Helping Our Friends



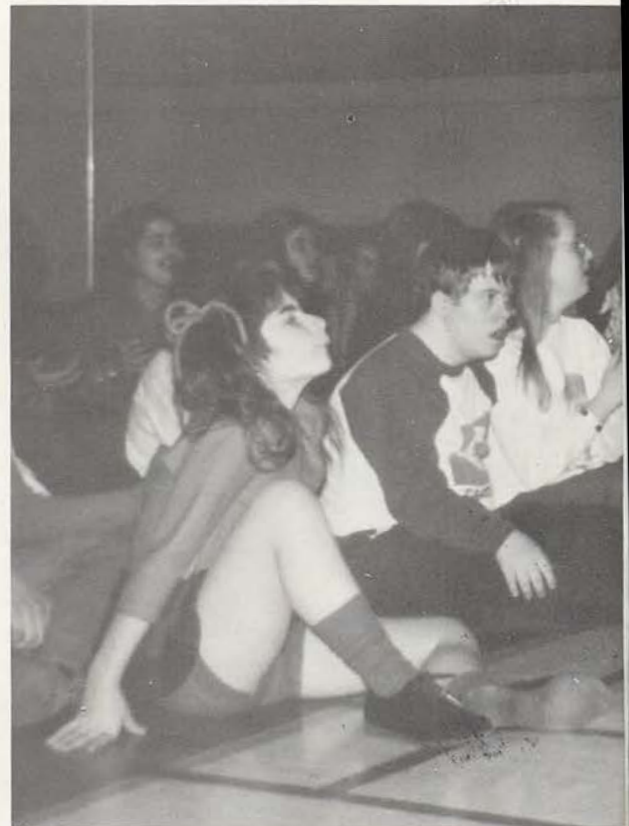
Community Government is made up of students who are concerned about the school and the community. They work on projects which will benefit both the school and the community.

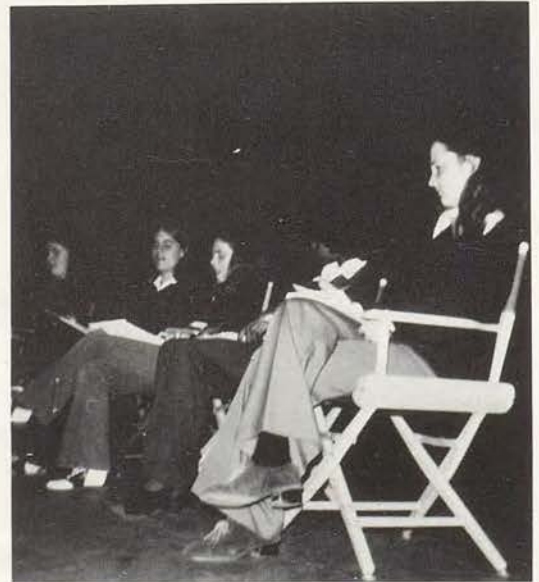
The theme, "a little help from my friends" is illustrated not only in the book but through the efforts of the Teresian staff.

