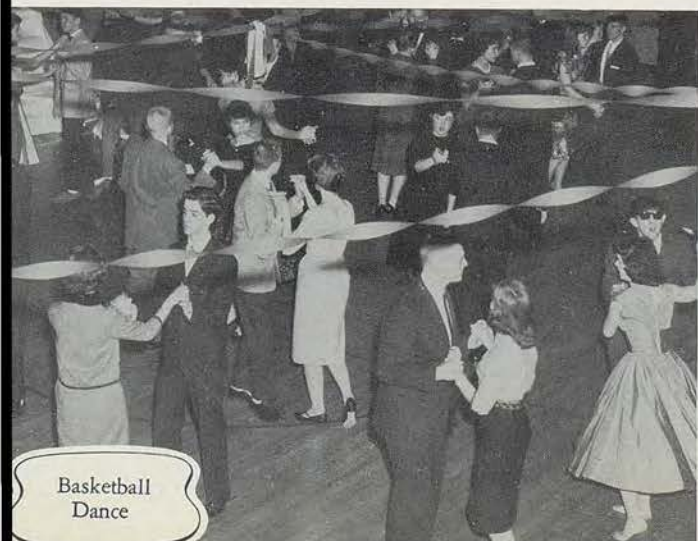
Southeast Knight Club again furnished an opportunity for many hours of dancing, playing ping-pong, and just being with fellow Knights and Ladies.

Madden Sprints.

Starting with the opening kick-off, and lasting through the last second of the season, Southeast had all reason to be proud of her Knights. Even though they were defeated and tied twice, they were never outdone in morale or sportsmanship, two essentials for a winning team.

Southeast opened its season by tying North Kansas City 19-19. The Knights had the game won twice, but gave it away both times during the sloppily-played second half. Doug Madden was a so-called one-man offense, gaining 221 yards rushing, scoring the first touchdown, and setting up both others.

The Raytown Blue Jays and the Knights played evenly in the first half, but in the last half the Jays' power along with several good breaks broke the game wide open. The Jays won 21-0 and ended the Knights' sixteenth game in an undefeated skein.

Manual was downed 38-0 by the Knights' reserves. The junior squad still had to fight hard to keep the score down.

Hard-charging Bears from East dealt the Knights their first league defeat in more than two years. Southeast rushed to two quick leads but again couldn't hold up during the crucial second half, losing 18-14.

Doug Madden, running behind the excellent blocking of John Becker, Bill Braun, and Richie Shopen, trampled Lincoln 27-0. Madden scored all four touchdowns on sprints of 25, 39, 69 and 76 yards. Altogether, Doug gained 357 yards on 13 carries for a new city rushing record for one game.

Southeast met and sped by the Central Blue Eagles 41-0. Madden, Dan Marcum, and Hugh Greer led the offense while Braun, Becker, and Ron Etherton headed the defense.

Putting together scoring bursts of 53, 60, 85, 40 and 39 yards along with Madden's two touchdown jaunts of 17 and 28 yards, Southeast brilliantly flashed by Paseo 48-6. The Knights put on several last quarter scoring threats but had to settle for a 6-6 tie with Northeast.

The Knights downed the Southwest Indians 34-19. Madden switched from runner to pass receiver. He caught two Marcum aerials for important touchdowns, the second one actually deciding the game. Becker, Braun, Creel and Etherton led a senior defense which completely stopped the Indians the last half. Southeast ended the season in third place.

