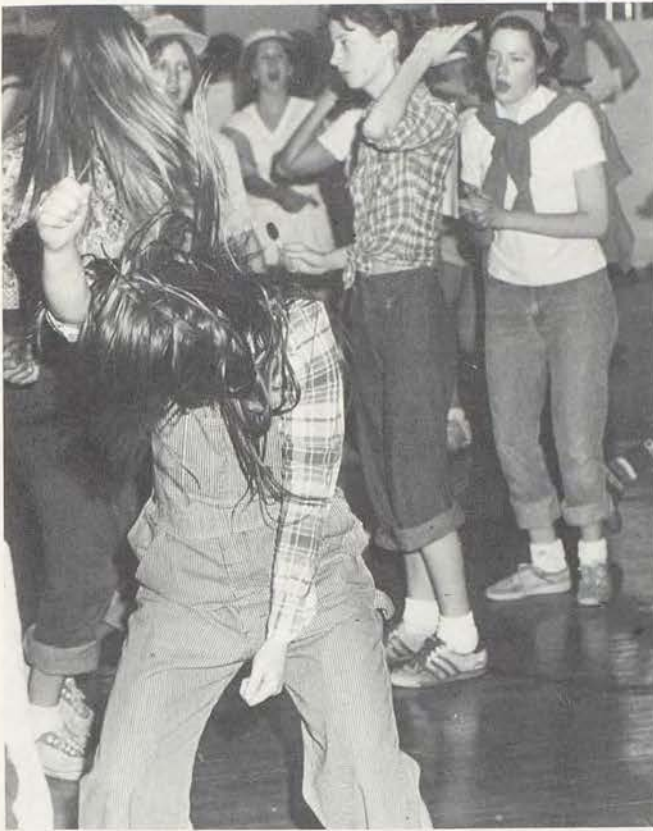




Dance Marathon

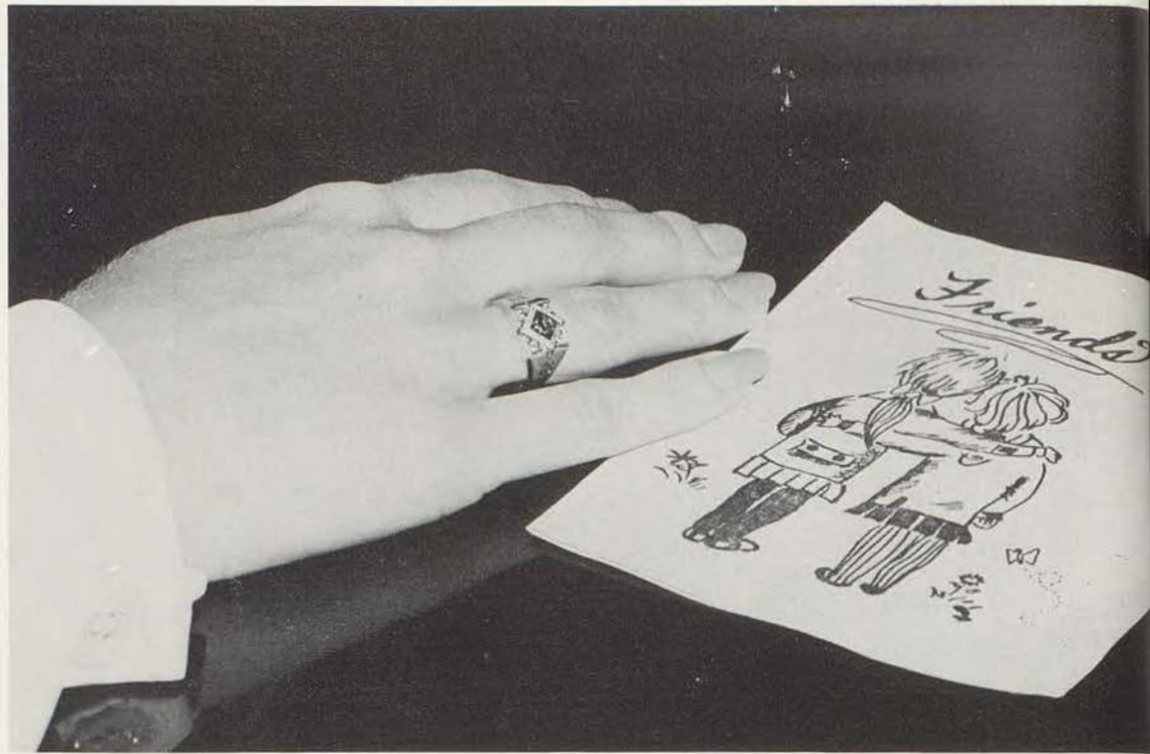








Ring Night
