


## LIVE


Darrius Knight said, "Living is hanging with friends, laughing, making jokes and just enjoying each other's company, while at the same time handling your business and insuring positive things for the future."


"Learn" is for now and forever. Southeast students said:

"Our 'Legacy' could be helping others, like a fund raiser, *Toys for Tots* or a food drive.


JROTC visits senior citizens' homes each year.







They finished with a high school diploma and college credit. And, they are more prepared to take the big step, going off to college in the fall.


