Spirited Frosh Festival welcomes ninth-graders


Frosh Fest gave the freshmen the opportunity to get to know their upper classmen. A series of events and dress up days were coordinated for the Class of 2004.







For five years now, St. Teresa's has hosted Unitown, an overnight experience at STA which is designed to help students become more aware of the different cultures, religions, sexes and races around them. 



Hey mom, tell me another story!


The spring productions consisted of two one-act plays, instead of the tradional full-length one. "I was going for something a little different, a little easier, and centering around the mother-daughter theme. We wanted to do something more abstract, relying more on artistic lighting rather than a realistic set," said theater veteran Stacie Stankus.

"Tell Me Another Story, Sing Me a Song" consisted of seven short scenes following a mother and daughter through life, demonstrating the walls we often build between each other, and eventually break down.

"Mother's Day" was longer, and touched the hearts of audience members as they caught a glimpse of the lives of adoptees and their families--both surrogate and birth. At 13 years old, the play's central character, Victoria, discovers she was adopted. The audience observed the inner struggle of Victoria and her family in a series of monologues.

"It was really quite a change to play a more serious role. I'm used to hamming it up on stage. It was a ton of fun, though," said Bridget McLaughlin, who played Victoria's adoptive mother.

Just Imagine...

Count to three...in that miniscule period of time that amounts to hardly more than the blink of an eye, a life has disappeared from the face of the Earth entirely. The cause is hunger. Such an easily reversible symptom creates devestatingly widespread deaths, amounting to about 24,000 lost each day. And the cure...a simple bowl of food. This is the pure reality of the world, a reality Food for Thought (FFT) attempts to reverse.

FFT is a relatively new yet extremely popular program moderated by Ms. Denise Gilmore. Not only do members collect food for organizations such as the Seton Center and the Bishop Sullivan Center, but they also provide an outlet for other STA students to help as well. "Food for Thought has been a wonderful opportunity for me to help the community," said Ray-Ray Cole, sophmore.

FFT involves the entire community

every year on Halloween. Participants trick-ortreat, but rather than collecting candy, they request canned goods and other non-perishable items to stock local food pantries. The success of this collection is astounding.

Another incredibly successful event coordinated by FFT is Project Box. A few selected members of Food for Thought sleep outside in the quad for one night with only boxes and a few blankets for warmth. Not only do these students collect barrels of food in donations, but they also gain an insight on what life is like for the people they serve.

Besides helping the hungry, FFT inadvertently aides the members. Said senior Catherine Rieke, "I've been a part of FFT since it was first organized. It's exciting and rewarding to know that this group is filling area stomachs."



Star Golfers Swing Their Way To State





Not only did Student Council and Spirit Club raise student participation, they worked hard to keep our campus clean.


"SCO keeps me involved at STA. I am constantly busy doing community-oriented activites," said Cady Loftus, sophomore.





Have faith in yourself,