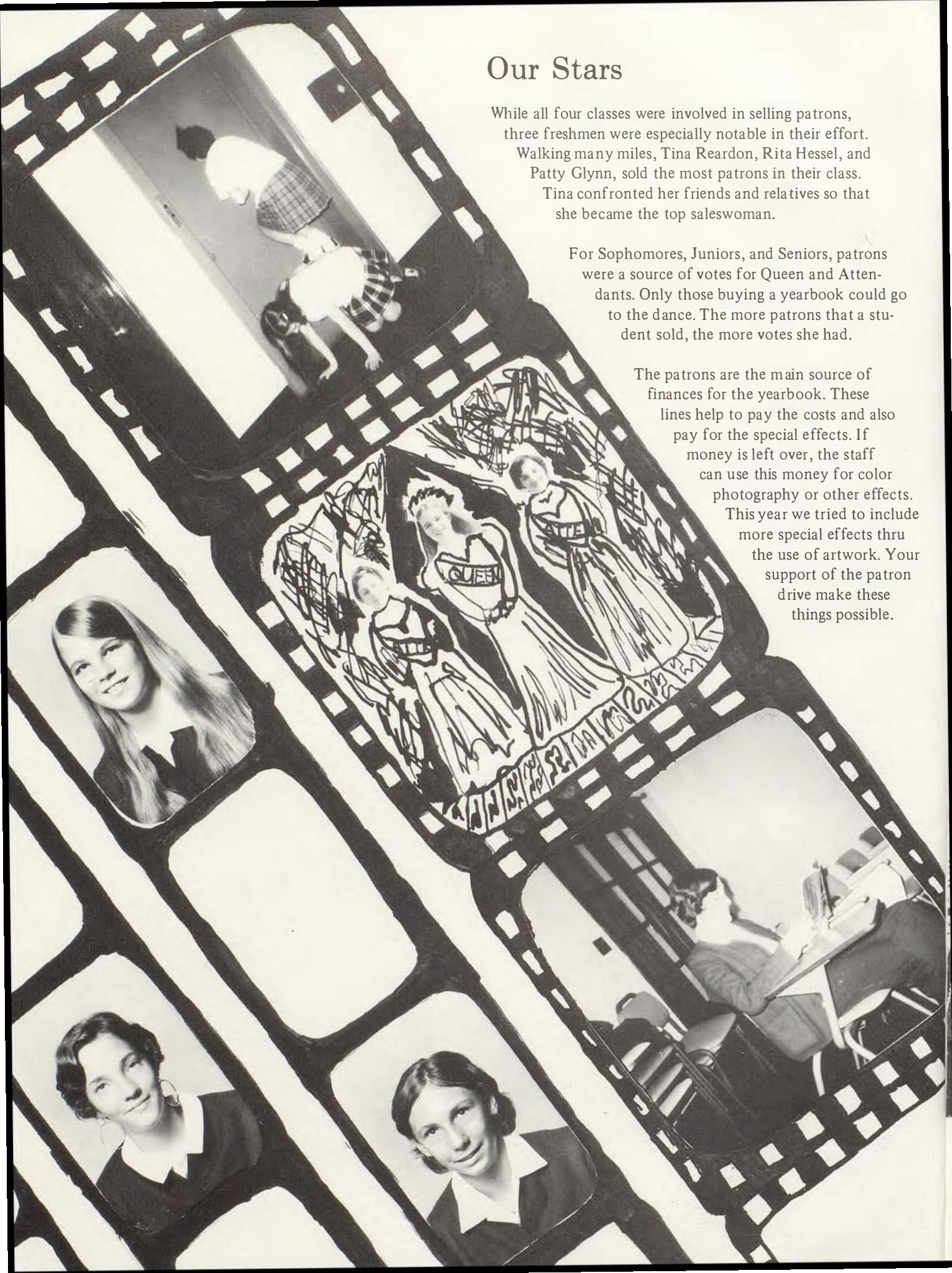


Our Stars

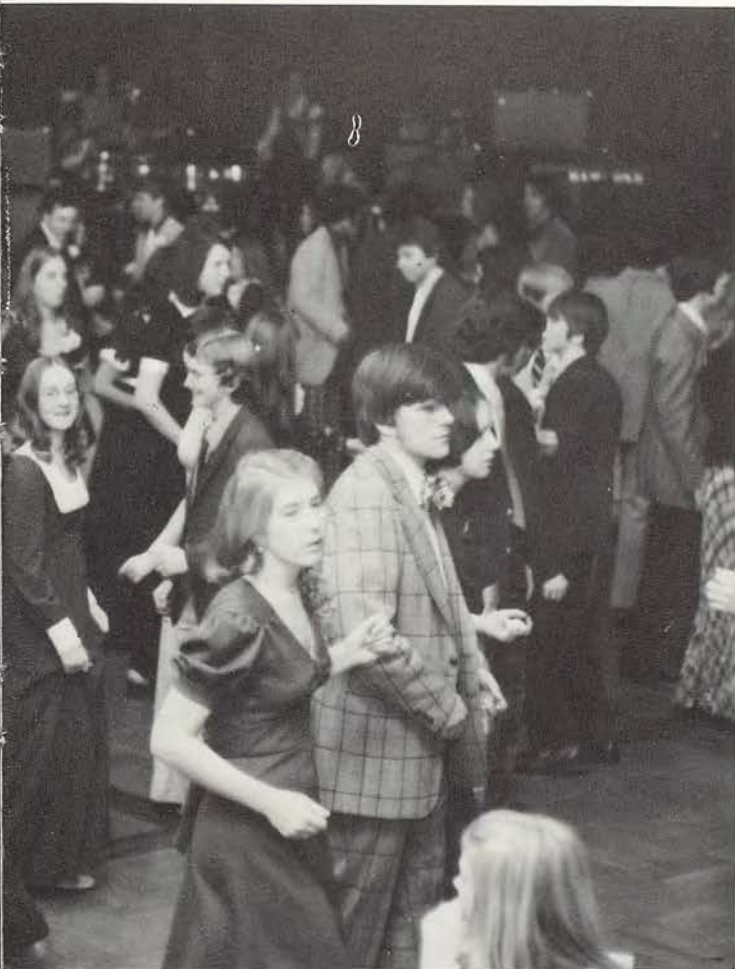

