## **WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL TREES**

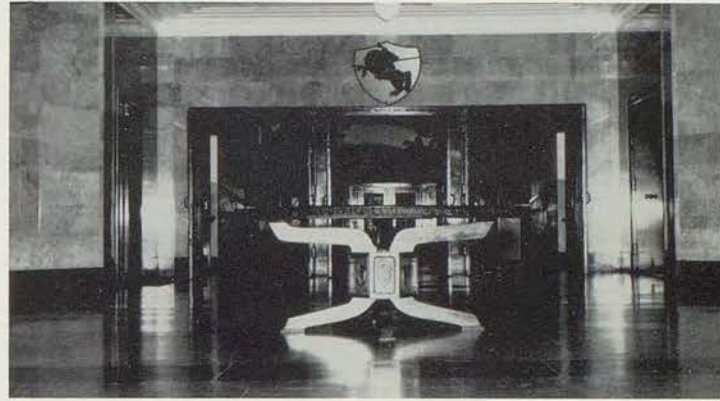

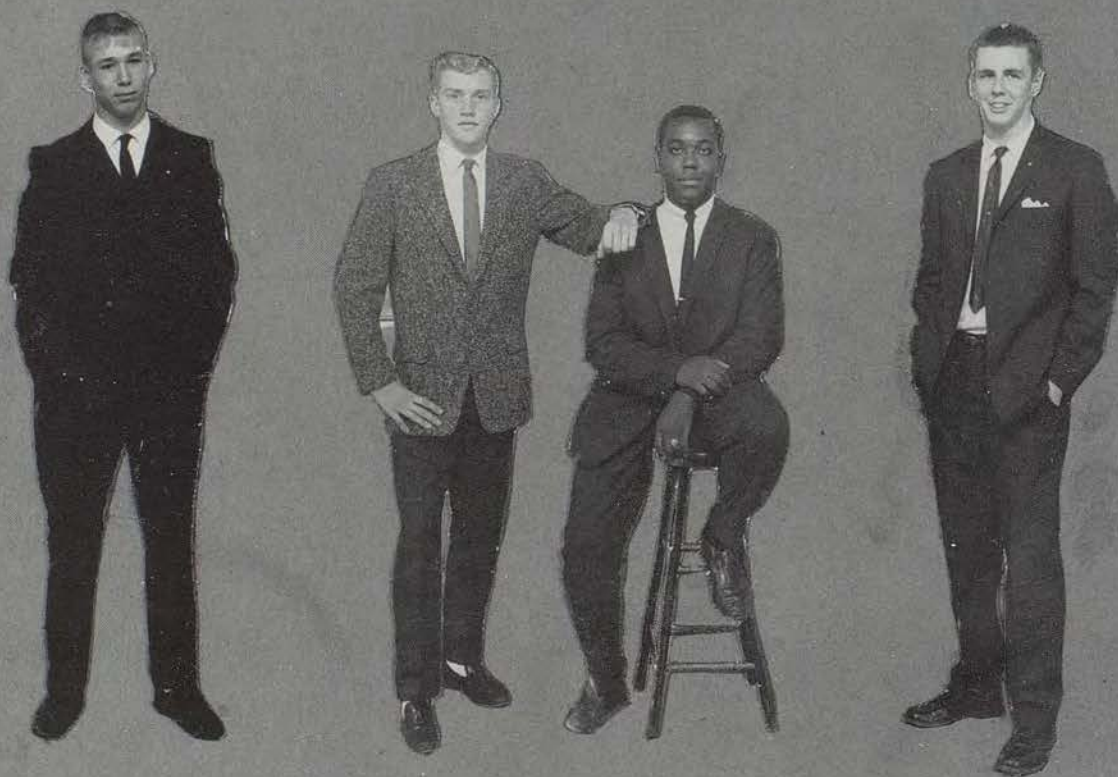


## MARK OF A GOOD TEAM

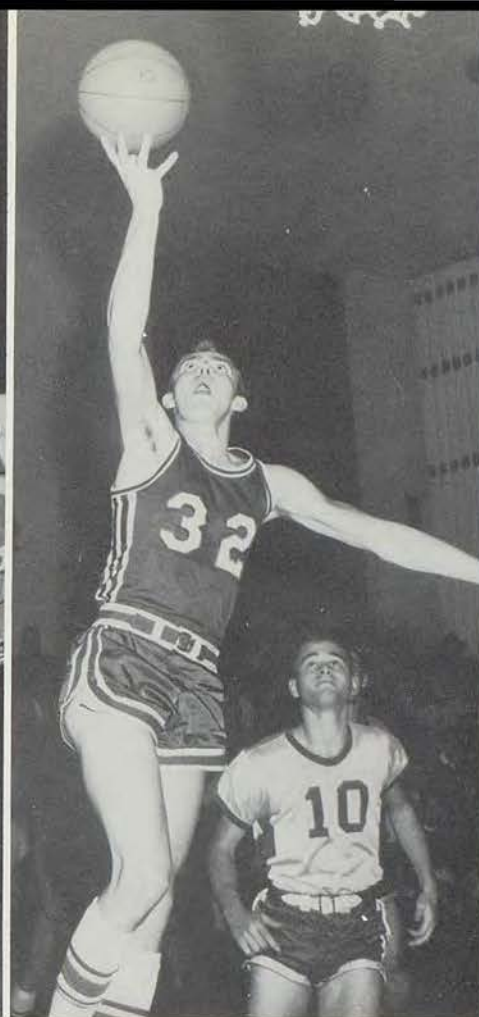
