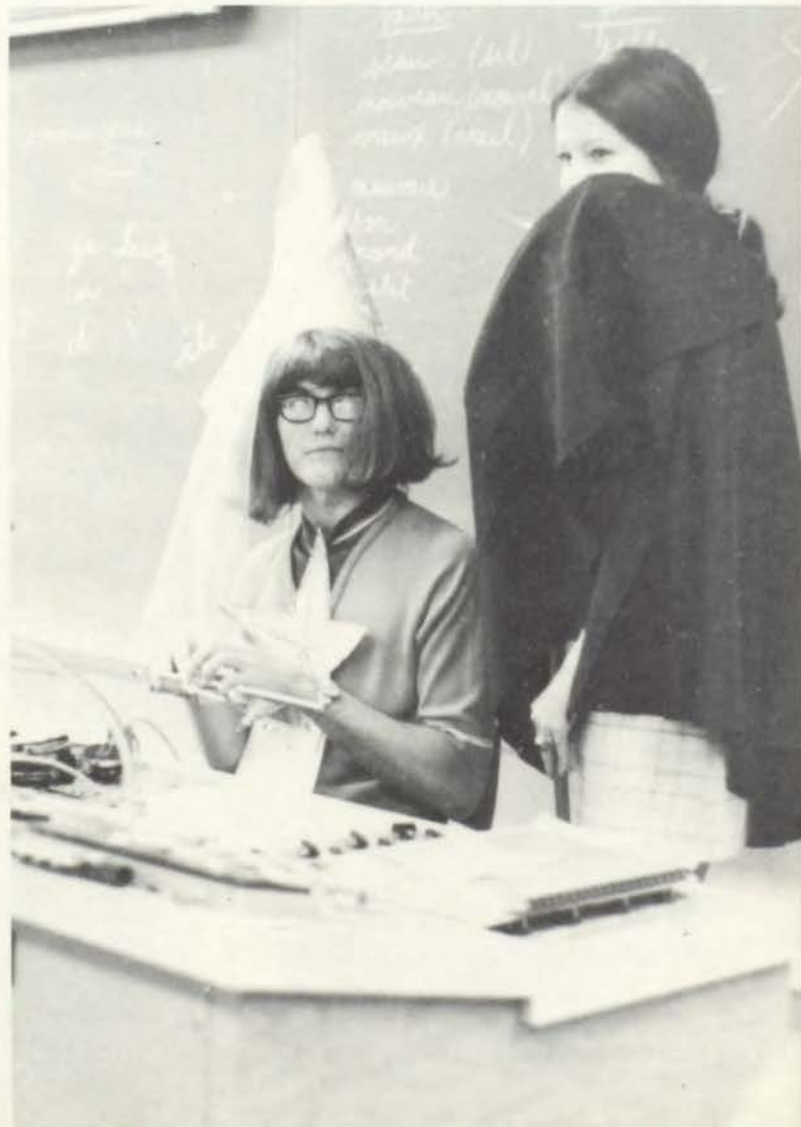

Oftentimes, what happens in the special education classes is a mystery to Ruskin students. This year, the *1971 Mirage* hopes to clear up that mystery.

Under the guidance of Mr. Roy Beers and Mrs. Mary Wille, twenty-seven students received extensive education in vocational fields to prepare them for the life they will enter upon graduation from high school. When these students leave Ruskin, they will take with them the knowledge necessary to acquire jobs in home decoration, furniture upholstery, sewing, woodworking, and many other vocations.

Activities included baking for special school events, making toys for hospitalized children, operating the Eagle's Nest, and selling homecoming mums.

Special education students had a social life, too: they attended an annual dinner-dance sponsored by Air Force personnel at Richards-Gebaur Air Base, took field trips to places of interest, and planned and attended parties for special occasions.

Overall, the basic goals of the curriculum were to improve the student's self-image and to develop better social adjustment, two ambitions that all classes, everywhere, should strive to attain.

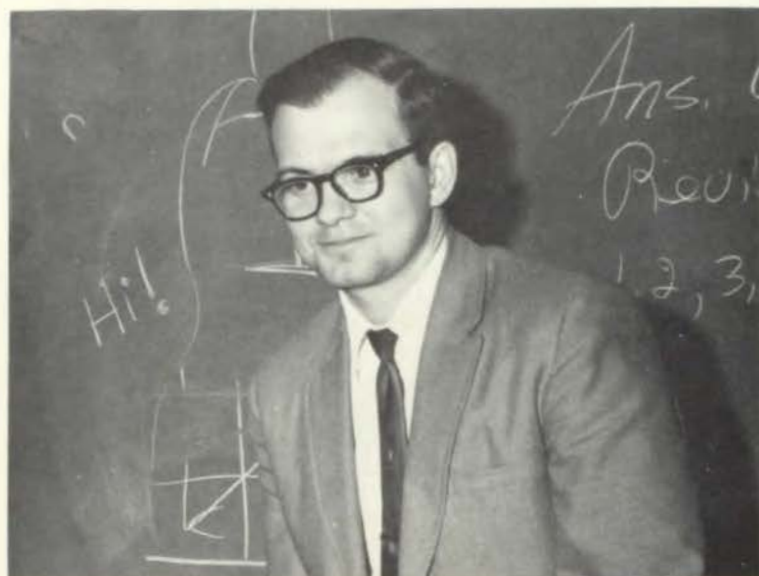

Research And Experiments Held In Science Classes

Research and experimentation were the main activities undertaken by students enrolled in science classes. Biology classes dissected frogs, worms, and crayfish, worked with microscopes, and made detailed insect collections. Chemistry students studied chemical reactions and properties, and learned to apply mathematical formulas to basic scientific principles. The study of the human body, with special emphasis on bones, muscles, and glands, was the basic curriculum of physiology classes. Problems in science research was offered as a college prep course for students who showed an interest in science as a career.