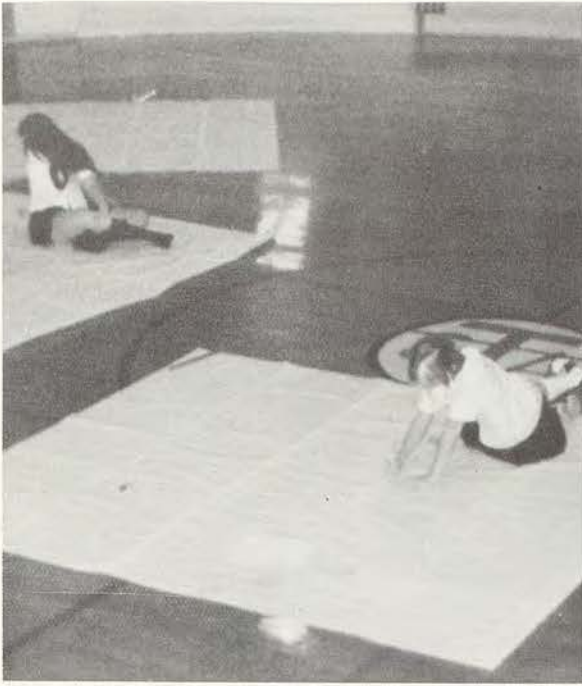
H—Is for Hallelujah

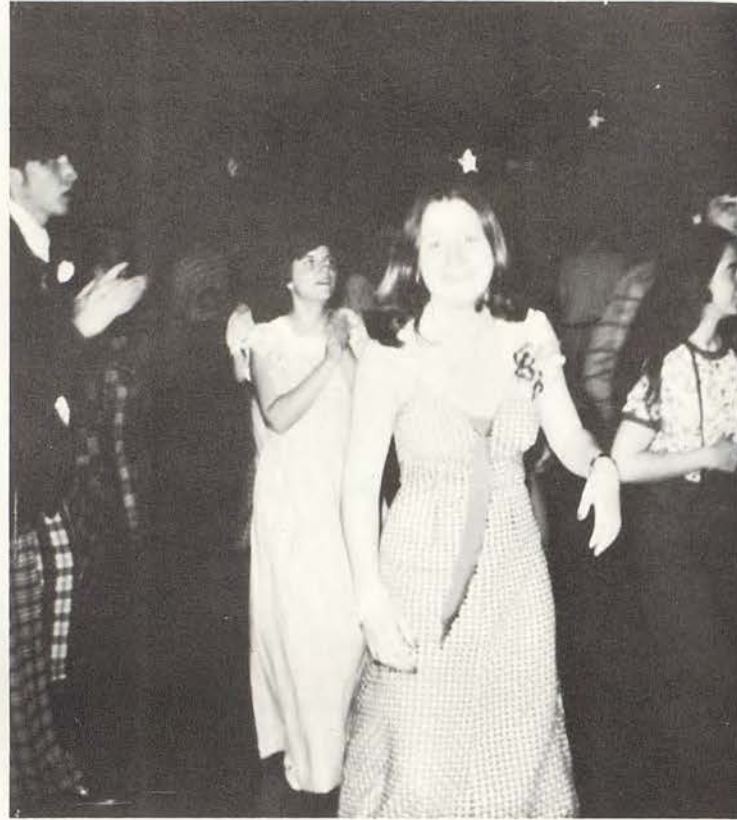

