FOREWO

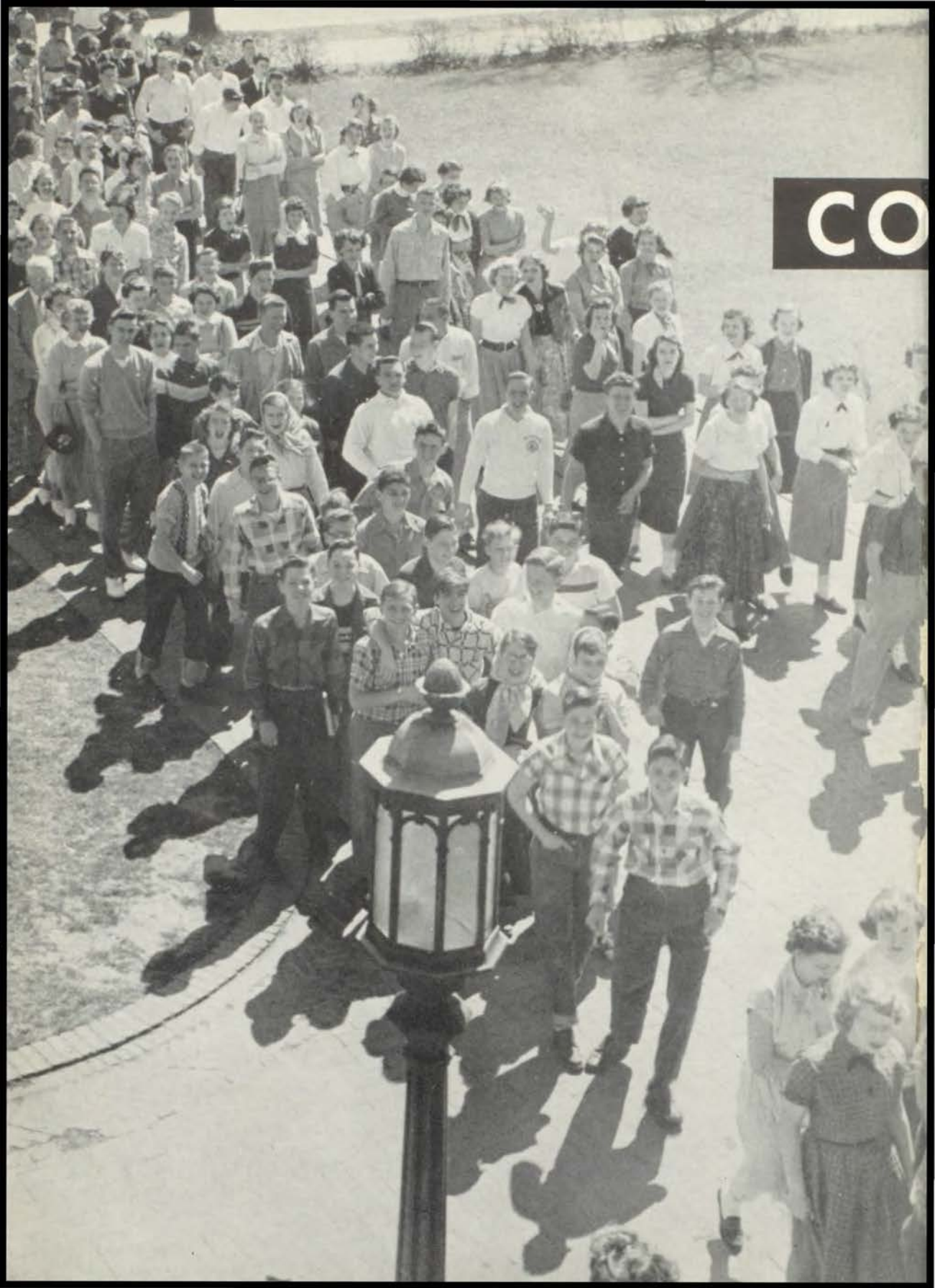

BASKETBALL

On the nights of April fourth and fifth the seniors of 1952 presented a Senior Play that will probably never be forgotten by those who saw it. The cast,

under the excellent direction of Miss Breen, had rehearsed for hours each night, but the reward, two perfect productions, was well worth it.

By the time the epilogue was reached, many solutions had been discovered, and the play was brought to a beautiful conclusion.

WONDER

What wonder there is in a child and a Christmas tree. The wonder I see tonight in her wide eyes that look at it so long. The tall tree with its strange clean odor, the presents underneath that brought so much happiness today, the faint whisperings of the candles on the mantle: it is all so new to these eyes that have seen only one other Christmas, and that an eternity ago. It is late, I think guiltily. Susan should have been in bed early tonight after so much excitement all day. And ordinarily she would have been, but surely Christmas night is different. This sweet charm, this spell of wonder, is all about us, and neither wants to break it.

What is she thinking of that she is still so long? Is she remembering how her daddy held her up so she herself could tie on those big colored balls? Surely she has forgotten how she cried when she dropped one. It splintered into a hundred tiny fragments. Maybe she is thinking about the little bells on the tree that jingled and made her happy again. And then her mother showed her how to hang the shimmering tinsel from the lowest branches. But I am forgetting, she is just a baby. It must be only that the colored lights and shining ornaments are more beautiful and fascinating than anything she has ever seen.

She is so small in my arms, so sleepy, and so determined to keep awake and watch that tree, though I have told her again and again that it will still be here in the morning. When her father and mother come home they will say disapprovingly that she has been up too long, and carry her off to bed. She will never remember this night; she is too young. But I think I will remember it for a long time. For my wonder is not in the Christmas tree, but in the child herself.

"Round yon virgin mother and child . . ." Sometime during the Christmas season God should give to every woman the chance to hold a child. In what better way can the real meaning of Christmas be realized? "Holy infant so tender and mild . . ." Are not all babies holy really? Is it not a wonder that God creates each one as pure and clean as He did His Son? And it is more than a responsibility; it is an opportunity, a miracle, that He leaves it to us to care for. How could that beautiful task ever be neglected and forgotten?

I wonder at a child's love—so freely given. Susan's arms around my neck when I carried her downstairs—never asking who I was, what I was, whether or not anyone else loved me. It is a pity that something in the next few years of her life will change all that. We who are older have to earn friendship, and we give it out on the same basis. Is it any deeper, more lasting, that way?

And I wonder at her faith. Oh, not her belief in the Santa Claus who brought her toys today, but her faith in the people around her, in me for instance. Now and then her sleepy blue eyes leave their vigil and glance up into mine—eyes full of her confidence in me, and I have done nothing to deserve it. Is it instinct, or something more, that tells her I would always be good to her, that I would do everything to help her and keep her safe from harm. And yet I believe she would trust anyone in the world; with her it might be all right. That too, of course, will change in time. The disillusion will come, and heaven knows I hope I have no part in it. But isn't it wonderful that while she is so young and helpless—at a time when by all laws of nature she should have the most cause to be afraid—she has no fear because of this faith.

Susan is not mine. But I once heard someone say that a child belongs to everyone at Christmas time. And sitting here before the tree, holding this sleeping child, I thank you, God, for giving me this perfect way of seeing the miracle, the wonder, of that first Christmas night.
