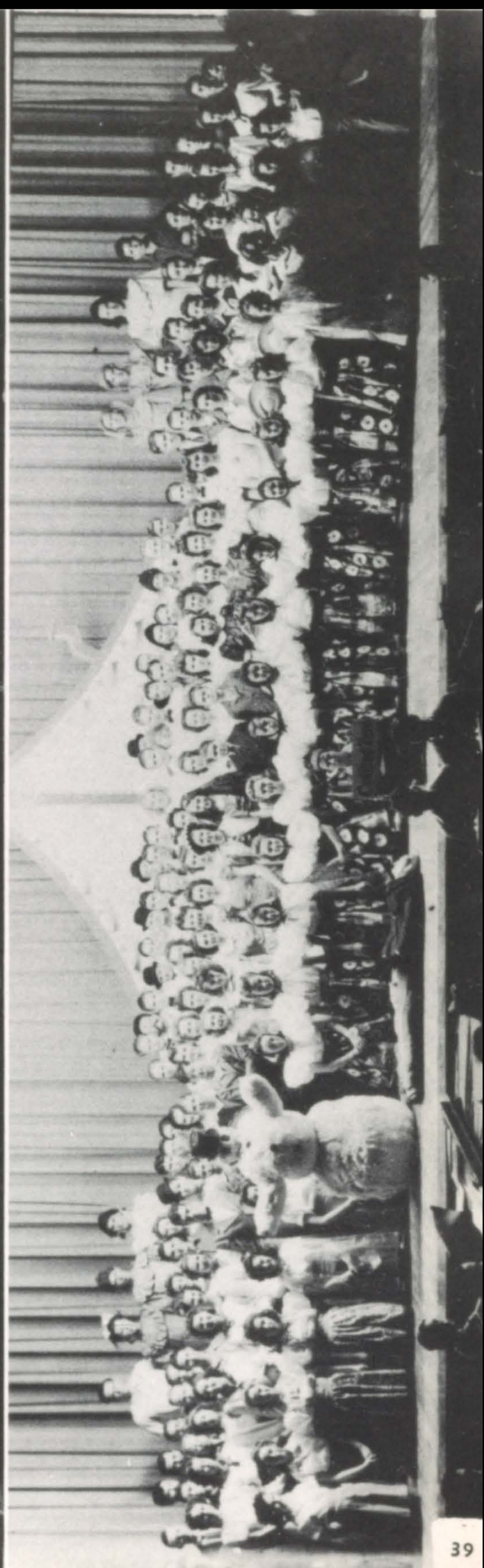
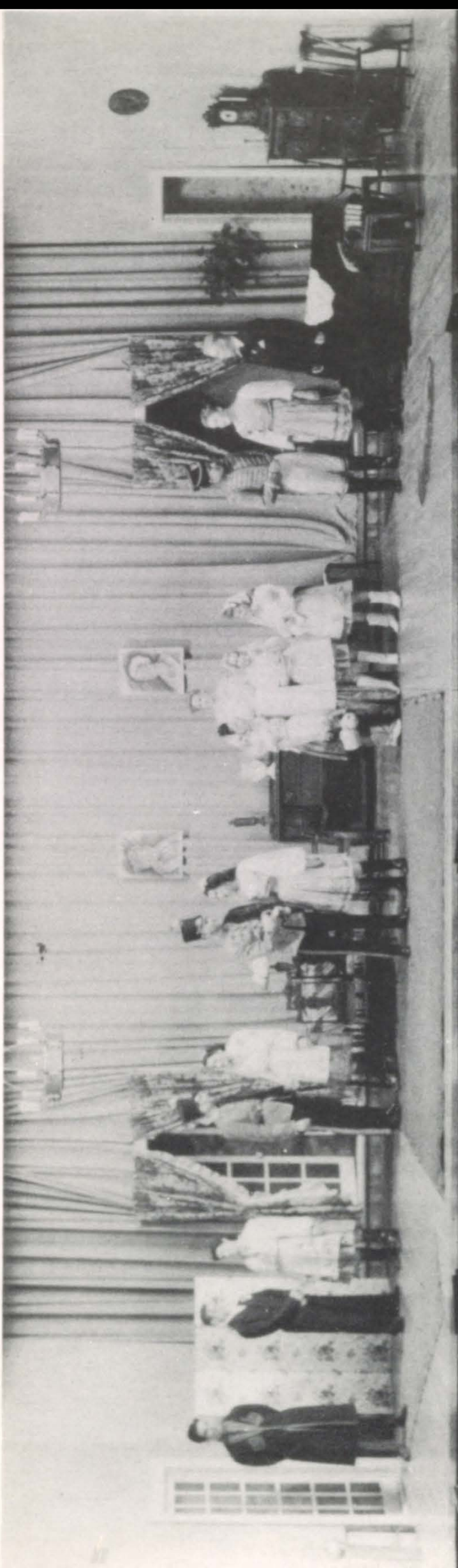
KNIGHTLITES