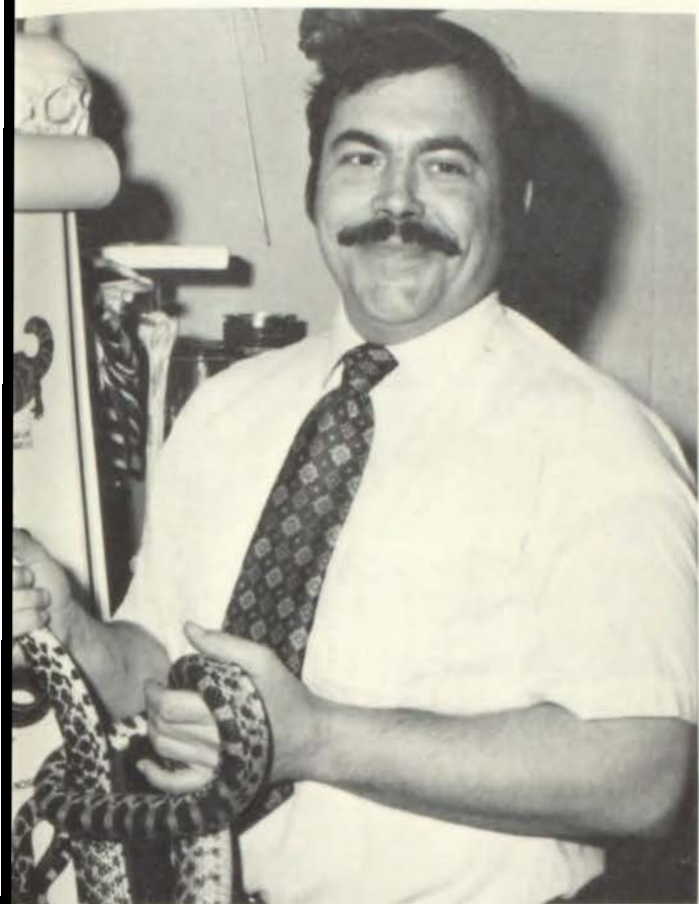

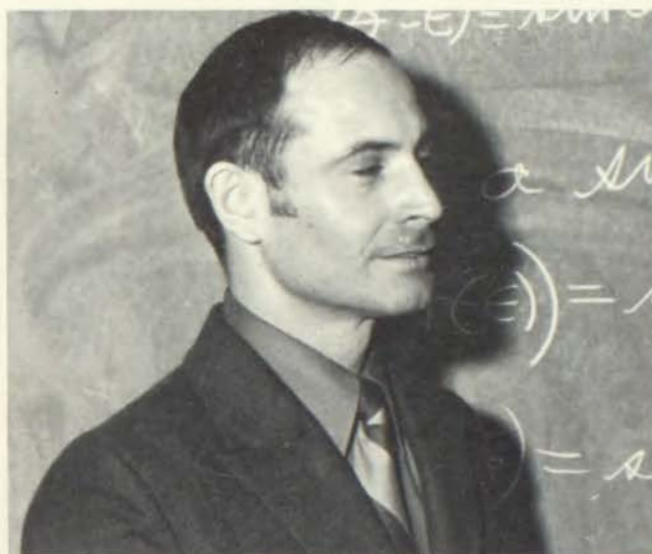

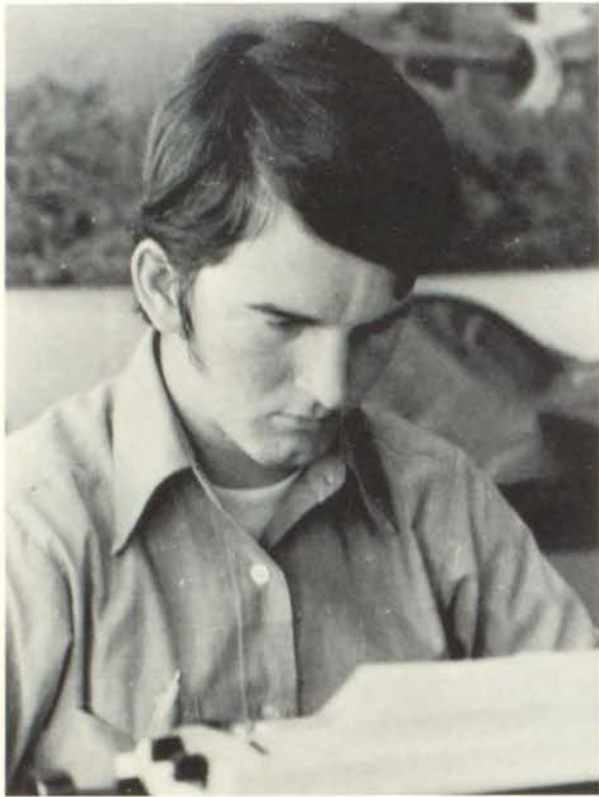

Hi-Light Awarded Top MIPA Honors

This year's Ruskin newspaper, the "Hi-Light," was published monthly by the Creative Writing class. Mr. Arch Wrisinger was the faculty advisor and Vicki Beatty served as editor. Staff members developed insight into the world of newspaper journalism as they gained experience in interviewing, editing, and accurate reporting. Between issues, the class wrote short stories, poems, and essays, many of which were submitted early in May for entry into *Missouri's Youth Writes*. This booklet, sponsored by the Missouri Association of English Teachers, is published annually and contains written work of students in junior and senior high schools all over Missouri. The 1970 issue of *Youth Writes* contained 23 entries by last year's Creative Writing students, making Ruskin the largest single contributing school in Missouri.

