Sykes Scores Again!

1958 Championship Trophy

Comin' Through!

Hail the Champions! THE SOUTHEAST KNIGHTS! The 1958 football season came to a close with glory for school, coaches, and players who were champions in every sense of the word.

Southeast will go down in the records as having won the top honors in rushing and scoring. The charging Knights scored 289 points in league play to top the old record of 270 piled up by Southwest in 1951. The defense, led by a hard hitting line and smart backs, held their opponents to six points the entire season, another Castle mark. Southeast intercepted more passes than her opponents completed.

Doug Madden took scoring honors with Sykes second. Doug's 84 points topped Chuck's 82. Madden also took the rushing title with 806 yards on 47 tries for a 17.2 average.

The squad racked up 2,932 total yardage in league play for 392.3 average, believed to be another record.

Southeast's record-breaking season began by wrecking the 15-game winning streak of the North Kansas City Hornets 24-0.

Raytown's Blue Jays were the next team to fall before the nights. The game, played at Raytown, ended 21-0.

Northeast, the only team to score on the Knights, suffered a 33-6 loss in the first league game.

The boys continued to add victories to Southeast's credit as the scores mounted. The rugged team defeated Van Horn by a score of

40-0. Then Lincoln's Tigers were caged up by the Knights 42-0.

Doug Madden led the scalping of the Southwest Indians with two 60-yard touchdowns. Playing before 3,000 spectators, Southeast waltzed to a 44-0 victory.

Westport was the next team to fall, with the Knights managing a 33-0 verdict.

Southeast virtually assured themselves of their third undisputed championship by trampling Paseo 45-0. The Knights, up and ready for this game, continued their set pattern of overpowering their opponents.

Romping over Manual 52-0, the Knights won the third City Championship in six years. Shifting plays and players quite often, Southeast unbeaten, untied, practically untested, wound up a terrific season.

The Championship was not only an honor for Southeast and each player, but also an honor for Coach Patterson and Coach Chamblee. The coaches and their expert instruction deserve as much credit as the boys' speed, power, and skill. Working together, the coaches and the boys constituted a team that didn't know defeat.

In a survey taken by the *Scholastic Coach* magazine, Southeast had the best defensive performance of the state high school football champions. Being 1958 NATIONAL FOOTBALL CHAMPS is the highest honor ever received by a Southeast football squad.
