We Remember Mrs. Mason With The Bishops Mass.



Mrs. Lura Mason was called by God but not before achieving the purpose for which she had been placed here, namely teaching. She died August seventh in a fire in her home in Blue Springs. Mrs. Mason was born in Greenwood, Missouri on January 17, 1941. She graduated from Central Missouri State College at Warrensburg in 1963. In that same year she became a teacher at William Chrisman Junior High and taught there for 9 years. In the summer of "77" she came to St. Mary's where she taught mathematics for two years to the sophomore and junior classes. Her first years at St. Mary's got off to a successful start as she accompanied students to Omaha, Nebraska for their first participation in the Creighton University Math Field Day. The next year was proved even more successful as she assisted in preparing students for the annual NWMSU, Math Field Day and helped students build up their abilities at the Raytown South Math Field Day. Mrs. Mason was also an active member of the Kansas City Area Teachers of Mathematics Association.

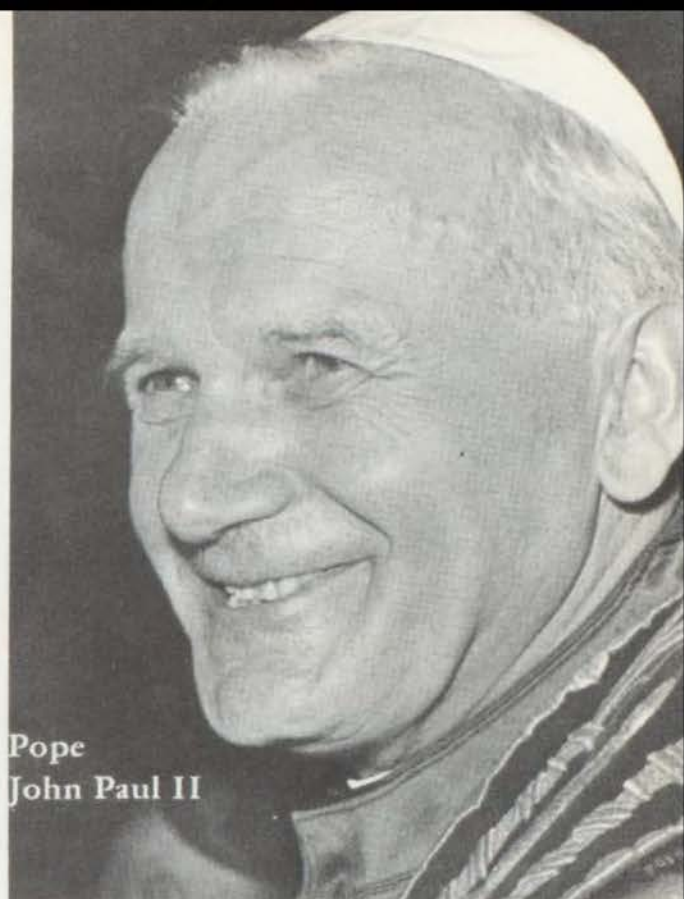

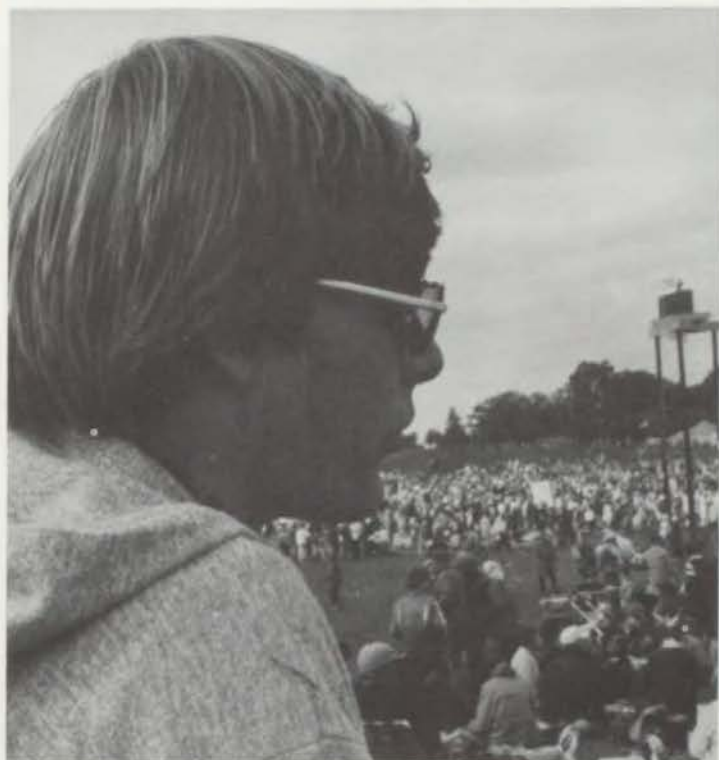
A Step In The Right Direction

The Spirit That Lives

From St. Mary's beginning in 1881 as a girls boarding and day school, to the present High School, the Sisters of Mercy have consistently been it's backbone.

Today, though most of the Sisters have retired from teaching, three have remained active at St. Mary's and they're fantastic! Sr. Aquinas has been with our school off and on since 1922. Sister served as a substitute teacher in the mid and late 20's and as a full time teacher and assistant principal from 1949 to 1954. Sister returned to St. Mary's in 1968 and has been with us ever since. Although Sister does not have a regular class, she finds time in the mornings