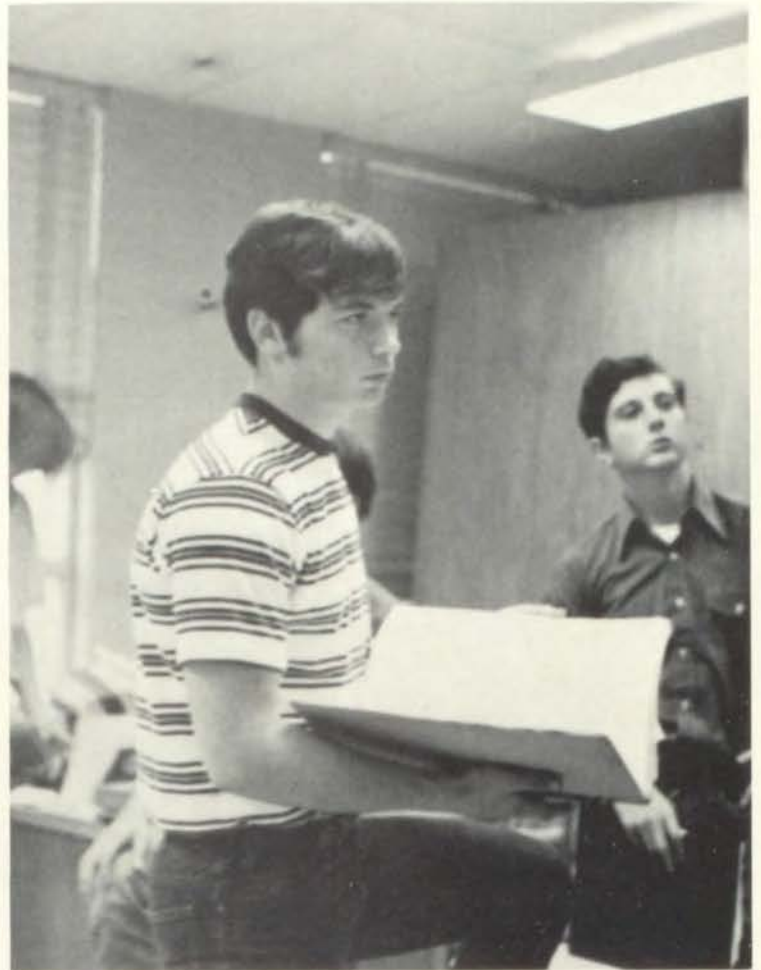

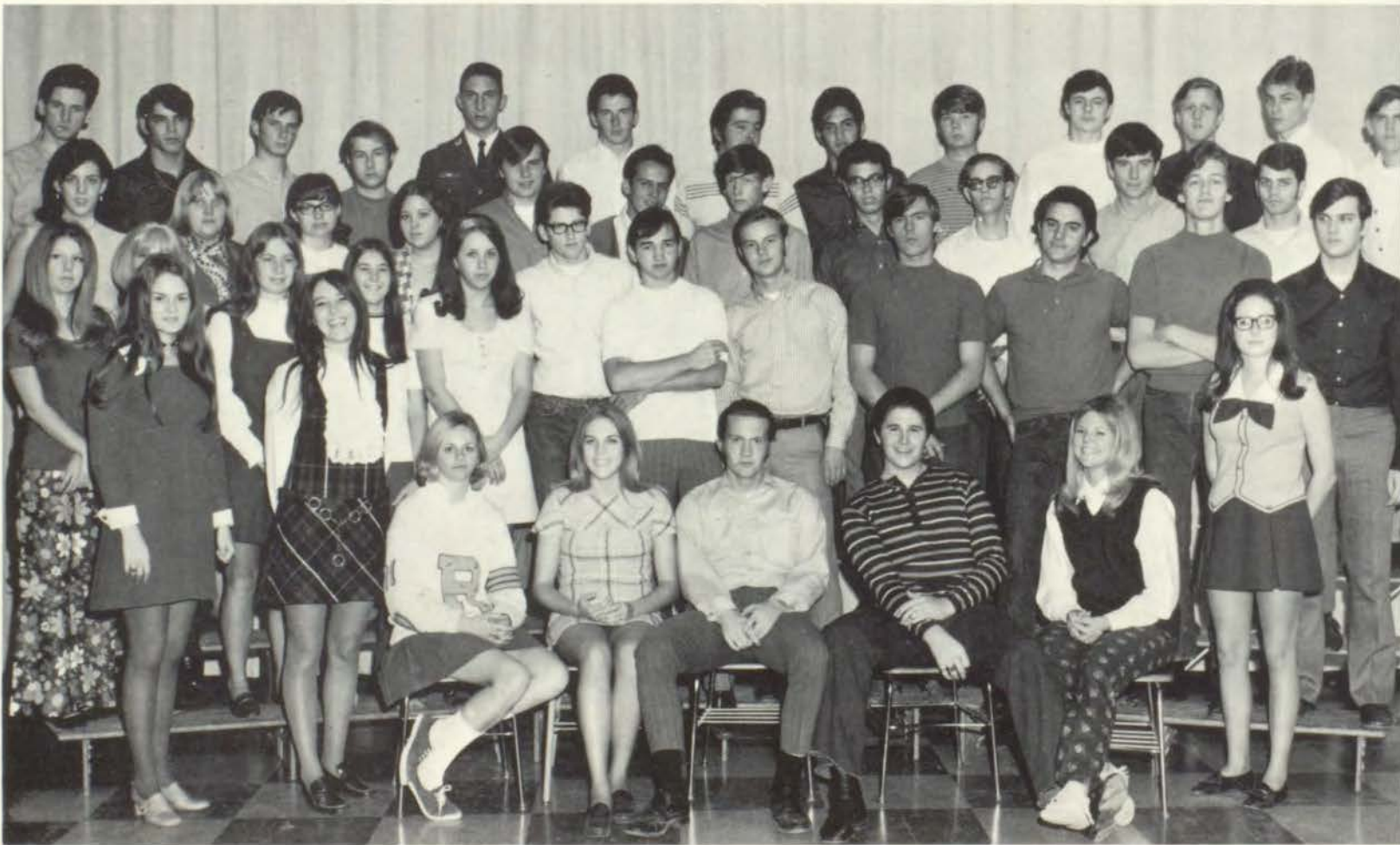

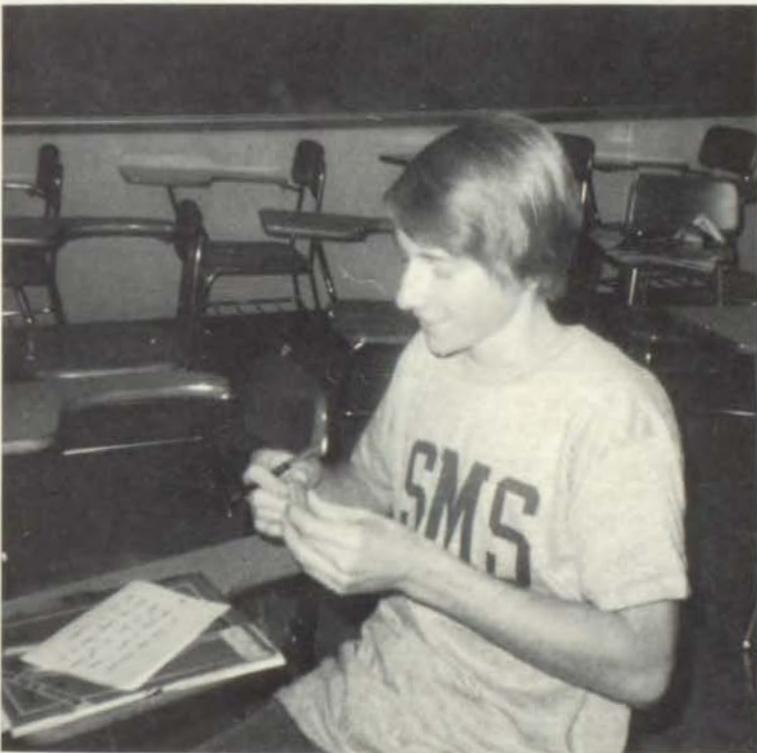

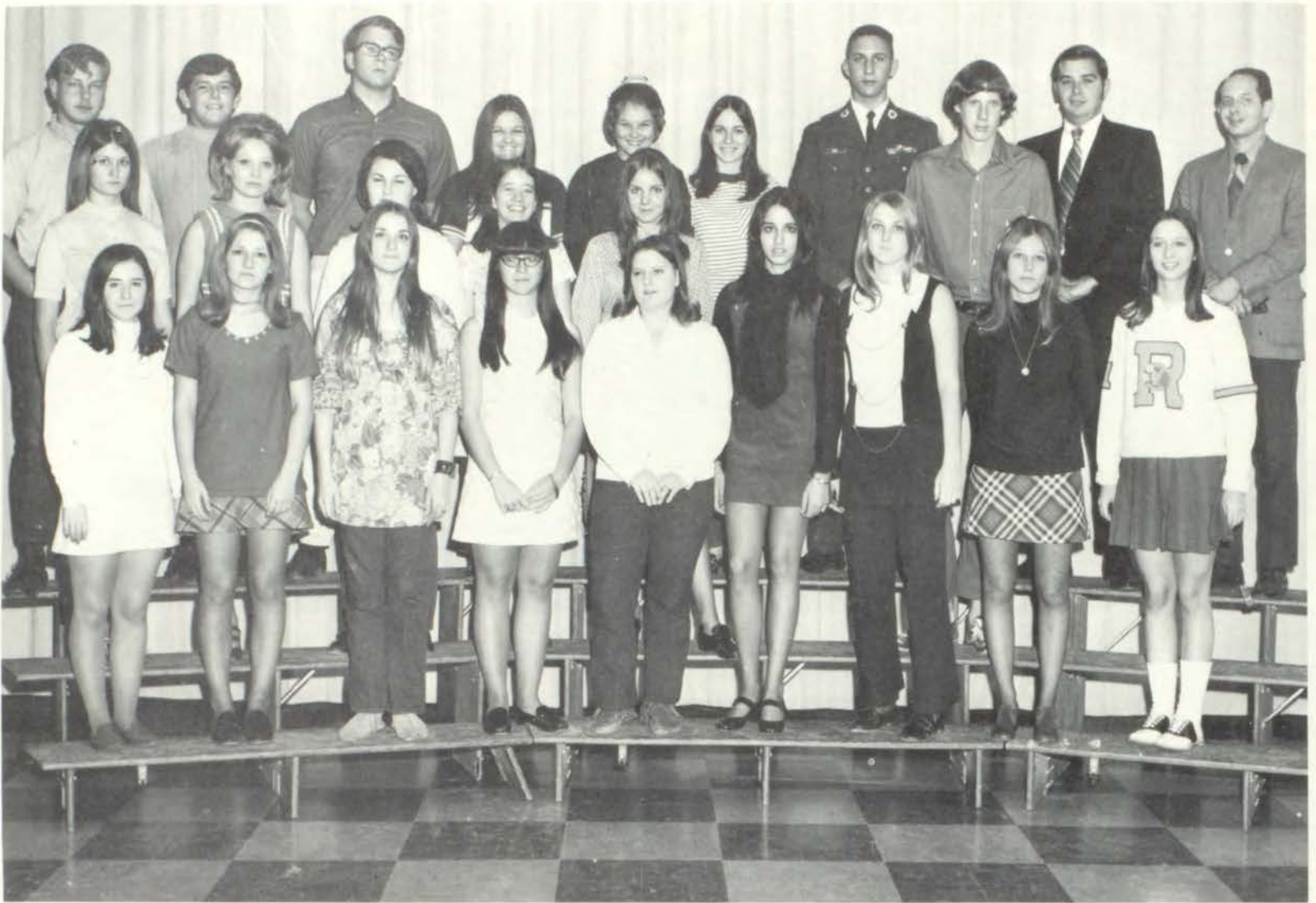

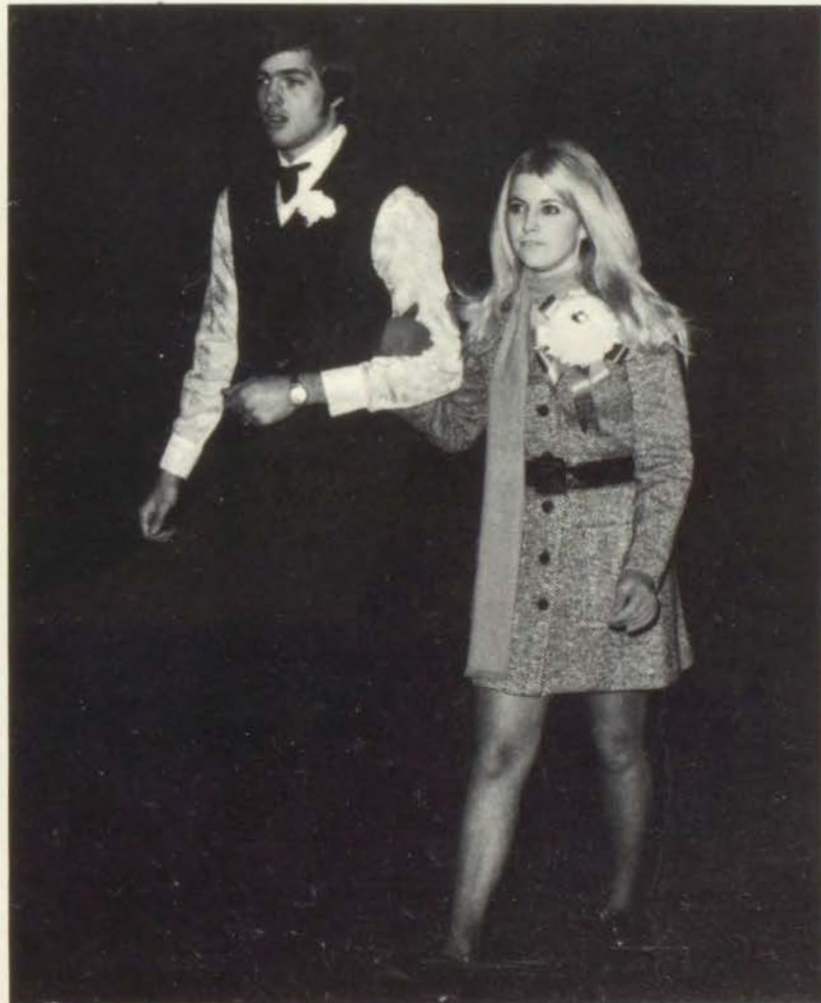

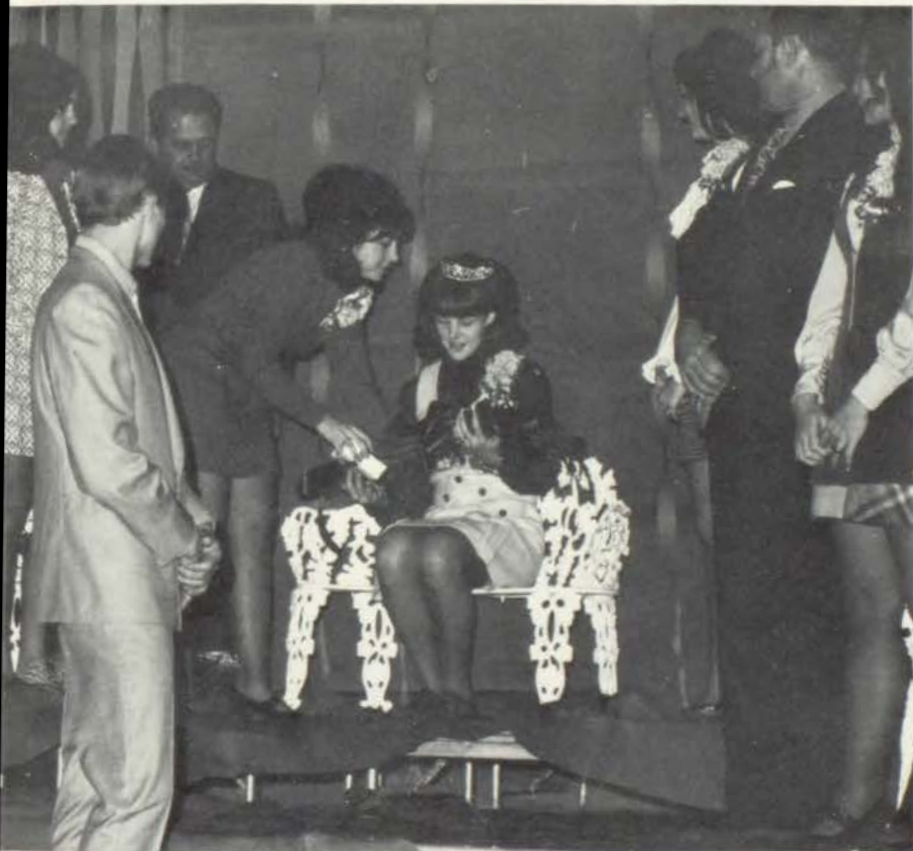
Hudgins Crowned Queen In The "Spirit Of '71"

Under the leadership of Coach Gerald Partridge and his staff, the Ruskin Eagles emerged from the football season with a 4-6 win-loss record. The opening game of the season was played against Lee's Summit on September 11, ten days before the beginning of school. Ruskin was overcome 14 to 0. Due to a boundary realignment, the final game of the five year old Ruskin-Grandview feud was played on September 18. The Grandview Bulldogs inched out the Eagles 20 to 19. Grandview won the feud by winning three games to our two. Our next game was played against Oak Park on the 25th of September with Oak Park taking it 21 to 15. October 2nd showed Ruskin lose to Raytown 21 to 0. Homecoming followed on the 9th of October with Ruskin shutting out Truman 17 to 0. The Ruskin-North Kansas City game ended with NKC pushing to a 7 to 0 win. A three game winning streak began on October 23rd when the Eagles fought to a 24 to 0 win over Rockhurst. Unable to bypass Ruskin on October 30th Raytown South lost 7 to 6. William Chrisman was trampled on November 6th when they lost to Ruskin 28 to 14. The final game of the season was played against Center on November 13 with the Eagles falling seven points behind to lose 14 to 7.

