



FOREWO



Due to inconsistency the Tribe was able to account for only four wins in seven interscholastic league games. By virtue of their performance they were awarded third place along with Paseo.



On the nights of April fourth and fifth the seniors of 1952 presented a Senior Play that will probably never be forgotten by those who saw it. The cast, under the excellent direction of Miss Breen, had rehearsed for hours each night, but the reward, two perfect productions, was well worth it.

The play opened on a darkened stage with a mother and father waiting up for their children who were out with the car. Harping on the irresponsibilities of the present generation, the couple were reminded of their own youth.

The play flashes back to the days of the Charleston; Al Jolson, the "Singing Fool"; \$13.98 wristwatches; ukuleles; records called "You're the Cream în My Coffee" and "Hallelujah, I'm a Bum"; painted jalopies; and yellow slickers lettered in red, "I'm a Rambling Wreck from Georgia Tech and a—pretty good engineer."

The major part of the play revolved around the romances of the teenagers of 1928, their ambitions, their fads. The problems of a romantic triangle and a younger sister, an old-fashioned father and a collegiate brother, and then, of course, Caledonia provided hilarious comedy. By the time the epilogue was reached, many solutions had been discovered, and the play was brought to a beautiful conclusion.







Is it instinct, or something more, that tells her I would always be good to her, that I would do everything to help her and keep her safe from harm. And yet I believe she would trust anyone in the world; with her it might be all right. That too, of course, will change in time. The disillusion will come, and heaven knows I hope I have no part in it. But isn't it wonderful that while she is so young and helpless—at a time when by all laws of nature she should have the most cause to be afraid—she has no fear because of this faith.

Susan is not mine. But I once heard someone say that a child belongs to everyone at Christmas time. And sitting here before the tree, holding this sleeping child, I thank you, God, for giving me this perfect way of seeing the miracle, the wonder, of that first Christmas night. I'm beating the tom-tom for your autograph.
