S is for Scholarship. Acquiring knowledge is our goal as students. Through this knowledge we grow and keep alive and meaningful the traditions and spirit of our Castle.



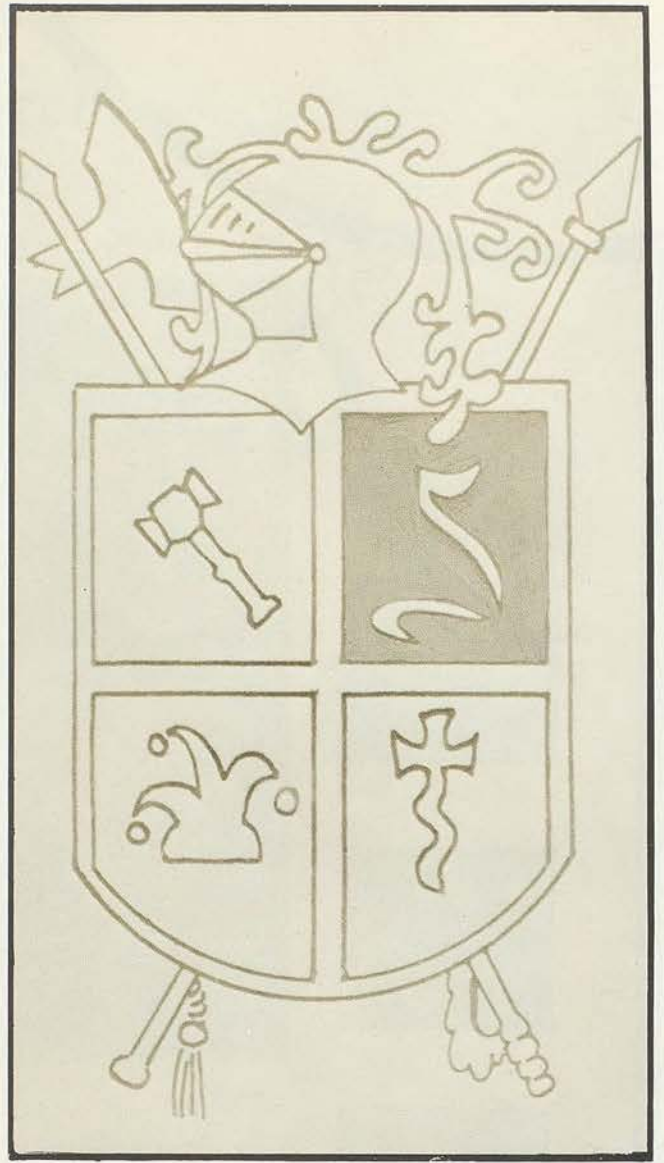

Participation in school activities, whether they be dramatic, musical or service, nourishes school spirit. It is a practical application of the code of a Knight.

