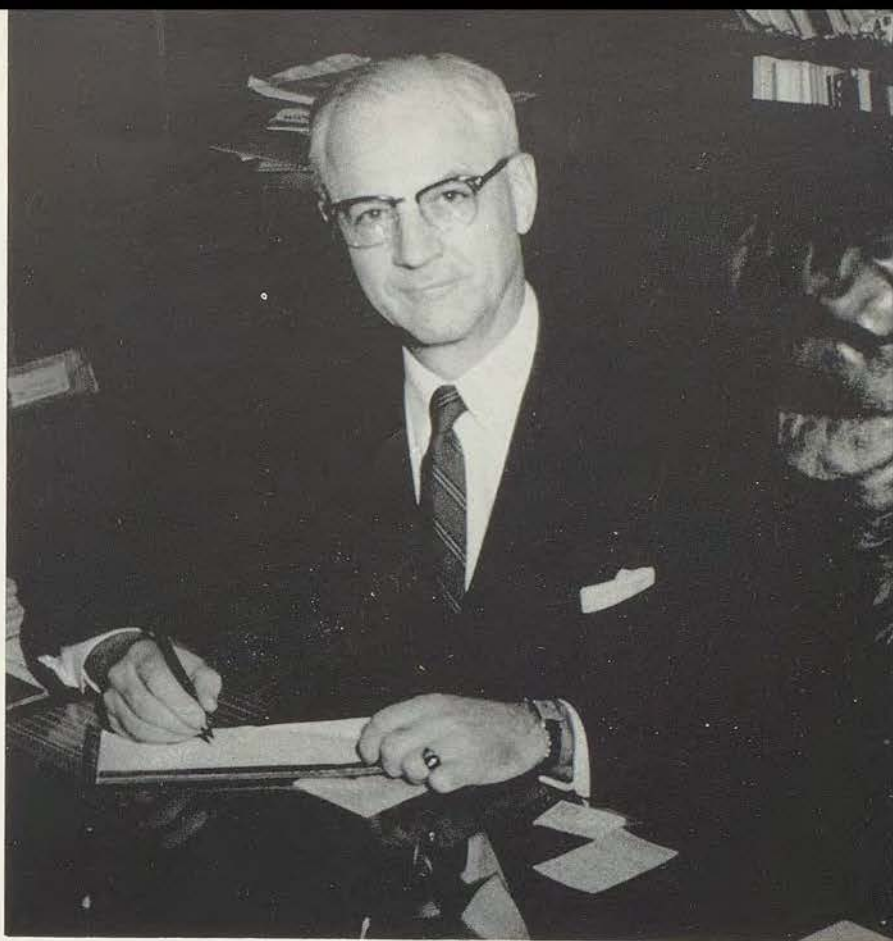
DEAR SENIORS:

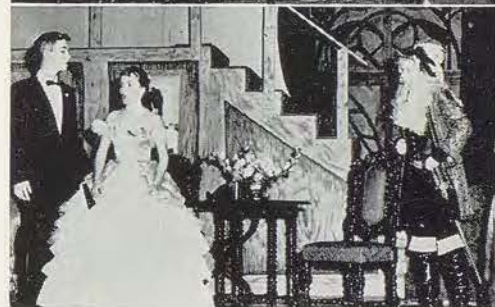
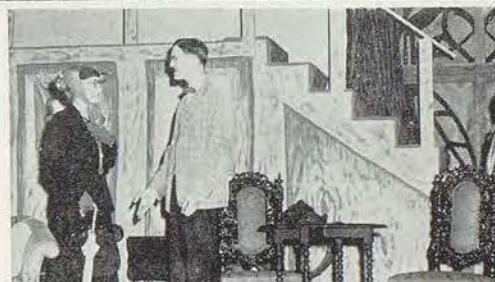


Offers Entertainment

The main goal of our Knights is to practice sportsmanship in all their games. The enthusiastic support of the student body helps the teams to attain this goal.



