Social Studies provides experience in world problems, government, civics, and black awareness in history. The aim of the social studies department is to strengthen students in their everyday involvement in the world around them.



Math




Acting Company Takes On New Look





Thus the 'class of 74' pays tribute to its princess Miss Joyce Abram, and Miss Sonya Thomas.



Chess Club




This year the track team got off to a fast start and according to Jim Julian, coach of the track team, is expected to do even better in the future.

A lot of the members will be returning next year as the track team consists of only four seniors, 31 juniors, and 58 sophomores and freshmen.