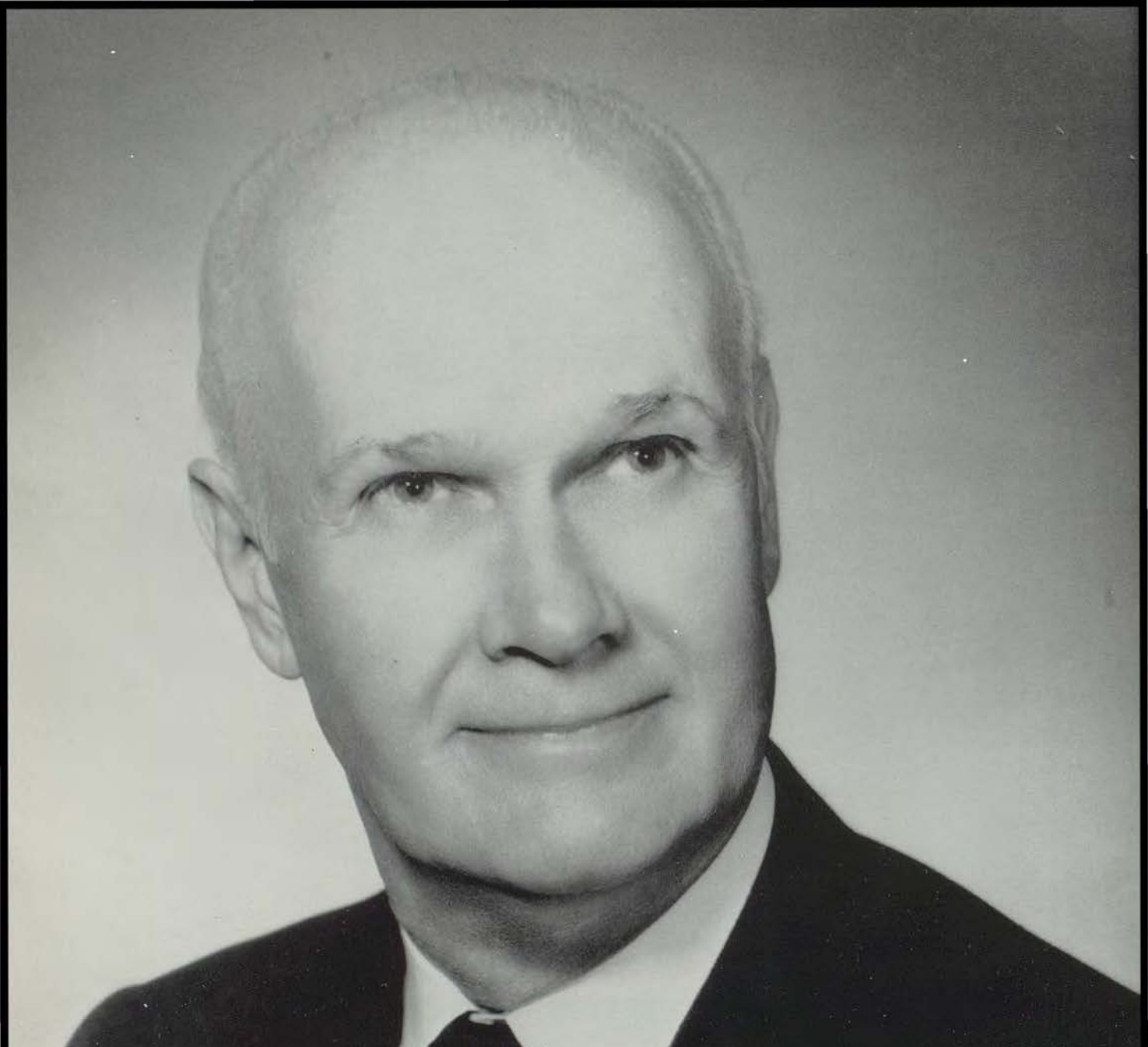


Courage is the hallmark of good character. On the athletic field our spirit and ideals are most dramatically portrayed.

tesy to others not because they are gentlemen, but because you are one";