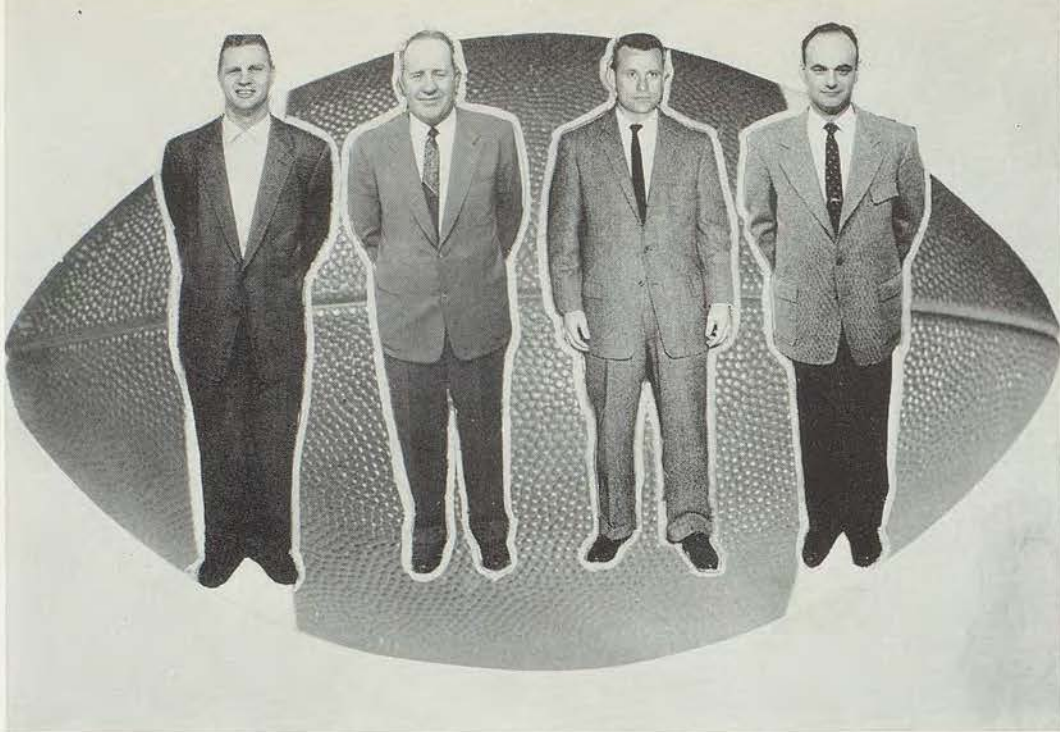

Girls' Physical Education Department

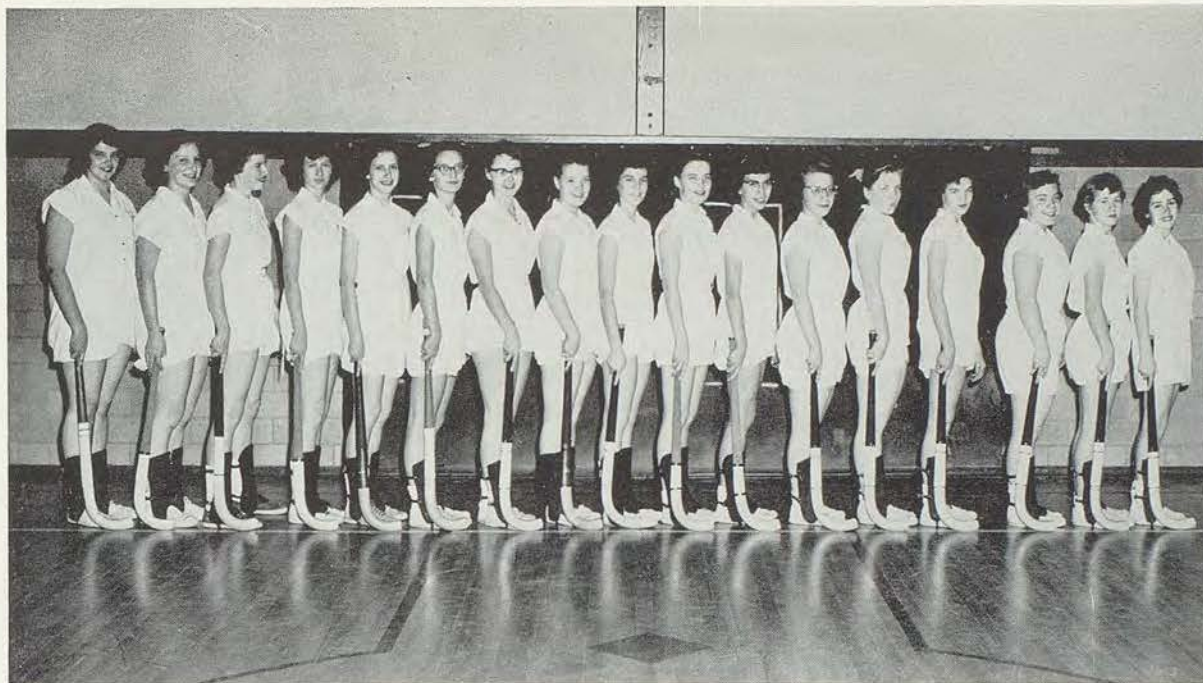
The girls' physical education department develops sportsmanship, health, and poise through participation in the various sports during class and after school.
