Officials Lead Castle Endeavors




Last fall Castle doors opened to Mr. William D. Evans as he began his first year here as acting principal.

Courses Encompass All Aspects of English

English classes study a broad scope of subjects including the basic concepts of English grammar through an understanding of Shakespeare's plays. Teachers hope that by enrolling in English, students will learn how to communicate and express themselves better both orally and in composition.

Freshmen deal mainly in composition and read selections from a variety of authors for a general English background. *Julius Caesar* and books like *Silas Marner* occupy most of the sophomores' time when they aren't busy writing and comprehending essays and poems. Junior English courses are a survey of American literature. The classes study short stories, plays and poems of such authors as Mark Twain, Robert Frost and Thornton Wilder. Primarily interested in literature, seniors extensively study *Hamlet*, early English literature and at the end of the year prepare a research paper.

Modern Labs Assist Students in Language Comprehension

Four foreign languages are offered at Southeast to students who have an adequate knowledge of English and wish to accept the rewarding challenge of Latin, Spanish, French or German.

Latin is a cultural course as well as a language course. Through the translation of classical literature and the study of ancient Roman society, students develop a basic understanding of man's history.

Spanish and French, as well as German, are taught as conversational languages. With an extensive language lab and coordinated tapes and books, students achieve a mastery of the language itself through usage. This method of study is based on the ALM program in which conversation is the stressed phase of a language.

Biology and human science deal with life in all its forms. BSCS biology, taught in all classes, stresses advanced experimentation. Classification and dissection play an important role and are facilitated by precision equipment such as microscopes and slides.



Chemistry and physics — the physical sciences — and mathematics are closely related. In the math department, students develop the ability to reason deductively and to organize ideas effectively. In this way, the student is able to analyze a scientific problem and come to a logical conclusion.

The most recent additions to the departments are CHEM Study and modern math. CHEM Study, an honor course last year, was taught in all chemistry classes this year. Both innovations train the student to discover the "why" and to interpret relationships for himself. CHEM Study uses laboratory work to gain these ends.

Math classes range from general math to college freshman math and encompass arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry and calculus. General science opens windows on all areas of the sciences in an attempt to give the student a broad understanding before specialization.


Family relations is designed to help students understand their parental home better as well as plan for their future family. Other topics include etiquette, insurance and child psychology.




Fine Arts Department Develops Personal Talents, Creativity

Through classes in the fine arts, students learn to express themselves and to discover basic characteristics of personality.

Speech classes offer experiences in all phases of speech-making and the theatre. They give students necessary confidence and poise in addressing a group in addition to a knowledge of stage drama.

Art students strive to achieve creativity by expressing themselves through the varied media of the visual arts. These cover the wide range from charcoal and paints to wax and glass.

Specialization Furthers Manual Skills,


Drafting, wood, metal, art metal and electricity classes compose the industrial arts department. By providing an opportunity to develop manual skills, these courses are often responsible for future jobs and hobbies.

In wood, metal and electricity, students produce numerous projects ranging from common household articles to furniture of commercial quality. Modern workshops are furnished with the most recent machinery.

Unlike the other industrial arts classes, art metal is often taken by girls. In this class they create rings, lavaliers and charms by using their skills in cutting, soldering and buffing.

After learning the fundamentals of drafting, students can enroll in technical, mechanical or architectural drafting, where they learn more specialized skills. Some of the advanced skills learned include drawing house plans and machinery assembly.

Driver's education teaches students to consider driving a privilege rather than a right. To be safe and responsible drivers, they must have a knowledge of Missouri laws and the ability to think quickly.



Home Economics and Commerce Classes Stress Practicality

Within the home economics department foods, clothing, senior home economics, child development and home decoration are taught. In foods girls learn sanitary and safe work habits in the kitchen and how to plan inexpensive yet nutritional meals. Clothing classes provide the opportunity for girls to have an attractive yet inexpensive wardrobe; they teach sewing skills ranging from making a simple skirt to tailoring lightweight coats and suits. Senior home economics gives a girl with no previous homemaking experience a glimpse of many different fields of home economics. The areas studied include foods, clothing, home decoration, home nursing, personality, figure and diet.

Business, accounting, stenography, typing and clerical practice comprise the commerce department. Besides teaching students the basic skills required in business, these courses provide an insight into the role of the business administrator.







Through classes in ROTC and physical education, students develop physical as well as intellectual talents.





















Primary activities of the club are its speakers and unusual field trips. Among their past meetings were a planned program on bats and an outing to view cadavers at the College of Osteopathy.










The Southeast Knights returned once again to their winning form of past years. Compiling a 7-3 record, the Knights finished third in the Interscholastic League.











Boys who have not won varsity letters are awarded patches if they are members of a winning team.





Awaiting sophomores are the challenges and responsibilities of juniors. As upperclassmen, they will join the seniors in leading Southeast through another successful year.








Leadership Duties