to tutor students having difficulties with their classwork. Sister is in charge of two of the most complicated operations at school, the bookstore and the cafeteria. Sister also takes time each month to decorate our bulletin boards with topical art work for our inspiration and enjoyment.

Sister DePaul, who has served as Principal here for a short time, teaches the German I and II classes. She also has classes devoted to students having trouble with their English courses. Sister is also very active in all of the school events. Sr. DePaul is definitely the most devoted, enthusiastic, and spirited cheerleader at St. Mary's.

Sister Theodore who is a graduate of St. Mary's, has contributed greatly to the daily functioning of the school. Sister is running the counselors office. She keeps permanent records on each student; sending school transcripts to colleges; scheduling appointments with the counselors; making report sheets on all students who visit the counselors; and on top of all that, receives the calls for the school. Beside her work here, Sister also takes care of the books for the convent and when something needs to be repaired they call on "Sister Fix-It" to get the job done.

We, the community of St. Mary's, would like to express our gratitude to our Sisters of Mercy, those mentioned here, and those who are not mentioned but have contributed greatly to the growth of our school. May God be with each one of them.

We also wish to commemorate the loss of Sr. Andrea who passed away over the Christmas Holidays. Sister devoted most of her life to teaching, and being exceptional with little children, she taught at St. Mary's grade school and before she died she taught part time at St. Ann's. The time, dedication, and love she gave to us shall long be remembered. May God grant her the peace and joy of heaven.