This was the first year of the sophomore football team at Ruskin. Under the leadership of Coach Larry Frazier and his staff, the underclassmen pulled through the season with a 6-1-1 record, giving them first place in conference.

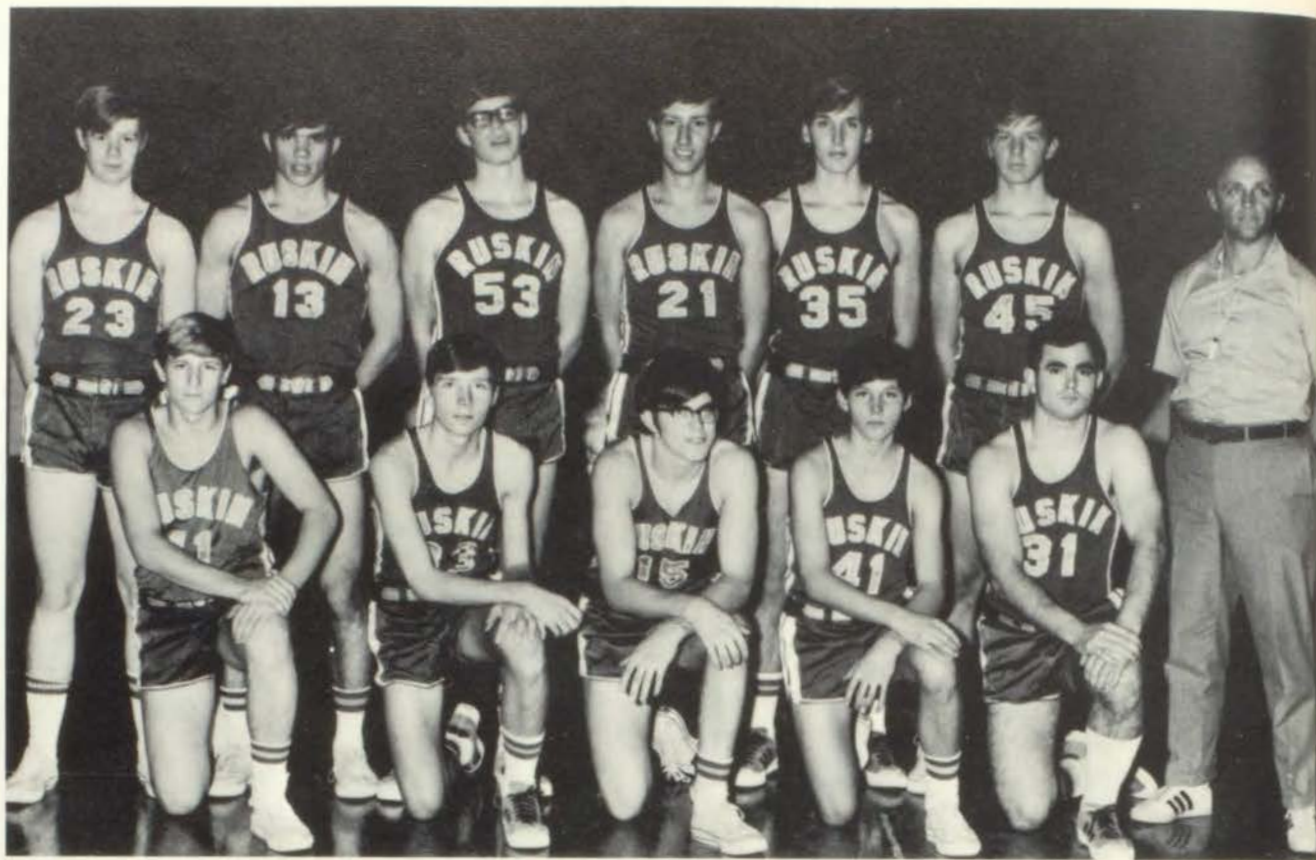