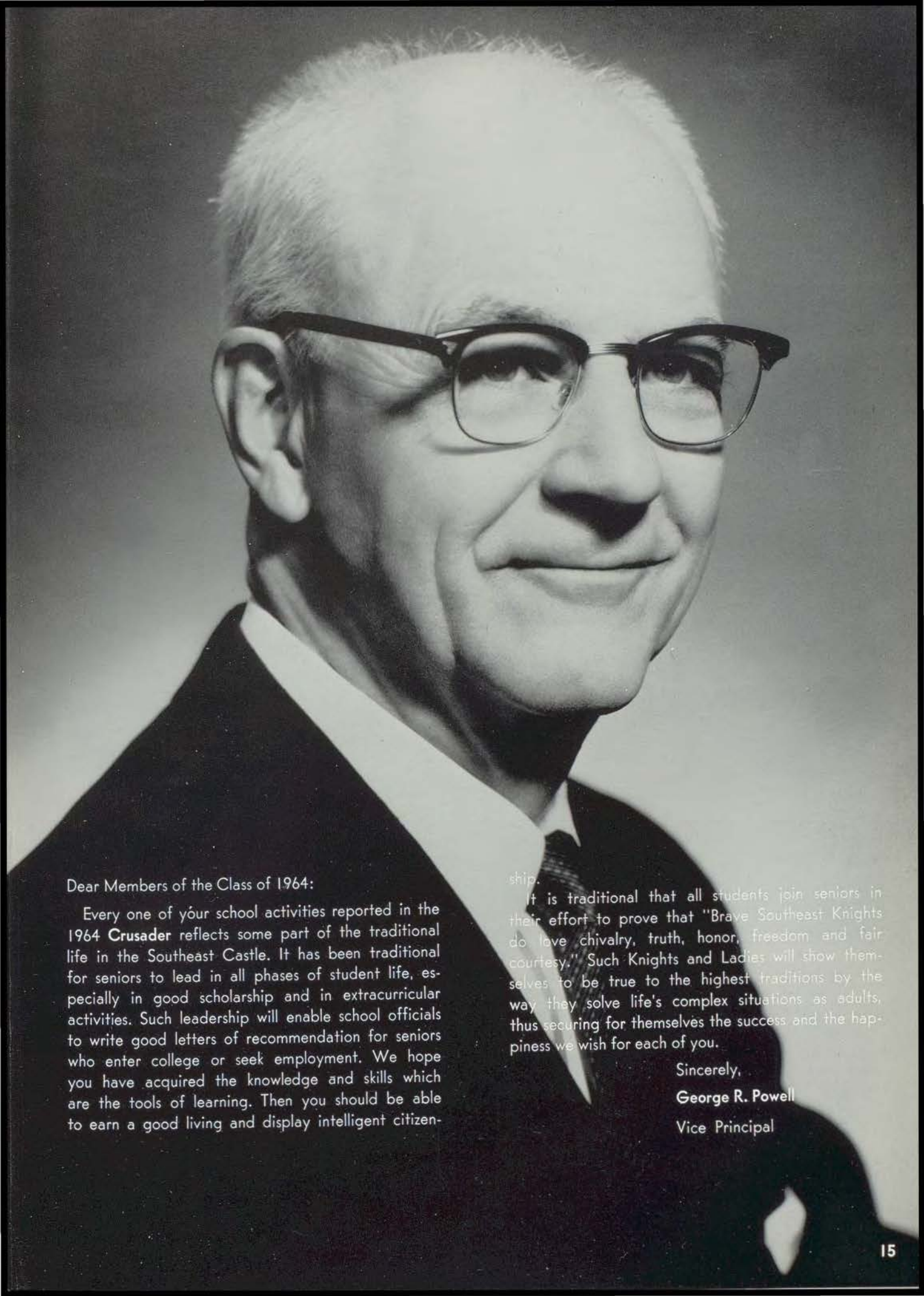
"A good thing to remember, a better thing to do, Work with the construction gang, not the wrecking crew";

The club is under the capable sponsorship of Mr. E. A. Smith.

