In Memory of Ronald Lee Butler

December 27, 1947 - February 17, 1965

Ronald Lee Butler entered Southeast High School as an eighth-grade student in September, 1960, and attended until he became ill in February, 1964. During this time he was interested in many phases of school life, but he was especially interested in R.O.T.C. He was recognized by Sfc. Froelich as an outstanding cadet and rose to the rank of first sergeant of his company. He also attained the honorary position of Color Guard Commander.

In his memory Southeast's R.O.T.C. has established the Cadet Ronald Lee Butler Award, a permanent distinction to be bestowed upon the most outstanding cadets in each year of R.O.T.C. training. Each recipient of the award will receive a medal. His name will also be inscribed on a plaque which will hang in the R.O.T.C. room as a memorial to Ronald, a fine cadet and Southeast Knight.

Freshmen Induction Introduces Knighthood





The R.O.T.C. cadet may put his training to use by continuing military service, or it may serve simply to make him a better citizen.




