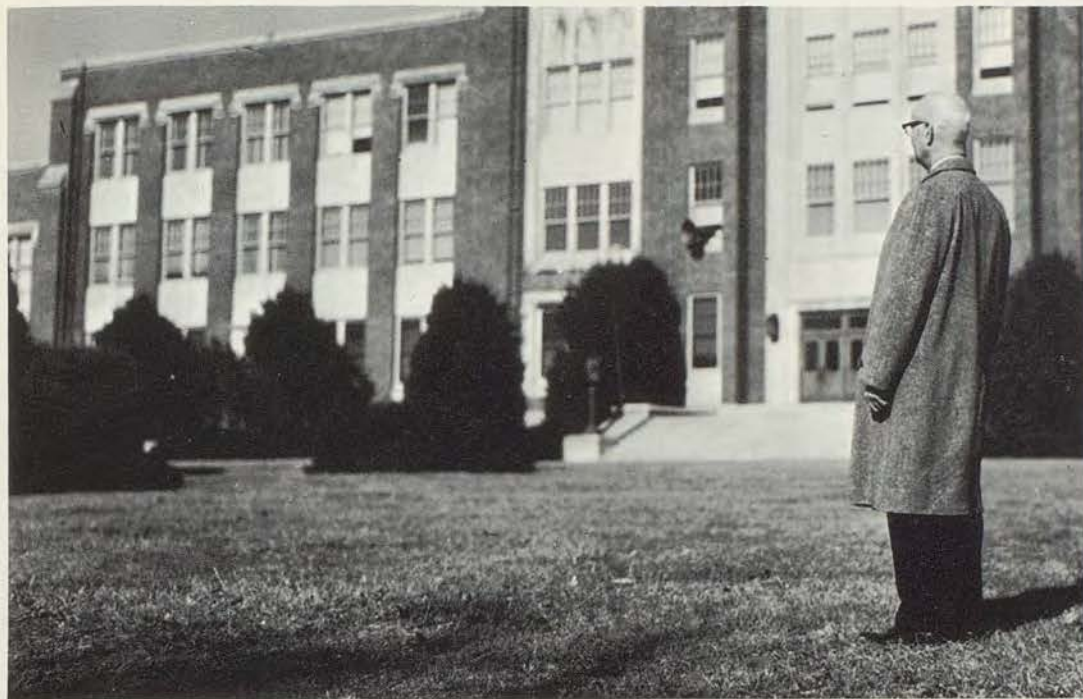
Dear Seniors:

Through his efforts Mr. McMillan has helped to make Southeast a school for which students and teachers alike feel a lasting loyalty.



