

The parade, Friday afternoon, consisted of a variety of floats, including the FFA float which won the float competition.




















"I was very upset that the juniors didn't get their act together and sell their chocolates," said Cara Carr, senior.
















"There were a lot of freshman this year," said sophomore Mallory Craig. "But I think they made our team what it was."