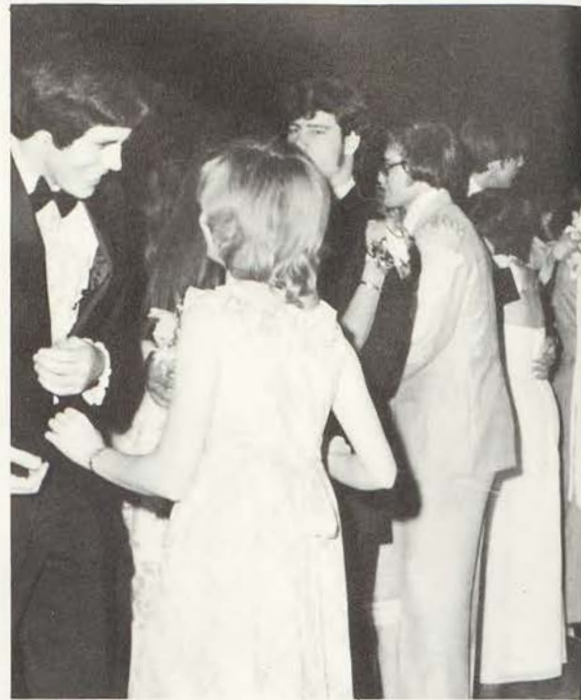

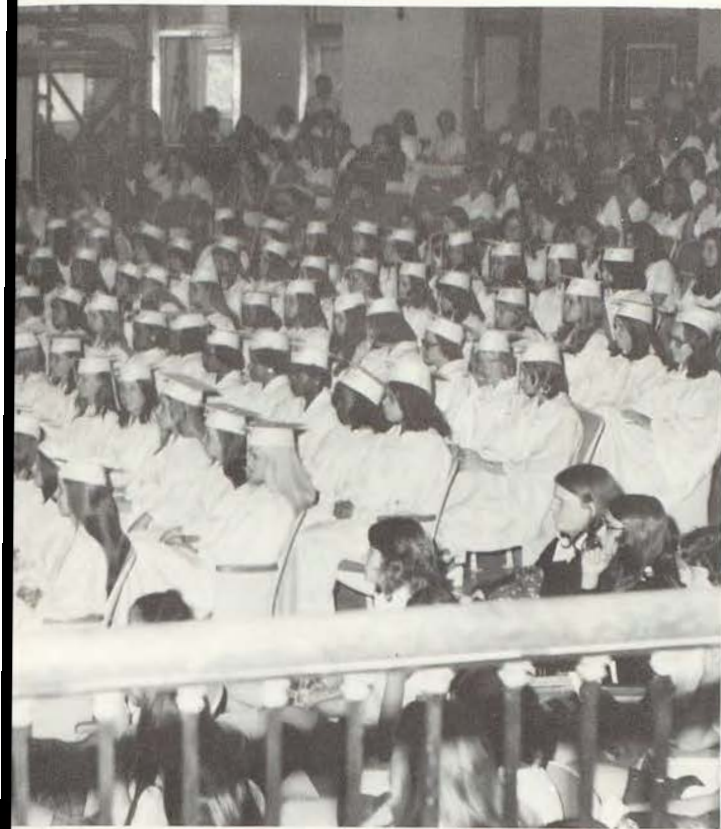