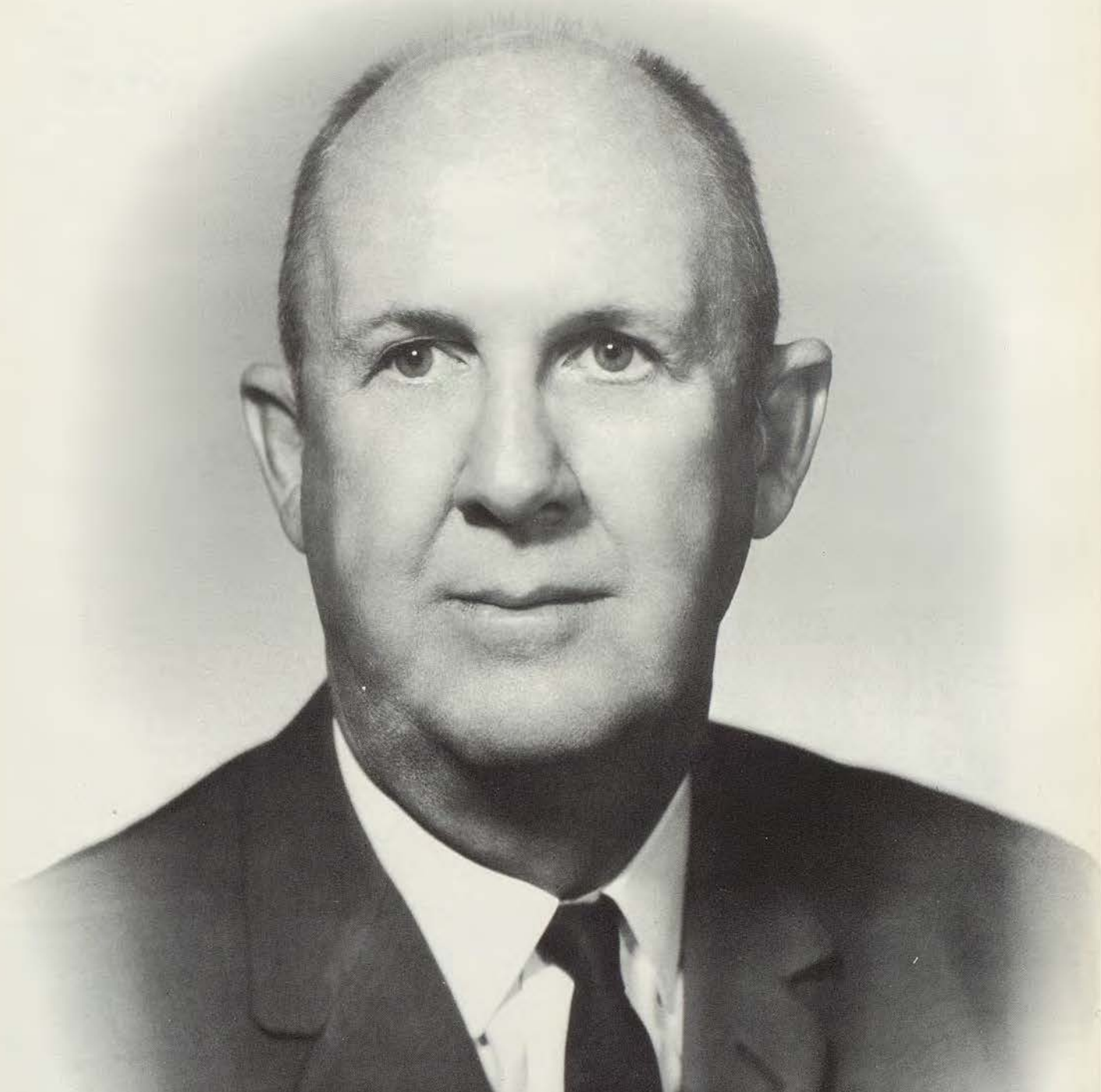


Dear Seniors:

