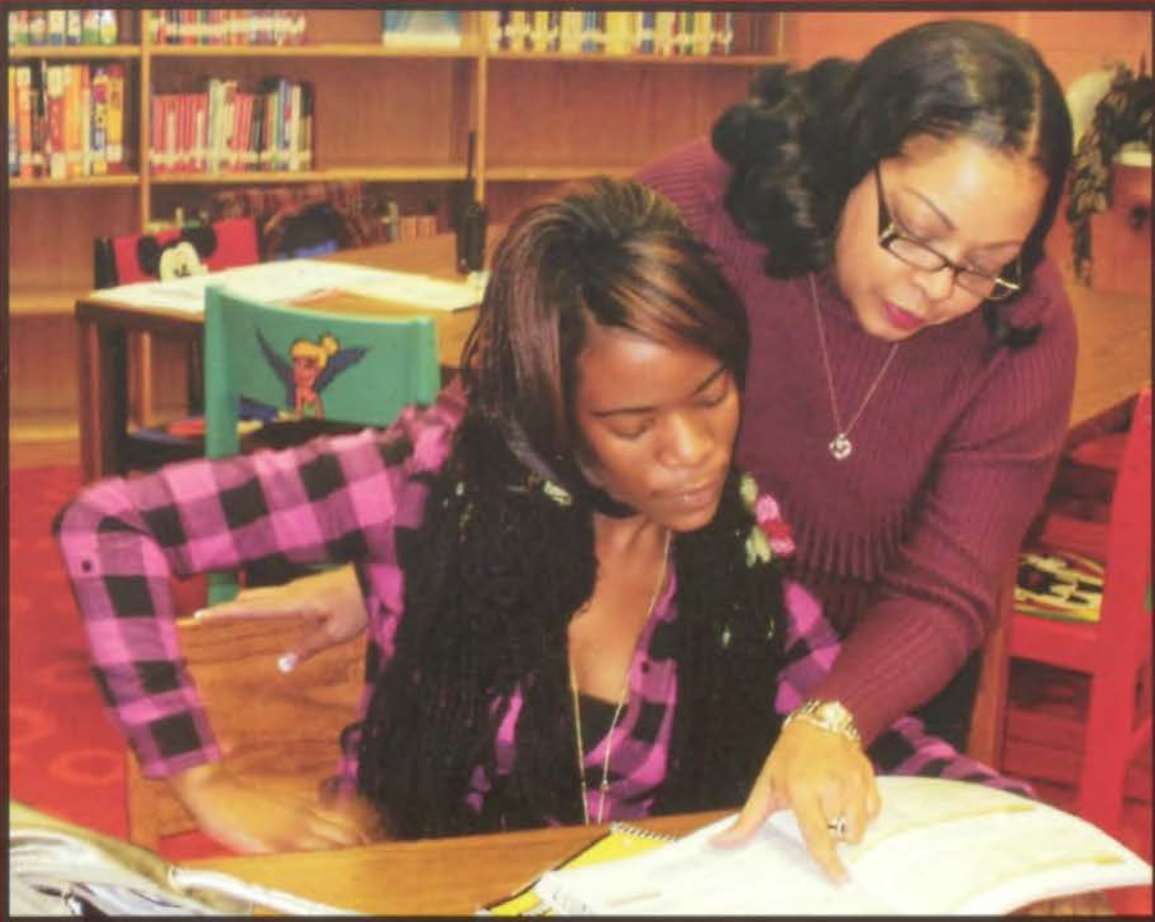
Darius Knight said, "Living is hanging with friends, laughing, making jokes and just enjoying each other's company, while at the same time handling your business and insuring positive things for the future."

Carmen Rivero said, "Live for today. Live every day to the fullest. Tomorrow is not promised."



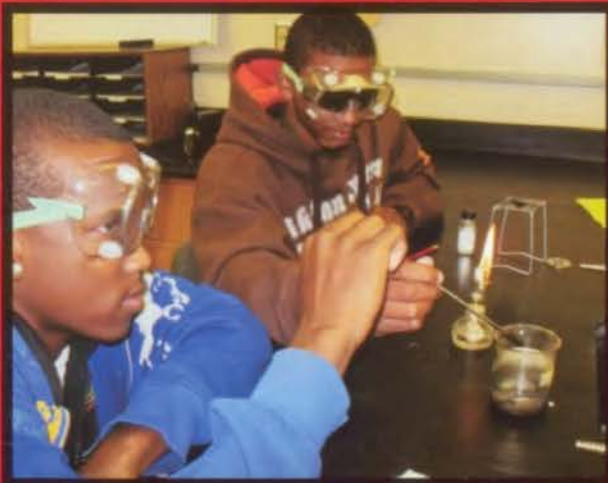
Halloween was a special occasion at Southeast. Students played games, ate lots of candy and had fun together. Montez Moore and Tashara Sherman played checkers.

