
Southwest welcomes its new vice-principal Donald S. Stephens, who is shown congratulating Alexandra Roll, valedictorian of the senior class.

The president serves in all official functions as the representative of the senior class and is the presiding chairman over senior meetings, the Senior Business Committee, and the commencement committee. Responsible for assuming the president's duties in his absence and in charge of the various Prom committees is the vice-president. As secretary, one is expected to record the minutes of the meetings and handle correspondence; as treasurer, to handle all finances. Perhaps one of the more important positions is that of the giftorian, who conducts research in choosing the senior gift and then presents this gift to the school. The publicity chairman is expected to handle publicity for senior events, while the sergeant-at-arms acts as parliamentarian and maintains order at meetings.

SENIOR BUSINESS COMMITTEE

This year's very efficient Senior Business Committee is composed of twenty outstanding leaders of the senior class who were elected in the fall of the school term. In order to manage the complex affairs of the senior class these members are organized into seven sub-committees, each under the direction of a senior class officer. These sub-committees present various reports to the committee at large, which in turn accepts or rejects the recommenciations. Projects such as the senior gift are then presented in organized form to a vote of the entire senior class.

GEORGE MANSFIELD: Named to the Second All-City Team this year, George was one of the league's top ground gainers.








GIRLS' SPORTS