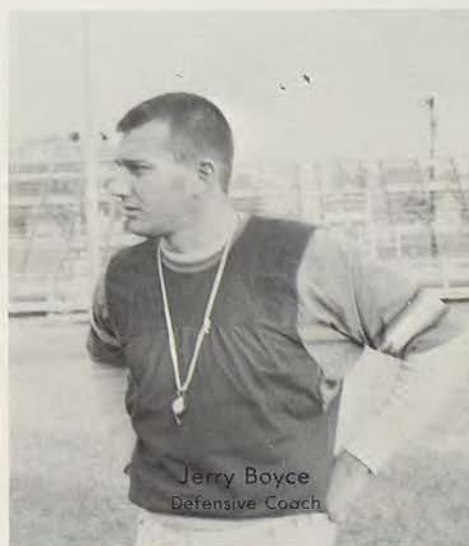

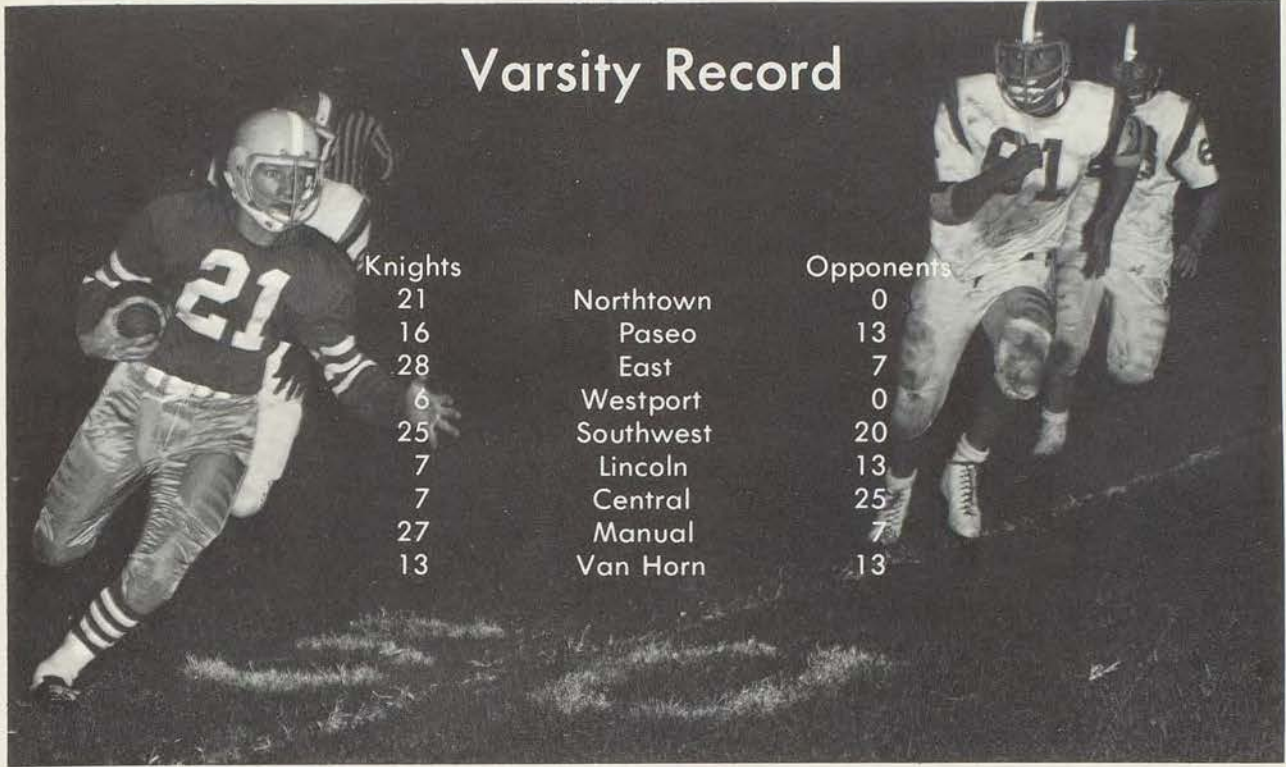

Game highlights recount winning year



Northtown

The game with North Kansas City proved to be a harbinger of a successful season for Southeast. A touchdown early in the first quarter created a deficit from which Northtown never recovered. Mike Hoedl's and Kenny Pummill's outstanding rushing, aided by Greg Herdon's key block and Logan Sousley's pass reception, proved to be determining factors in the 21-0 shut-out.



Paseo

A determined Pirate team tried vainly to dethrone the Knights in their second pre-season contest. A 14 point scoring effort in the third quarter gave Southeast the lead for the first time in the game. An end-zone

tackle by Butch Lee resulted in a safety and strengthened our lead. The score was now 16-13. Extra point kicks by Jim Allred and touchdowns by Mike Hoedl and Dave Clark accounted for the Knights' scoring.

The Bears left our stadium with much to growl about as Southeast handed East a 28-7 defeat. The Knights ran a successful ground game against East's not-so-successful passing. A 41-yard run by Pete Parnell and a 66 yarder by Mike Hoedl put Southeast ahead for good in the first quarter. Ken

Pummill's one-yard plunge widened the margin and Richard Greene's 39-yard run-back on a pass interception in the third quarter ended our scoring.

Westport

A 6-0 triumph over Westport led to a three way tie for a first place berth for the Knights in the Interscholastic League. Logan Sousley picked a loose ball out of heavy traffic to complete the pass for the only score of the game. Sousley began the Southeast drive by recovering a Westport fumble on the opponents' 40-yard line. This game boosted the Knights' record to 4-0.