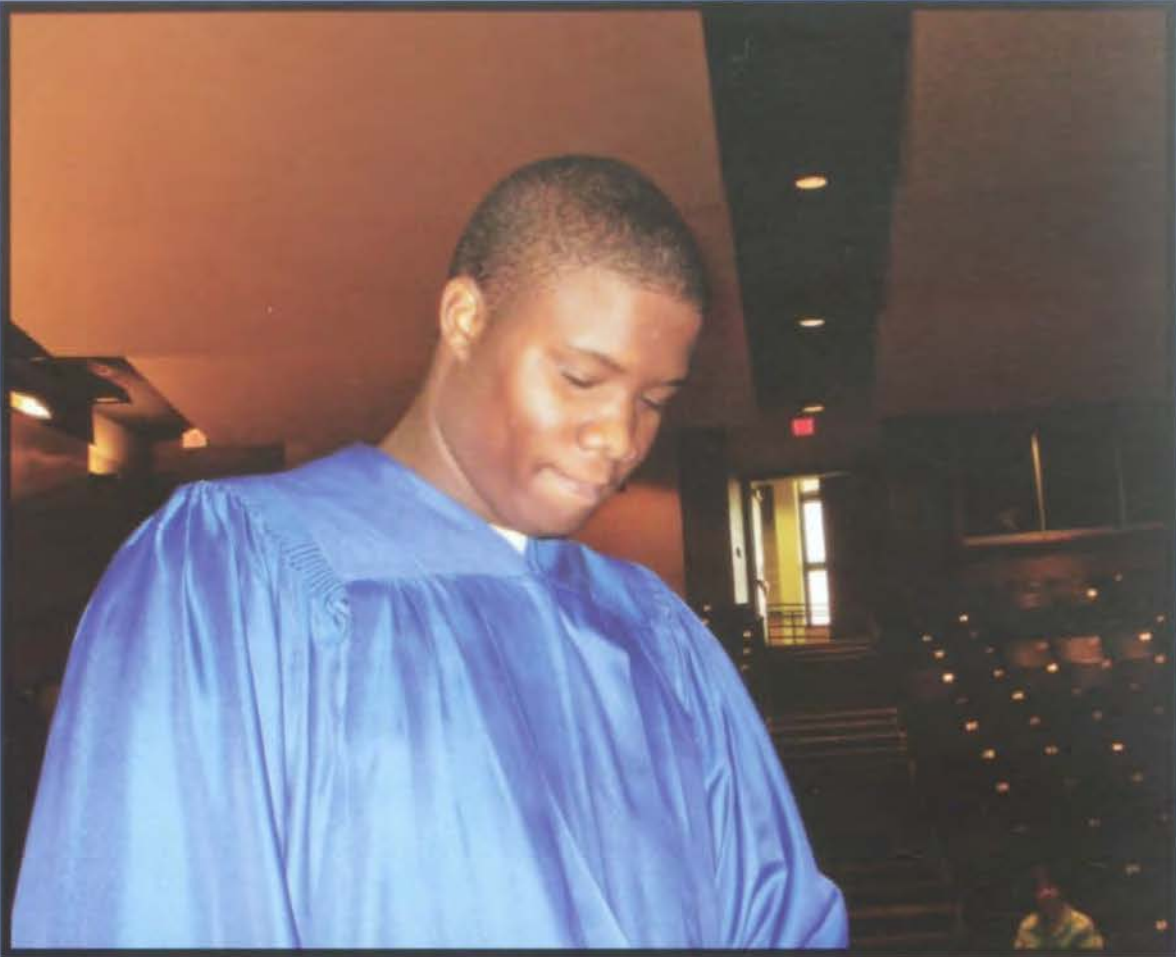
Brandon Powell and Dell Davis worked on an experiment in Mrs. Scott's Chemistry class.

Graduation is a must! During senior picture day, Thomas Daniel got the feel of the gown like he would wear at graduation on May 25.

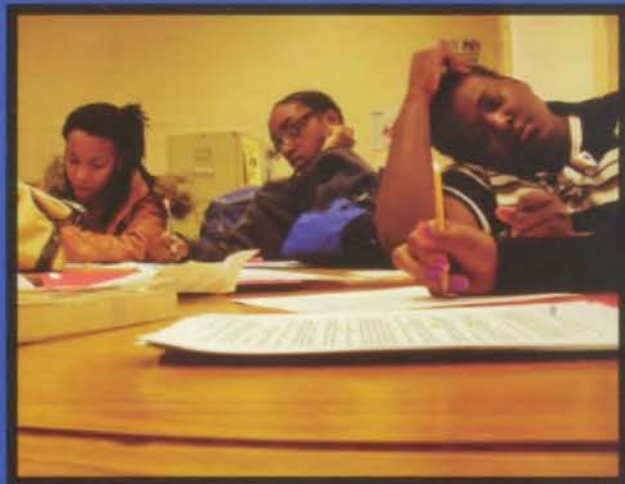
Students carefully considered a meaning for "Legacy." The dictionary defines it as "anything handed down from an ancestor or predecessor."