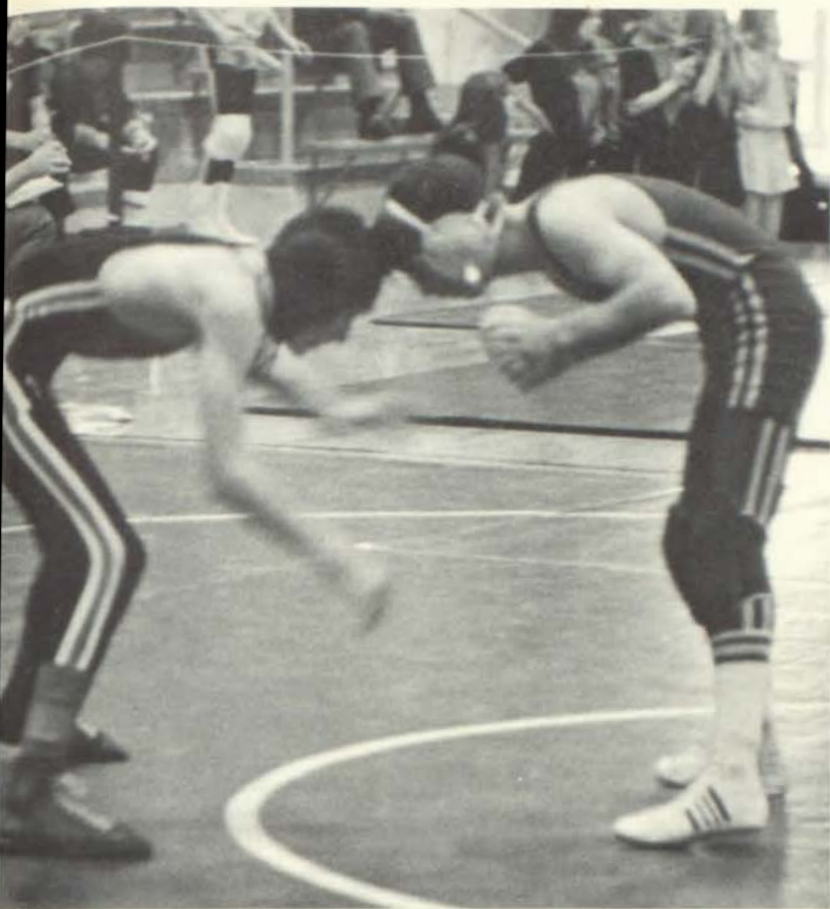

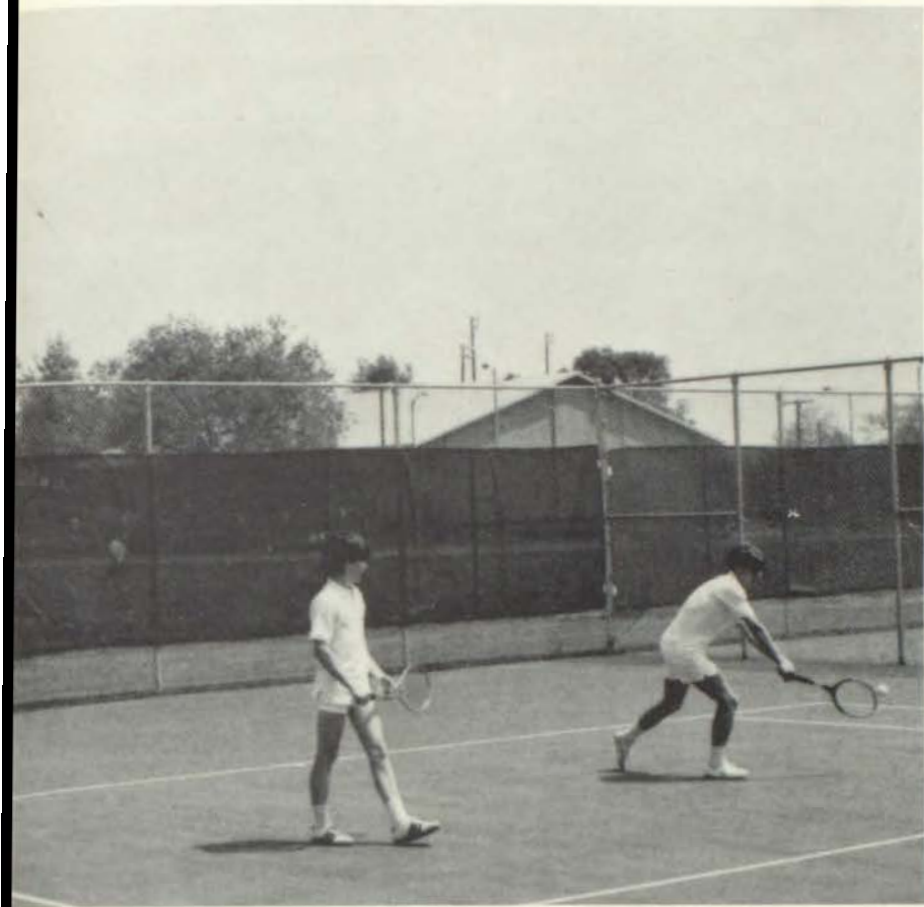

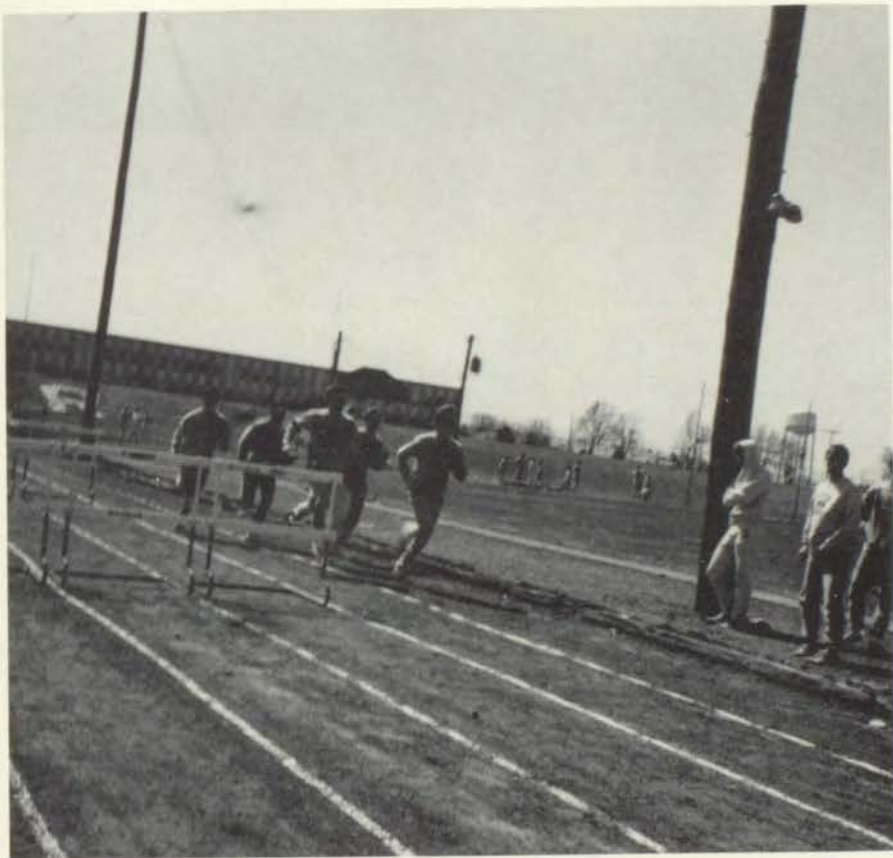




Ruskin Records Broken By Two

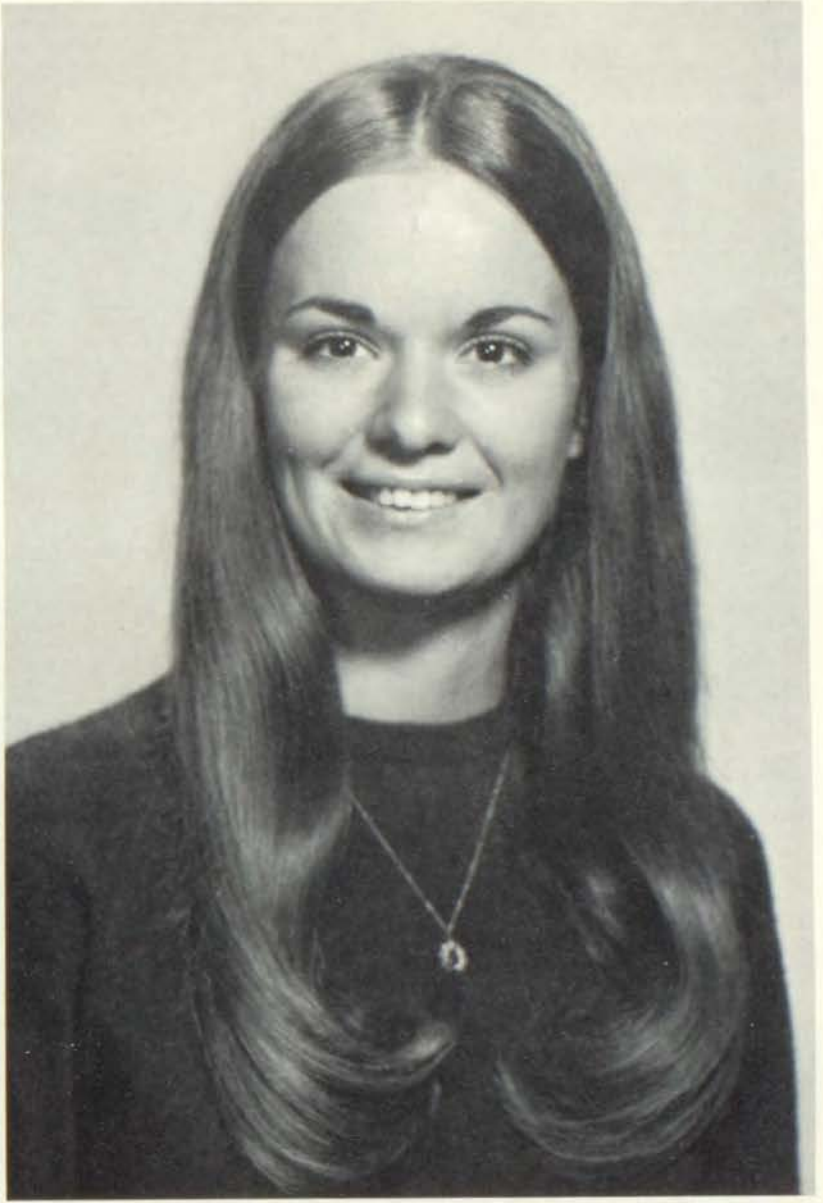
1971 Graduation Theme Was "Happiness Is. . ."