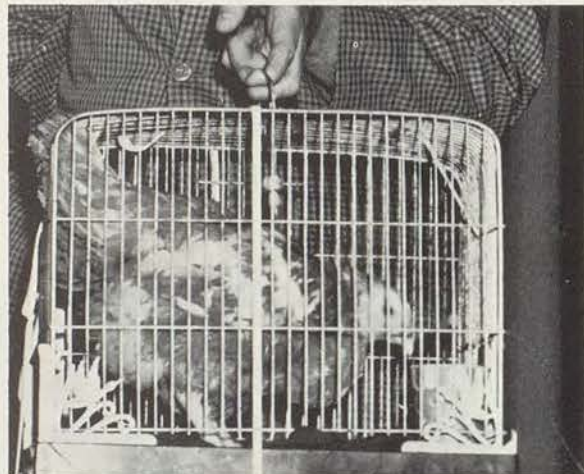




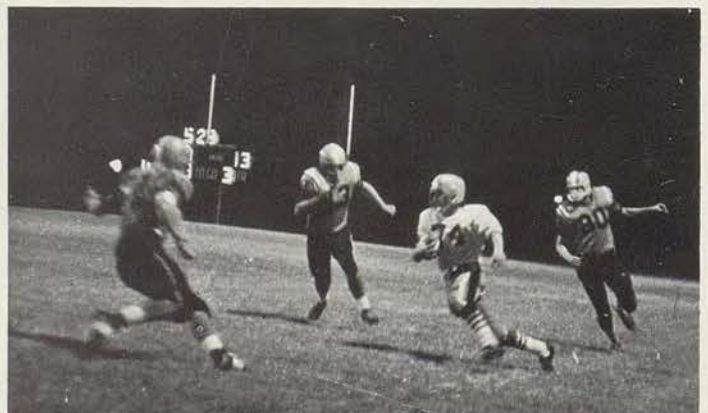

Mike Hoedl proved to be the most outstanding player of the game as he passed and ran Southeast into command. 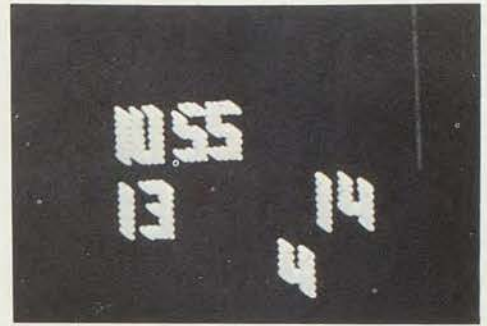
Southeast's defensive strength and an interception by Max Elrod helped earn the Knights' fifth straight victory and possession of the Southside trophy for the upcoming year.

Lincoln

Southeast was toppled from a league-leading position and also from the hope of a perfect season in our fourth league contest of the year. The Knights earned a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter only to be tied by a Lincoln pass completion with 5 seconds left in the first half. A 7-7 deadlock held until, with only 2:51 left in the game, the Tigers pushed over the winning touchdown.

The Southeast offense led in both rushing and passing, but they were unable to use their advances favorably. Greg Ono led the game in individual rushing, compiling 93 yards on fourteen carries.





Central

The Knights proved to be another victim of Central as the Eagles left our field with a 25-7 win to their credit. In the opening minute of the fourth quarter, Logan Sousley recovered a Central fumble on the opponents' 34-yard line and managed to

return it to within one yard of the goal. Ken Pummill then vaulted across for the six points. This touchdown, however, did little to override Central's four tallies, and Southeast was handed its second loss of the year.

Southeast coasted to a 27-7 victory over the Manual Cardinals in the season's next-to-the-last contest. Greg Ono paved the way for Ken Pummill's 3-yard touchdown with a 40-yard run in the first period. Ono then earned a touchdown of his own with a 25-yard gallop to give a 20-0 lead at the half. Manual avoided a shut-out with a 45-yard fourth quarter touchdown.

Outstanding scorers for Southeast were Jim Allred, completing 3 out of 4 extra point attempts, and Ono, totaling 153 yards rushing on only 10 carries.

A 13-13 tie with Van Horn provided the setting for the Southeast homecoming and final game of the season. Mike Hoedl scored the first tally of the night with a 79-yard jaunt. A second period touchdown by Greg Ono put the Knights into the lead. A Falcon score early in the fourth quarter resolved the deadlock, however, and the next 10 minutes, 44 seconds proved to be a defensive battle with Pete Parnell, John Mullin, Ronnie Parker, Ron Williams, Jim Scammahorn, and Bill Endres leading the Knights.

With 1:43 and 1:13 remaining on the clock, Jim Allred attempted field goals from the 15 and 30-yard lines, respectively. Both proved unsuccessful and the clock soon ran out.