## Legacy...

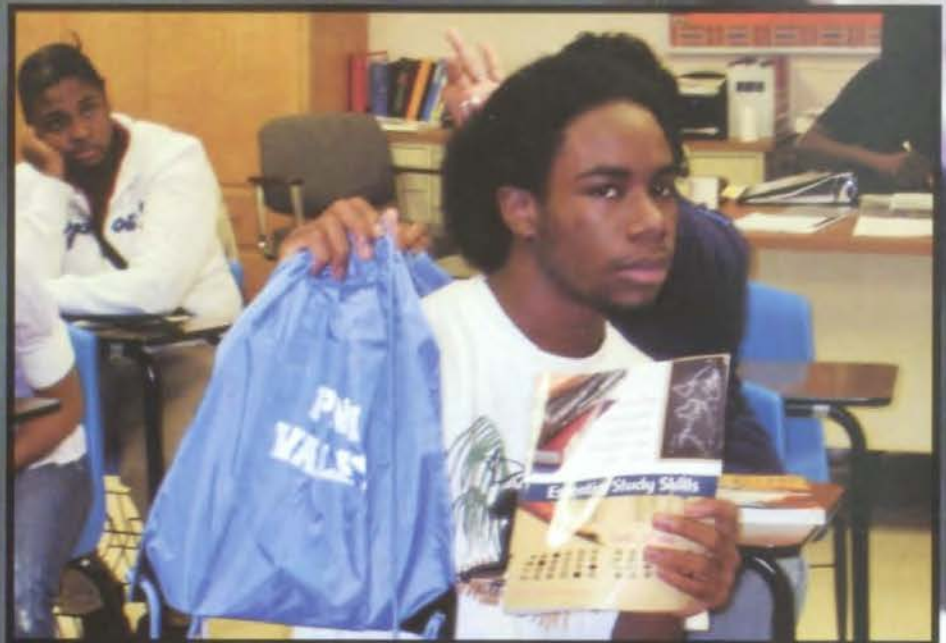

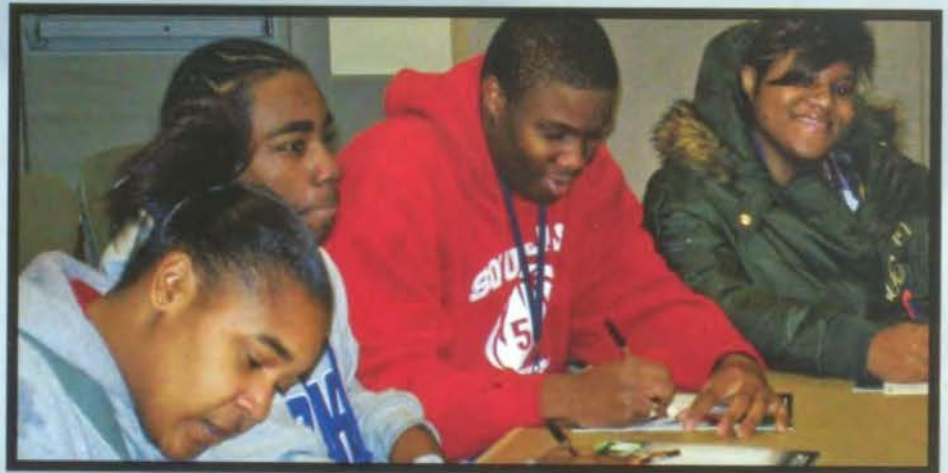

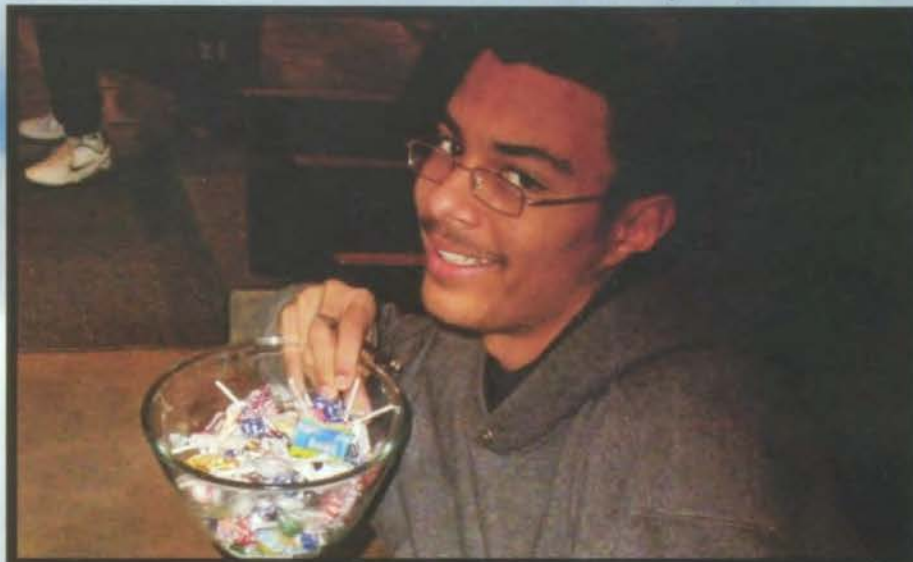