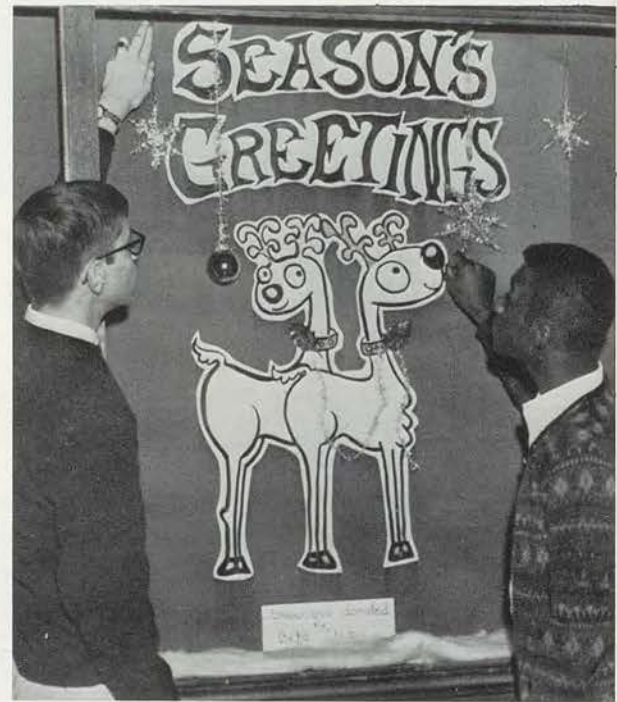

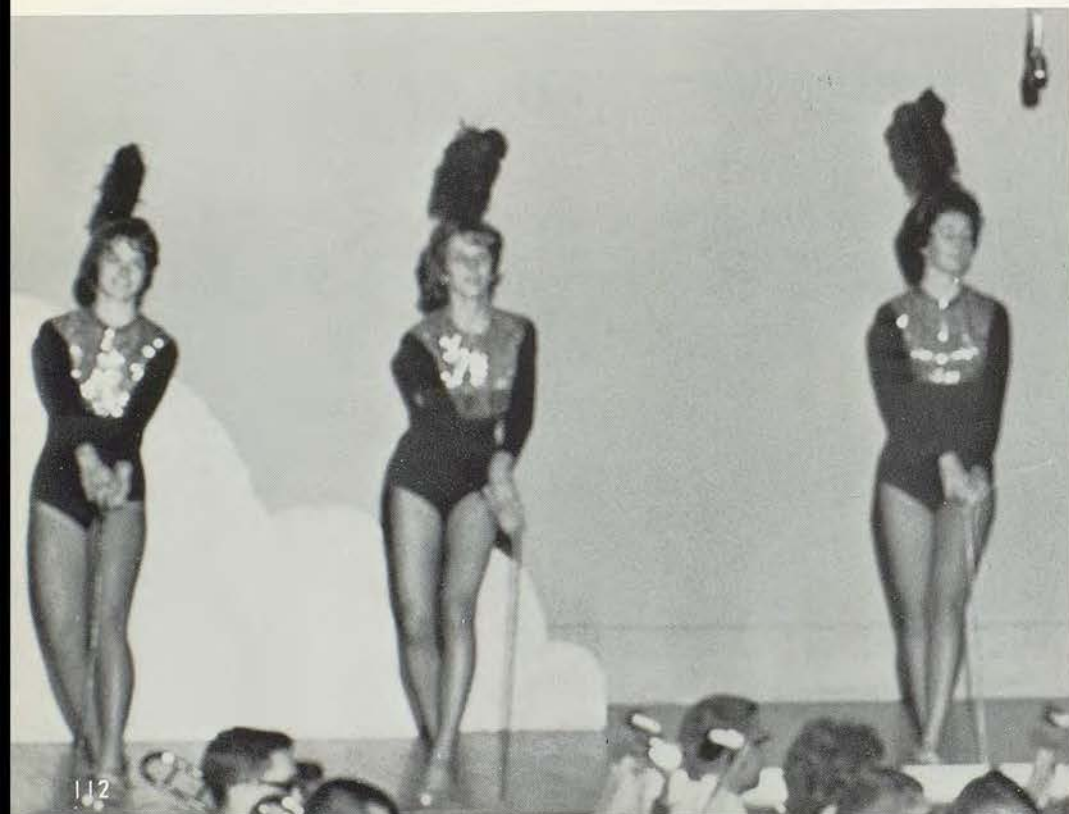


Knightslites 1963

Senior Farewell

This page marks the end of the 1964 **Crusader**, and this **Crusader** marks the end of our years at Southeast—five wonderful years in which the Castle has been the hub of our lives.

We have stored many memories of the last five years, memories of school activities: Induction, Knightlites, senior assemblies, football championships, basketball championships and state tournaments, the Beta convention, campaign parties, elections, the Prom, singing Christmas carols, the **Tower**, and other **Crusader** days. Every senior has conjugated verbs and diagrammed sentences, waded through Shakespeare and **Silas Marner**, floundered in algebra and chemistry, dissected frogs, peered at conjugating spriojyra through a microscope, spent weary hours at the library working on a research paper, burned the midnight oil cramming for finals or typing that paper which was due the next day.

We have seen many changes, too, in these past five years. These have been changes in our school and our world which have directly or indirectly affected us as individuals. Some of these changes have been forgotten; others are indelibly imprinted on our memory. Fads have come and gone in clothes, entertainment and humor: knee ticklers, tab collars, shift wheat jeans, blades, ratted hair, teenage monsters, charm bracelets, stretch pants, madras, folk music, Vaughn Meder records, the Beatles, the twist, the uptown, the mashed potatoes, pool, pro football, elephant jokes, contemporary greeting cards, the Smothers Brothers, Shelly Berman, Steve Allen, **Mad Magazine**, and an endless list of others.

And yet the biggest change, the most important change has not been in the fashion world or show business or science or Washington, D. C.. It has been in us. We have grown from gawky, gaping eighth graders to seniors. Guided by unchanging ideals of truth, honor, freedom and fair courtesy, we are now more poised. We gape no longer but rather we intelligently wonder, and we know in part where to look to find our answers. After five years of learning, we are beginning to learn how to live.