During a half-time ceremony, Miss Jo Lynn Niday was chosen to represent Southeast as 1965 football homecoming queen.

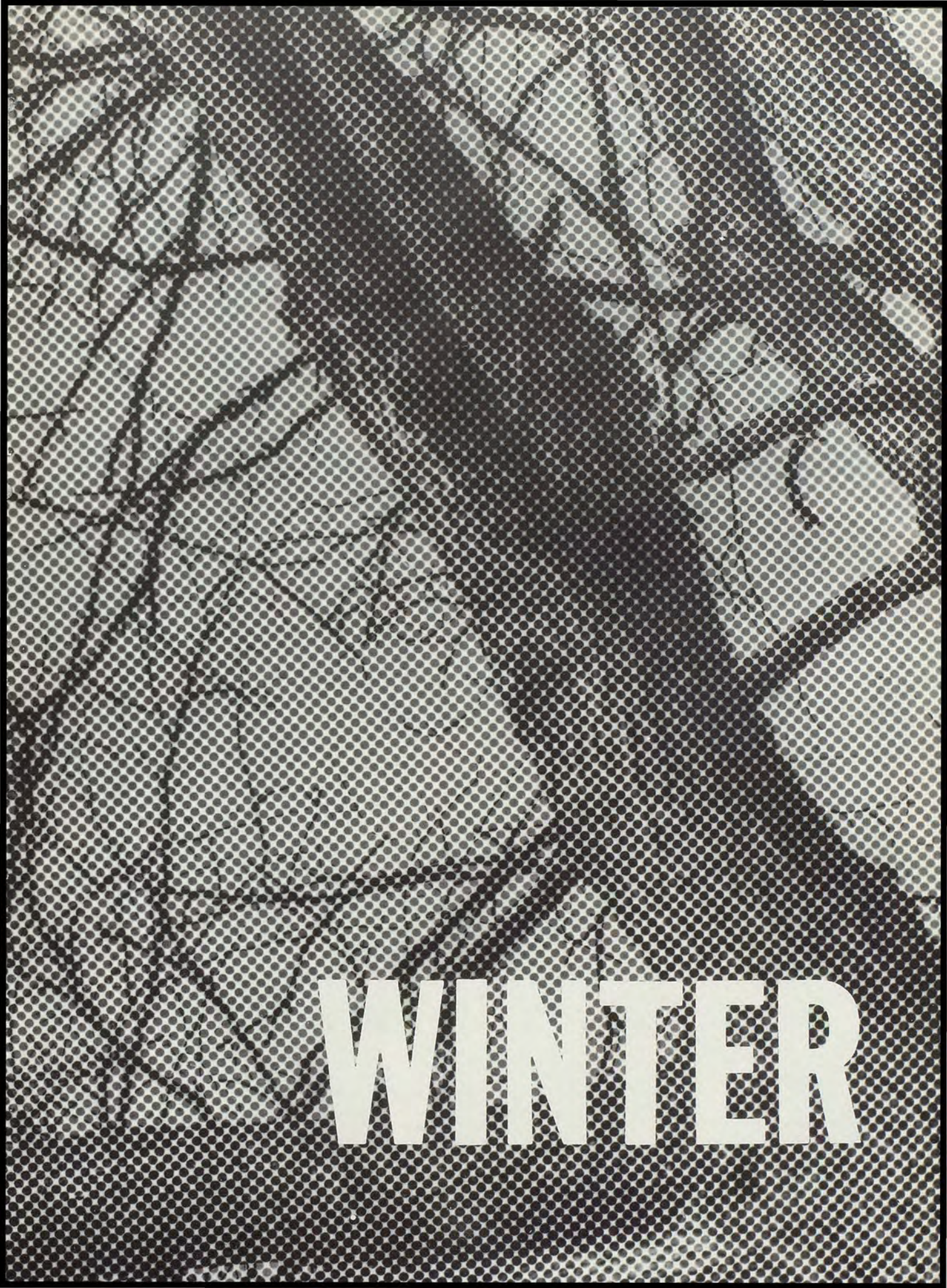
The publication of the student directory, the purchase of a scrap book for the American Field Service student, and the collection of contributions for United Funds were some of the achievements of the first semester Round Table.