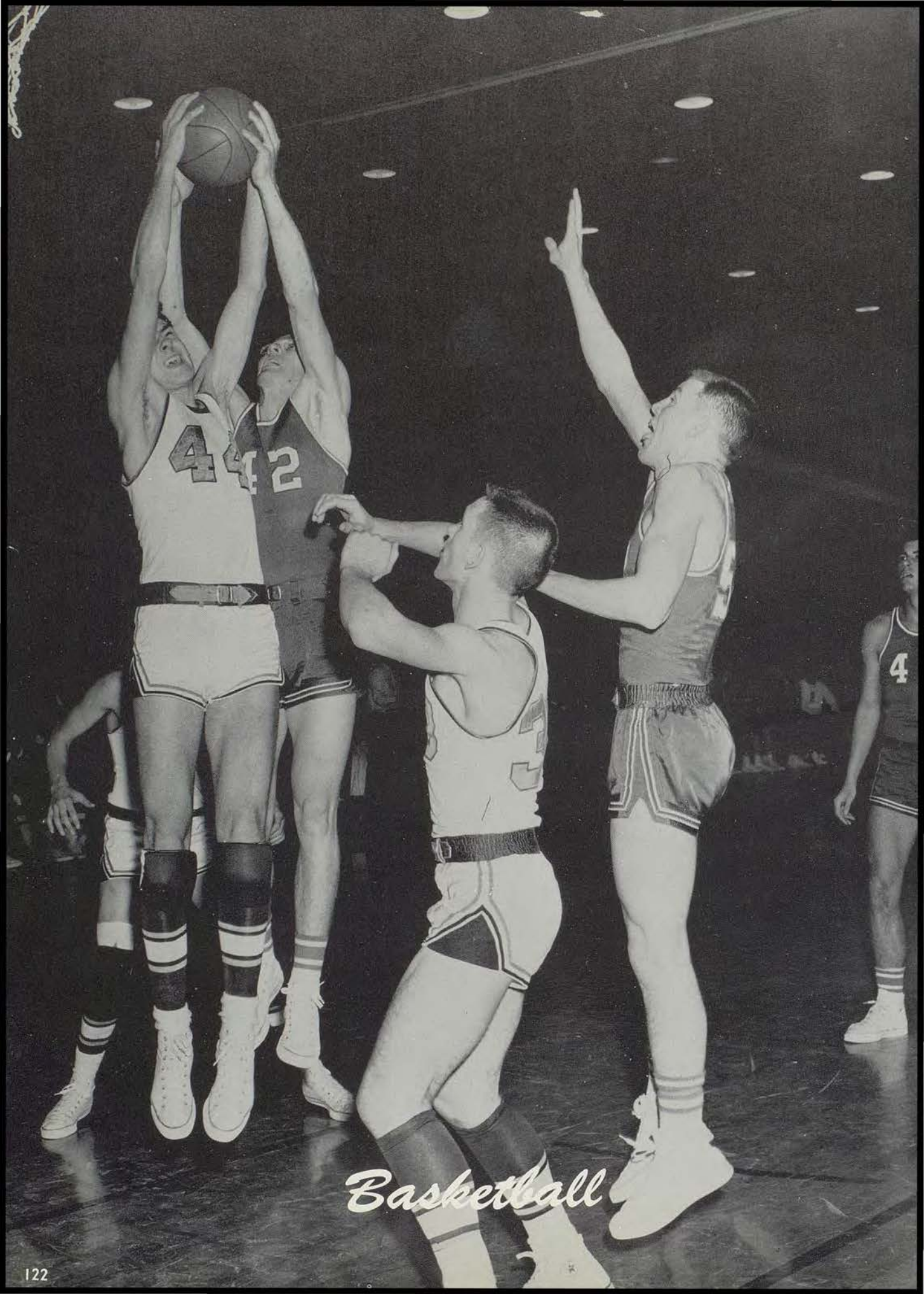

The Knights' main weakness was inexperience. The team had only three returning lettermen, Bill Braun and Bob Blaine, seniors, and Ken Wood, junior. The team was forced to rely on boys from last year's B-team and freshman squads. Dave French senior, and three sophomores, Larry Norris, Jack Patterson, and Preston Washington were newcomers, who helped carry the load for the Knights. 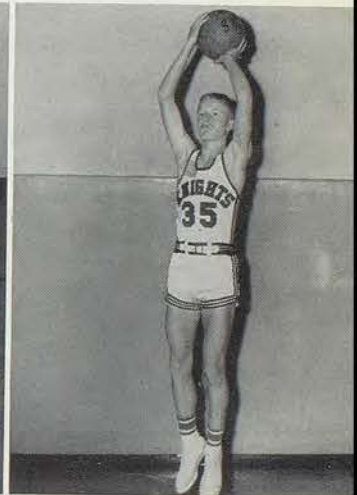

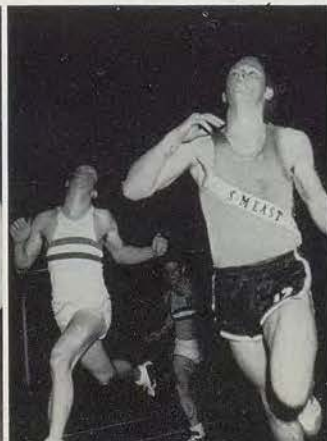

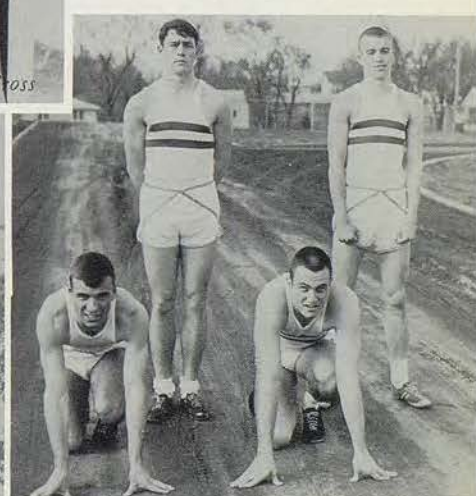