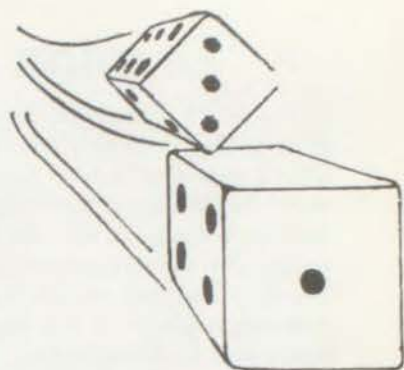


What's Cookin' . . . In The Office

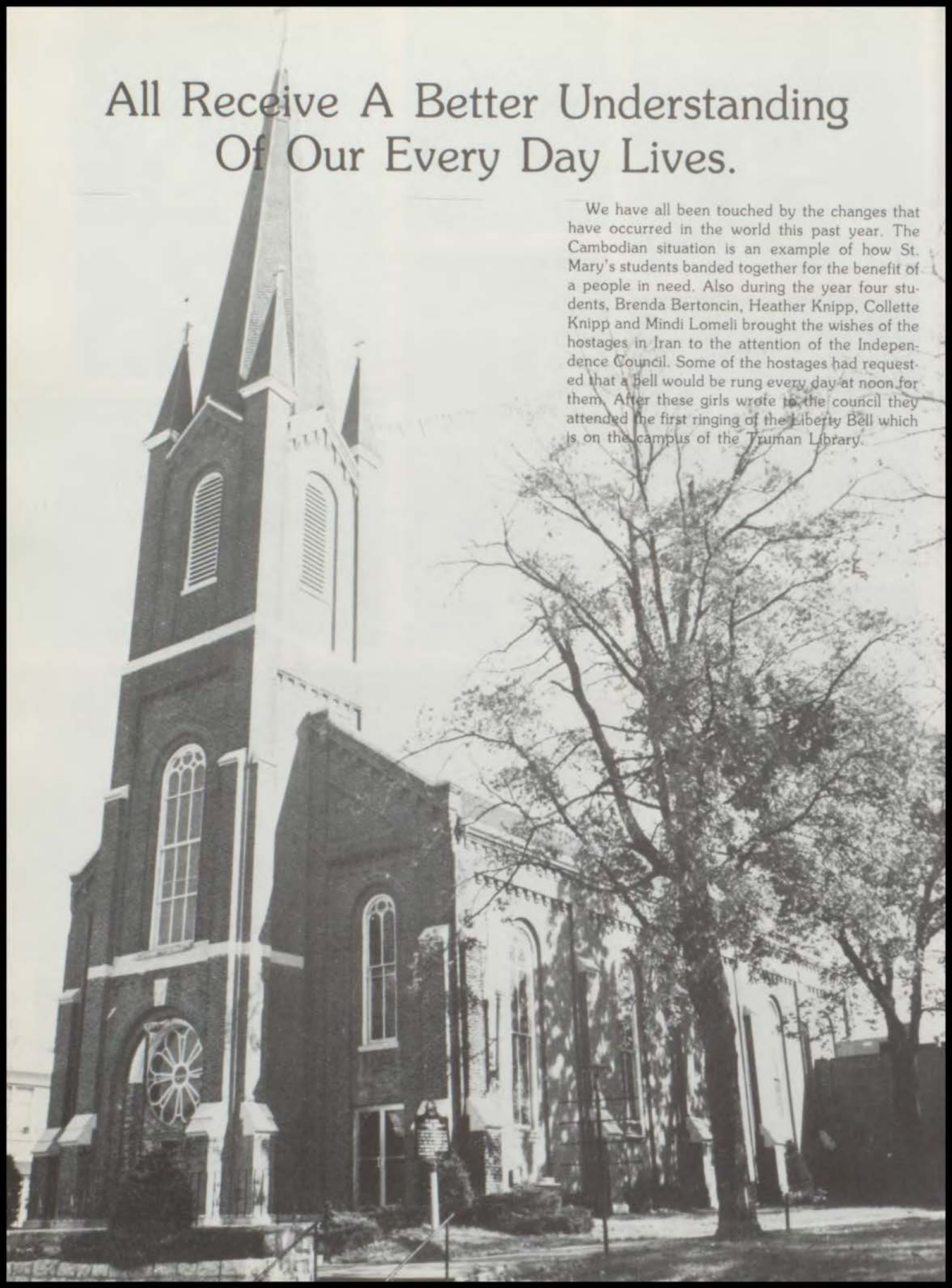

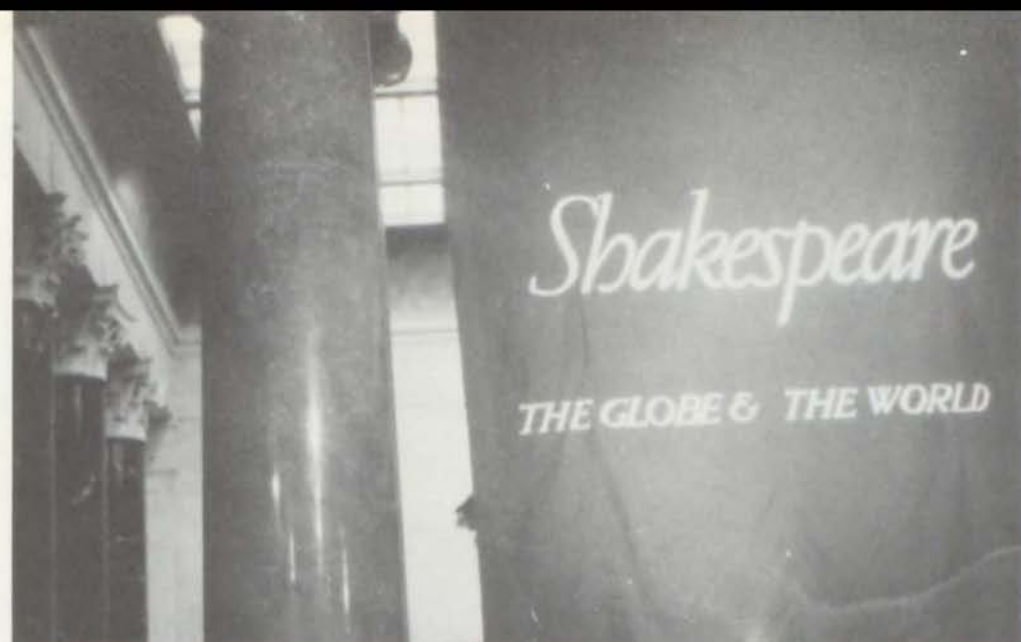


Learning The Language And Its Roots

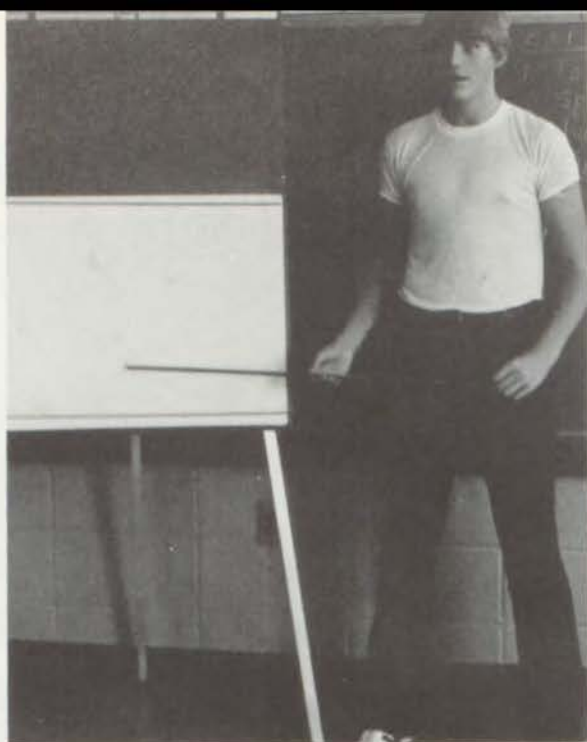

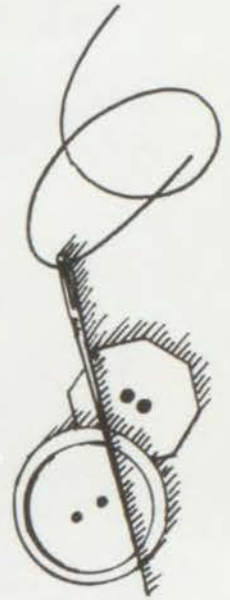


Photography Class Blows Things Up