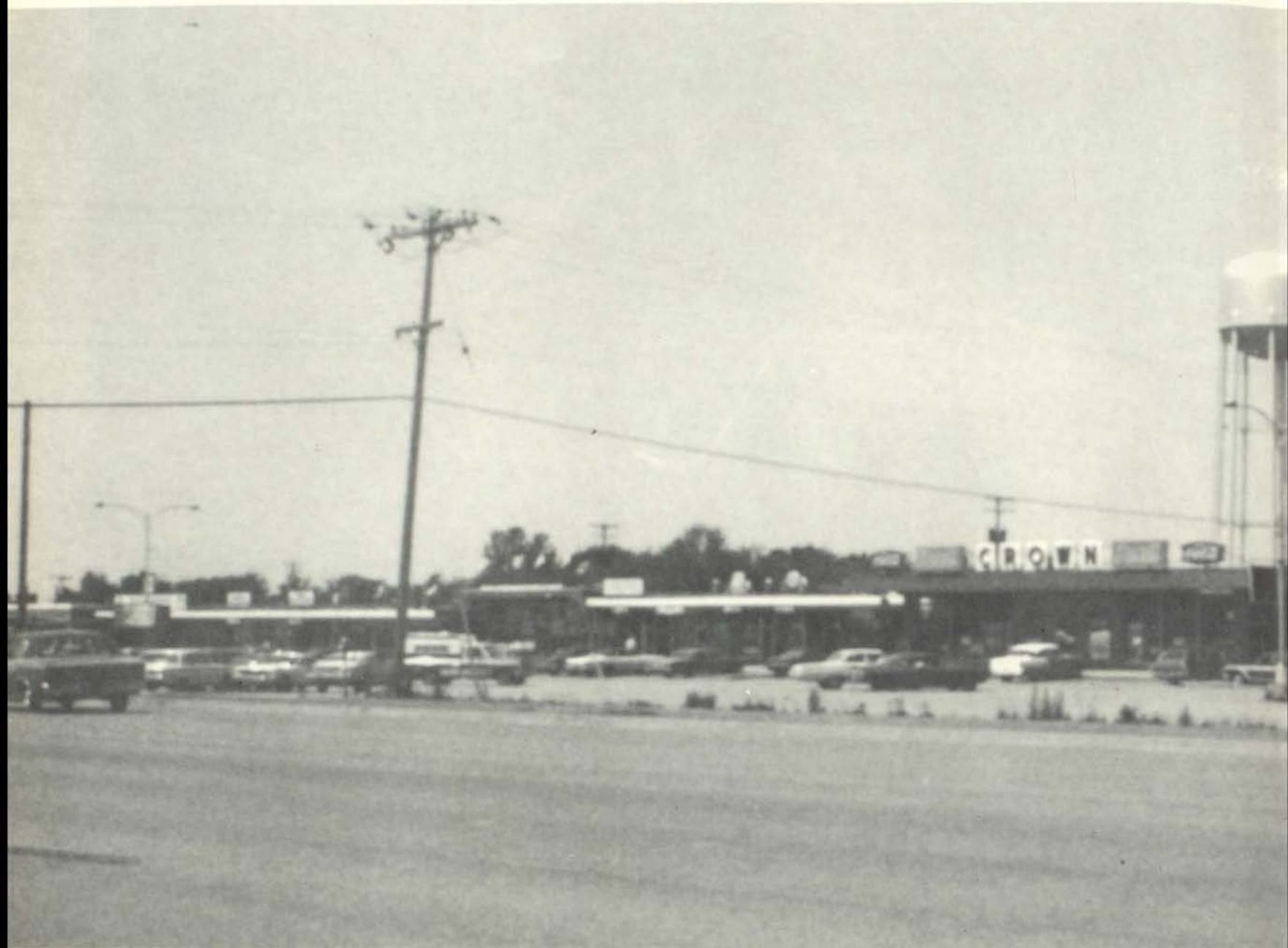
Lunn, Vice-President, Debbie Wesson, Secretary, and Jo Floyd, Treasurer.

