These plays gave the Drama students additional practice on the art of stage performances. All the plays were presented and directed by the students themselves.





The Pom-Pon Drill Team was formed during the basketball season this year. The group was made up of Sophomore and Junior members of the Pep Club.



Drill Team Means Competition To ROTC Cadets




















North Kansas City




Joplin



let us turn our heads forward and allow the night to be gone with these shadows.


Gently drop hands,