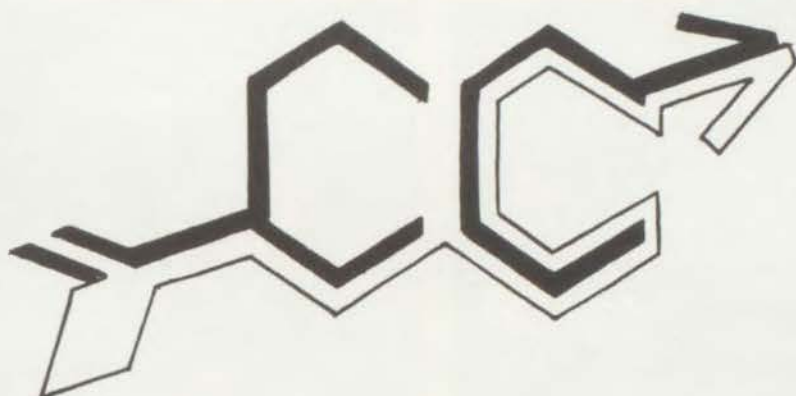

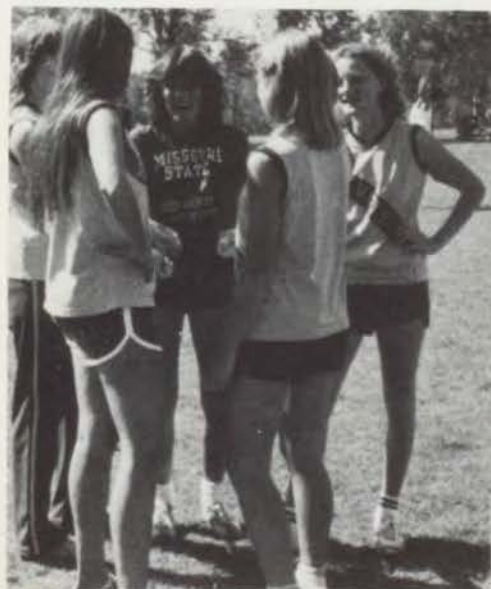

Spirit Week Starts With A Spark

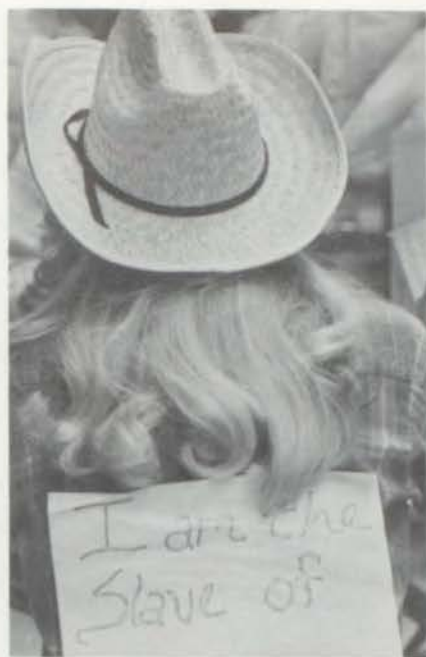
As the Trojans rallied up for homecoming, a big week lay ahead. Students Council started the week out with career day.

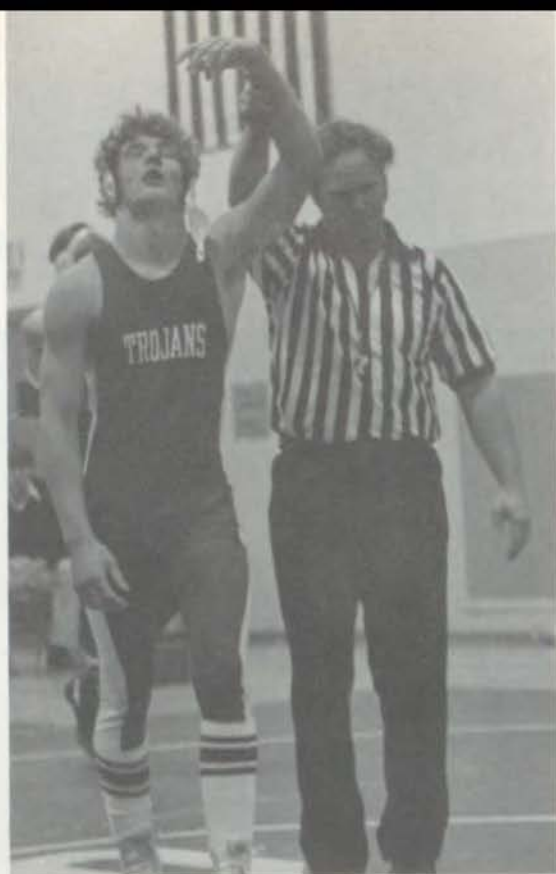


Homecoming '79 — "To Be With You Tonight"

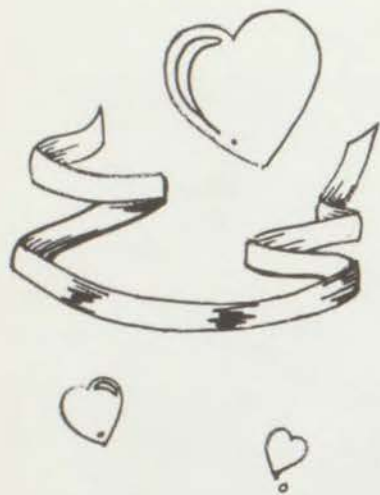

The coaches at St. Mary's are very dedicated in preparing the different athletic teams for competition. They spend long hours setting up schedules, practicing and participating in the various events.

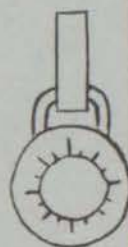
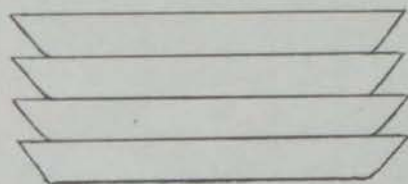