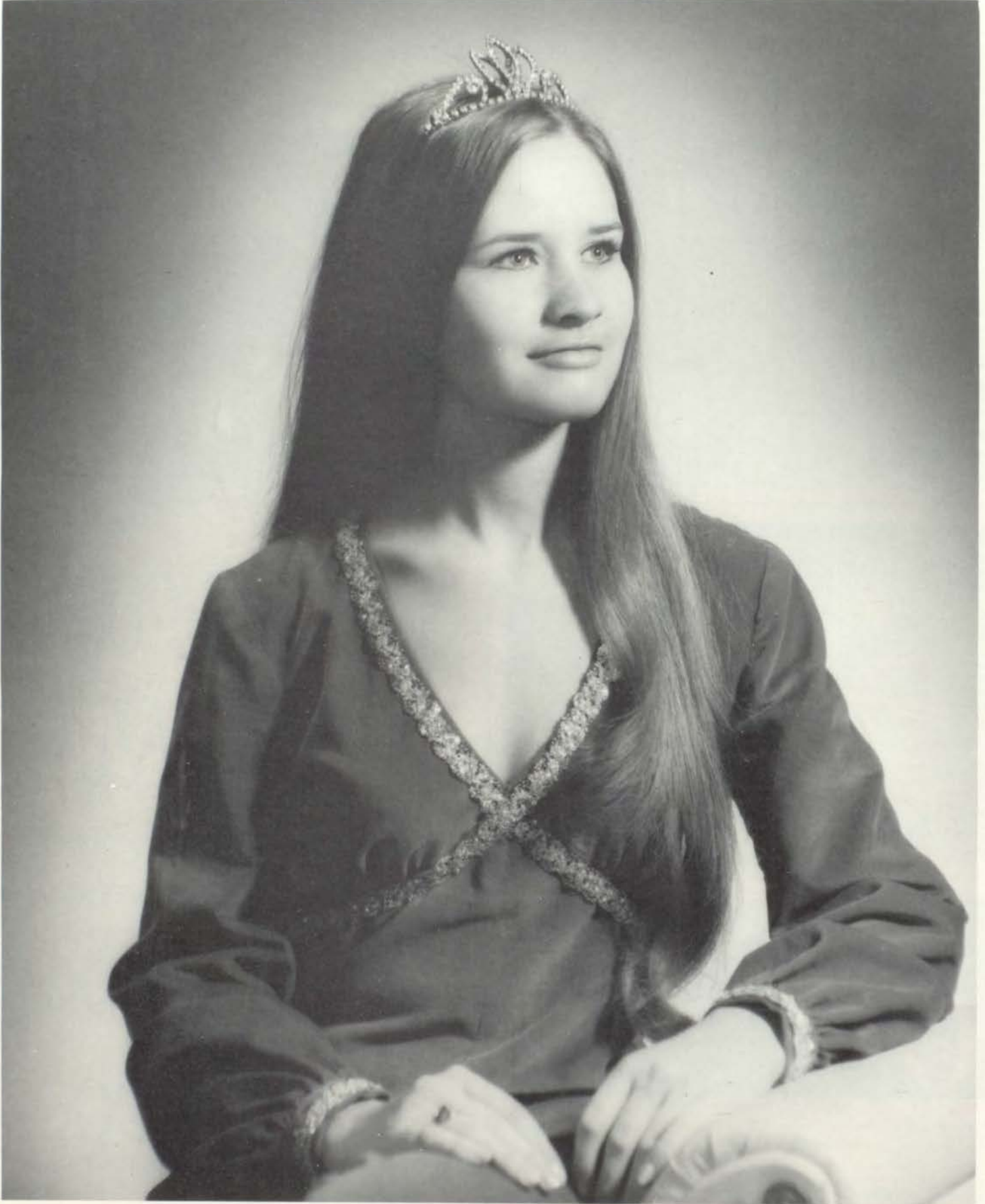

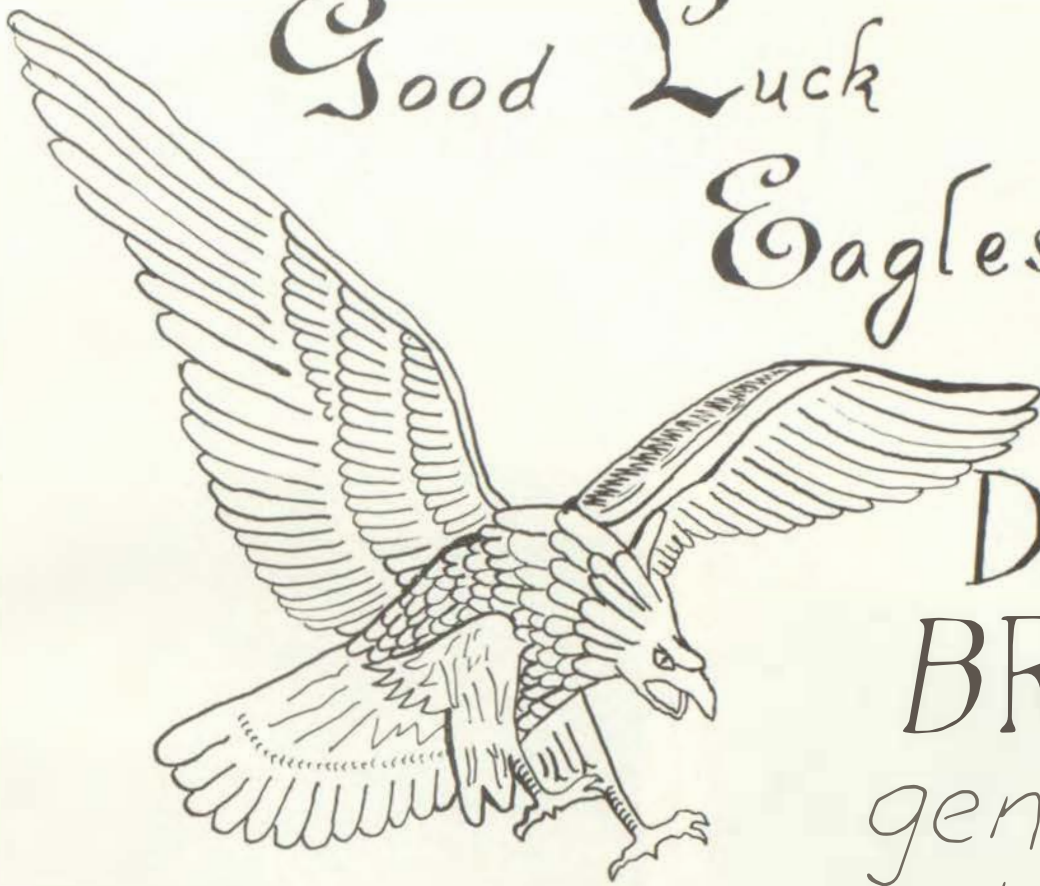

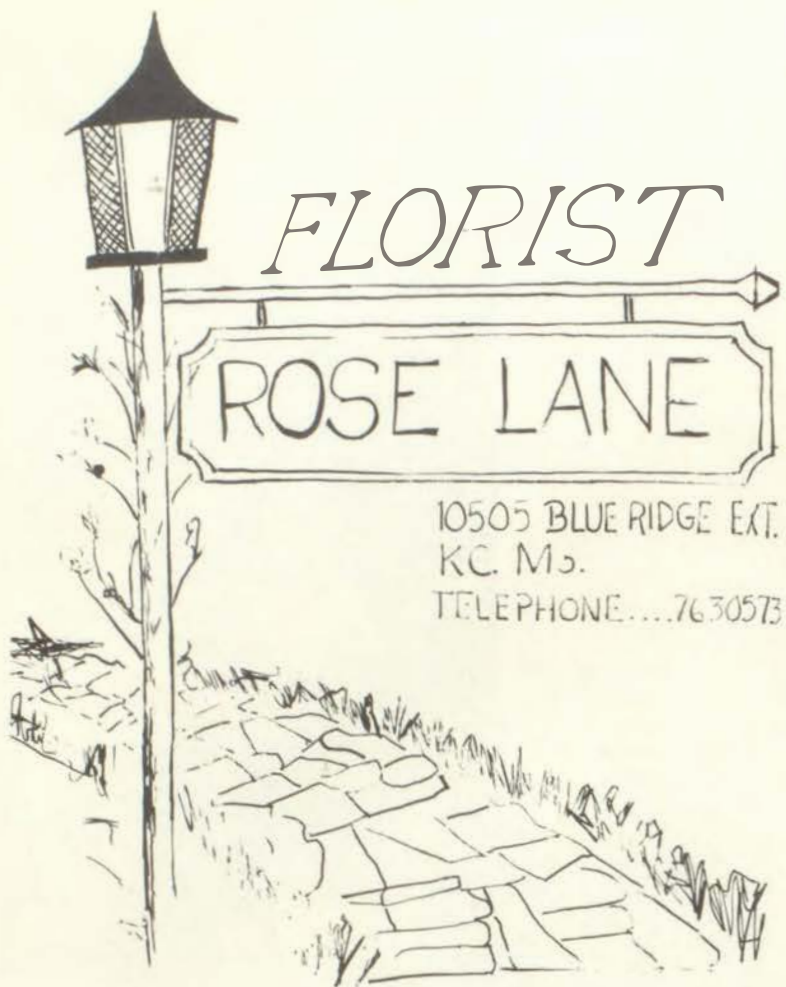
